Contestants: Notice Rules are for you, by you

Contestants: You wrote the rule. Don't even ask to have slack changed. The slack is to be run in the order of the rodeo with the exception of the ladies barrel race which is always run first!!

NRA rulings and procedures on Trade-outs/ Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are tradeout rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADEOUTS."

A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade <u>must</u> call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Turnouts:

As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m.

the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary/judge/contractor that you will not be there, you fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors/judges/secretaries/spectators/ announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.



Montana State Men's team wins second national Collegiate Title

BOZEMAN, Mont. - Mon- lot to me because I've been so tana State won more than an unprecedented second straight men's team title at the 1991 College National Finals Rodeo.

The school also has been picked to host the event at least until 1996.

Three other cities - Rapid City, S.D., Ogden, Utah, and Lubbock, Texas - had put in bids to try to wrest the CNFR from Bozeman, which has been the site of the finals in 21 of the past 22 years.

But at the conclusion of Saturday night's final go-round in the week-long rodeo, officials of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association announced to a crowd of 6,000 they are happy with Bozeman and will keep the rodeo here.

"I think this is the greatest place to have the college finals," said Montana State coach John Larick. "We have solid people working every year, and we know it will work."

What worked for the Bobcats at the rodeo was a solid nucleus of returning veterans, led by Shawn Vant.

The Wyoming women matched the Montana State men, as they became the first two teams ever to earn backto-back titles at the rodeo.

Vant scored a 71 on his bareback bronc ride Saturday night to nail down both the CNFR and season-long national allaround cowboy titles. He also won the CNFR average title and the national championship in bareback.

"The bareback title means a

close the last two years," he said. "Winning the team championship for the second year in a row is a pretty big deal, too."

Montana State's Dan Mortensen won the national title in saddle bronc riding, MSU's Craig Miller was ninth in the same event at the rodeo and third for the season, and teammate Chris Witcher was fifth in the rodeo in calf roping and third in the national standings in that event.

Montana State finished with 607 1/2 points, while runnerup Utah State had 474. Then came Fort Scott Community College of Kansas with 408, Blue Mountain Community College of Oregon 396, and Scottsdale Community College of Arizona 330.

Dustin Durfee of Utah Valley Community College came up with a clean sweep in team roping at the rodeo.

He combined with Brett Broadhead of Utah State to win Saturday's go-round in 5.8 seconds, and the two carted off the CNFR title with a threeround combined time of 21.9 seconds. All those points also helped Durfee win the national title in the event.

A pair of cowboys with famous relatives also did well.

Rope Myers of Sam Houston State, son of Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association steer wrestling great Butch Myers, came away with the CNFR title in that event.

And Chuck Holloway of Fort Scott, the nephew of bronc riding legend Casey Tibbs, took the CNFR saddle bronc title.

The Wyoming women, with a new cast of characters this season, won with 480 points. Walla Walla Community College of Washington was second with 351, followed by UNLV with 336. Southwestern Oklahoma State 318, and Cal Poly-SLO 261.

Wyoming coach Dan Dunleavy, in only his second year on the job, said he felt vindicated.

"It means a lot because people didn't give us much of a chance to win the national crown, but they really came through," he said.

Lori Rhodes helped clinch the championship by winning the final go-round of goat tying in 8.4 seconds and finishing first in the average in that event at the rodeo.

"I think the thing that put the fire in us was that people said we didn't have a chance without Jimmie Jo Martin," said Rhodes. Martin was last year's all-around cowgirl and scored all of Wyoming's points en route to its championship.

"We said, "We're going to show them," Rhodes said.

The all-around cowgirl title at the rodeo this year went to Walla Walla's Brenda Mays, while Julie Adair of Cal Poly-SLO won the seasonal title.

Veteran NRA contestant addicted to the ride

Arlee - At 41, veteran rodeo star Bob Schall says he won't quit the big time until they pack him out in a box.

After 28 years in the professional bucking business, Schall has out-ridden and out-roped countless other cowboys across the nation. And this year, he says, he's having his best season

In recent weeks, Schall has pulled down another round of top awards in bareback bronc riding, roping and steer wrestling. By the end of June, he'd already completed in 45 rodeos this

Within the next couple week, he'll hit more than a dozen more spread over five Western

"It's been a hell of year," Schall said during a rare break in arena action. "I don't know what else to say."

His trailer house near hometown Arlee is packed full of prize belt buckles, bronzes and other memorabilia. He's a member of the Montana State University Rodeo Hall of Fame and in 1972 was named top bareback rider in the United States.

As Schall puts it, though, he didn't have much choice but to be one of the best in a tough trade.

His hard-driving father, the late Robert H. Schall, Sr., was a rodeo man from way back and produced shows in western Montana for as long as Bob remembers. At age 6, young Bob was riding calves for sport. By high school, he was getting to be a star.

"I didn't have a whole lot of career choice, if you really look at it," Schall said. "In a way, it was a set pattern. But I hated horses until I was 15. I hated riding. I would just as soon mess with machinery."

But mechanical jobs weren't in the cards, and soon enough Schall says he got snagged on the high produced by a bucking horse.

"It's the high, it's the up, it's the excitement of winning," Schall said when asked to explain why he keeps it all these years. "It's just like sex. You can't beat it."

Loving it has meant leaving it for awhile, however. In 1981, Schall got dumped on his

neck, an excruciating experience.

After many months of recovery, Schall forced himself to climb back on a horse. "That was as tough as my first ride ever," he admits now.

Then there was the time a pickup man ran over him with his horse, tearing his shoulder apart. Over the years, Schall also has had his arm snapped, his ribs broken and suffered from uncounted sprains and bruises.

And through it all, he realizes he's not getting any younger.

"Healthwise, I've been pretty lucky," he observed. "But eventually you get to the point of jarring around so much you can't take it anymore."

Schall says one of the keys of consistent winning is putting nearly all your attention into the animal beneath you, rather than toward the men you're competing against.

"Most of it's physical, but it gets to be a mental game the further you go," he said. "Psychologically, I've got the advantage right now. I don't have to beat them, they have to beat

To make it in professional rodeo today, Schall said you've got to run harder and ride better than ever. That means spending long days and nights on the road moving from one event to another, going up to 72 hours without decent sleep or decent food.

"It gets pretty hectic," Schall said. "If I could sleep in the pickup, though, I could go to 200 rodeos a year. It seems like I never get enough rodeo. I'm fully addicted."

Along with tenacity, success has been gained by keeping a positive mindset, staying in top physical shape and putting professional needs above nearly anything else during the season, Schall said.

That attitude, however, can be tough on relationships, he noted. "I've got to put in 110 percent and that's hard on other people sometimes," Schall said. "The rodeo world is dogeat-dog in a way"

But for all of its hardships, it's after the roar of the crowd is gone, the lights are low and the





I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.
