



From the crow's nest ...

Some very exciting things are happening in the world of rodeo this summer. The limited edition rodeo trading cards featuring the 1992 NRA champions will be available soon at a Pizza Hut near you. See the article and ad elsewhere in this issue.

The filming of a movie in Montana about rodeo people is the most exciting news yet. Matched bull riding and bronc riding will be presented at Livingston and Wilsall to provide the "real thing" in the rodeo world. See the ad on page one, and watch for more news on this.

Preserving the heritage of rodeo and our way of life here in the west has proved to be a full-time job for Friends of Rodeo Montana Executive Director Karen Miller, and she reports that the people most reluctant to help the cause are the rodeo contestants themselves.

These are the same people who also forget the "dress code" spelled out in the rule book about hat, boots, long sleeved shirts, and long pants. I guess you don't often see football players appearing on the football field without their uniform, or basketball players competing without a uniform. Yet, rodeo competitors appear in the arena before the rodeo performance, warming up their horses without their "uniform," donned in tank tops, caps, tennis shoes, no hats, or worse yet, visors, and the list goes on.

The rule book does not specify the exact time frame when you should be wearing your "uniform" except when competing, but common sense should prevail; you should know when the crowd is in the stands and watching, or when some impressionable tourist will be aware of the way you are dressed. Use your common sense; wear your "uniform" whenever you appear in or near the rodeo arena so a rule won't have to be written in the rule book.



MontanaFair Has Changed!

MontanaFair at Billings has made some important changes this year that NRA cowboys and cowgirls need to be aware of.

First of all, special arrangements have been made for specific rodeo contestant parking. No longer will contestants park in the lower lot (on the side of the hill, or wherever parking attendants put you previously).

Contestants must enter the grounds through Gate One, which is located immediately off the new Lockwood Bridge on the Hardin Highway (by the race horse barns).

If you are coming from the interstate, take the Lockwood Exit #452, cross the bridge, and take a right into Gate 1 (on the southeast edge of the fair grounds). Vehicle parking will be located adjacent to the fenced area for race track parking.

CAUTION: Do not enter Gate One but turn to the right, and about 50 yards, turn left into the special parking area.

The rodeo office will also be located by this gate and will be so signed.

Access to the METRA Arena will be from this backside by the Rodeo Office and SuperBarn. Only walk-in and horseback traffic will be allowed through the access gate. No vehicles will be allowed.

Wristbands will be issued by the Rodeo Secretary for CONTESTANTS ONLY, and wristbands must be worn. Only wristbands will be allowed through the METRA access gate, so as companions are considered

paying customers and must go through the gate where tickets are sold. The closest ticket gate is Gate Two. (see map).

METRA access gate will be open to contestants one-half hour before each performance and slack. Your designated warm-up area is the straight-away at the back of the starting gate on the race track. This area is lso so noted on the map. The warm-up area will be open one hour before performance time and one hour before slack.

Rodeo Office will open at 5 p.m. each evening and 8 a.m. the morning of slack.

Slack will be held at 10 a.m. on Friday, August 20. If additional slack is needed it will be held after the performance on Thursday, Aug. 19.

The MontanaFair features no contestant preference in selection of performance, no drawouts, and no tradeouts. Permits are accepted in only bareback and saddle bronc riding only, and are not accepted bull riding and in timed events. Local entries will be limited to residents of Yellowstone, Stillwater and Carbon counties, and fees for local entries must be paid prior to the rodeo.

Entries open Thursday, August 5 from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. with Call Backs on Friday, August 6 from noon - 6:30 p.m., both through Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry, 406-428-2205. Added money for each event is \$1,000, with \$75 entry fees.

HOW TO ENTER NRA RODEOS THROUGH BIG SKY RODEO CENTRAL ENTRY DIAL 406-428-2205

Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised. Charge is \$3.50

Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

- 1. Name of rodeo
- 2. Your NRA card number
- 3. Your name
- 4. The event or events you wish to enter
- 5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
- 6. Name of buddy or buddies two per event, six total.
- 7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
- 8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m.(unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are up.
- 9. Keep track of the confirmation number the operator gives you, both on entering the rodeo and calling back. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation. YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY OUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING HIS FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, you will be charged an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

Trade-outs and Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADE OUTS."

Trades: A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved <u>before the draw</u> in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

Note: a new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earier.

<u>Turnouts:</u> As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judge, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

Top rodeo bull lost

Don Jacobs lost one of his best bulls during the Big Timber rodeo June 25 and 26, and the media had a hay day with the story, with one-sided information and biased reporting being spread across the state on the wires of the Associated Press, a week after the incident took place.

"Dirty Dingus McGee," reportedly on his way to a PRCA stock contractor for the ripe sum of \$7,000, went "bonkers" after the rodeo on Friday night, escaped onto the Interstate Highway, and had to be shot.

The AP story, and the one in the local Big Timber paper painted a pictured of a bull escaping from the rodeo grounds immediately after the rodeo, running around town, charging people and cars, and two cowboys and the stock contractor (who wasn't named) chasing after him with guns, shooting him with a .22 pistol 75-100 times, and finally downing him with a .357 Magnum.

The story was written "according to the Sweet Grass County Sheriff's department," and no one else was contacted as to the facts, not even the stock contractor. The officers implied that they were willing to let the bull remain with a pasture full of cows until daylight, but said that the stock contractor chased him out of there.

Four days after the story appeared in statewide papers (which was one full week after the incident occurred) the Billings Gazette reporter who wrote the AP story apologized for her one-sided reporting. At press time it was not known if or when a correction would be printed.

Dick Lyman, pickup man for Jacobs Livestock Rodeo, painted a much different picture of the incident, saying that the bull escaped sometime after



midnight, after pacing the fence and being "on the hook." They (the stock contractor and he) were awakened about 1:30 p.m. by the local rodeo chairman, Monte Finn, at their motel who notified them that the bull was out. Sheriff's Department officials said they had not seen the bull, but assisted the stock contractor and Lyman in finding him. Apparently the pasturefull of cows was not enough to attract the bull's attention, and the usually docile bull charged them, went through the pasture, ignoring the amorous cows, over the fence, and headed for the Super 8 Motel where he chased people up on their cars.

Realizing the bull was "crazy" and out of control, the group asked for help from the Sheriff. The bull charged Lyman's pickup, jumped the cattle guard onto the Interstate, highway and the chase was on. The bull was finally shot by the Sheriff's department, but not with a puny .22, and not with 75-100 shots, according to Lyman.

The valuable bull was sacrificed before human lives were lost, but because of the story, it appears that much damage was done to the rodeo industry unnecessarily.



It is not specifically set out in the rule book that two loops can be carried, however, it does state that in case rules are not covered in that section, refer to Ladies Breakaway Roping rules. LBAR rules state ONE LOOP. With this interpretation, until this can be


Friends of Rodeo national office moved to California





In the saddle bronc riding, Jess Martin of Western Montana College won the first go-around, second in the second go, and ended up seventh in the national standings.

Paul Solberg was bucked off on the back of his neck during the Broken Horn Stampede at Absarokee and



Prep cowpokes headed for nationals

HAVRE — Wendy Badgett of Ashland captured her third straight year-end all-around cowgirl title here June 24, 25, 26 and 27. The top four finishers in each event earned the right to compete at the national finals scheduled July 25-31 in Gillette, Wyo. Placers five through eight qualified for the Silver State International Rodeo in Fallon, Nev., July 1-4.

Badgett accumulated 4,554.965 points during the 1992-93 high school season to easily capture her third consecutive all-around crown.

In addition, she won the yearend pole bending title, was second in girl's cow cutting, and combined with Judd Long of Wolf Point for third in team roping.

At the state rodeo, Badgett won the pole bending average and was second in girl's cow cutting.

The all-around cowgirl title at the rodeo went to Jill Ferdina of Wolf Point, who also won the barrel racing average.

Jess Matt of Ethridge won the year-end all-around cowboy crown with 3,301.88 points. He finished third in bareback riding for the season and fourth in the average for the event at the state rodeo.

The all-around cowboy title at the rodeo went to Doug Leeds of Havre who won the bareback riding average.

Shannon Burns of St. Ignatius won the girl's year-end rookie allaround title, while Derick Fleming of Broadus walked away with the boy's rookie all-around title.



I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.




