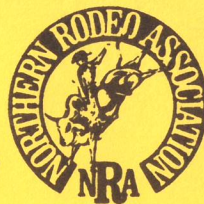
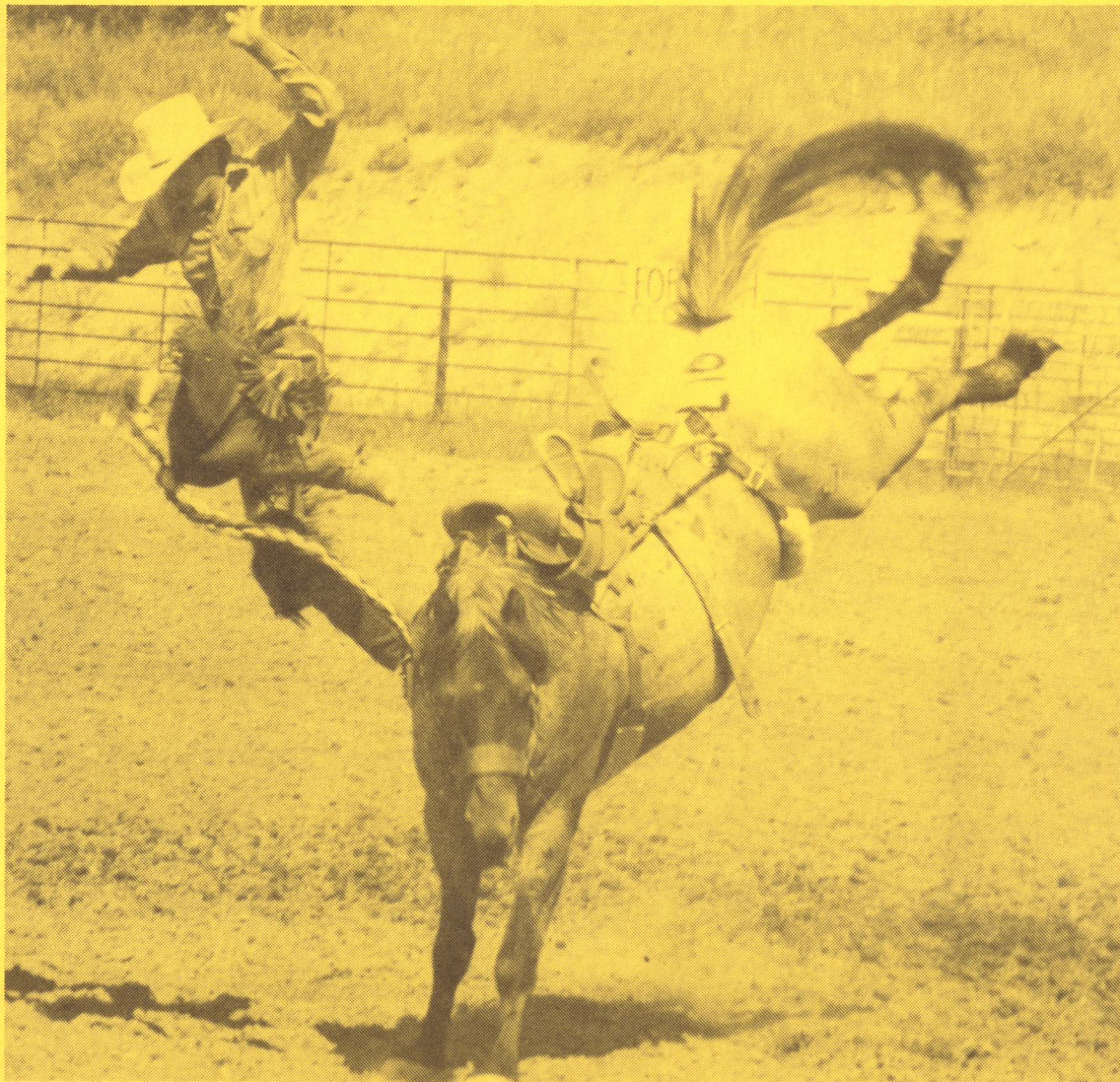

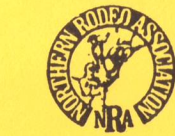

Forsyth plans fun

This year, the dates for the 84th Rosebud-Treasure County Fair is July 30th thru Aug. 2nd. A county fair is never complete without a rodeo. The Small Rodeo Co. has lined up good livestock, and a fast paced program, according to Dale Small. Grand entry is at 1 pm on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, and the flags will be presented.

Stan Rasmussen, from Choteau, is the announcer and entertains the crowd with humor and his basic knowledge of rodeos. The bull fighter is Justin Hawks of Billings, who also doubles as the rodeo clown.

Two local horse races are to be run on Saturday and Sunday, and the winners will be in the Rosebud-Treasure County Derby on Sunday. Contestants must be 16 years or older, and purses will be awarded for each race. Pre-registration is on July 31st from 9 am to noon at the fair office.

An exciting event is the rookie bareback, that gives young persons a chance to compete in a professional rodeo. The purse is \$100 and the entry fee is \$20.

The Pepsi Challenge barrel race event assures the audience of action when the horse and rider race around the barrels. Pepsi has added an additional \$200 purse to the event.

This year, the Rosebud Sidesaddlers are looking forward to performing a new and interesting routine. The group has been formed for a number of years, and includes some mother-daughter members.

One of the races on Sunday is the sidesaddle quarter mile race. Due to the body weight and saddle placement on the horse, the race is run from the back side of the track around in front of the grandstand.

Also, on Saturday, the Indian relay race is scheduled. It is sponsored by the Northern Cheyenne Chamber of Commerce of Lame Deer, and all contestants are members of the tribe.

Tami Taylor of Colstrip, Miss Rosebud County 1993, will be riding in the grand entry each day.

MEMBERSHIP: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos without restrictions, to share all advantages of a member in good standing including such items as a guarantee of your entry fee; check writing privileges after the first year initiation period; and a subscription to the newsletter.

NEWSLETTER: The official publication of the NRA featuring current data regarding the Association and NRA sanctioned rodeos, information of all association business, as well as interesting news articles and exciting photos.

PERMITS: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos accepting permits as listed in the newsletter until \$500 is won. After \$500 money limit is won by permit holder, a card must be purchased. The price of card to be the dollar difference between the cost of a permit and the cost of the card. Permit holder's points will be credited to the yearend standings, however, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the NRA Finals. The \$500 money limit will be accumulated from year to year, allowing the contestant to purchase a permit each year until the \$500 is won. A card holder the previous year cannot purchase a permit the following year.

Back side of application must be completed to guarantee processing of membership application.

RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Northern Rodeo Association sanctioned events and membership in the Association, I and my heirs, successors, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE and agree to HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Northern Rodeo Association, the rodeo committees, stock contractors, sponsors, arena operations or owners, their agents, representatives (collectively referred to as the NRA) from all liability to me and my personal representatives, heirs, successors, and next of kin from and all claims and liability for all loss of damage, and any claim of damages therefore on account of any injury to my person including death or damage to my property while I am utilizing NRA facilities or participating in NRA events.

I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

I UNDERSTAND AND AGREE THIS RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to ACCIDENT, INJURY, OR DEATH OCCURRING DURING THE TERM OF MY MEMBERSHIP IN THE NRA. Any subsequent Releases and agreement I might sign in the future shall amplify, but shall in no way limit, the provisions of this document.

I further state and certify that I have carefully read the foregoing Release, know the contents thereof and sign this Release and Agreement Not to Sue as a free and voluntary act. I am not relying on any statements of representations of any party released hereby. I UNDERSTAND THIS IS A RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS.

THROUGH BIG SKY RODEO CENTRAL ENTRY

DIAL 406-428-2205

A. Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. Unless otherwise advertised.

B. Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

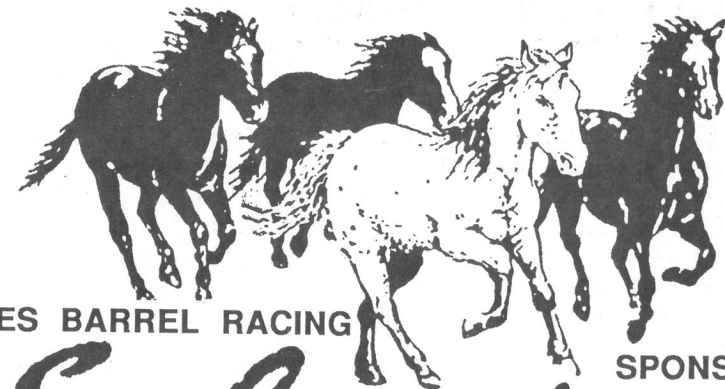
1. Name of rodeo
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your Name.
4. The event or events you wish to enter.
5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies - two per event, six total.
7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. to find out when you are up.

C. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, are recorded on tape, and each cowboy is given verification number for that conversation.

YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING THEIR FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, it costs an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

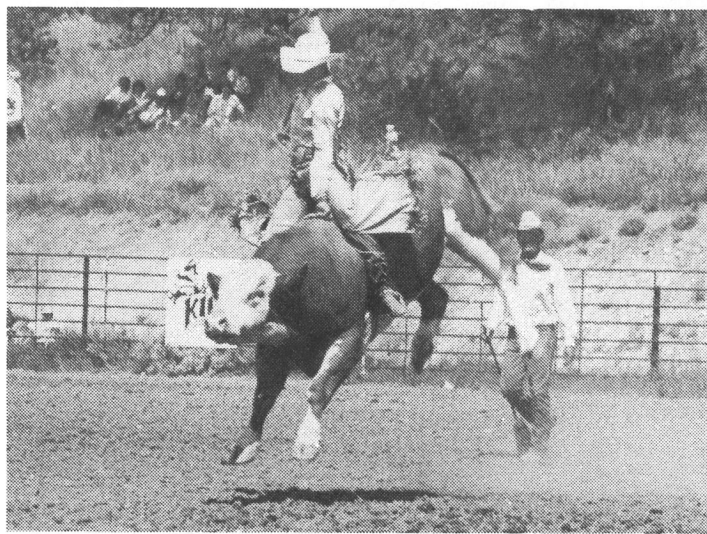

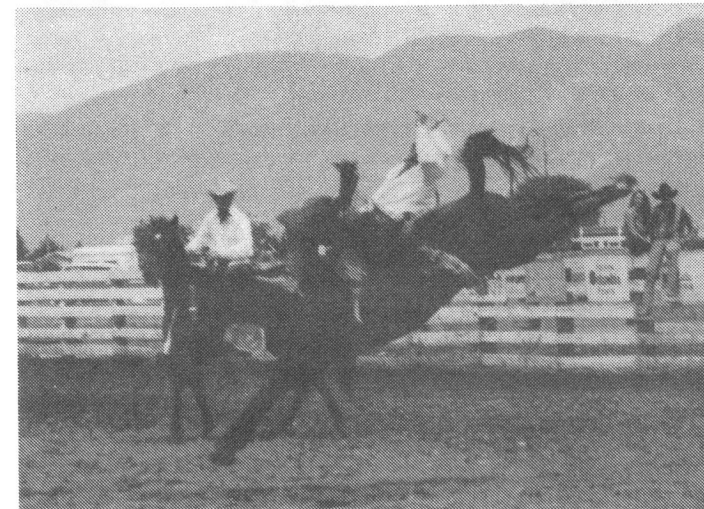

NRA rulings and procedures on Trade-outs/ Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are tradeout rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADEOUTS."

Trades: A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved, before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

Note: A new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of *two hours* before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

Turnouts: As stated in the rule book, if a

contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. **Notified turnout:** If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary/judge/contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors/judges/secretaries/spectators/announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.
