Merrill honored at Absarokee Stampede

When Merrill Miller died in March, it looked as though one of the rodeos he loved might die with him. Instead, his family and friends have revived the Broken Horn Stampede in his memory.

The official "Stampede" has been around for 15 years, but its roots run deeper than that, according to Miller's son, Eddie.

Before the Broken Horn Stampede established itself as a non-profit organization to run the annual event, unofficial rodeos were held "whenever cowboys got together to rope and ride and wrangle," he said.

"My dad's family homesteaded near Springtime in 1884, and he grew up with all those great old time cowboys still around," Miller said. "Those were his heros. He loved rodeo and was always a staunch supporter. Hell, he always bought his National Finals Rodeo Tickets a year in advance. When we settled his estate, one of the things we had to settle was who got the rodeo tickets."

"I think his dream, even before rodeo cowboys got about half respectable, was to be a rodeo cowboy. He loved that kind of Gypsy, devil-may-care life they had."

Before Miller died at 71, he knew that one of his favorite rodeos was on the "endangered list," according to his son. Held the first weekend in June for the past 15 years, the Broken Hom Stampede always drew top Northern Rodeo Association competitors and good crowds, but it had problems.

One of the rodeo's problems grew as the town

did. Housing development lapped at the edge of the arena when the rodeo had always been held.

"We just ran out of space where it used to be," Eddie Miller said. "People living near it had to put up with all kinds of parking and other problems. There just wasn't any room around the arena. It was a cowpoke island fenced in by landscaped lawns and nice homs.."

It wasn't always that way, he recalled. At one time the arena, owned by the Absarokee Lions Club, was located outside the town, with few houses near it.

But, after the arena became hemmed in by housing developments, the Lions decided to sell the property they leased once a year to the Broken Horn Stampede Organization. That left the rodeo without a home.

"The Lions Club always was good to the rodeo and we couldn't blame them for selling that property," Miller said., "It only got used one a year and they had community projects they wanted to donate to. Besides, there were a lot of other problems. We needed to spell some of the older members who always put in a lot of time. It was hard getting enough new blood. You tend to get a few active members who shoulder most of the work. Sponsors weren't as easy to come by. And, we lost our stock contractor. The combination made the future for the Broken Horn look pretty bleak."

When his father died, Miller talked with his son, Matt, about a tribute they could make to the man they both admired.

"Rodeo has always been good to our family," Miller said. "All of us have been involved in rodeo and enjoyed it and we knew how much dad loved it. I told Matt if he was willing to help, we'd find a way to do it. We agreed this was one way we could pay our respects."

Miller owns property north of town that includes a roping arena where cowboys frequently gather to practice. He enlisted friends





one weekend, and, with the Lions Club's Blessing, moved the arena bleachers and stock chutes to his property.

Broken Horn Stampede members also found eight sponsors willing to put up \$300 each to provide seed money for the NRA sponsorship.

"Over the years, townspeople got a little tired of noise and rowdiness that went with the rodeo and some businesses didn't really see that they got much benefit from the people it brought to town. We stressed that all the money we ever made on the rodeo went back into the community. As a non-profit organization, we never made a dime on it. We plowed it back into either the swimming pool fund or the vocational education scholarship fund," Miller said.

By moving the rodeo farther from town, he said, "the commotion might not be so irritating."

Next, Great Falls stock contractor Don Jacobs agreed to handle the rodeo on a percentage basis.

Help from Broken Horn Stampede members and other rodeo supporters finally corralled everything they needed for holding the rodeo, for at lease one more year.

NRA spokeswoman Jann Parker said it didn't surprise her that Absarokee would be having its 16th Annual Broken Horn Stampede.

"Absarokee's always been one of our top-10 rodeos," she said. "The cowboys like coming there. It's a fun town, everyone has a good time, and there's always a good gate. We knew they had a problem when they lost the arena, but we knew they'd find a way to put it on. It's that kind of town."

Parker said the Broken Horn Stampede has a total payoff of more than \$17,000 and draws 310 competitors for eight main events.

"That doesn't include entries in some of the extra events like novice bareback riding, kids sheep riding, and junior barrel and breakaway roping," she said. "Overall there are 365 entries. It is definately one of the top rodeos in the state."
