What do breakaway ropers do with their hands?

Breakaway roping is like no other rodeo event in that it causes problems for the roper when the calf is caught.

The roper has absolutely nothing to do with her hands! In every other event, the contestant has lots of things to do with his or her hands, but not in breakaway roping. For example: all of the rough stock riders can keep their hands busy dusting off the dirt, scraping off the mud, holding their sore spots or merely undoing their chaps as they strut back to the chutes.

No problem for the barrel racers - - they're long gone outside of the arena pulling "whoa back" on those runaway horses.

Bull doggers have lots of dirt to shake out of various parts of their clothing as they are greeted by their fellow bull doggers saying things like, "Man, what a steer!" and "He really didn't take it too good did he!?" or "You turfed him."

I'm certain that heelers must practice their funny little shoulder drop or the well-known grimace (depending on whether they get two feet or not) as their cute little horses shudder and wait for their impending fate.

Headers have lots of things to do: coil their rope (if they have missed), train their horses as they follow the steer out or train the steer as the horse wonders if he was in proper position.

Calf ropers have so much paraphernalia with pigging strings, jerk lines, etc., that they take forever getting out of the arena as it is.

Problems when the calf is caught!

But the poor breakaway ropers. They have nothing to do with their hands after the rope breaks away. Consequently, some ropers have an urge to pick up their nose, or they have a predisposition to at least check it.

I think it was Janie Carlson who started the whirl-around-to-see-if-you-broke-out technique. Deb Haugland, Lisa Mainey, Nancy Petersen, Tammy Jo Risa, Joyce Ayre, Teresa Murnion and many others followed suit.

Some have even gone so far as to nervously adjust bra straps

 - but those are usually the ropers who are married to bull riders.

Cinde Barthelmess has a unique little wave to the sky after she throws her slack that takes up some time until she gets out of the arena.

Some ropers are into petting their horses after they rope. Not necessarily because they are so very fond of the beast, but because it is something very handy to do with the hand that has been so busy.

The ropers from the Dakota have a tendency to put their hand on the cantle. What that originates from, I don't know, but they also have the word "Crimoney" in their vocabulary. The three sisters, Bunny Bail, Deb Burghduff and Alice Burman, as well as newly Dakotanized, Kelly Gorrell, drift toward these two peculiarities.

What to do with the roping hand is a dilemma that breakaway ropers love though. The alternative means the rope did not break away. It means the calf was not caught. It means that the roper has to give that famous, furious jerk to break the string to try to get rid of the frustration of a no time.

Hartford offers NRA exclusive policy for horses

Hartford Insurance is offering an exclusive benefit to Northern Rodeo Association members.

Jeff Diercks, special agent for Hartfort's livestock office in Billings said the company has just approved the Hartford Blue Ribbon Mortality program - a horse mortality insurance.

This is a death mortality policy including transportation and theif, Diercks told the NRA News."This is a death-only policy," he said. However the horse is covered if the vet recommends the animal be "put down."

The cost is 3.9 percent of the purchase price of the horse up to \$15,000 for geldings and \$25,000 for mares and studs. "This is a very good rate. Most policies are 5 percent," he said.

Diercks said if the owner feels they have increased the value of the animal since the purchase, "we'll take that into consideration" and may increase coverage.

Vet inspection is required on the application. Registration papers are also needed, if the horse is registered.

"As soon as we have a vet check and those papers, we can bind coverage on the animals," Diercks said.

Hartford writes policies for most the major Thoroughbred Farms and on many Quarter horses, Diercks said. The insurance is available thorough any Hartford agent. For more information contact Diercks at his PAYS office, 252-0678.


Jennie Locke married T.J.

Dear NRA Barrel Racers and officials;

I am writing in regard to the lack of use of the electric timer at the Forsyth NRA Rodeo.

Everyone knows that no flagman can be as accurate as a timer - - why else would the association purchase and carry one with them? Also the association charges a timer fee - - we all paid, but no timer was used the first performance.

Ithink whoever collects the timer charge should certainly be responsible for having that timer set up for every performance, the girls in that performance should have their fees applied to their percentage of the purse (3 perf's at Forsyth, including slack, therefore, 1/3 of the purse) and pay it as a separate rodeo; or the whole rodeo should continue as it was begun with a flagman.

I think the girls who are concerned with this should call or write Betsy Evans, who is their director and let her know how they feel about this and a rule should be made about a circumstance like this. It what happened at Forsyth and will probably happen again.

Regardless of which performance you were up this time, the situation could be different next time. If the girls are responsible for setting up the time, it would be good business to tell them so. All of us are no acquainted with your unwritten rules.



Where all the champions gone?

"To make the worst horses look good and the good horse look even better," was Pat Howey's prescription to place in the saddle bronc riding. It was a winning formula in 1967 when Howey was the Montana Rodeo Association saddle bronc riding champion.

The former bronc rider likes to talk about the days of riding bucking horses. When he was 15 years old he entered the Wilsall rodeo and continued riding broncs for the next 25 years.

Howey's bronc riding skills were taught to him by Bob Shellhammer, of Billings. "I lived with him from the time I was 11 until I was 25 years old," he says. "He taught me most everything about rodeoing."

Howey rodeoed in the MRA and NRA for a few years but as soon as he won the championship he was PRCA-bound.

His favorite rodeo was always the Diamond Spur in Spokane. It was the first rodeo he entered every the spring.

He fondly recalls going to Calgary for 10 years

in a row, from 1966-1976. His first year there, the saddle bronc riding offered six head. Howey won second in the average but he won first in five goes. (He was disqualifed on one horse.)

"I always won something in Calgary," he says. His first year in the RCA, Howey hit the winter rodeos and drew 16 NFR horses. His favorite was Kesler's Quick Silver which took him to the pay window in Fort Worth in 1968.

He recalls coming off Descent at the whistle in Sidney, lowa. "He wasn't rode yet, and I wanted to ride him pretty bad."

In the MRA, it was Mike Quinn's horses that Howey remembers. "Buttons" was a big brown gelding with two white sock. "He threw a lot of guys off but he fit me pretty good," Pat remembers. "He kicked like Trails End. I could hear his hocks crackle behind my head when he bucked."

Howey wasn't worried about the number of rodeos he could place at. "I never did travel hard," he says. "The Diamond Spur was my first rodeo every year and I quit after Dillon on Labor Day.

"I made a few extra bucks to use to feed my family," he recalls. "One year I went to 32 rodeos and placed at 26 or 27."

Howey, now of Bridger, reflects that he thinks about retirement and then again he thinks he might try it again."I keep thinking, I might crack out. If I hadn't sold my saddle, I might crack out." Dan Mortensen now owns the Severe saddle Howey rode.

For Howey riding broncs may just remain a good memory. "I was always glad to be there. I liked to ride broncs. It didn't matter if you win or lose, it was always a thrill to ride."

Today, a part of Howey's shadow still graces the arena. His son Nye is competing in the junior roping events and younger sons Anders and Shay are in the wings.

Today, the 43-year-old drives truck for Steve Nelson Trucking saying, "Desperate men do desperate deeds."






