OOPS, Check the GVW

(Editor's Note: We ran this blip last month but had the GVW wrong. IF you're pulling over 26,000 you are required to have a Commercial driver's license.)

Remember Rodeo Contestants: As of April 1, many state laws have been changed. When entering another state and pulling horses, you must stop at the port of entry. (Idaho fine is \$82.50 for failing to stop).

Annual equine import permits are required when you leave Montana with your horse and plan to return.

Some states require health certificates on livestock issued in the last 30 days; No Coggins required for Idaho, however, Wyoming does require that testing.

Also know that commercial driver's license are required if you're pulling over 26,000 GVW in Montana or 10,000 in Idaho. (A crew cab pickup with camper pulling four-horse trailer loaded is about 18,000 GVW.)

If you have questions on livestock permits, call the Montana Department of Livestock in Helena, 444-2976. Questions about commercial drivers license call the Department of Highways, GVW department, in Helena, 444-6131



A. Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. Unless otherwise advertised.

B Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

1. Name of rodeo

2 Your NRA card number

3 Your Name.

4. The event or events you wish to enter.

5 preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.

6 Name of buddy or buddies - two per event, six total.

7 If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.

8 Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. to find out when you are up.

C. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, are recorded on tape, and each cowboy is given verification number for that conversation.

YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS

REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING THEIR FIRST PERFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.

Permit holder's points will be credited to the yearend standings, however, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the NRA Finals. The \$500 money limit will be accumulated from year to year, allowing the contestant to purchase a permit each year until the \$500 is won. A card holder the previous year cannot purchase a permit the following year. Back side of application must be completed to guarantee processing of membership

application.

RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Northern Rodeo Association sanctioned events and membership in the Association, I and my heirs, successors, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DIS-CHARGE and agree to HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Northern Rodeo Association, the rodeo committees, stock contractors, sponsors, arena operations or owners, their agents, representatives (collectively referred to as the NRA) from all liability to me and my personal representatives, heirs, successors, and next of kin from and all claims and liability for all loss of damage, and any claim of damages therefore on account of any injury to my person including death or damage to my property while I am utilizing NRA facilities or participating in NRA events.

I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

I UNDERSTAND AND AGREE THIS RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to ACCIDENT, INJURY, OR DEATH OCCURRING DURING THE TERM OF MY MEMBERSHIP IN THE NRA. Any subsequent Releases and agreement I might sign in the future shall amplify, but shall in no way limit, the provisions of this document.





advertised as "NO TRADEOUTS."

Trades: A contestant may trade positions/ performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved, before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

Note: A new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

Turnouts: As stated in the rule book, if a

All NRA rodeos are tradeout rodeos unless contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

- 1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.
- 2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary/judge/contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors/judges/secretaries/spectators/ announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.
