Complete authority for amending or revising the bylaws shall be within the power of the board of directors."

Montana Rodeo fans clipped a coupon at the NRA Finals this weekend. Bob Ragsdale, 15-time NFR qualifier and national president of the Friends of Rodeo, attended the activities during a four-day period and instructed people in the rodeo industry about erroneous facts about animal use that are being distributed by animal extremists.

"The goal of animal extremists is to completely eliminate all animal use, whether it be enjoying pets at home, for training elephants in the circus or for riding a horse around barrels," explained Ragsdale.

Ragsdale spoke to contractors, rodeo committees, and contestants and informed them about the purpose of a four-month-old organization, Friends of Rodeo. Unity is important. People who hope to continue using and enjoying animals are asked to join Friends of Rodeo.

"Over 98 percent of the people in the United States are urban," said Ragsdale. "This is just the opposite of what it was 100 years ago. People today are, three or four generations away from the land, and have not grown up around actual animals."

"Many people today perceive all animals as talking people with fur on them," Ragsdale said. "Mickey Mouse and Pluto are the animals seen by them are on television; consequently, they think that all animals are like those animated characters."

"Those of us who work with animals know that they are much different — spiritually, mentally and physically," he explained.

Animal extremists are misleading the public with half truths about what animals can endure."

Stan Rasmussen, president of the NRA says, "I knew Bob Ragsdale when we both lived in Harlem, (Montana). Bob is an honest, sincere person. "All of us will benefit from his efforts to assure that rodeo will be kept alive and that animals will be cared for in the correct manner."

Karen Miller, Executive director of the Montana Friends of Rodeo, presently is organizing committees that will help to preserve this part of our western heritage. Publicity, education, mem-

The following are what NRA Finals contestants suggested for rules. Very little editing was done on these, so read carefully. Here are the rules as you wrote them. If there are duplicates it is because it was suggested more than once.

Now it's your turn. If you are an NRA member and did not fill out that question on the NRA finals entry (even if you were a finals contestant), you can write a response to the following question:

If you could write a rule in the NRA rule book what would it be?

If you're serious about rule changes, get in contact with your director. The April 18th board meeting will include serious rule writing. Read pages 54-57 of this newsletter. Consider these proposed changes, write some of you own ideas and call you director. The NRA needs your feedback on rules.

NRA MEMBERS:

- No third year bulldoggin' steers in the team roping
- Contestants cannot be in the arena unless in Western attire
- That you can enter slack as first preference
- To make the breakaway a catch as catch can
- a stricter and more enforced rule on animal abuse, because of animal rights activists
- Judges have to qualify or go to a seminar
- Give slack as a first preference
- Permits should be \$10 at each rodeo
- Two bullfighters at the finals
- Stricter rules towards judges qualifications
- To allow a reasonable length of time to get the electric eye set up if it malfunctions
 - More added money equal in the team roping at all rodeos
 - All judges must go to PRCA judging clinic, yearly

- All judges must score a mandatory 30 points or mandatory reride
- Judges are to show no bias toward any person or stock.
- Judges clean off your glasses
- The stock contractors would be responsible for the electric eye or barrel racers should, by rule, take responsibility of the eye for their particular rodeo, and fined if don't take care of it.
- Change the payoff system
- To find out the draw when you call back after entering a rodeo
- Revert back to the old payoff system
- Money for turnouts are included in the payoff.
- That a point deduction be assessed instead of a no score regarding the bronc riding markout rule
- Companion passes (free) at NRA finals (Every contestant should get one.)
- It would be a good sportsmanship rule
- Give contestants more say in matters that deal with contestants

JUNIORS:

- To let the juniors compete in the Metra during the Billings Fair
- Two divisions in the junior events
- If the calf goes into the box, the person should get a rerun
- More money added in the rodeo
- Top ten juniors to run in actual NRA evening Finals performance
- To let the juniors ride in the final performance with the adults at the Metra. To let committees be aware to have equipment to rake between (ladies) barrel racing and juniors; Let the juniors ride in the Metra during the Billings Fair like at any other rodeo.
- Pay day money
- Kids rope during the rodeo in Metra and add goat tying in junior events
- Same judges throughout the whole rodeo including the junior events!!

NRA FINALS RODEO:

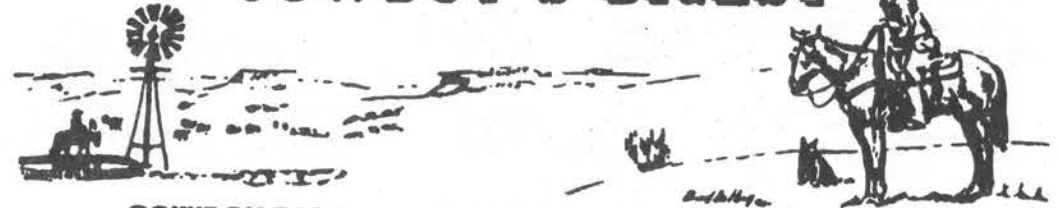

After being gone from the NRA for a year, Mary Salmond returned to the association finals the same way she left - winning the NRA All Around Cowgirl Award.

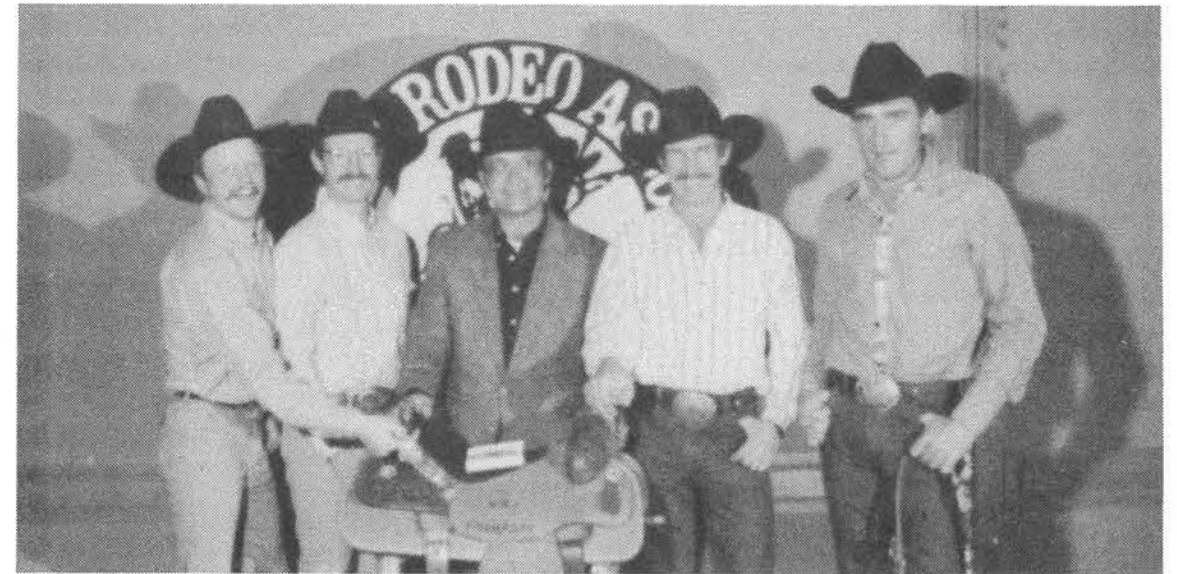

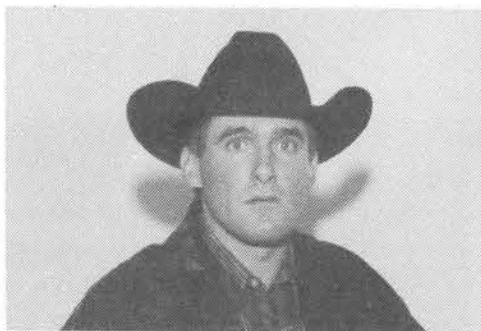


Champion - Bob Schall, Jr.

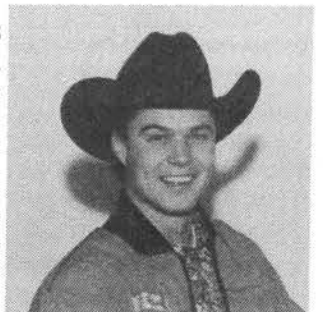

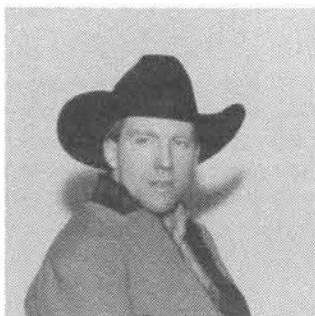

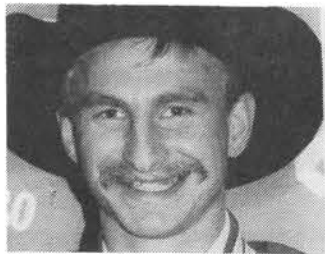
Champion - Marty Penrod

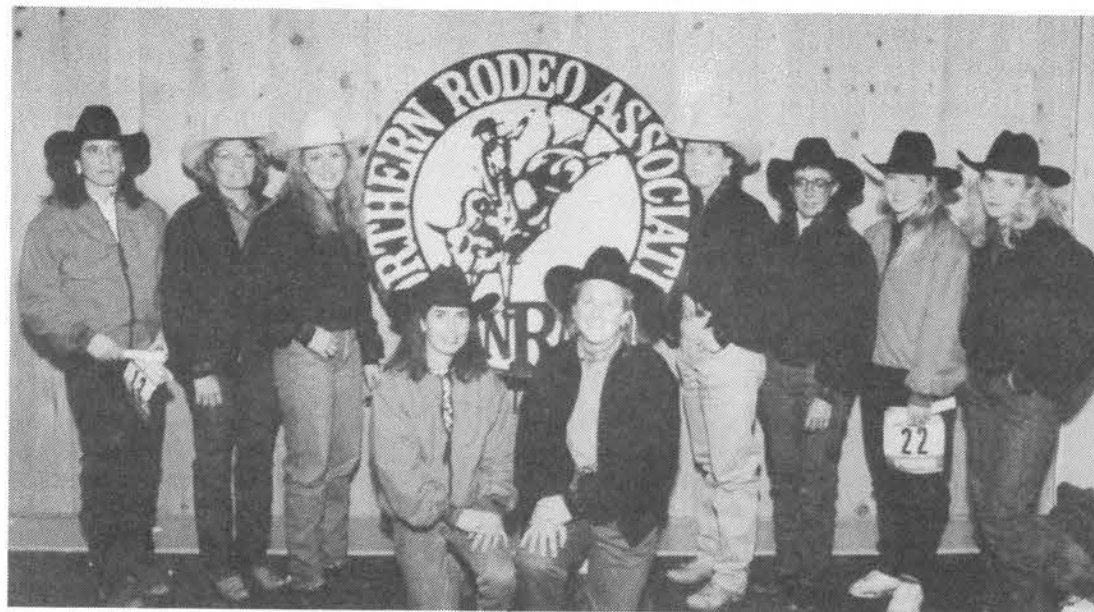


Runnerup - Scott Breeding

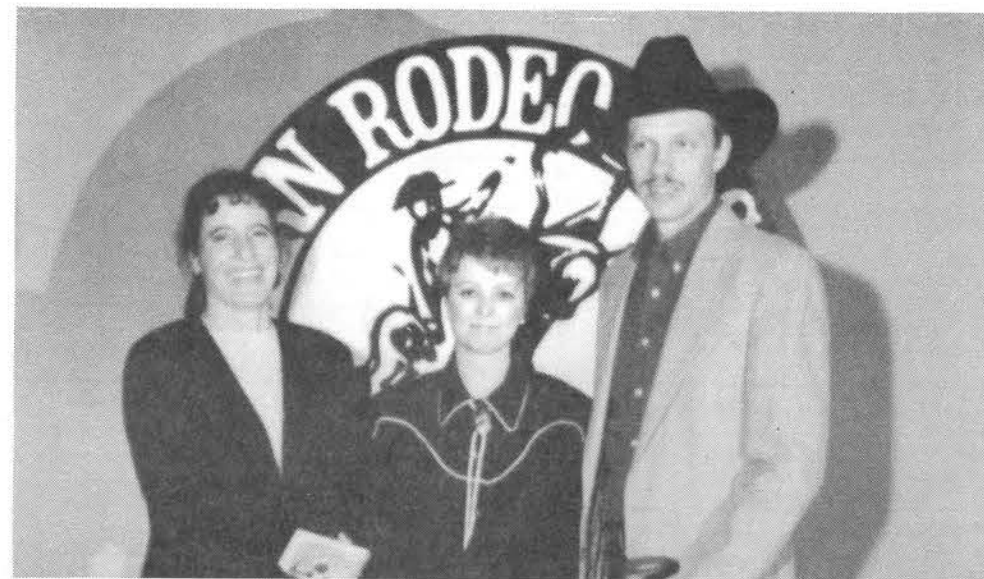
Runnerup - Jody Petersen

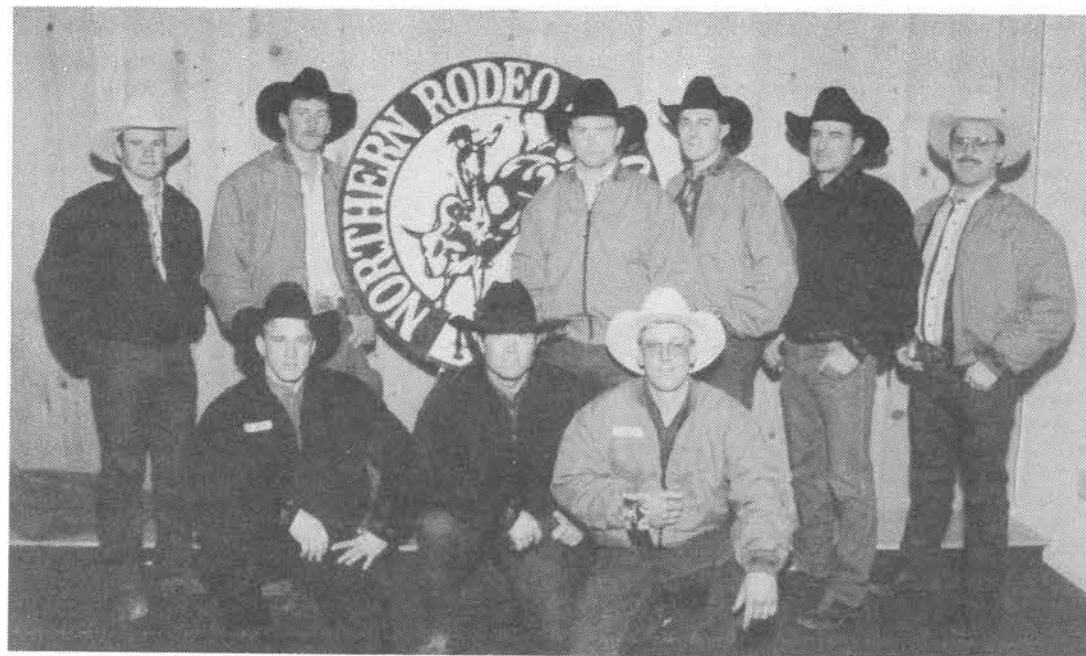
Runnerup - Rayna Prewitt

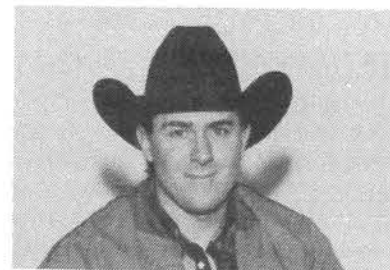
Champion - Chris Witcher

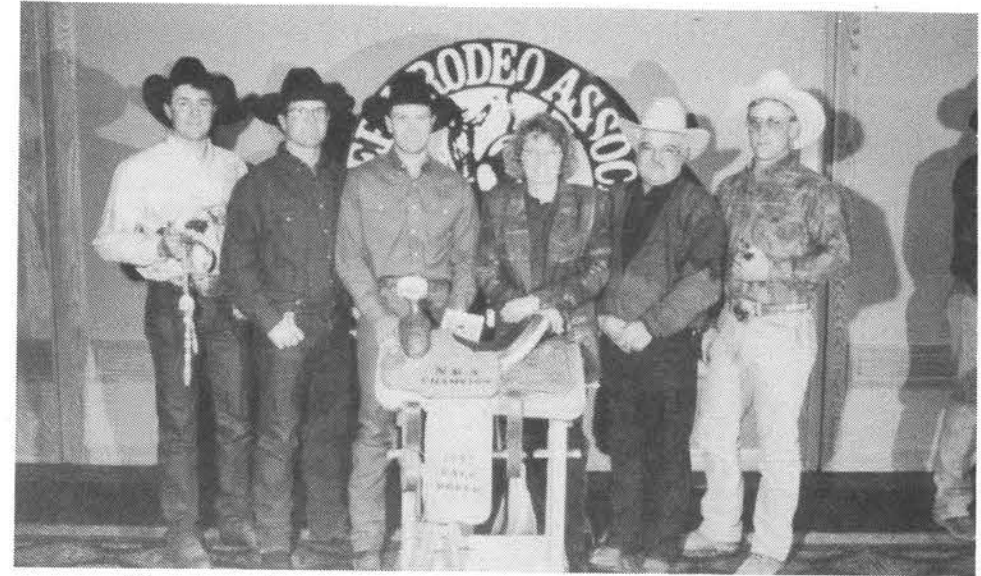
Runnerup - Jody Wacker

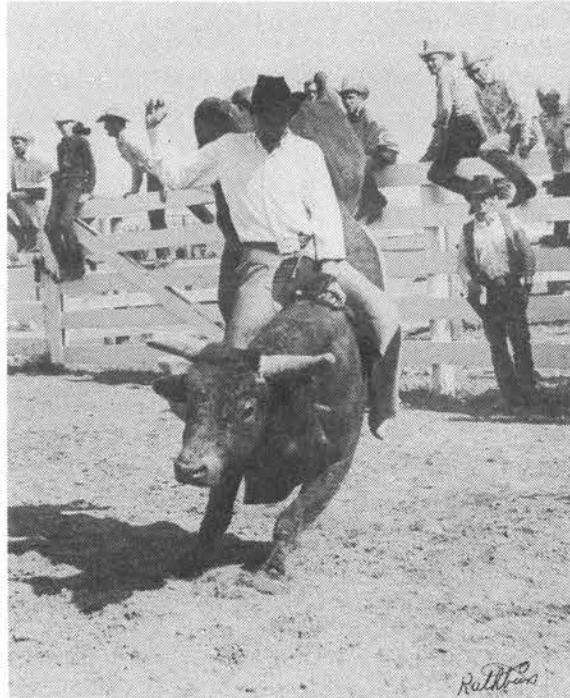

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The NRA needs your input on these proposed rule changes. Call your event director and let them know your opinion of these changes. Their numbers are on the inside front cover of this newsletter.

Humane Treatment of Livestock:

- Protective neck collars to be used on all animals in tie-down ropings.
- Animals in tie-down roping will be a minimum weight of 200 pounds.
- Contestants will be immediately disqualified if animals in the tie-down roping are pulled over backward causing them to land on the middle of their back.
 - Contestants will be immediately disqualified if animals in the tie-down roping are dragged more than one (1) animal length. (Before/after or just after the tie ????)
 - A vet will be present or on call at all performances and slack.
 - A large animal sled, pry bars, and jacks must be readily available at each rodeo.
 - Horses or bulls will be released, if fighting the chute and are in danger of injuring themselves.
 - Any flagrant abuse of livestock will constitute disqualification and fines as listed.

ADD: One extra animal in each timed event will be drawn for all paid performances to be used in place of any animal drawn for that performance, but deemed unusable or misdrawn. The extra will be drawn after the performance has been drawn from the animals remaining. If the extra is not used, it will be included in the next draw and not considered run.

Add: Page 36, #1: Contestant must immediately accept or decline reride option.

Add: Page 34, #21: (b): Team will be assessed any penalties occurring on the qualifying run (i.e. 5 seconds for one leg.)

The following are for the calf roping section:

Add: Protective neck collars to be used on all animals in tie-down ropings.

Add: Contestants will be immediately disqualified if animals in the tie-down roping are pulled over backward causing them to land on the middle of their back.

Add: Contestants will be immediately disqualified if animals in the tie-down roping that are dragged more than one (1) animal length. (Before/after or just after the tie ????)

Add: Contestant that touches rope or jerkline before mounting his horse will be disqualified and fined \$50.

This section contains portions of rules that need to be deleted. The portions that need to be deleted are signified by “ ” (quotation marks.)

Del: Pg 28, #1: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “In all riding events, a complete performance must be drawn at one time and any stock, including the first performance and stock bucked before the second performance, shall be drawn the night prior to the first performance. . . .”

Del: Pg 36, #1: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “up until that time.”

Pg 32, #12: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “up until that time.”

Pg 42, #12: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “up until that time.”

Pg 46, #14: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “up until that time.”

Pg 48, #11: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “up until that time.”

Del: Pg 36, #1: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “The Association Board of Directors has the right . . . taken from the draw.”

Del: Pg 41, #4: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “Horses to be saddled in the chute. Riders may cinch own saddle.”

Del: Pg 42, #8: (h) (delete portion of the rule) . . . “and suspended thirty (30) days.”

Del: Pg 45, #7 (delete portion of the rule) . . . “and suspended thirty (30) days.”

Del: Pg 37, #1: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “All bucking animals are to be furnished by the rodeo”

Del: Pg 37, #5 (delete portion of the rule) . . . “If an animal . . . will take the animal first.”

Del: Pg 62, #4: (delete portion of the rule) . . . “Catching legs or a tail in a loop will be considered an illegal catch.”

The following section includes rules which need changed:

Chg: Pg 28, #1 (b) Delete all of previous rule and change to read, . . . Rerides will be assigned according to order awarded and in the order the animals are drawn prior to the performance, (i.e. First contestant awarded a reride will get first reride drawn.) After designated rerides are used, rerides will be drawn using turnouts. If additional rerides are needed after using designated rerides and turn outs, they will

be drawn from available stock.

Chg: Pg 41, #3: Contestant's halters may be used (delete "if they meet specifications" (add "subject to the approval of the judges.")

Chg: Pg 41, #4: Flank cinch may not be hobbled, (add "unless requested by the contractor")

Chg: Pg 34, #21 (a) . . . the contestant must declare him or herself by pulling up (delete "before contesting on animal") (add "immediately.")

Chg: Name of Calf Roping to Tie-Down Roping and change calf to animal in all places in the rule book.

Chg: Pg 49, #8: animals shall weigh a minimum weight of (delete "150") (add "200") pounds . . .

Chg: Eliminate six-second rule and the time will be official when the contestant mounts and horse makes its first step forward.

Rule that will be effected if this is approved:

Pg 49, #4, 5, 6

Pg 49, #7 may need changed

Chg: Pg 50, #12: Change this to read the same as pg 52, #9, but to cover tie-down roping.

Chg: Pg 53, #20: Cattle may be lined by (delete "only one person") (add "two people") to the scoreline.

Chg: Pg 57, #20: Cattle may be lined by (delete "only one person") (add "two people") to the scoreline.

Chg: Pg 56, #19: . . . a heel loop is thrown before the header has dallied and changed the direction of the steer (add "and the steer is in tow), the team will be disqualified.

Chg: Pg 62, #4: When roping muley cattle, the rope must pass over the animal's head (and "and ears") and come tight on (delete "the neck (behind the ears, in front of front legs, see diagram)") (add "any part of the animal") and breakaway.

Chg: Pg 63, #6: . . . must have a colorful (add "florescent") cloth . . .

Following is a breakdown of offenses that will result in disqualifications and/or fines. A judge has the authority to assess fines. You will not be allowed to compete at the next rodeo, until your fines have been paid. Remedies for protesting a fine or disqualification are outlined below:

A contestant will be subject to the following, if an offense occurs during an NRA Rodeo.

- 1) A contestant will be disqualified for the following offenses:
 - a. Refusing to contest on an animal drawn for them,
 - b. Not being ready to compete when called upon,

c. Pulling animal over backward causing them to land on the middle of their back in the tie-down roping.

d. Dragging an animal in the tie-down roping more than one (1) animal length. (Before/After or jest after the tie??)

2) A contestant will be disqualified and fined \$50 for the following offenses:

- a. Being under the influence of liquor in the arena
- b. Rowdyism or quarreling on and around the rodeo grounds,
- c. Touching rope or jerkline before mounting horse.

3) A contestant will be disqualified and fined \$100 for the following offenses:

a. First offense of Mistreatment of animals, in or out of the arena. Second offense will be disqualification and a fine of \$500. Any offense, thereafter, will result in suspension from NRA rodeos for a period of one year.

B. Cheating or attempting to cheat.

4) An NRA member that harasses, intimidates, or threatens an NRA official or Board Member will be disqualified and fined \$500 for the first offense. If this offense occurs at any time other than a rodeo, the individual will be fined \$500 for the first offense.

Upon the second offense, the member will be disqualified, fined \$1,000 and will be subject to suspension as determined by the board.

5) A contestant will be fined \$25 for not wearing a western hat, boots or long-sleeved shirt while in the arena, on the bucking chutes, or on the sides and back of roping boxes. Any contestant being assisted in any manner by an individual not adhering to this dress code will be fined \$25.

Remedies for Protesting Disqualification of Fines:

1) A written letter of objection must be submitted within 7 days of being notified of offense. The letter must contain, at the minimum, a thorough explanation of the incident and the individual's reasons of objection. Fines, as mentioned above, must be paid even if an individual submits this letter.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

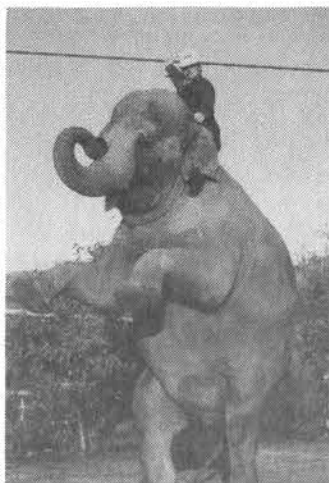
