

 - (e) Preferences you have on when you want to be up.
 - (f) Name of buddy or buddies two per event, six total
- (g) If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.


Keep up the good work, Becky!

Keeping the sport of rodeo alive and well!

Editor's note: The following was written by Bob Feist and reprinted by permission from the Roper's Sports News.

All team ropers should be aware of several animal rights groups that are targeting cruelty to animals in or around roping arenas and rodeo arenas. These groups are very strong and are making a major move to ban these events through legislation.

Our events can and should be policed in our own arenas to ensure that no unnecessary roughness is bestowed upon any animals. Headers and heelers can make a clean run without coming so tight that the steer is brought to the ground. Many of the people are trying to blame the poly rope for causing injury to cattle. However, if the rope is in the hands of the right person he or she can rope feet and provide "give" to the steer throughout the dally.

Ranchers rope and doctor cattle every day without any undo roughness to the animal. Ropers, and especially young up-and-coming ropers need to be taught to respect these animals and learn what unnecessary roughness is.

Some ropers are so cautious of what is going on that they are having group meetings of arena

operators and stock contractors to come up with some alternatives. Some have suggested that the heeler would rope breakaway and the other is that facing would no longer be required to get flagged.

The time could come when the heel rope would come off of the saddle horn.

No one wants rule changes in the sport, however, in today's world there are some people who are not ranch-raised and do not see things the way we do. Use discretion and most of all use you head and be aware of what you are doing with the animals you rope as well as the animals you ride.

This is not something you can just shrug your shoulders and say someone else will take care of , because it is up to us in the industry.

Jack Roddy has been making many public appearances at cattle groups as well as ropings and rodeos to make people aware of the fact that there is someone on the other side. There are other people who are working very hard to prove that our sport should be outlawed. Jack has started that we, as rancher and ropers, can do things within our own house to make sure that cruelty to animals does not take place in our own arenas.

1989 rule changes

The following changes will be included in the new rulebook to be printed in the near future. The Northern Rodeo Association wants all members to be aware of these changes, because nobody really wants to break a rule, right??

PLEASE ADD THE FOLLOWING RULES TO YOUR RULEBOOK:

(Page 7, #9) NON CONTESTING MEMBER-SHIP DUES OF 425 APPLYING TO ALL CONTRACT PERSONNEL, TIMERS, SEC-RETARIES, PICKUP MEN. CONTRACT ACTS, CLOWNS AND ANNOUNCERS.

Delete current Page 7, # 9 ruling.

(Page 16, added to #3 for clarification) WHEN LESS THAN THE NUMBER OF CONTEST-ANTS PLACE IN AN EVENT THAT THE PROPER PAYOFF FOR THAT EVENT, THE PLACES PAID WILL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NUMBERS QUALIFIED. EX-AMPLE: ONE QUALIFIED RECEIVES 100 PERCENT; TWO QUALIFIED 60/40; THREE QUALIFIED 50/30/20; ETC. IF ALL CON-TESTANS FAILR TO QUALIFY, THE EN-TRY FEES AND ADDED MONEY FOR THAT EVENT WILL BE TO THE NRA OFFICE TO BE INCLUDED AS ADDED MONEY FOR THE NRA FINALS RODEO ALLOWING CONTESTANTS TO COMPETE BACK FOR THAT MONEY.

(Page 8, #30) BULL RIDING: THE ENTRY FEES IN THE BULL RIDING EVENT WILL BE SCALED TTO THE ADDED MONEY AS FOLLOWS:

\$100-200 added money \$25 entry fees \$201-400 added money \$35 entry fee \$401-500 added money \$45 entry fee

\$501-750 added money \$50 entry fee

\$751-1000 added money \$75 entry fee \$1001-over added money fees set by

board

(Page 16 under rodeo payoff) FOR THE BULL RIDING EVENT ONLY, THERE WILL BE A SIDEPOT (DAY MONEY) ENTRY FEE OF \$25 IN ADDITION TO THE APPROPRIATE ENTRY FEE FOR THE RODEO. THE ROGI-NAL ENTRY FEE WILL BE INCLUDED WITH THE ADDED MONEY FOR THE RODEO, 3 PERCENT TAKEN OFF, AND PROPER PAYOFFS MADE. THE ADDI-TIONAL \$25 OF "SIDEPOT" (DAYMONEY) ENTRY FEES, LESS 3 PERCENT WILL BE PAID OUT EQUALL TO THE BULL RIDERS WHO QUALIFY IN A GIVEN PERFORM-ANCE, EXAMPLE: 10 BULL RIDERS UP IN A PERFORMANCE, TWO QUALIFY. ALL PAID SIDEPOT DAY MONEY FEES OF \$25. THE SIDEPOT DAY MONEY ENTRY FEES ARE \$25 X \$10 BULL RIDERS = \$250. THREE PERCENT TAKEN OFF THE \$250 - (\$7.50) = \$242.50. THIS TOTAL WILL BE SPLIT EVENLY AMONG THE QUALIFIERS. \$242.50 DIVIDED BY 2 =\$121.25 TO EACH QUALIFIER. THE DAY MONEY WILL COUNT TOWARDS THE ASSOCIATION'S STANDINGS. IF ALL BULL RIDERS IN A PERFORMANCE FAIL TO QUALIFY, A GROUND MONEY SPLIT OF DAY MONEY WILL BE MADE. GROUND SPLIT MONEY WIL NO COUNT FOR ASSOCIATION POINTS. SLACK WILL BE CONSIDERED A PERFORMANCE. \$1 CHARGE PER BULL RIDER WILL BE ASSESSED FOR THE RODEO SECRETARY, IN ADDITION TO THE \$25 DAY MONEY FEE.


