Thanks to all those who worked behind the scenes to help make this years NRA Finals a success. All in all things really turned out well and next year should be even better!

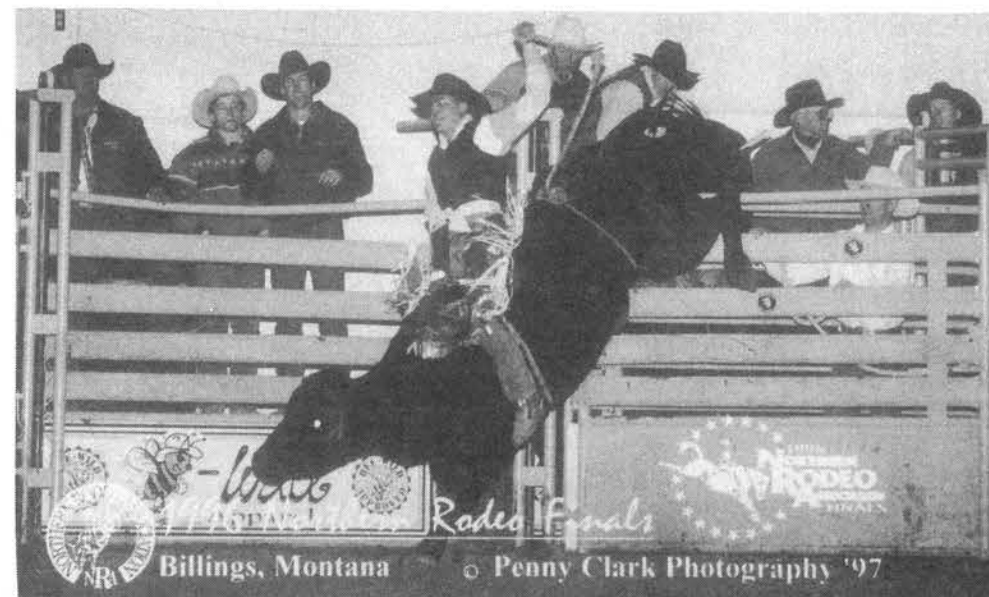

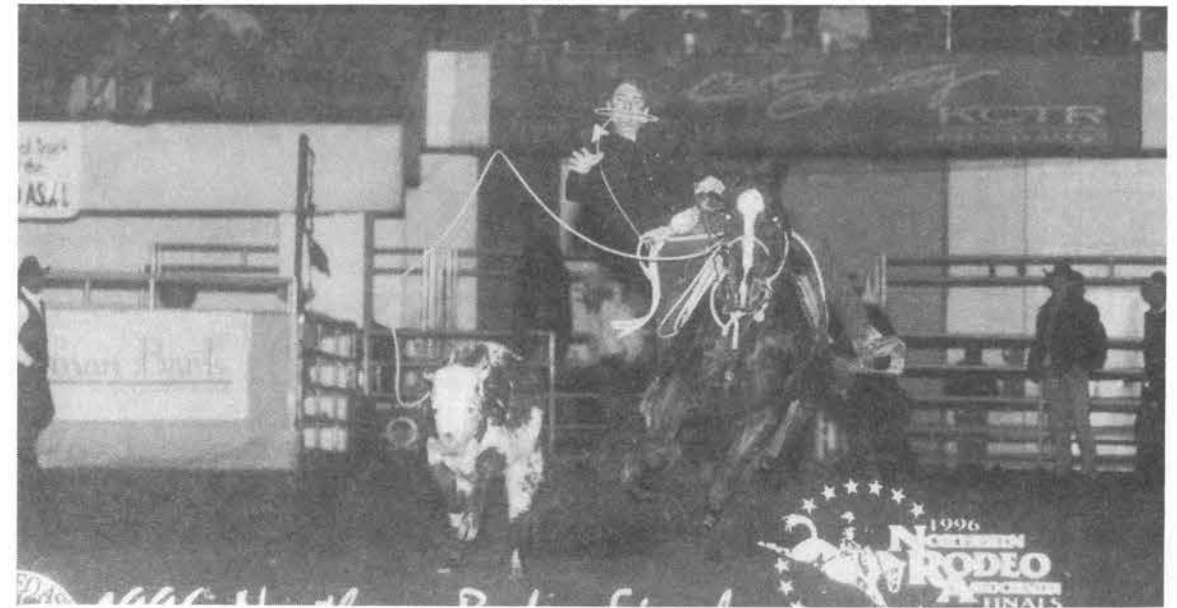

NORTH AMERICAN RODEO UPDATE!

WFR personnel applications sought...

The 1997 World Finals Rodeo will be held in Charleston, South Carolina on November 11-15, 1997. The Rodeo will consist of 6 performances and slack.

Now is the time for anyone interested in applying for a personnel position at the WFR to submit their applications to the RMRA office. The NRAC Executive Board will be hiring Judges, Timers, Clowns, Pickup Men, and Announcers for the 1997 WFR at its May meeting.

You will be required to arrive in Charleston no later than November 10th at 12:00 noon. You will be required to stay through November 15th. Pickup Men will be required to bring 6 horses. Hay and stalls will be provided for them.

Applications should be received by the RMRA office no later than April 15. Please contact the NRA Office for an application if you are interested.

Applicants should provide adequate materials to demonstrate their abilities including, but not limited to, a list of rodeos worked in the past 18 months, letters of reference, videos, audio tapes, etc. The NARC prides itself in hiring top-notch personnel and both the compensation and experience is outstanding!

Experience will tell

The going rate for a baby-sitter is \$2 an hour. Sometimes a little more if those paying are in a generous mood.

This summer, Scott Augare found a way to supplement his baby sitting income.

He rode a few saddle bronc horses.

"Those boys, my son (J.C.), cousin Beau Michael and Clarence Gilham were traveling together and kept getting into trouble," said the Browning cowboy with a chuckle from some of the younger saddle bronc and bareback competitors.

"Somebody had to baby sit them and they selected me. I wasn't going to sit around and watch. I entered, got on some good horses and was lucky enough to place a few times."

The elder Augare led by example Friday night, scoring 79 points aboard the horse Blue Blazes at the first performance of the Northern Rodeo Association Finals.

The Finals, held at Metra, goes again tonight at 7:30 p.m. and concludes with a 2 p.m. Sunday performance. The NRA Finals determines the 1996 year-end champions.

Hopefully those young cowboys traveling with Augare listened well. The likable 40-year-old won a national Indian saddle bronc championship in 1982 and qualified for the NRA Finals in 1988.

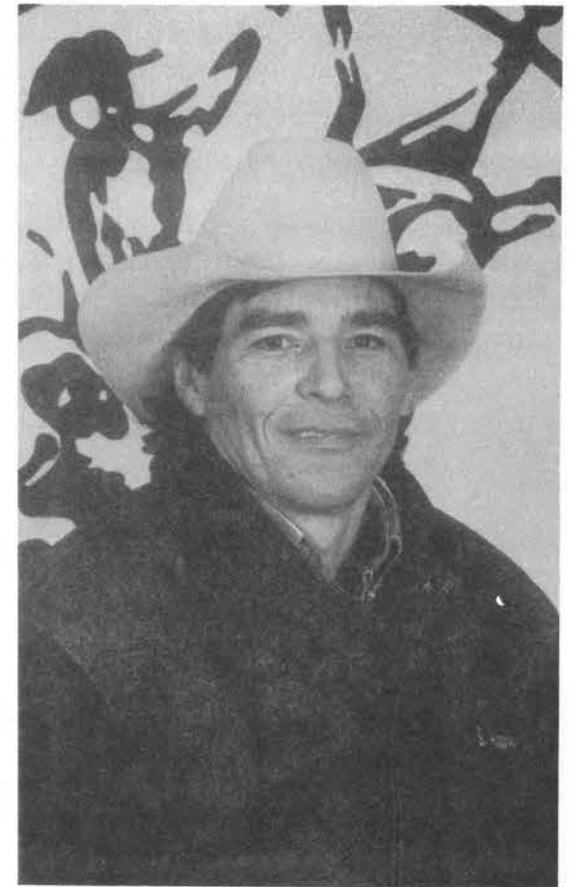
He showed some of that championship form while atop the hard-kicking gray horse.

"He's a good buckler," said Augare. "He flat-out kicked and it was tough to stay in

control at the end. He almost blew me out of there. I was just trying to stay back and get back down in the saddle. He was a good horse to draw tonight."

No new standings leaders emerged, but a few leaders stumbled in their quest to pad their earnings.

Josh Reynolds of Corvallis, who has already set a single-season earnings record for saddle bronc riding, got tossed by the horse Hungry Creek, while steer wrestling leader Chuck Fields of Lewistown had to take a no-time.



COORS STOCK OF THE YEAR NAMED

The 1996 NRA Finals isn't just a showcase of the NRA's best cowboys. It is also a place where the NRA's best bucking stock get to show thier stuff and in thier own right, become champions, too.

Rocky Mountian Rodeo Company proudly claims two of those champions with Coors Bareback horse of the year, Kenny's Baldy, and Coors Bull of the year, 96 Dynamite. Kenny's Baldy, a 5 year old bay stud was bought through the sale ring in Billings, taken home, bucked at Carpenters Winter series the winter of 95-96 and made his NRA debut the summer of 96. "He always has a good trip" says Jeanne Carpenter "and the cowboys really like him."

Also making his debut this year was Carpenters 96 Dynamite. The big red bull went through the 96 summer season without being

ridden. "He didn't buck to his potential at the finals" says Jeanne. "He hasn't wintered real well and he just wasn't feeling up to par".

Eight years ago at a Billings horse sale Don Jacobs of Jacobs Livestock Co. picked up what he thought was going to be a 4 year-old broke saddle horse to use around his place. After trying to ride him twice and the horse successfully winning the battle, Don sent Melvin O to Three Forks to be turned out for the winter and see if he was really going to make it. Best in the west

Fair manager Gary Wiley has always believed the new rodeo arena at the Ravalli County Fairgrounds was an exceptional facility.

But his belief was validated when local cowboy Joe Reynolds returned from the Northern Rodeo Association Finals with a special award. The NRA members - the cowboys who participate in rodeos across the Northwest - voted the Ravalli County Fair's rodeo the "Best in 1996."

Reynolds was given a plaque to commemorate the choice at the NRA year-end banquet and asked to present the plaque to Wiley and the local fair board.

"It has to be No. 1," Reynolds said. "There isn't anything to compare to it anywhere in the state."

Wiley, who was surprised and delighted with the award, goes a step further. "We've been told it's the best facility west of the Mississippi River and I believe it," Wiley said. "It's right here in Hamilton and it's here because of the community."

The arena complex developed from a dream by a handful of people who looked at the out-dated, deteriorated facility after the 1995 fair and decided something had to be done about it, Wiley said. The wooden arena was 35 years old and nearing the end of its lifespan. "Posts were so rotted out and brittle that the wood split when you tried to put a nail in it," Wiley said.

"This arena exists because local arena users decided to do something together," Wiley

said. The problems were inventoried and the only solution was to replace the arena.

The fairgrounds had some money in its budget for maintenance. The county commissioners approved a building loan to be paid back over several years. There wasn't enough money to do the entire job, but that didn't faze the organizers, Wiley said. They came up with their own solution - do it yourself and ask for help.

Wiley catalogued 2,175 hours of volunteer labor and 300 hours of donated equipment labor. Businesses from all over the valley donated materials or provided materials at cost.

"We started Feb. 28 and finished on June 15," Wiley said. "There was not a single day, seven days a week, that we didn't have people out there working on their own time, staying until way after dark. It was incredible."

Three dozen community members, a dozen local businesses, Montana Power Company, the Trapper Creek Job Corps, community service workers from the local courts and a Boy Scout working to earn his Eagle badge - the work and workers never faltered. On the day the Powder River panels were delivered, 35 people showed up to unload and the two semi-trucks by hand. That enthusiasm remained until the last gate was hung and the last piece of iron was painted.

"This award belongs to every one of these folks and I'm proud to accept it for them," Wiley said. "Every citizen of Ravalli County shares in it because of them. We should be proud to call these folks our neighbors."

The PEOPLE earned Committee of the Year award

It was the people. It was the people of Ravalli County, through the forward-thinking fair board, who earned the 1996 NRA Committee of the Year award.

Sure, the Ravalli County Fairgrounds in Hamilton has a completely new and beautiful structure. True, the scenery at the fairgrounds is breathtaking. The grandstands are bulging every rodeo performance. The rodeo is a good paying rodeo. Yes, and it has some of the best fair food.

But it is the people who merit the award.

The people at the Ravalli County Fair over Labor Day greet rodeo contestants at the back gate with a welcome smile and a "Good luck to you!"

The people are enthusiastic with every rodeo event.

The people bend over backwards to make sure the NRA rules are followed.

The people of Ravalli County try hard. Congratulations on being chosen the 1996 Committee of the Year!

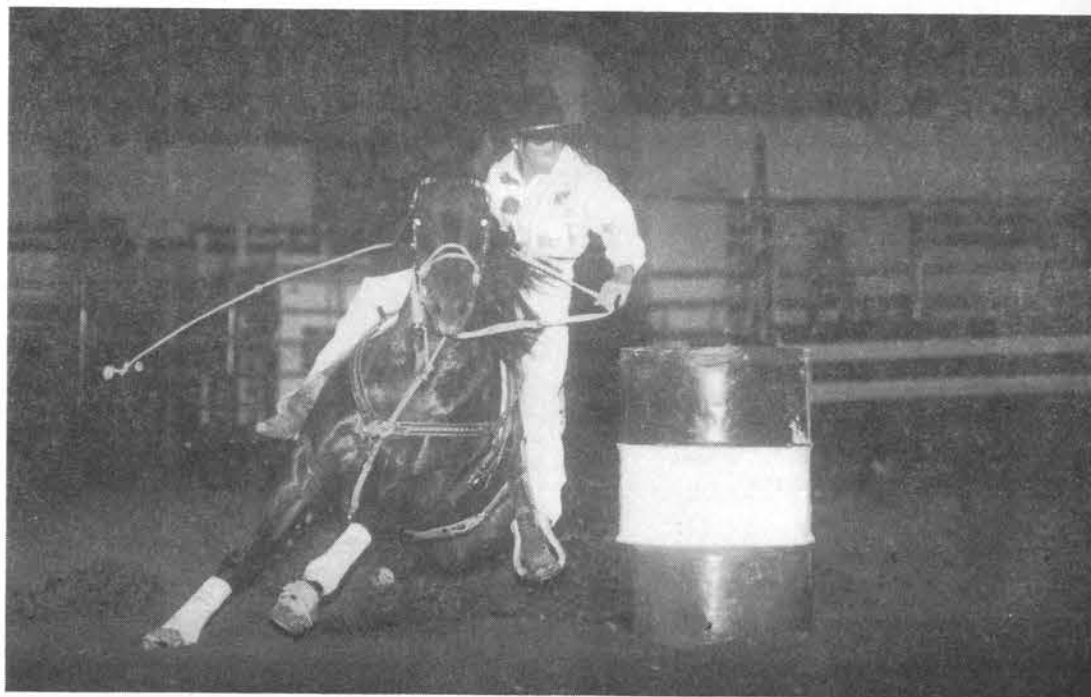

Lisa Scheffer injured in accident

Lisa Scheffer, prominent barrel racer, roper, team penner and horse trainer was injured the end of January. She was pulling a bale from the top of a hay stack, the twines broke and she fell 20 feet to the frozen ground shattering both heels. Because she came down with such force her knees came up and hit her chin bruising her and then she fell backwards into the barbwire fence making a small cut on her neck! One heel has a couple pins in it and the other required reconstructive surgery with plates, screws, etc.

The only way she can get around now is in a wheel chair — pretty difficult for someone as active as Lisa. It will be nearly 2 months before she can try to put any weight on the one foot and 4 to 6 months on the other one. The doctor told her it will be at least 6 months before she can ride a horse again. Of course it will take a while to build up the muscles etc. For a person that makes her living training horses and rodeoing this is a devastating accident. TIMED EVENT HORSES OF THE YEAR

STEER WRESTLING HORSE OF THE YEAR:

At almost every NRA rodeo in 1996 you could bet Jeff Solomon would be there with his Bulldoggin horses. Whether he mounted one cowboy or five, Smokin Jo or "Jo" to most, would always make the same trip and usually go to the pay window. At 11 years old, he is honest, runs hard and is solid in the box. These are the features that made him steer wrestling horse of the year for 1996. Although most of the time he is a big pet, "He will buck" says Jeff "but that makes him better".

BARREL RACING HORSE OF THE YEAR:

Always looking for prospects, Rachael Myllymaki and her mom Judy bought a three year old gelding from the Scott Ranch outside Billings hoping to be able to Futurity him. After an average futurity year, Judy tried to convince Rachael to sell "Scotty" or "Turtle" as Judy called him, because she was sure he just didn't have the run it would take to compete at the bigger rodeos. But Rachael wanted to keep him. Just give him one more year she said. At the High School Finals that year Rachael ran a 17.1 and a 17.2 on a regulation pattern. After that Rachael had won the battle, and Scotty had a home. "He is very long strided" says Rachael and "very quiet". "The fastest "slow" horse I've ever ridden" says one of Rachael's best friends. This quiet sorrel gelding took Racheal to the pay

window so many times in 1996 that she won over \$15,000, the most of any NRA member in history.

BREAKAWAY ROPING HORSE OF THE YEAR:

Seven years ago, the Petersens picked up a nice red roan horse they thought might make a good rope horse prospect. Well, after a few acts as a bucking horse at home, one which dislocated Jody Petersen's shoulder, he started to come along. "Peppy" has come along way since those days although Jody says, "He is still a real fresh horse. He has alot of fire". Maybe that is why this awesome horse is the NRA's 1996 Breakaway Horse of the Year. Jody says she feels that Peppy gives her a big advantage. "He is fast and stops hard". Peppy also won Horse of the Year for Jody's College Region and was runner up for Horse of the Year for the Nation.

CALF ROPING HORSE OF THE YEAR:

As one of the best calf horse trainers in Montana, it's not surprising that Arnie Johnson's sorrel horse "Oakie" recieved the calf horse of the year award for 1996. The 10 year-old Doc Bar bred gelding took Arnie to the pay window enough times in 1996 to bring him to the NRA Finals in the number three position with just over \$2,400 won. "He works well on all kinds of calves" says Arnie. "Oakie is real free and I

like that. He gives you a good shot each time and lets you have the chance to place." Oakie actually is owned by Arnie's son Chad. However, Chad travels down the road roping on Arnie's horse, Slick. It seems that the trade works out well for both.

TEAM ROPING HORSES OF THE YEAR:

This year's team roping horses of the year belong to the Dennis Tryan family. Clay and Travis' head horse, "Sugar", a solid bay mare, runs hard and is very solid in the box. Dennis' sorrel heel horse, "Rocky" is always right in there giving Dennis a good advantage for the pay window. The father and son team of Dennis and Clay won over \$6,800 during the regular NRA season and just under \$2,000 during the NRA Finals.

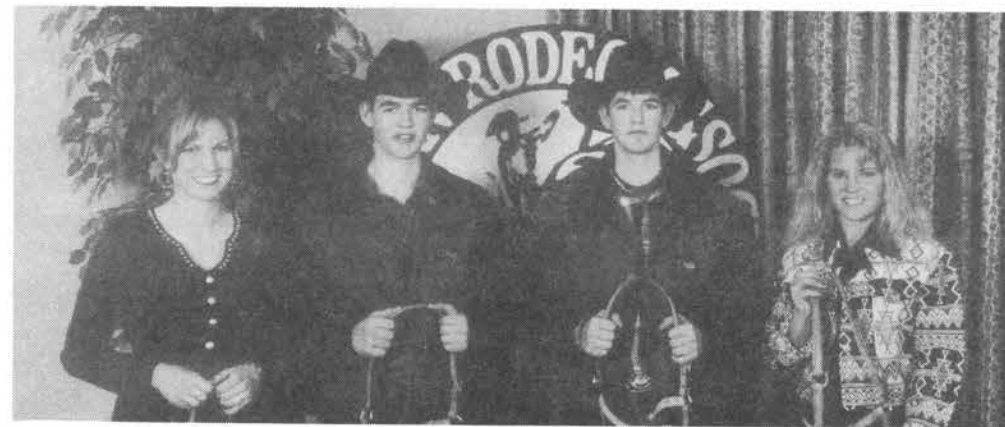

Last two ladies in each performance (slack being considered a performance) are responsible for getting the electric eye to the judge prior to the barrel race. First two ladies to run in each performance (slack being considered a performance) are responsible for taking the eye down after the barrel racing and returning it to the secretary. Failure to do so shall result in a \$25 fine. DEFEATED*****

All contestants shall enter the arena through one gate designated by the judge prior to the barrel race. Any contestant entering the arena through any other gate than the one designated by judge will be disqualified. PASSED UNANIMOUS

The first three contestants in the first performance (slack being considered a performance) are responsible for marking the barrel pattern. If one of the first three is a turnout, the next person on the list is responsible. Failure to do so will result in a \$25 fine. Central Entry to inform first three contestants at the time of call back. Discussion. Amended. The first three contestants in the first performance (slack being considered a performance) are responsible for marking the barrel pattern. If one of the first three is a turnout, the next person on the list is responsible. Central Entry to inform first three contestants at the time of call back. PASSED UNANIMOUS.

In slack, ground throughout the barrel pattern must be worked (not raked) conditions permitting, immediately before and after

the barrel race and after the equivalent number of contestants drawn for a performance. PASSED UNANIMOUS.

The score in the steer wrestling will be the box length minus six (6) feet. This applies to all rodeos unless previously approved by the event director and the stock contractor. Discussion. PASSED.

NEW BUSINESS:

Rhonda Kountz addressed the Board concerning the Breakaway Roping event. The following rule was proposed:

All rodeos will have a "spotter" designated by the judge for the Ladies Breakaway Roping. The "spotter" should be on the opposite side of the arena from the flagger. PASSED.

The following was passed by the General Membership at their meeting held Friday, January 31.

Dick Lyman proposed the following for the Logan Coach Bonus Bucks Program:
Each member purchasing a "Contesting Membership" or "Permit" will pay an additional \$20 along with the membership fee. The NRA Office will mail 4 Logan Coach Bonus Bucks tickets to member. Member can sell tickets for \$5 a piece or keep tickets for themselves. It is the members responsibility to mail stubs from tickets to the NRA Office to be eligible for drawings.

Tootie proposed the following rule clarifications: Additions are underlined.

Add to the last sentence of R.14.12.1 "The timers will also record the times from the stopwatches."

Add a rule "The hand time will be used in the event the electric eye malfunctions." This is in addition to R.14.12.3, about how to proceed with a malfunctioning electric eye 51% of the time.

Rules R.14.12.6 through R.14.12.9 should be moved to general barrel racing rules (above the electric eye rules in the rulebook) and renumbered. ALL ABOVE RULES PASSED BY GENERAL MEMBERSHIP. Discussion. PASSED*****

George Cook updated Board on discussions with Tootie regarding timers getting eyes to judges for the Ladies Barrel Racing. It was decided that timers will be responsible for having eyes ready and getting them to the judges during the rodeo and slack.

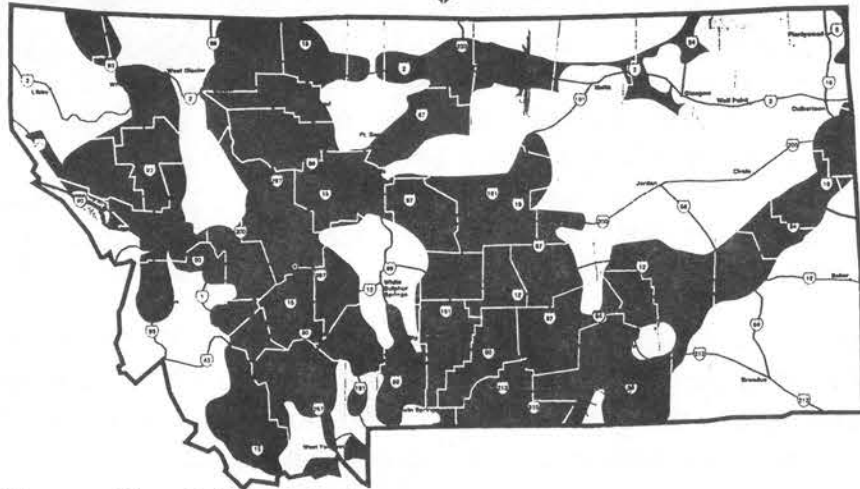

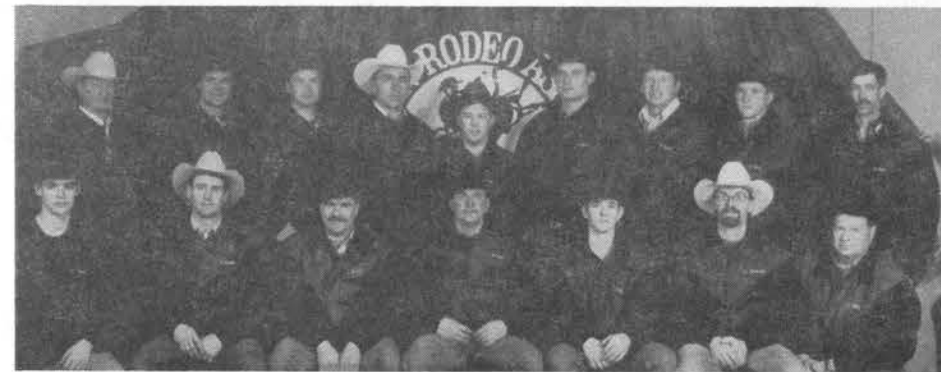
