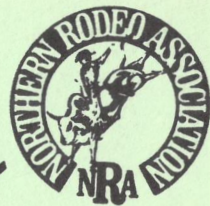

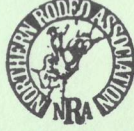

World Finals - Nov. 6-14

World Finals Rodeo dates are set for Nov. 6-14 in El Paso.

A change in this year's format is the rodeo will feature two groups of associations in 4-day drafts. The first half of the contestants will compete from Nov. 6-9; the second half will compete Nov. 10-13. Top contestants in each draft will compete for the short go-round on Saturday.

Contestants from the Northern Rodeo Association and 11 other associations will compete on Nov. 10-13 only. They will compete in both go-rounds in these four days. Other associations competing at that time are Canadian Cowboys Rodeo Association; Chinook Rodeo Association; Foothills Cowboys Rodeo Association; Lakeland Rodeo Association; Northwest Rodeo Association of Canada; Wyoming Rodeo Association; Southern Rodeo Association; South Dakota Rodeo Association; North-west Ranch Cowboy Association; North Dakota Rodeo Association; Nebraska State Rodeo Association.

Contestants in the first draft are members of: Colorado State Rodeo Association; Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association; Kansas State Rodeo Association; Louisiana Rodeo Cowboys Association; Midwestern States Rodeo Association; New Mexico Rodeo Association; South-west Rodeo Association; Texas Cowboys Rodeo Association; Texas Pro Rodeo Association; Tri State Rodeo Association; Bushmans Campdraft and Rodeo Association

NRA contestants will enter through the NRA office (252-1122) on Monday, Sept. 28, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Three per event will be accepted, with the top three in each event standings given priority. Alternates will also be chosen. Be sure and enter if you are interested in going to the NARC Finals. Fees are \$150 per event.

Contestant check-in is every morning, 9:30-12 noon. Payoff is Nov. 11-14.

Ticket-buyers are rodeos most important people

This event we call Rodeo has an important segment of people that are often overlooked by everyone who is entrenched in the production, promotion and competition of the rodeo.

These people are "part timers." So part time, in fact, that some of them may only witness a rodeo once in a lifetime. And, for those of us that participate or manage rodeos on a full-time basis, that's our fault.

You see, the part timers I mention are those who pay the bills for everyone involved in rodeo. They sit in the audience after they have paid hard earned money for an admission ticket and they are there to be entertained! No more, no less.

If they are not entertained, they'll never come back and, what's worse, they'll tell everyone they know how bad the rodeo was. That's a killer.

While the production of rodeos has been much improved over the past 20 years, there are still far too many "amateur" rodeos in this country that travel under the guise of professionalism because they are sanctioned by some organization and shouldn't be sanctioned by anyone.

These are rodeos that are held in atrocious facilities (bad on animals and spectators) and run by management that doesn't know how to read a clock.

The livestock doesn't buck, lighting is poor and the sound system is muffled. The announcer may not have any command of the King's English, doesn't know the first thing about a rodeo and shouldn't be allowed to speak in public.

The acts are poor and often border on burlesque, which does not sell to a family audience anywhere. And that's just what a rodeo audience is, a family audience.

How to improve a rodeo

After surveying rodeo audiences for over 30 years, we have a pretty good idea of what it takes to entertain them. At the same time, we continue to learn with each new survey. Here are some of the things they are looking for:

1. Good, clean facilities with good access and

colorful setting.

2. A very fast paced performance that starts on time.

3. Excellent livestock in peak physical condition.

4. Clean-cut contestants with ability.

5. High class, well-costumed acts that don't last over six minutes each.

6. Plenty of good clown work that is genuinely funny and does not border on the risqué. They don't want to be afraid of taking grandma and the kids to the rodeo.

7. A first class printed program loaded with lots of photos and well-written copy about the rodeo. It should include a score sheet for that performance listing all the contestants (with their numbers) their hometown, and the livestock they have drawn in the rough stock events. This is the best educational tool any rodeo can provide.

8. A non-nasal announcer who speaks clearly, gets to the point and talks to the spectators instead of the participants. He also gives all the scores and times promptly.

9. Clean restrooms and concession stands with good food and drink at reasonable prices.

10. Adequate lighting and public address system.

If your rodeo doesn't provide all of the above, try to cover all the bases next time around, so you can please the most important people in rodeo. After all, they pay your bills and wouldn't it be nice to have them come back again and again, so you could show a profit.

MEMBERSHIP: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos without restrictions, to share all advantages of a member in good standing including such items as a guarantee of your entry fee; check writing privileges after the first year initiation period; and a subscription to the newsletter.

NEWSLETTER: The official publication of the NRA featuring current data regarding the Association and NRA sanctioned rodeos, information of all association business, as well as interesting news articles and exciting photos.

PERMITS: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos accepting permits as listed in the newsletter until \$500 is won. After \$500 money limit is won by permit holder, a card must be purchased. The price of card to be the dollar difference between the cost of a permit and the cost of the card. Permit holder's points will be credited to the yearend standings, however, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the NRA Finals. The \$500 money limit will be accumulated from year to year, allowing the contestant to purchase a permit each year until the \$500 is won. A card holder the previous year cannot purchase a permit the following year.

Back side of application must be completed to guarantee processing of membership application.

RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Northern Rodeo Association sanctioned events and membership in the Association, I and my heirs, successors, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE and agree to HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Northern Rodeo Association, the rodeo committees, stock contractors, sponsors, arena operations or owners, their agents, representatives (collectively referred to as the NRA) from all liability to me and my personal representatives, heirs, successors, and next of kin from and all claims and liability for all loss of damage, and any claim of damages therefore on account of any injury to my person including death or damage to my property while I am utilizing NRA facilities or participating in NRA events.

I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

I UNDERSTAND AND AGREE THIS RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to ACCIDENT, INJURY, OR DEATH OCCURRING DURING THE TERM OF MY MEMBERSHIP IN THE NRA. Any subsequent Releases and agreement I might sign in the future shall amplify, but shall in no way limit, the provisions of this document.

A. Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. Unless otherwise advertised.

B. Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

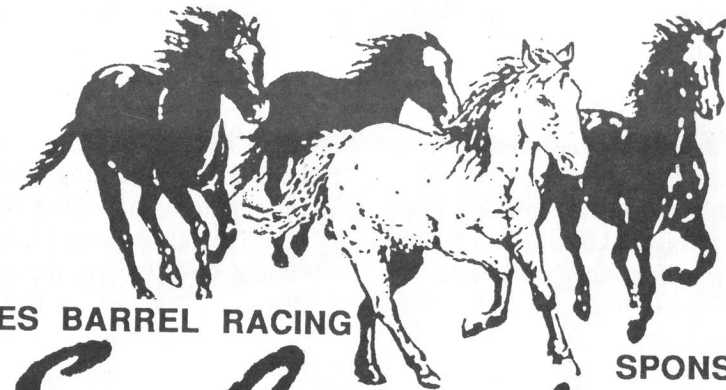
1. Name of rodeo
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your Name.
4. The event or events you wish to enter.
5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies - two per event, six total.
7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. to find out when you are up.

C. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, are recorded on tape, and each cowboy is given verification number for that conversation.

YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING THEIR FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, it costs an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

Banker turns competitor on weekends

Dean Wang's rodeo friends wouldn't recognize him on weekdays.

Monday through Friday, mostly 8 to 5, Wang is a nice, conservative banker. On weekends, he travels from arena to arena, slamming steers into the ground as quick as he can. Monday morning, it's back behind his desk in Baker.

Yeah, I wear a suit and have to shave every-day. It's pretty ugly," laughed the 25-year-old banker/steer wrestler.

"Actually, I enjoy the numbers end of it. I've been there (at the bank) about eight months, so I'm still the rookie around here."

If he had his choice, Wang would be in his pickup seven days a week, criss-crossing the country on the rodeo circuit. But in December of 1990, the choice was taken away.

A rising star on the PRCA circuit, Wang had qualified for his first National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas. And, on his first steer at the World's Richest Rodeo he blew out his left knee.

"It was kind of a freak deal," Wang said. "It just kind of stuck a little and tore the ligaments. Other than getting some stitches in my head, I had never really been hurt before.

"So, I guess as long as I hit my head, I'm fine. But I was really looking forward to next year and it all crashed down around me."

Wang watched the rest of the NFR from behind the fence, then traveled to Billings for his knee operation later than month. Doctors replaced the torn ligament with one from a cadaver and prescribed rest and rehabilitation.

"It worked out because I had a quarter of school left," said Wang, who completed his degree in business administration at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo in California. "I did a lot of work on the bike, a lot of agility stuff. I was training the leg to do things all over again."

"I tried to stay as far away as possible from rodeo. And it was tough because I really missed it. I missed the people and the traveling atmosphere."

Wang stayed off horses and away from the competitive arena almost a complete year. He tried a couple practice runs at home and this past January entered the rodeo in Rapid City, where he won the steer wrestling competition.

"I was pretty apprehensive the first couple of times," said Wang. "I didn't jump until the first part of January. The rodeo in Rapid City, it was quite an experience. Physically, I knew I was fine. But I wasn't sure mentally."

With each run, Wang has developed more confidence and faith in his re-built knee. He is currently sixth in the NRA standings and second in the Montana Pro Rodeo Circuit standings. However, not everything is perfect on the comeback trail.

"There are some days when I feel pretty good about myself," Wang said. "And then there are other times when I make a mental mistake, something I wouldn't have done a couple of years ago. There's always the question in my mind if I could compete. But with every steer I run, my confidence gets better."

"Rodeo is the only thing I found I could do all day long and not get tired of it. I just crave it, for lack of a better way to describe it. I dearly love the sport. I tried golfing and team roping and found out I wasn't much good at either one."

His summer of banking and steer wrestling will culminate with a major decision this fall.

"I've got to look back and re-evaluate things," said Wang. "I'd like to go back (to the PRCA Circuit) and I don't know if it's the most prudent thing for more to do. I lose a lot of sleep about this.

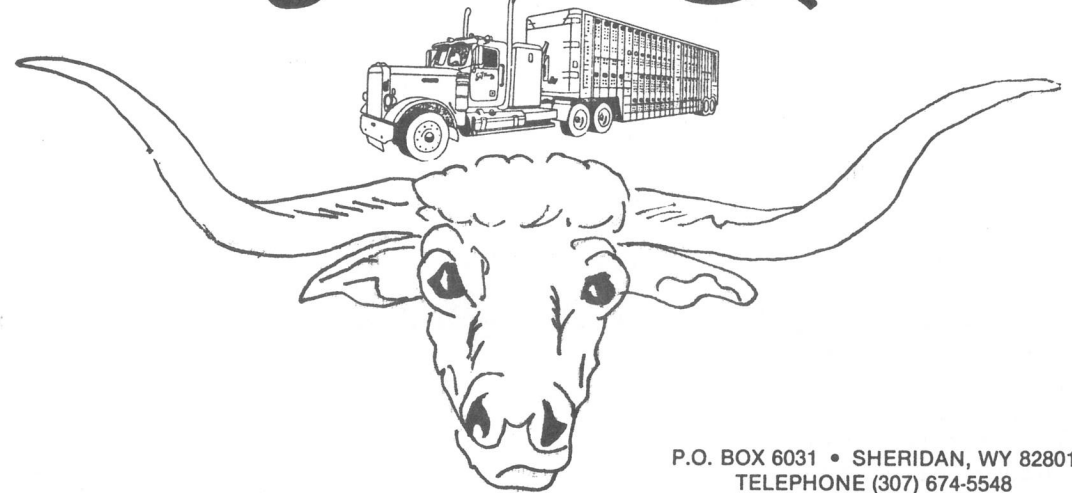
"If I'm going to rodeo full-time, I need to do it at this point in my life. It's either go full-time at it and get my butt to the practice pen, or stay home and go to rodeos closer to home.

"I'll continue to dabble no matter what. I wouldn't be any smart enough to get away from it completely."

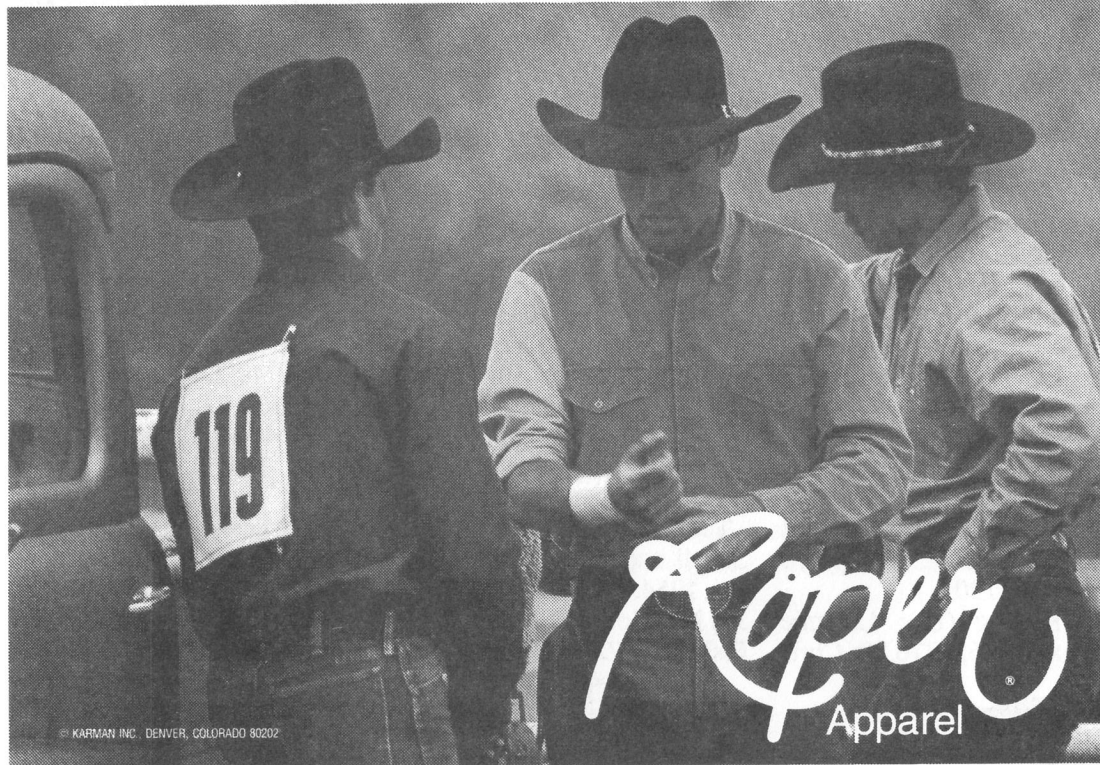
