Director requests juniors be included in big rodeos, too

Dear NRA members;

I'd like to address the general membership of the NRA on behalf of our junior rodeo contestants.

If you were around the Metra at 9 a.m. Saturday morning for the finals, you would have seen 32 hard working and very competitive young rodeo hands. (These kids competed for a \$100 purse and year end awards through sixth place, which were all sponsored by businesses and rodeo enthusiasts around the state of Montana. They were very much appreciated.)

What I'd like to bring to everyone's attention is the fact that these kids are not only the future of the NRA, but they are a part of the NRA

During the 1989 season there were 21 rodeos which offered junior events. There were an average of 26 junior entries per rodeo. These kids and their families helped fill grandstands at rodeos. When talking to rodeo committees about including junior events at their rodeos, I can't imagine a community or their Chamber of Commerce not welcoming the idea of bringing in that many more families to spend money in their town.

As far as stock goes, it is up to the committees and stock contractors to furnish breakaway calves and at some rodeos, JBARs did pay a stock charge.

Which brings me to the biggest point I am trying to make. These junior contestants have the same costs to rodeo as do the adult members. The pickups and horse trailers to haul them down the road costs the same as yours. The gas bill is as outrageous as yours. The food bill is the same and sometimes more, because kids can't seem to skip meals like the rest of us.

They are mounted on better and better horses due to competition and their tack and feed costs are just like yours.

The only difference in the financial status is the fact that they compete for an average of \$50 purse and \$15 entry fees. I'm not arguing with that - but I do feel that these kids should receive some sort of support and recognition from the

NRA. They work and train very hard for very little.

The NRA uses the junior events when they want to promote NRA as a family affair, but doesn't seem to want to include them in the glory.

I'd like you to consider these kids and their events the next time the NRA signs another rodeo or plans another finals. Please don't leave them out of the big ones. They are a good part of this association that I'd hate to see it without them.

Barrel racers proposing a day money payoff

A day money proposal will officially be presented at the NRA Board of Directors April 7th Meeting.

The proposal requires each barrel racing contestant to pay an additional \$25 (\$1 to the secretary, \$24 to the pot.) The pot would be paid off like a day money with a payoff for each performance and slack.

According to Nancy Petersen, Barrel Racing Director, the reason for the new proposal is "in Montana we have so much change in ground conditions - rain, sleet, snow, farming, non-farming, etc."

"Even though it is more money," Petersen says, "the day money could at least pay for travel expense to a rodeo that you normally would not stand a chance at winning a dime at if it has rained during your performance."

"We propose the points count," Petersen said. "Whoever wins that day was the best under those conditions."

Proposed payoffs for the barrel racing day money are for example with 18 barrel racers paying \$50 fees = \$900 plus \$200 purse = \$1100 - 3% (\$33) = 1067.

Average pays five places and the payoff would be 1) \$394; 2) 288; 3.202; 4) 106; 5) 74.

Payoff for the day money if there are 15 in the performance and three in the slack would be: In the performance: $15 \times 24 = \$360 - 3\% (10.80) = 349.20$; 1) \$174.60; 2) \$104.76; 3) \$69.84. Slack with three participants times \$24 = \$72 paying a first only, \$69.84.

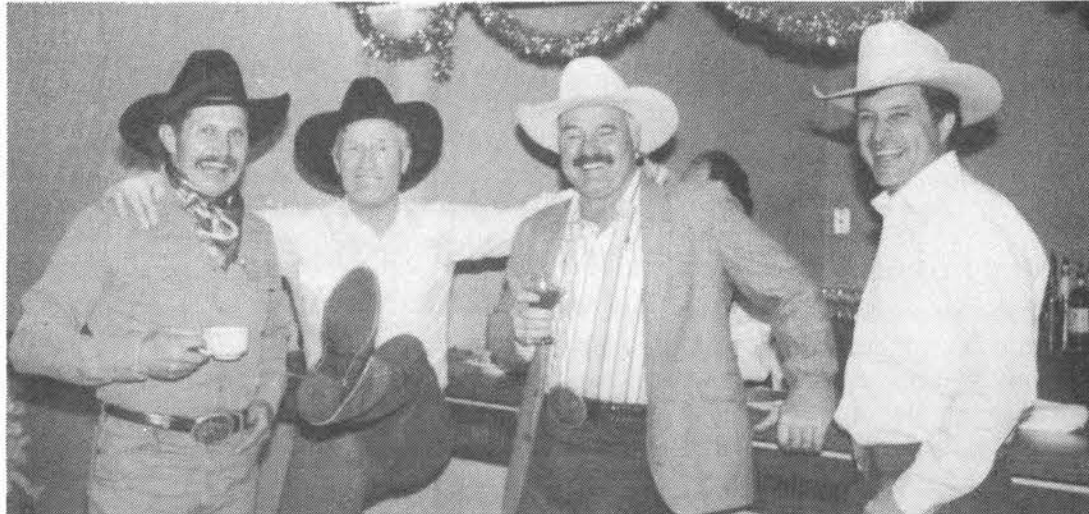

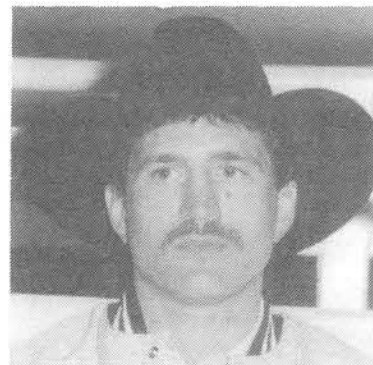

Kent and his wife, Amy (Rennaker) have 2 kids - J.T., 9, and Ross, 6.

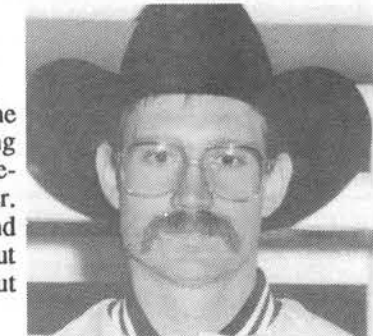


3. Dan Mortensen, Billings, Montana

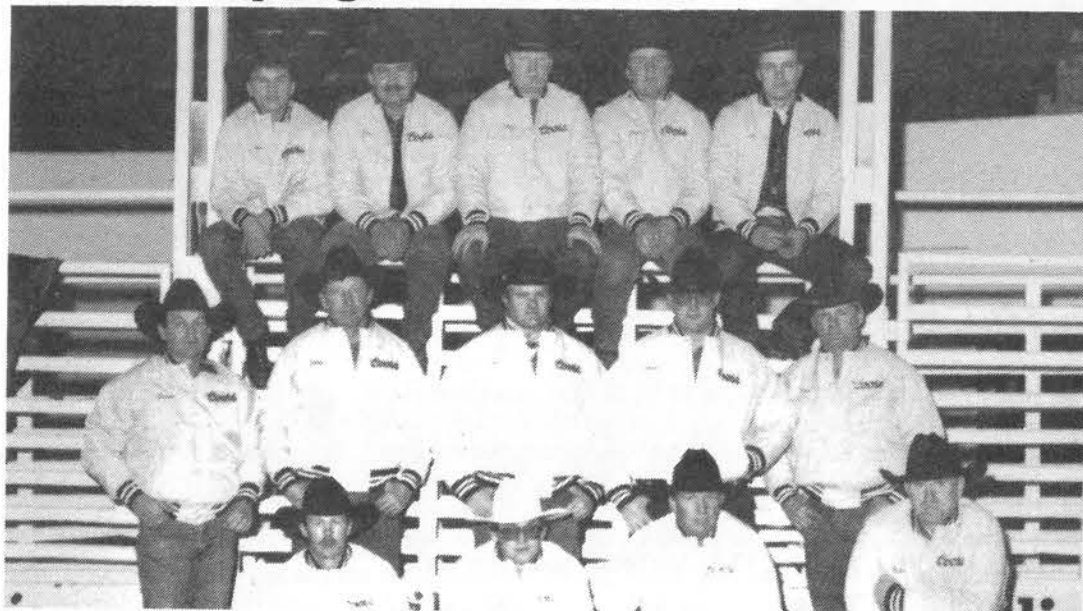
5. Deb Haugland, Helena, Montana

Coming to the finals in three events, the Ashland rancher finished fourth in Men's All Around standings.

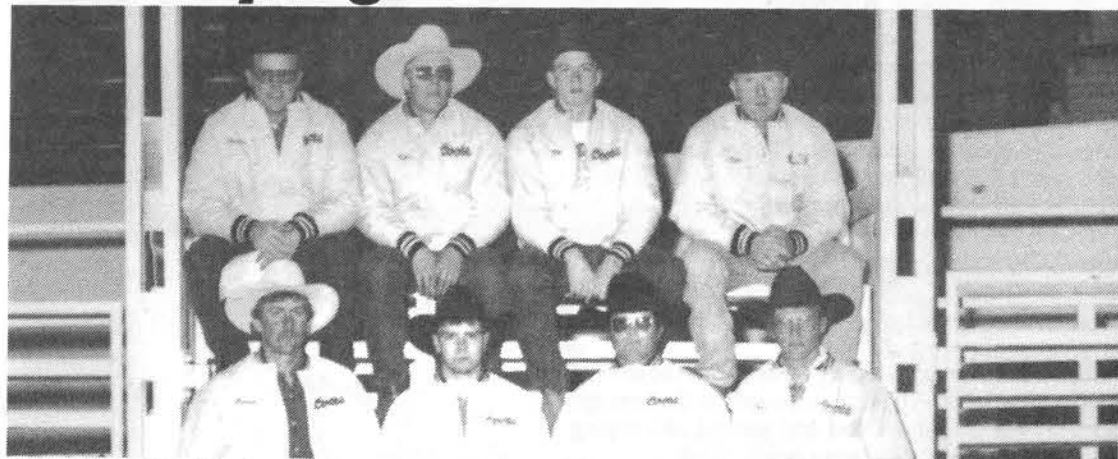
5-6. Rob Kountz and Charlie Briggs, Bozeman, Montana \$3,873.05

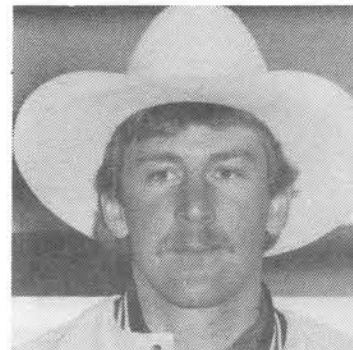

\$ 2,859.61

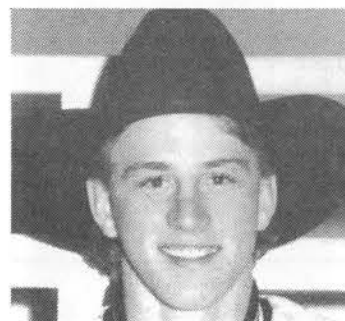

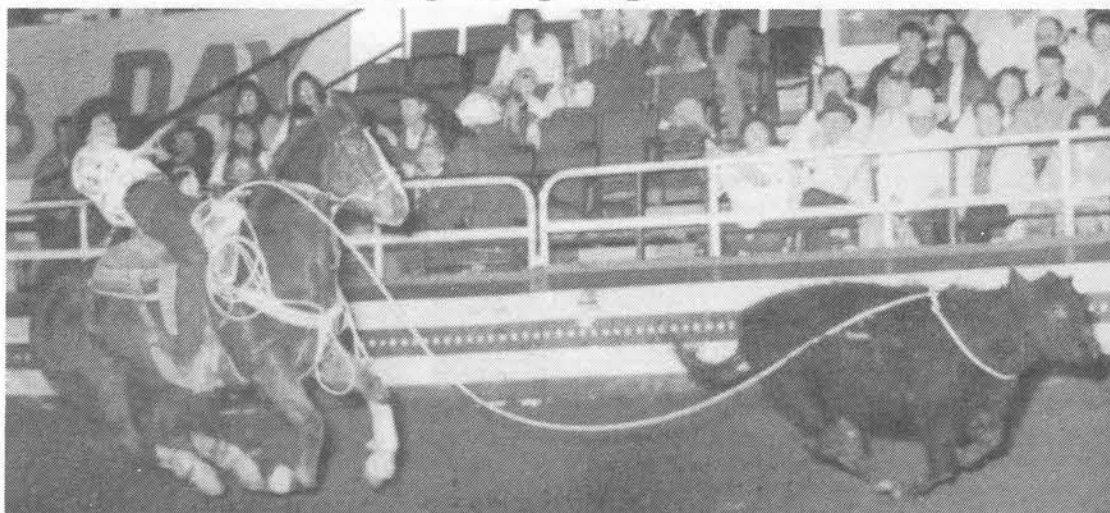


5. Bill Boyce, Lewistown, Montana

In 1989, she was fourth in the average at the finals after winning a second and a fourth in the go arounds.

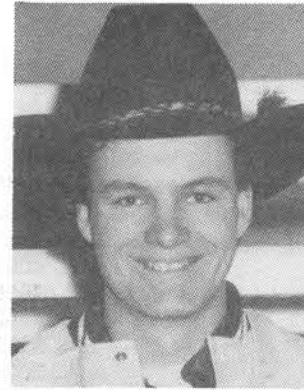
She's married to "Beef" Carlson. They often team rope together at NRA rodeos and travel with a two-year-old son, Jason George.

1. Rob Kountz, Bozeman, Montana \$ 3,313.19

It's the first yearend title for this former college champ. Bozeman rancher Rob Kountz came to the finals with a healthy lead needed to take home the championship saddle and buckle. He placed fourth in the first go and fourth in the average to sew up his yearend lead.

This is Kountz' third trip to the NRA finals. His big wins in 1989 were in Ennis, Salmon, Ida., Baker and White Sulphur Springs. He competes in steer wrestling, calf roping, travels with, hazes for and teams up with third place steer wrestler Charlie Briggs in the team roping.

2. Spike Guardipee, Browning, Montana \$ 2, 802.78

Spike Guardipee will admit steer wrestling is not his favorite event. The timed-event competitor prefers swinging a rope to jumping from a horse. But consistently he picks up a check in this event so that keeps him entering. At the NRA finals, he won second in the first and second goes and split 2/3/4 on his final run. This gave him a first place average finish in the event. The almost \$1,200 won in the Steer Wrestling at the finals propelled him to first in the Men's All Around.



3. Charlie Briggs, Bozeman \$ 2,703.84

The three-event man from Bozeman turned down a baseball/hockey scholarship at an eastern school to attend school at Montana State University "I hadn't even enrolled (at MSU) . . .," Charlie Briggs told the Billings Gazette. Apparently Montana suits Briggs who came to this year's finals in three events ending up second in the Men's All Around.

On his first trip to the NRA finals, Western Montana College student was shutout. Jesse Peterson failed to pickup a check on this trip to the Metra. However, he split the steer wrestling at the Billings Fair this summer picking up a \$1,300 check.

5. Ray Stoos, Geraldine, Montana \$ 2,341.40

Ray Stoos was leading the NRA steer wrestling when he broke his arm at Cheyenne in late July. He thought his 1989 season was over. But an injured Bob Schall and non contesting (in school) John Gee and (in Arizona) Todd Garrison, made room for Stoos to come to the finals. The 30-year-old took advantage of the chance winning first in the first and second go and first in the average at the finals with 14.2 on three head. The Geraldine carpenter is working in Las Vegas this winter but plans to compete again in the NRA in 1990.

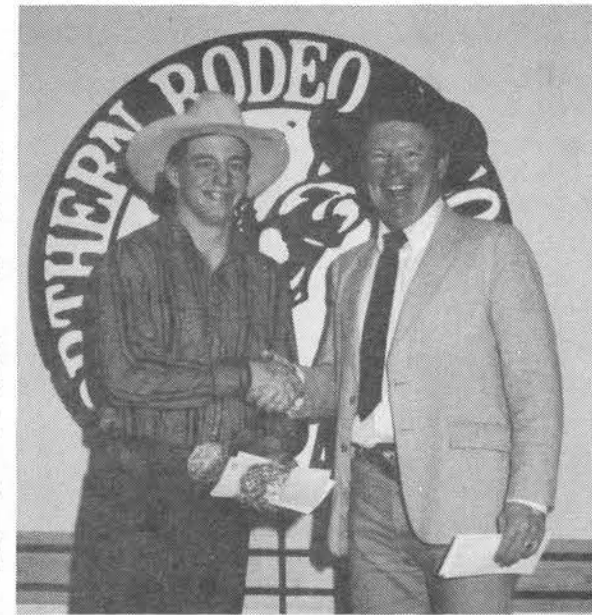

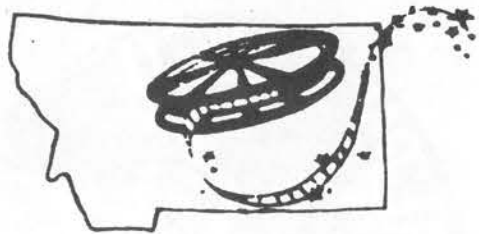

Minimum pay for judges was addressed. SKEETER NORDAHL MOVED JUDGES TO BE PAID AN ADDITIONAL \$35 PER SLACK. Motion dies for lack of a second. Sentiment of the group was that judges and contractors should have the specifics decided PRIOR to the rodeo.

ED MILLER MOVED: THERE WILL BE A SLIDE USED ON THE AUTOMATIC BARRIER NECKROPES. BILL LYNN, SECONDED. PASSED.

LBAR: ED MILLER MOVED: IN THE LADIES

BREAKAWAY ROPING EVENT AND JUNIOR BREAKAWAY ROPING EVENT A STANDARDIZED STRING WILL BE USED AT ALL NRA APPROVED RODEOS SUPPLIED BY NRA AND PROVIDED TO THE JUDGES. LYLE BAUMANN, SECONDED. PASSED.

STACEY BAUMANN MOVES: IN THE LADIES BREAKAWAY ROPING EVENT, THE FLAGGER WILL FLAG THE EVENT FROM THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ARENA UNLESS THE ARENA CONDITIONS DICTATE OTHERWISE, SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE WITH THE RUNNING OF THE CATTLE. SKEETER NORDAHL, SECONDED. PASSED.

PATTI HOLLAND MOVED: THE MINIMUM PAY FOR NRA CARD-CARRYING TIMERS BE \$35 PER PERFORMANCES AND SLACK. SKEETER NORDAHL, SECONDED. ED MILLER, AMENDED; DOES NOT INCLUDE SLACK. PHIL FLEMING, SECONDED. AMENDMENT PASSED. MOTION AS AMENDED PASSED.

Trade outs in NRA follow the following guidelines:

1. If trade is to be made before call backs are over, trade will take place through the central entry office. Trades can continue to be placed through central entry office up until 10 a.m. the day after callbacks.

2. After books are closed, or after 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades will be handled through the NRA office. BOTH parties involved with the trade are required to contact the office to verify trade. THE NRA OFFICE AND/OR CENTRAL ENTRY CAN ASSIST WITH PHONE NUMBERS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR THOSE WISHING TO TRADE AT A GIVEN RODEO. REMEMBER, ALL RODEOS ARE TRADE-OUT RODEOS UNLESS SPECIFIED OTHERWISE.

NO JUDGE MAY JUDGE MORE THAN TWO RODEOS CONSECUTIVELY FOR ANY ONE STOCK CONTRACTOR. This rule was inadvertently omitted from the rulebook but is to be reinstated.

THE TWO LOWEST SCORED HORSES IN THE TOP 12 WILL BE THE RERIDES, UNLESS MOVED UP BY THE CONTESTANT. WAYNE KELLY SECONDED. PASSED.

Clarification of the "Hometown ruling.": ONE HOMETOWN RODEO MY BE WORKED WITHOUT JOINING THE NORTHERN RODEO ASSOCIATION IF PROOF OF RESIDENCE OF REASONABLE PROXIMITY IS ACCEPTED BY THE RODEO SECRETARY OR RODEO COMMITTEE. REASONABLE PROXIMITY TO BE DETERMINED BY EACH COMMITTEE.

Bill Lynn moved: SLACK IS TO BE RUN IN THE SAME ORDER OF EVENTS AS THE RODEO, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE LADIES BARREL RACING AND JUNIOR BARREL RACING EVENTS WHICH WILL BE RUN FIRST. ALSO,

THERE WILL BE NO CONSECUTIVE RUNS ON TIMED EVENT STOCK UNLESS AN EVENT IS ALL THAT REMAINS OF THE SLACK. INFRACTIONS SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE NRA OFFICE BY THE EVENT DIRECTORS OR REPRESENTATIVES AND A \$100 FINE WILL BE LEVIED AGAINST THE STOCK CONTRACTOR AND EACH JUDGE IN VIOLATION. Lyle Baumann, seconded. PASSED.

Glen Hough Moved: (PAGE 30, RULE 20), A. IF IN THE JUDGE'S OPINION CONTESTANT IS FOULED BY BARRIER NECKROPE, (ONLY NECK ROPE MAY CAUSE FOUL), THE CONTESTANT MUST DECLARE HIM OR HERSELF BY PULLING UP... IF IN THE JUDGE'S OPINION, THE BARRIER FAILS TO WORK PROPERLY (MALFUNCTION), THE CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE A RERUN IF A QUALIFIED TIME IS MADE. Bill Lynn, seconded. Passed.

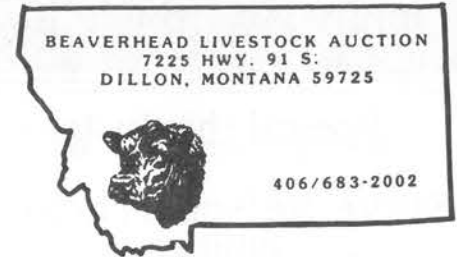

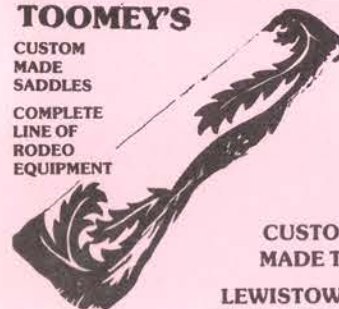

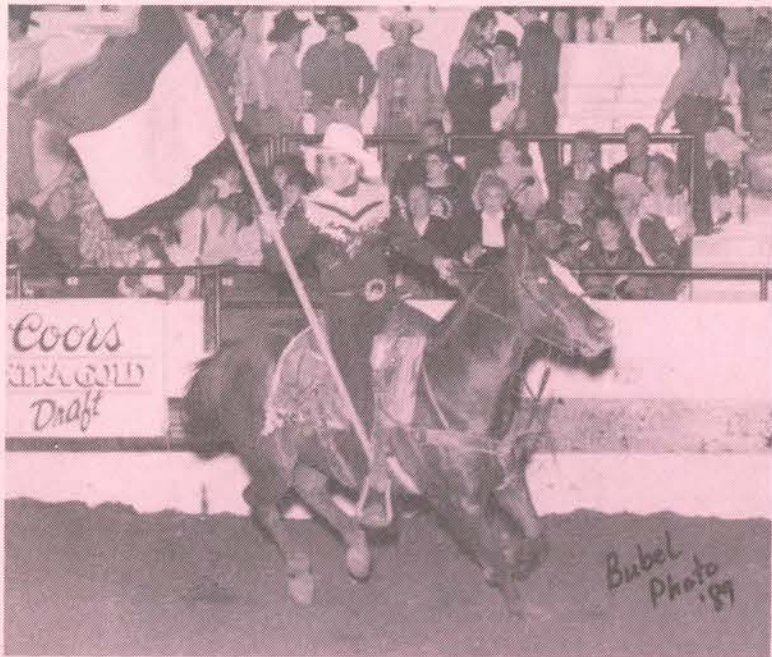
