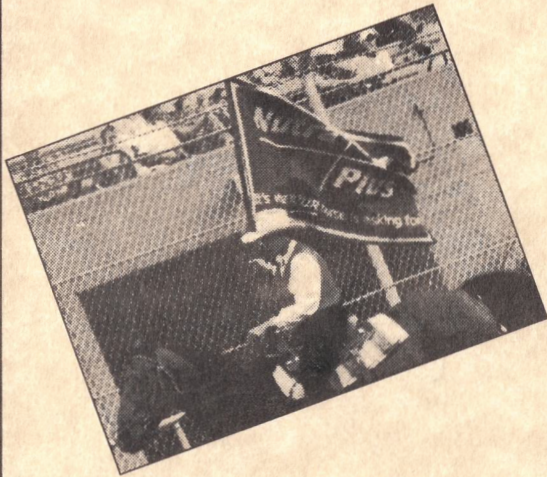

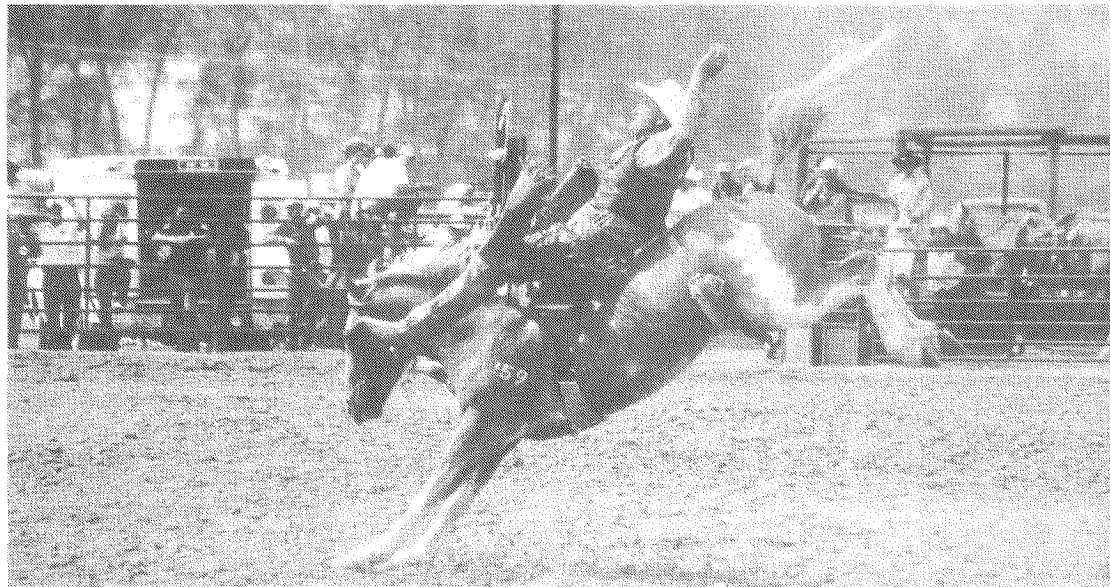

Entries will be taken on Wednesday, January 3rd, 9 am to 5 pm. Contestants must enter during this time. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!!

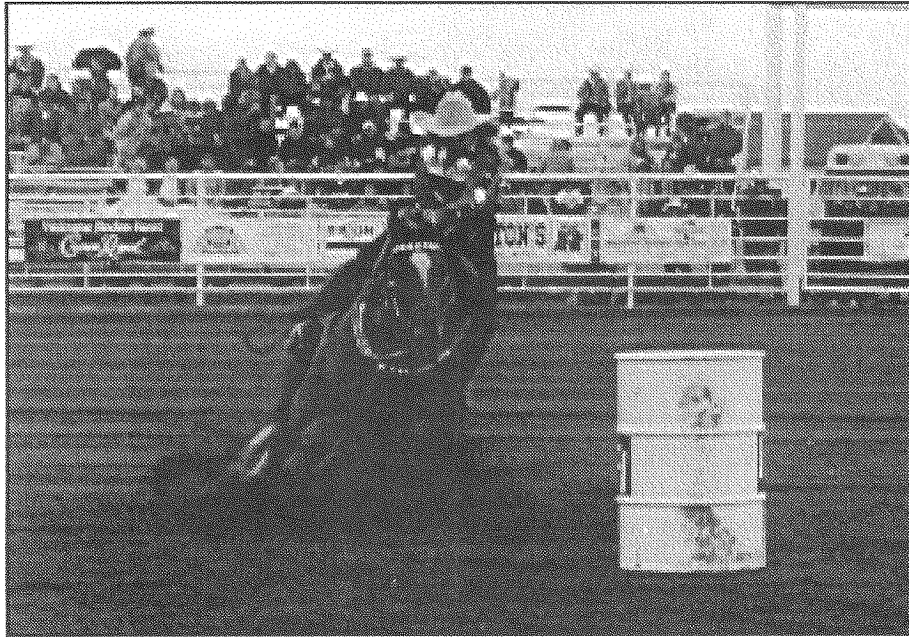

Mark is also proud of announcing at World's Greatest Horsemen, Riverfront Farms Derby, American Paint Horse Shows,

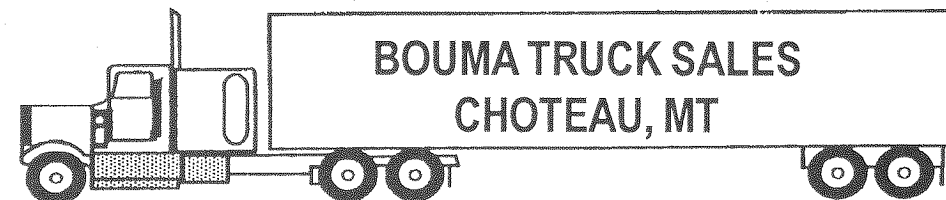

In Memory of Charlie Pierce

The Northern Rodeo Association/Northern Women's Rodeo Association is deeply saddened by the loss of one of the best cowboys and dedicated committee men in the association, Charlie Pierce.

Charlie Pierce passed away Thursday, July 20, at his home of natural causes.

Charlie had been an active member of the Meagher County Rodeo Club since 1985 after moving to White Sulphur Springs. He never held any office within the club, but he was active in helping with the construction of the calf chutes on the south end, the arena fence, and the rough stock pens behind the bucking chutes.

The rodeo grounds were Charlie's second home from May 1st to October 1st each year.

When the rodeo stock arrived on the grounds, Charlie and Ben Heriem were the "Official" caretakers. He fed the rodeo stock, watered and worked the ground for all events throughout the year. As quoted by Willard Bernhardt, "Charlie was the

most dependable tractor man we ever had, I don't know where we'll find another one."

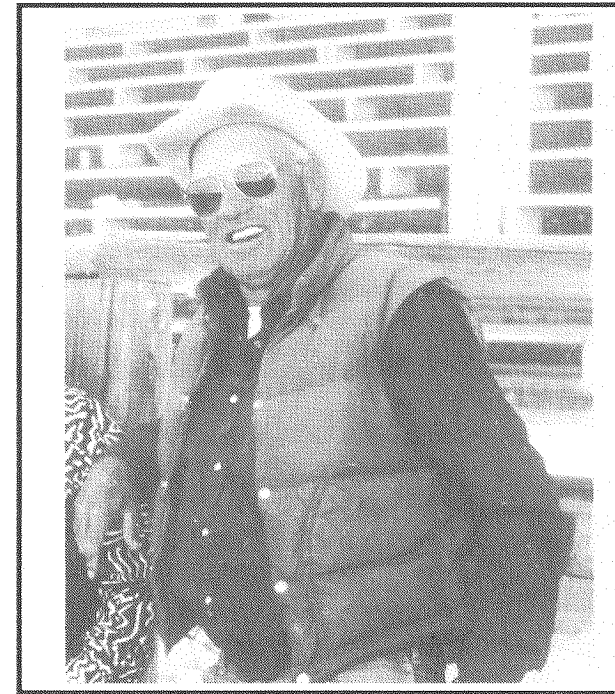
Every Labor Day, Charlie could be found with his hearty laugh and smile running the small gate at the north end to let the rough stock contestants in and out. He was supportive in the calcutta held during

the rodeo. Charlie was also active in all the kids' events held here, either helping set up or maybe helping judge an event.

A celebration of Charlie's life was held at the Meagher County Rodeo grounds in White Sulphur Springs Wednesday, July 26th. Many, many people turned out to celebrate Charlie's life at his second home, the Meagher County Rodeo grounds.

Charlie gave so much to the Rodeo Club and never asked for anything in return. He will be greatly missed by all.

Memorials can be made to the Charlie Pierce Memorial Fund at First National Bank, P.O. box 709, White Sulphur Springs, MT. 59645, which will be used to help purchase a sound system for the high school gymnasium.

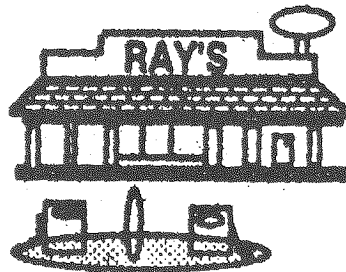

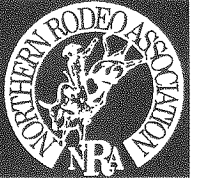

MEMBERSHIP: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos without restrictions, to share all advantages of a member in good standing including such items as a guarantee to your entry fee; check writing privileges after the first year initiation period; and a subscription to the newsletter.

PERMITS: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos accepting permits as listed in newsletter until \$500 is won. After \$500 money limit is won by permit holder, a card must be purchased, the price of card to be the dollar difference between the cost of a permit and the cost of the card. Permit holder's points will be credited to the year-end standing, however, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the NRA Finals.
