Larry Johnston Killed in Crash

KELLOGG, IDAHO — Larry C. Johnston, a Great Falls cattle truck driver and top rodeo pickup man, was killed late Tuesday, Oct. 1, and his cargo scattered over Interstate 90 after he swerved to miss a pickup truck that had landed in his path, according to Shoshone County sheriff's deputies.

Johnston, 27, had been named pickup man of the year the past three years for the Northern Rodeo Association.

The accident, shortly before 9 p.m., closed the freeway three miles east of Kellogg for nearly $4^{1/2}$ hours.

Deputies said a westbound pickup truck driven by Timothy Nelson, 34, of Yakima, Wash., left the roadway, crossed the center median, struck a large pile of dirt, and vaulted onto its top into the cattle truck's path.

Officials said Johnston swerved to miss the pickup and his truck struck the guardrail, rolled several times and landed in the South Fork of the Coeur d'Alene River.

Nelson, who was not seriously injured, was charged with drunken driving, deputies said.

The cattle roundup and accident cleanup took until 8 a.m. Wednesday, officials said. Johnston's funeral was Saturday, Oct. 5, in

Great Falls, with burial in the Craig Cemetery.

He was born in Dillon and attended grade school there. He graduated from Townsend High School in 1976, and had been a professional trucker since 1978. He was employed by D & J Livestock until starting his own trucking business, the Wineglass Truck and Cattle Co., a year and a half ago.

He was a pickup man, along with his partner, Dick Lyman, for Jacobs Rodeo Livéstock Co.

He was married in 1984 to Lana K. Nahrgang in Great Falls.

Survivors include his wife; son, Tyler Lawrence Johnston; brothers, Stanley Johnston of Winston, and Ben Johnston and Ross Johnston, both of Helena; sister Kathy Johnston of Helena; parents Kay Johnston of Helena, and Lawrence Johnston Sr. of Billings, and a grandmother, Kathleen Price of Helena.



A strange phenomenon has occured with the onset of fall: no one seems nearly as excited about rodeo as they were six or eight weeks ago. If the NRA office has not received your entry blank before the designated deadline (usually the first Monday in January), then it will be assumed you are not competing, and the next contestant in line will be contacted. The association assumes you are grown up and leaves the responsibility for entering on your shoulders.

Junior members can compete in the finals if they have won any amount of money, but must fill out an entry blank also.

Fall and winter also bring about a lot of moves. Please send us your change of address should you move; your newsletter is not forwarded if you move, the post office merely chucks it in the nearest wastepaper basket.





Something to Think About

From the Sun Valley Sun, Augusta September 5, 1985

If Augusta area outfitters, bars restaurants, hotels and motels promoted out-of-state their annual Pack Horse Race (Sept. 1 this year) in connection with its "gateway to the Bob Marshall and Scapegoat Wildernesses," they would be eligible for financial help from the Travel Promotion Division of the state Department of Commerce on a dollar-for-dollar matching basis.

This fiscal year \$40,000 is available for such promotion by a non-profit tourism-related organizations and associations.

Projects receiving matching monies during the first round of funding are:

Yellowstone Country Regional Tourism Association, \$7,500 to help publish a summer, 1986 issue of Yellowstone Magazine.

Tobacco Valley Board of Commerce, \$2,765, for promotion of yearly rodeo and rendezvous.

Missouri River Country Tourism Association, \$500, for distribution of their tourism brochures.

Gallatin Council, Bozeman, \$1,546, to help promote two events, the Classic West Open Fiddle Contest and the annual Chariot Races.

Custer Country Regional Tourism Association, \$3,750, for production of tourism brochures.

Yellowstone Cross Country Race, Inc., West Yellowstone, \$844.60 to help promote the annual Yellowstone Rendezvous ski race.

In total, seven of the 11 associations applying for funds received monies. The application deadline for the next round of funding is Nov. 15.

In 1984, Scobey received \$1,000 to promote its annual Scobey Threshing Bee.

I do hope you realize that any check that exceeds \$150 and is NSF (Not Sufficient Funds) is considered a felony, punishable by up to 10 years in the state prison. Any check amount below \$150 is a misdemeanor offense, punishable by a fine of up to \$500, 6 months in jail, or both.

The proper county attorney offices have been contacted and have received a copy of your bad check. I suggest you take the proper action to make these checks good immediately or write me from behind bars.


