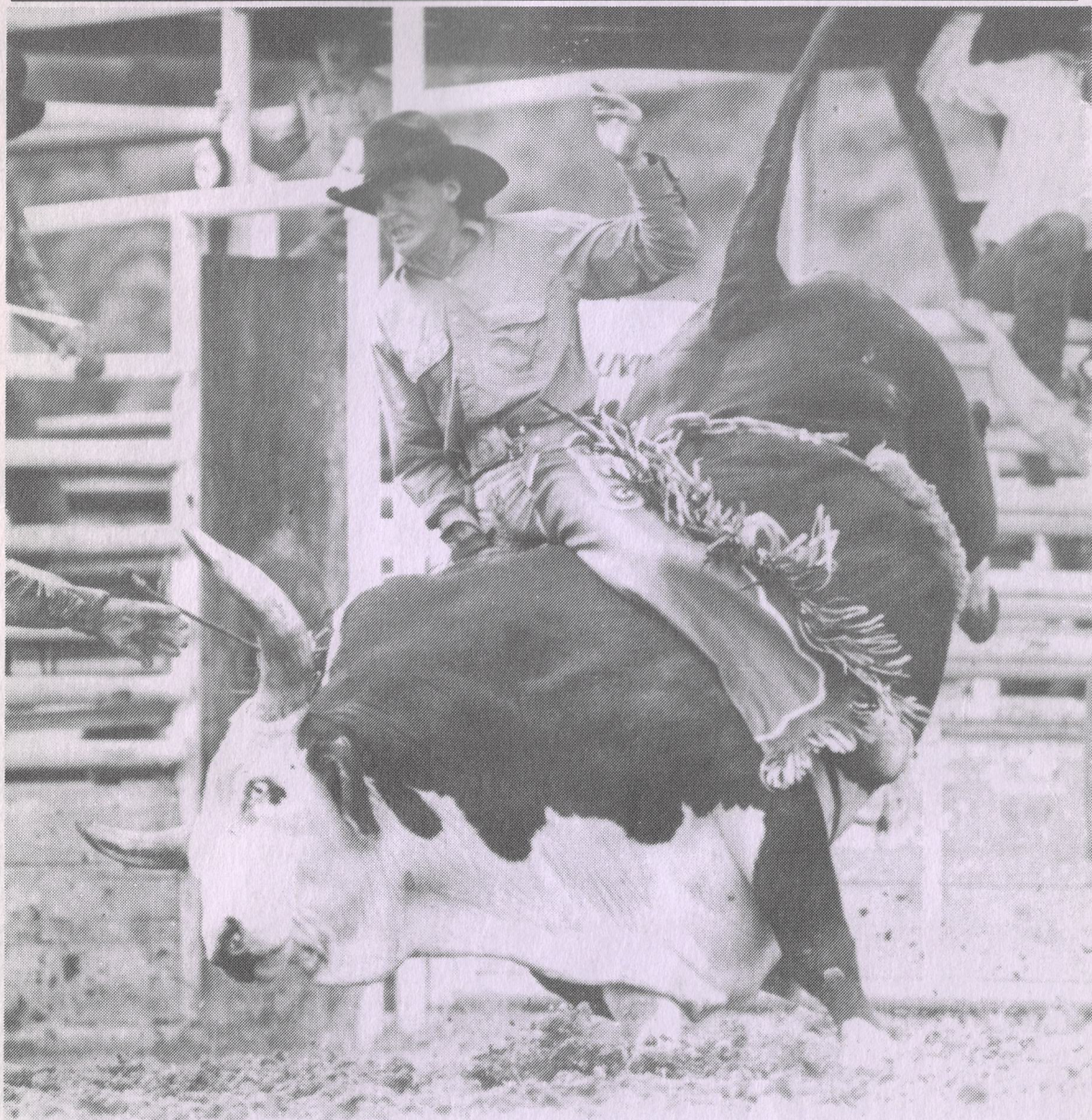

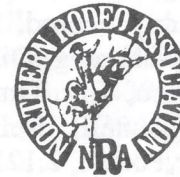

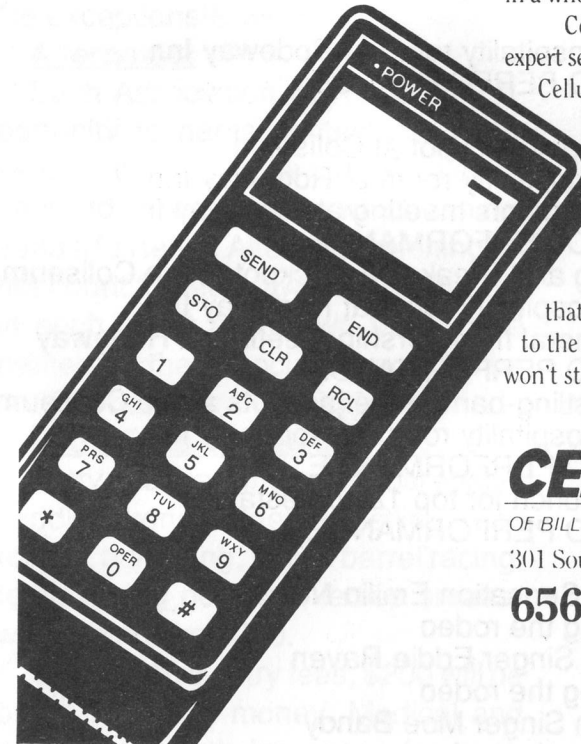

Of the above entry fees, \$200 will be put in the prize money. Medical and accidental death insurance for each

contests is an additional \$3. This cost is mandatory and will be added to each person's entry fees. (This is per person and not per event.) This money collected with the entry fees.

**Added money**

The roping will be entered two times with a different partner; \$50 per man; three steers progressive after one and the top 12 teams including the splits will come back to rope their final steer during the rodeo performance the night of the roping. The roping will be Saturday, Nov. 3, starting at 10 a.m. Entries should be sent in with the regular CWFR entries. However, late entries will be accepted the day of the roping with a late charge \$5 per man.

#### Jackpots:

Timed event jackpots will be at the Coliseum beginning Friday, Nov. 2 with an open team roping. Additional jackpots will be held throughout the week with a full schedule posted at the coliseum.

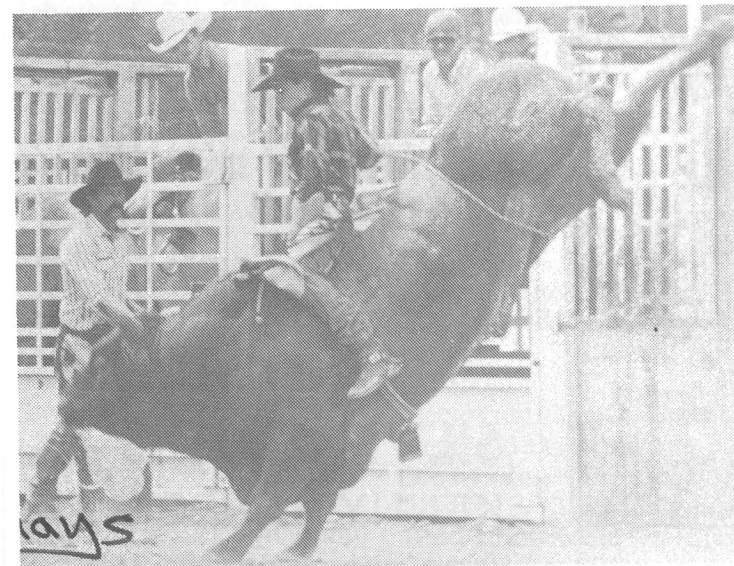
