Chatting with Chuck About Sports Medicine... by Chuck Karnop Montana State University

Competing when Sore and Banged-up!

At this time of the season, many rodeo contestants are attempting to continue to compete with less than severe injuries; without the luxury of being able to take time off to heal up. I will use this opportunity to give you ideas as to some things you can do to improve your situation. Initially; however, allow me to emphasize the importance of seeking advice in the management of severe problems that might be career altering. So often, I advise seeing a knowledgable M.D. knowing that he may not be able to tell you exactly what is wrong; but, perhaps what is not wrong.

When you are sore, stiff, and cannot seem to get a body part to function at a high level, quite often you can decrease your symptoms with a longer, more progressive warmup. The warmup activity needs to begin with very low intensity and progress from that point to what ever level it will allow. For example, lower body symptoms from the lower back down through the ankles and feet will often decrease if you begin with walking until you perceive your body temperature start to rise; then break into a jog, increasing your rate only as you continue to loosen; then slow change of direction can be added. Many



atheletes like to gently stretch. After reaching the "glow" of increasing body temp. I think gently is a key word. Keep in mind that if you are in fairly good shape you may need to walk/jog up to 30-40 minutes to note the warming up. More aggressive activity can then be progressively added; (running harder, calistehentics, aggressive stretching, ect.) but, not to the point of pain. Keep the intensity causing yourself real pain within a warmup is counter productive. I have personally witnessed many athletes who 2-3 hours prior to competition, thought there was no way, who with a slow, progressive time.

After your event(s) the ice, compression, rest principles are appropriate in that as you cool down your symptoms probabley will return.

The Carpenter family (Rocky Mountain Rodeo Company) of Kalispell will supply the stock and secretarial services.


The rodeo grounds were in the residential district of Boulder until the late '70's. The new grounds were an improvement and a great help to the contestants and to the committee.



7th Year for the Gold...KENNEDY WALSH won the All-Around Buckle and DAN WIGERT won the seventh leg of the "Go for the Gold". The Go for the Gold challenge was started in 1988 and to win the accumulated (one ounce per year) gold, a contestant must claim high money honors three times. Past champions include: Danny Cross, 1988-89; Todd Turner, 1990; Richard Carpenter, 1991; Bob Schall, 1992-93; Dan Wigert, 1994. This year Kennedy Walsh won the All-Around Buckle but did not earn enough money to beat out Dan Wigert for high money honors. Superior awards the All-Around to anyone winning money in two or more events. But each leg of the gold is awarded to the cowboy winning the most money at their rodeo each year. There is now 7 ounces of gold in the pot, estimated at \$2,800.



HOW TO ENTER NRA RODEOS THROUGH BIG SKY RODEO CENTRAL ENTRY DIAL 406-428-2205

Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised. Charge is \$3.50

Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

1. Name of rodeo

2. Your NRA card number

3. Your name

4. The event or events you wish to enter

5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.

6. Name of buddy or buddies — two per event, six total.

7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.

8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are

9. Keep track of the confirmation number the operator gives you, both on entering the rode and calling back. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation. YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING HIS FIRST PREFER-ENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRAC-

TION.

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, you will be charged an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

Trade-outs and Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADE OUTS."

Trades: A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

Note: a new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earier.

Turnouts: As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judge, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer. I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.





TO: Breakaway Ropers FROM: Janie Carlson, Director

Due to a small amount of confusion I thought I would try to explain the reasoning for a proposed rule change regarding neck only verses catch as catch can. In theory the rule is great, but in reality it has created more probelems than it has solved. Correlate it to some government programs that look great on paper but when implemented are a mess.

The neck only rule has been in existence for ten years. The rule was to make it easier for the judges to flag the event. There were problems right away and a petition was passed around to get rid of the rule. The reason being, was the majority of the illegal catches were made on the left side. At the NRA Finals, if there was an illegal catch the roper was flagged.

The next year the Fianls rule was if you got an illegal catch, time was taken and then you got your calf back lap and tap. This could result in a two looped calf in the 5 second area. I think those conditions existed for several years.

Then the 92 Finals rule was one loop, just like the rodeos duing the summer. This was again changed because Finals are supposed to be an average type of rodeo. I think the next summer the flagger was again moved across the arena because he didn't have a clear view of the breakaway flag as it broke from the horn. This is the current rule and the Finals have a judge on each side of the arena and three stop watches. So clearly there has been many problems in the past

ten years. The breakaway really isn't as easy to flag as one might think. It is the only timed event where motion does not stop. Consider flagging the team roping with he heeler breakawaying. Add a few more variables--night rodeos with marginal lights, mud and slop, sun, inexperience in flagging the event.

Ladies, we do have a problem. So far this year alone we have had at least ten flags on illegal catches before the 1st of August and some catches that were legal and called illegal.

Of the top 15 from last year, seven voted to change it to catch as catch can, two voted against, three did not care, and two were unavailable. These are the people that go very hard, see most of the problems, and most have done so for many years. So clearly you can see the majority of people that have seen the evolution of this rule want it to return to the rule that is good enough for the two largest rodeo organizations in the world--the National High School Rodeo Association and the NIRA.

A Concerned Judge

Over the past few years, the NRA has tried very hard to improve their image and also to promote the sport of rodeo in a professional manner. As a true leader in Regional Rodeo, we have come a long way over the years and have gained the respect of many in the rodeo world. This is a tribute to the strong leadership of the association and a fact that we all should be proud of.

There were several proposed rule changes brought up and passed at the last Board Meeting that I feel are a step backward in professionalism. These proposals were approved at the Board level but now need to be acted on at the full meeting for final approval.

I have been involved with the association for over 25 years and a Board member for 13 years and sincerely feel that these potential rule changes do nothing but take the NRA from a position of strong professionalism to a more amateur level. The proposed rule changes in question are:

- 1. When roping muley cattle, the legal catch in the Ladies Breakaway roping will be catch as catch can after the loop passes over the entire head of the animal.
- 2. The committee or stock contractor has the option of using rubberbands or string to tie neck ropes.

The current rules covering these two areas were put in place within the last (5) years & were done so to improve the event and to insure less mistakes. The clean bell head catch in the LBAR is much easier to flag and the best ropers seem to come to the top. The one risk that you run is that the roper may also pick up that off-side front leg and this can sometimes be missed by the flagger if he's not watching closely. By properly educating the judges, this error should, however, be kept to a minimum. With the catch-as-catch-can rule, the flagging is much harder and the risk of rope, the barrier pulls the same every time. With rubberbands on the neck rope, the barrier breaks differently and therefore the risk of additional problems.

I would urge the Board and the entire membership to strongly review the pros and cons of each of these proposals before they are apporved and put into final form. We need to do whatever we can to maintain the professionalism in our association and I strongly feel that these (2) rule change proposals if approved, would be taking a big step backwards.
