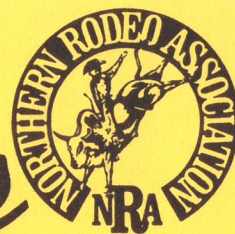

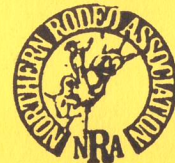

Added Money increases over NRA's Labor Day weekend

Northern Rodeo Association cowboys and cowgirls will be competing at more added money this Labor Day run.

Ravalli County Fair rodeo in Hamilton has increased their purse in the rough stock events to \$400, while the timed events have been upped to \$350 per event. Ravalli County Fair will also host Rookie Bareback Riding with \$100 added and \$15 entry fees. Jacobs Livestock Rodeo of Great Falls will be producing the rodeo. Performances are Aug. 29 and 30, at 8 p.m. with slack if necessary after the performance on Aug. 29.

Labor Day rodeo action in Helmsville at the Helmsville Rodeo Club sponsored NRA rodeo will see \$300 added in the rough stock events, with a top six saddle bronc ride-off for \$400. Performances are Sept. 1 and 2, at 1 p.m. with slack if necessary after the performance on Sept. 1. Rocky Mountain Rodeo Company of Kalispell will be producing the rodeo. Rookie Bareback Riding will also be featured in Helmsville, with \$50 added and \$20 entry fees.

Bull Riding, Ladies Barrel Racing and Breakaway Roping events have increased added money to \$300. Rookie Bareback Riding will have \$100 added with \$15 entry fees. Performances are at 1:30 both days, with slack at 8 a.m. the morning of Sept. 2. Small Rodeo Company of Pompeys Pillar is the stock contractor.

On Sept. 8 and 9, Kalispell will play host to NRA rodeo at the Carpenter Arena. 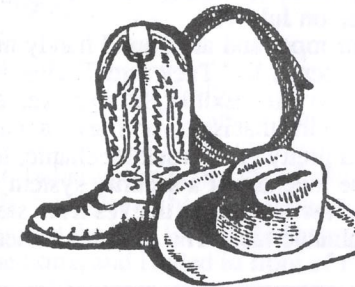

Downing's team has a busy night at East Helena

At 46 years of age, Steve Downing hasn't slowed down in his rodeoing. He has just shifted the emphasis a little.

And now he is letting his "team" of horses help pay his way down the road as he competes in everything from open rodeos to professional rodeos with some Northern Rodeo Association and Old Timers Association rodeos thrown in. But now he limits his competition to the steer wrestling.

The Helena cowboy used to be a good bareback bronc rider and also competed in steer wrestling. He even got on some saddle broncs and bulls for a few years. After 22 years, he decided to give up the bareback broncs because

he felt he was slipping a little in that event.

But after 20 years of jumping on running steers, he says, "I keep improving every year. I am bulldogging better than I ever have in my life." However, his steer set up on him Friday night at the East Helena Rodeo and he overshot the horns and landed in front of the steer.

There were eight runs in the steer wrestling Friday night, and Downing came out of the box on one side or the other for every one of them. He rode his dogging horse, Eight Ball, when he was doing the steer wrestling, and he was on his hazing horse, Charlie, on the other seven runs.

Both of his horses are registered quarter horses with some running in them. Eight Ball did run on the track for awhile and Charlie was trained on the track, but never ran a race. Charlie is six years old and Eight Ball is "11 or 12," and Downing is in his third season riding Eight Ball while this is his second summer riding Charlie.

Referring to his busy night in East Helena, Downing said, "there were not many hazing horses here tonight." But he admitted, "I have been hazing quite a bit this year. One reason is that I get up on odd days for some guys. I am up when a lot of others guys don't want to be up (like opening night in East Helena)."

He wanted up Friday in this rodeo because he will be in Malta today and in Chinook on Sunday to compete in a pair of Old Timers Association rodeos (for contestants 40 years of age and over). And he enjoys competing with the "old timers," pointing out, "when I started rodeoing I grew up reading articles (on steer wrestling) by Jack Roddy (a former world champion). Now I am dogging against him in the Old Timers rodeos. It is neat competing against some of my old heroes."

Downing calls Charlie and Eight Ball "probably the best team of horses I have ever owned." And while they don't pay his way to all of the rodeos, he admits "they help a lot. I have collected quite a few checks this year" as he picks up a percentage of all money won off his horses.

Helena has long been known as a "hot bed" of steer wrestlers in Montana and Downing says there are currently "close to 50" in the Helena area who get together at least occasionally, and some of them pretty regularly, to practice. And veterans like Downing and Steve Blixt, along with some "real old timers" who helped teach these guys, work with the younger bulldoggers to help them learn the trade, and learn how to go to it right.

After more than two decades of rodeoing, Downing has no plans to quit. He goes to "about 80 percent" of the NRA rodeos in the state and still carries a permit to compete in Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association approved rodeos, always entering his hometown Last Chance Stampede and several others around Montana.

As long as he keeps "getting better" at wrestling steers, Downing is going to keep going down the road, and his team of horses will help get him there.

A. Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. Unless otherwise advertised.

B. Give the following information when entering a rodeo:


1. Name of rodeo
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your Name.
4. The event or events you wish to enter.
5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies - two per event, six total.
7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. to find out when you are up.

C. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, are recorded on tape, and each cowboy is given verification number for that conversation.

YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER. IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING THEIR FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES, AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION

ONE LOCAL ENTRY PER SEASON.

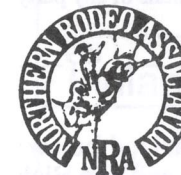

I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further **COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA** for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this **RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE** extends to any all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.
