Grinding your own Flour

If Americans now enjoy grinding their own coffee, why not their own wheat for fresh flour to make home-baked goodies?

That's the premise of a new venture by a Montana business that has made the past decade a new venture in processing wheat into value-added products.

At selected stores in Montana, Idaho, and Washington, the customer can now grind fresh, whole-wheat flour from WheatMontana Farms & Bakery.

"Why do it any other way?" says Dean Folkvord, whose latest brainchild lets the customer process high-quality whole wheat with the push of a button. "It's the same as coffee. It's another quality-of-life issue."

Folkvord is general manager and chief executive officer of WheatMontana, a decade-old family business that has gone from a \$400,000 crop of wheat in 1990 to an expected \$10 million in sales in 1999. WheatMontana has its own flour mill and

bakery at the junction of Interstate 90 and U.S. 287 four miles west of Three Forks. The junction has become a tourist attraction. U.S. 287 leads visitors north to Helena and south to Lewis and Clark Caverns, Virginia City, and an alternative route to Yellowstone Park.

The Folkvords' cropland, where they grow the high-protein spring wheat, lies next to the highways to the west and north.

"We've gone from a wheat farm to flour producer and bakery by using creative ideas to merchandise original products," Folkvord said.

"We need to continue to create opportunities."

"We're still farmers at heart. If we make a dollar, we'll invest two. We are proud to do it in Montana, bringing money to Montana."

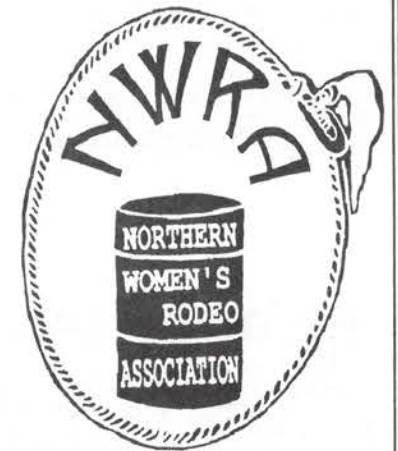

CONTESTANTS:

Important new change for the 1999 season affects you!

NRA Rule M.1.10.1. All individuals must purchase their card through the NRA/NWRA Office before they can enter a rodeo. The applicaiton must be signed, witnessed or notarized and have correct amount of money or it will be refused. The application and membership fee must reach the NRA/NWRA Office no later than on the day entries are taken. Applications received on or before the last business day before entries are taken shall be subject to the dues set forth in M.2.1.1. Late applications shall be subject to an additional \$25.00 late fee.

ATTENTION TEAM ROPERS!!!

NRA Rule F.1.1 The top ten money winners in the heading and heeling categories will be eligible to compete at the Finals rodeo.

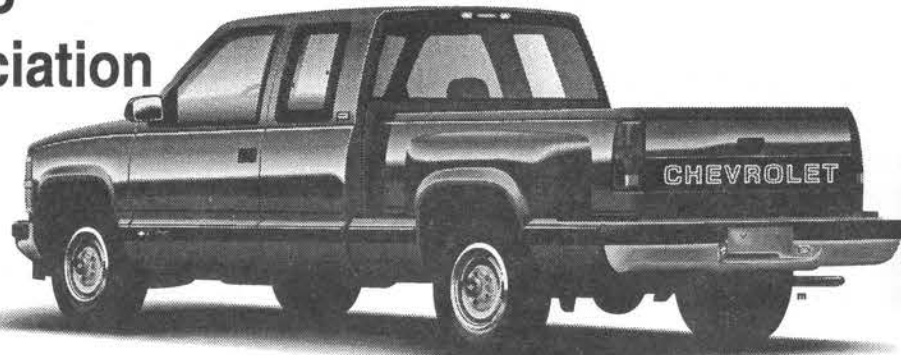
NRA Rule A.4.1.2. Team roping members must notify central entry weather they are entering as a header or heeler.

NRA Rule 1.5.13. If a team roper's partner doesn't show up at the rodeo they may obtain a partner from the membership of the Association, provided that person isn't partnered in the team roping. That person must notify the rodeo secretary before the performance of his partner and whether they will be heading or heeling. If two contestants enter the team roping separately as two teams, and they end up roping together, they are still responsible for a partner's entry fee. The man who did not show up to compete is fined \$20, only if someone else ropes in his place and his fees were paid



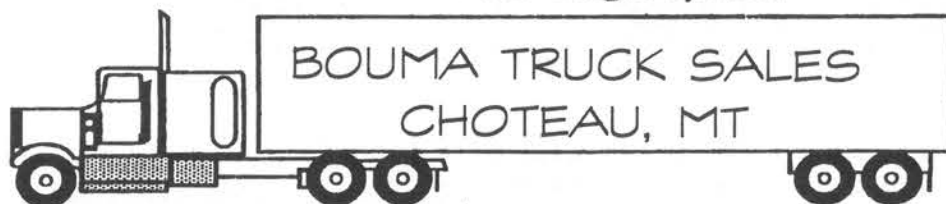

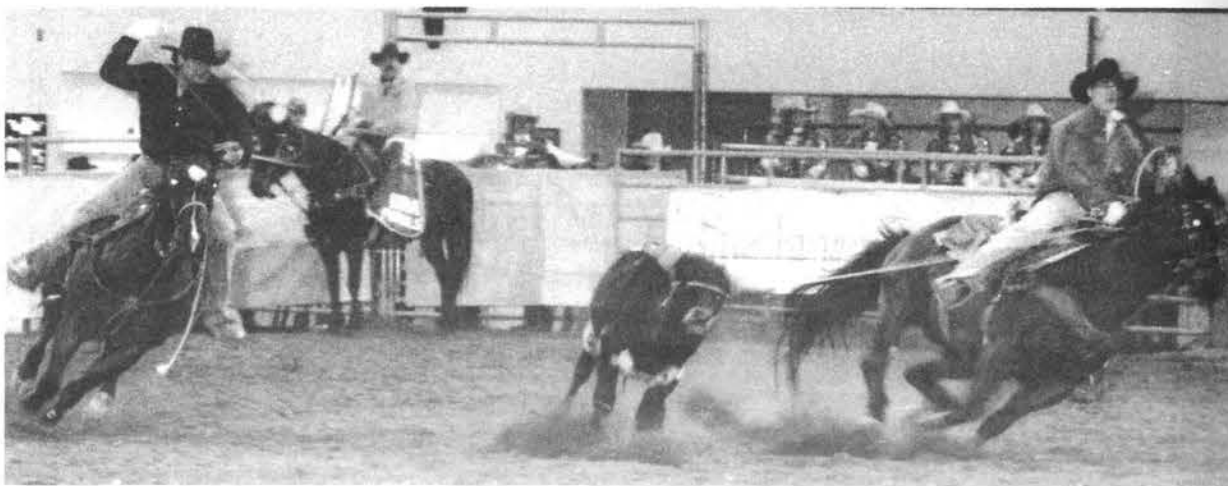
Poplar Saddle Club president Tom Atkinson said.

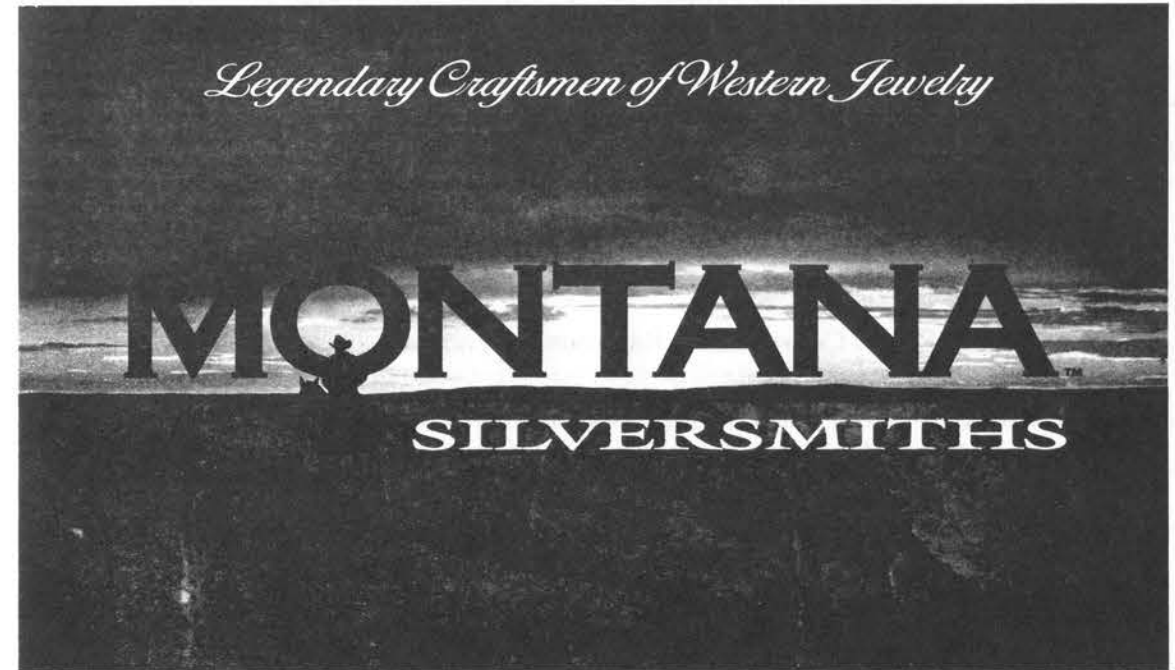

NRA Finals: The NRA Finals was discussed. Ideas for selling signage around the arena floor were discussed. There was also discussion on using NRA Committee's to help with the production of the NRA Finals. Discussion was held on the NRA Finals promoter. It was moved and seconded: The NRA Executive Board and Dick Lyman would select the NRA Finals promoter. PASSED. The NRA Office will place an ad with the Montana Newspapers Association to be responded to in writing by April 10th.

Judges Program: Dick Lyman updated the Board on the judging program and discussed a new rating system for the judges.

Logan Coach: Theresa Caldwell updated the Board.

OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion was held regarding the amendment to rule R.9.1.5. It was moved and seconded to amend the amendment to rule R.9.1.5.: If, in the judge's opinion, contestant is fouled by barrier the contestant must declare him or herself by pulling up immediately. Any penalties incurred before the foul will be assessed. (i.e. broken barrier. Judge must determine if barrier is obviously beaten by contestant). If broken barrier is assessed, original animal will be given back lap and tap plus 10 seconds. (Judge needs to be aware of the difference between a foul and a malfunction at/of the barrier). DEFEATED.

It was moved and seconded to amend rule R.9.1.5.: If, in the judge's opinion, contestant is fouled by barrier the contestant must declare him or herself by pulling up immediately. Any penalties incurred before the foul will be assessed. (i.e. broken barrier). If broken barrier is assessed, animal will be given back lap and tap plus 10 seconds. (Judge needs to be aware of the difference between a foul and a malfunction at/of the barrier). PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mike Smith addressed the board on his proposal to do the NRA's media.

Discussion was held regarding a new entry fee scale.

Discussion was also held regarding the Junior Events. There will only be an All-Around saddle give away for the year-end unless more sponsors are found to pay for the additional saddles.

The NRA Saddle Makers program was discussed.

A copy of Big Circle Rodeo Company's incorporation papers, their contract with Larry Wirtz, and a copy of the letter Larry Wirtz mailed to the NRA Office was distributed to the Board to clear up any misunderstanding about Big Circle Rodeo Company.

Jan Walsh addressed the Board regarding the Competitor News becoming the official paper of the NRA.

Discussion was held regarding the NRA Office.

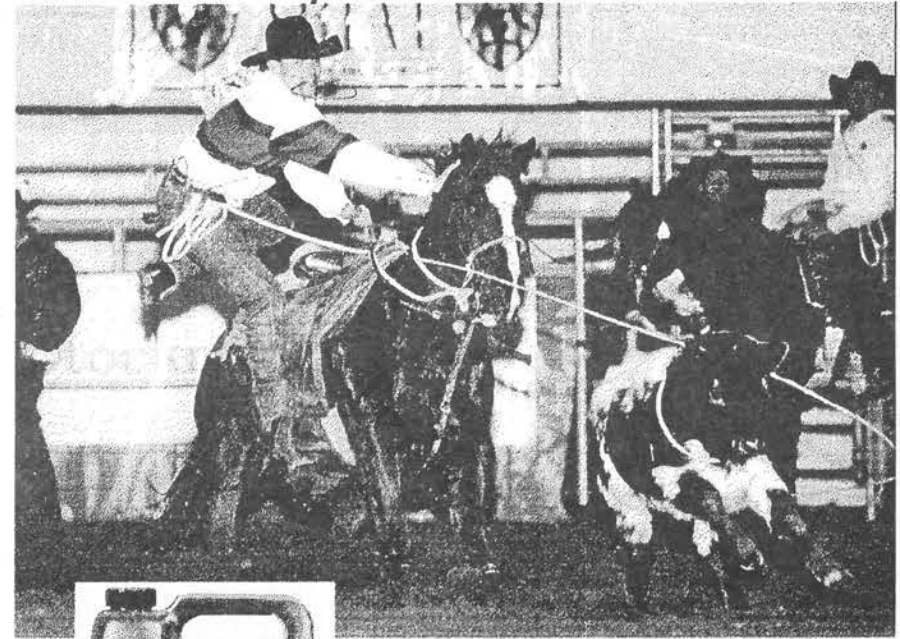

Drawouts, Tradeouts and Turnouts

The NRA and NWRA Guidelines: for complete information, please refer to the NRA rulebook section A.8.0. The following is provided for your convenience.

Drawouts: At the time of call back, a contestant may draw out of a rodeo(s). There is not a charge IF you did not receive your preference of performances. However, NRA rule A.4.1.4 and NWRA rule A.4.1.4 states: "Any contestant who draws out of a rodeo after receiving their first preference of performance at a given rodeo or rodeos will be fined \$20 per infraction."

Tradeouts: All NRA/NWRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised in the rodeo listing as "No Tradeouts".

A contestants may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the stock draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through centray entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA/NWRA Office 406-252-1122. Both parties involved in a trade must call the NRA/NWRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties. NOTE: The timed-event draw must be made in the presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

Turnouts: As stated in the rulebook, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA/NWRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout:

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at this rodeo, call the NRA Office. You will be responsible for your entryfees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in.

2. If it is too late to notify the NRA Office, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judges, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus the payment of your fees at the rodeo).

Courtesy, please. Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcers, and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

Medical and Vet Releases: As soon as you are aware that you will be unable to compete at an NRA/NWRA rodeo you have entered due to a medical or vet release, contact the NRA/NWRA office. With a medical or vet release you are not responsible for your fees but releases must be sent into the NRA/NWRA office within five days after the rodeo along with a \$10 processing charge per rodeo.

Vet releases are accepted in the barrel racing event only. Keep in mind, when you medical or vet release, there is a five day waiting period before you can participate in another NRA/NWRA rodeo.

How to enter NRA/NWRA Rodeos

Welcome to the Northern Rodeo Association. NRA rodeos have utilized Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry since 1984 and offer the following guidelines to assist you. Take a moment to familiarize yourself with the NRA and NWRA rules on Central Entry. They can be found in section A.4.0 in the NRA rulebook and in section A.4.0 in the NWRA rulebook. A thorough knowledge of the NRA and NWRA rules which apply to entering will help you better achieve your entry objective.

NRA/NWRA Rodeo entry procedure through Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry • 406-428-2205

UNLESS OTHERWISE ADVERTISED, rodeo entries will open at 10 a.m. and remain open through 6:30 p.m. every Monday preceding a rodeo weekend. Call backs open at 12 Noon and remain open through 6:30 p.m. every Tuesday. Per rodeo charge of \$3.50 per contestant. Please read your rodeo listings carefully as the entry dates that fall on days other than the Monday before the rodeo will be in bold lettering.

When entering, be prepared with the following information for the central entry operator:

1. Name of rodeo(s) you wish to enter
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your name
4. The event (s) you wish to enter
5. Preferences you have on which performances you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies - NRA rules allow for two per event, six total.
(To buddy together you must enter together.)
7. If a multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 Noon and 6:30 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised)

to find out when you are up.

9. Keep a record of the confirmation number the central entry operator gives you, both upon entering the rodeo, and when you call back. Every conversation, both entry and call back, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation.

In the event of a discrepancy, you **MUST** have your confirmation number available. No complaints against Central Entry will be considered valid unless a confirmation number is given.

If you do not call back during the specified call back times, late call backs will be accepted at the late call back number 406-428-2398. There is an additional charge of \$2.50 per rodeo for this service.
