

The latest on ladies events in WSS

The White Sulphur Springs Rodeo Committee and the MBRA met to work out a workable compromise to those involved directly and indrectly with the MBRA Finals.

The decision was made to give those selecting the NRA-only purse one run in a perfromance; those selecting the MBRA purse will get two runs (one run each performance).

To assist the committee and their calcutta all ladies barrels and breakaway contestants will be in a performance (no LBAR or barrels in slack).

All ladies are asked to please ride in the arena during the calcutta just prior to the rodeo.

The MBRA has decided to issue MBRA permits at a cost of \$15. This allows you to run at the extra money but would not be eligible for yearend awards. Eligibility for yearend awards requires membership two years prior to finals.

Junior events at Askins, Aug. 18

Junior events during the Billings Fair will be on Aug. 18 at 8 a.m. in the Jerry Askin Arena in Laurel. Entry fees are \$20 with \$100 per event added. Junior breakaway will have one steer for each entry. Jerry Askins has donated his arena.

The added money is donated by Bud and Bert Roberts, of Ballantine; Jolene and Cody Taylor, of Miles City; Phillip and Deb Fleming, of Ismay, and Corral West Ranchwear in the Billings Heights.

An open and matched team roping will be in the same location following the junior events. (10 a.m.)

DIRECTIONS: Get off Interstate 90 at Laurel (Refinery) exit. Go under railroad underpass and turn left at the 4-way light. Three miles on highway 10 and turn north 1/4 mile. Permanent signs mark the way to Askin arena.

Rule: timers paid \$35 per perf Contractors and Rodeo Committeemen:

With so much money on the line at these rodeos, rimers are a very important part of the final result. Good timers don't decide first place checks, contestants do. However, poor timers may negatively influence first placings.

To ensure that quality timers are paid appropriately, the NRA Board of Directors voted at the February Board meeting to pay NRA cardcarrying timers a minimum of \$35 per performance. NRA officials ask that those responsible adhere to the rule so an integral part of your rodeo is properly paid!




