individual rodeo. Information about each sponsor as well as sponsor's slogans are provided to each NRA announcer in their announcer's handbooks.



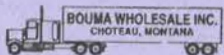
Each sponsor is included on 10,000 NRA/NWRA rodeo schedules.

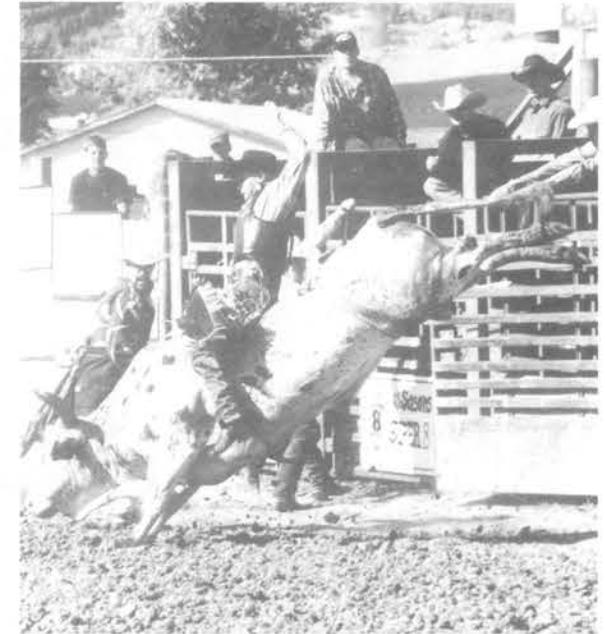
Deepest Sympathy

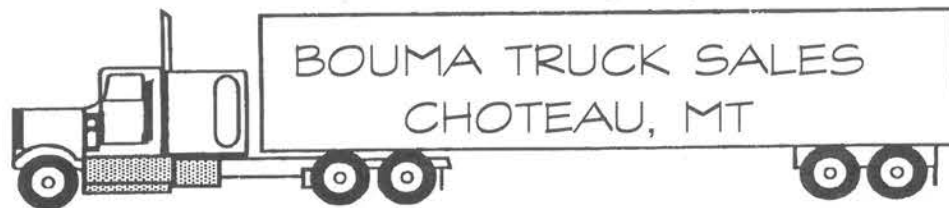

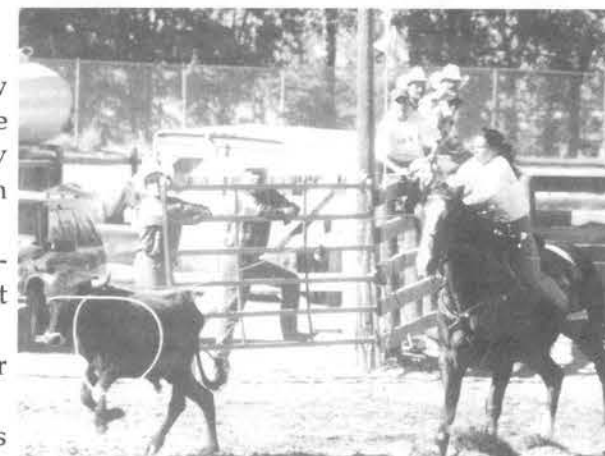

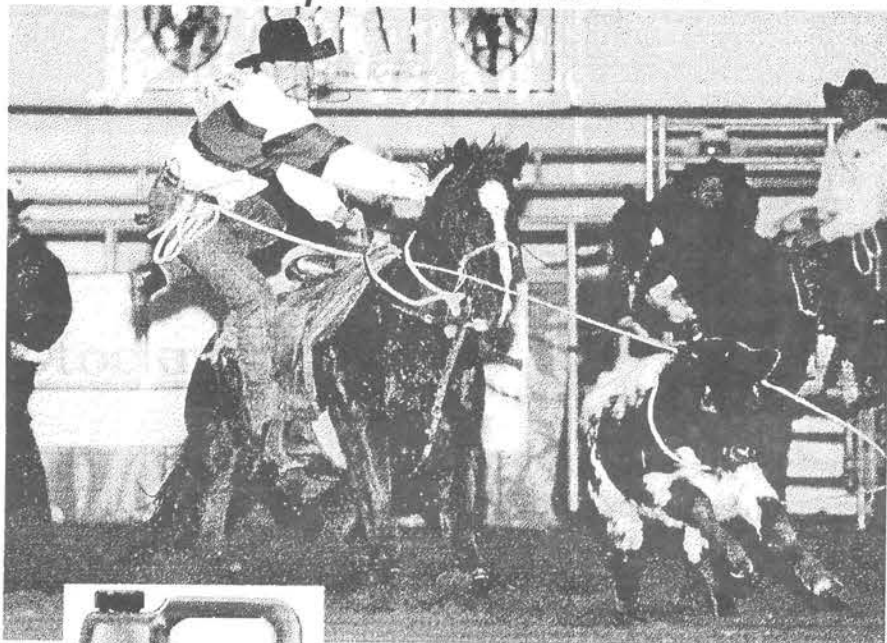
"What Would You Say"

Cowboys' Toys to Expand Wholesale Accounts

Cowboys' Toys maker of top-quality custom leather horse tack and rodeo gear, is seeking to expand its business through an increase in wholesale accounts with retail stores around the country. The Cowboy Craftsmen of Cowboys' Toys hand-craft headstalls, reins, breast collars, cinches and other tack and accessories out of fine Hermann Oak harness leather.

Owner/Craftsman Dale Lane acquired his leather-crafting skills in the '80's out of sheer necessity while working as a ranch foreman. Word-of-mouth soon spread about the quality

of Dale's work, and in 1989 Cowhorse Equipment contracted him to build their leather tack. Before long, Dales' growing business forced him to quit the ranch, and in 1991 "Cowboys' Toys" was born, opening at 208 Main St. SW, downtown metropolitan Ronan, Montana!

James Cole is national high school saddle bronc champion

On Sunday August 8, family and friends gathered at the Bull 'n' Bear Saloon for a party to honor the Carbon-Stillwater Rodeo Team and especially James Cole, who won the saddle bronc riding title at the recent 1999 National High School Rodeo finals in Gillette, Wyo.

Cole, the son of Tom and Donna Cole of Red Lodge, reported that he has been riding bronc for just four years. "I never really rode before my freshman year," he said.

Unlike ropers, who can practice at any time, Cole said, he has no broncs to ride and so practices in actual rodeo competition. He also watches tapes of top performers such as his personal favorite, Red Lodge resident and former world champion Deb Greenough, and exercises to keep in shape. "I don't know Deb that well, but he's given me a few tips when I've seen him," he said.

The road to the national high school finals - the largest rodeo in the world, with 1,580 athletes competing in 12 performances over an eight-day period - begins with qualifying rodeos through the previous fall and spring. The cumulative cowboys and cowgirls advance to the state finals, and the top four finishers of the 38 participating states and four Canadian provinces earn a trip to the national finals.

At the finals, bronc riders ride twice to determine the top 20 riders, who advance to the one-ride "short go" round. Cole said that he watched all the bronc riding events and tried to remember the individual horses and how they tended to

behave. "We were kind of lucky because we'd got to see some of the head at the state finals. There were a lot of good horses there, including some pro stock.

For his first ride, Cole drew Copenhagen Crow, a horse he described as "twice my age - a good veteran horse to ride." Cole's 66 points put him in second place after the first round, and he scored a third-place 65 on his second ride, aboard a horse called Molly. "She was real nice to ride," Cole said. "I got lucky. A lot of horses bucked really hard - the eliminators. Molly was pretty smooth."

His total of 131 points tied Cole with Arizona cowboy Jeff Cavey heading into the short go in which they again tied and were named co-champions. Cole rode a horse called Tomcat for a score of 59. "He's a good horse," Cole commented. "He didn't have a good trip with me as he usually does, but I was happy to end up tied with Jeff. I got to know him a bit down there, and he's a real good kid."

This summer Cole is keeping in top form by competing on the Montana amateur circuit. He will enter college rodeos this fall and next spring, with his eye on making it to the college finals. "I'm just going to keep on riding," he said.

Serious business

There's no clowning around in specialized rodeo school

Being brave is easy. Being funny is not. Anyone can throw himself in front of a one-ton, four-hooved stick of dynamite. But not everyone can get a hot, sweaty audience to laugh in unison.

To help bullfighters elicit more smiles from the audience, Duane Reichert and Shawn Penrod—under the direction of Stan Steen—offered a rodeo clown school Sunday at Metra.

The school attracted six hopefuls—from as far away as Washington and Missouri—who paid \$125 to learn how to fight bulls and be funny simultaneously. The group included 15-year-old Ben Swanz of Columbus, there under the watchful eye of his mother, to 46-year-old machinist John Sheppard of Lacey, Wash.

A majority of the six—Lee Webber of Laurel, Sheppard and Missoula's Tom Plovanic, along with Mike Prince and Garan Bridges of Missouri—have already worked in some capacity in the rode arena as a barrelman or bullfighter.

"I'm here to pick up the comedy," said Webber, who works as a rodeo clown for the Big Sky Bull Bash series held around the state and Wyoming. "To learn some new things from Duane. This is just a hobby, not a profession."

"We don't have rodeo clowns where

we're at," added Prince, who drove 24 hours straight with Bridges and another friend to reach Billings from Dexter, MO. "Besides, we didn't have anything else to do this weekend."

Reichert is a long-time rodeo clown/barrelman from New Underwood, S.D. Penrod, of Miles City, has been one of the top bullfighters in the Northern Rodeo Association the past six years.

Steen said the NRA put on a school back in 1972 to help then would-be bullfighters hone their skills, and in turn, make rodeos a better product.

"There is definitely a void for comedy in the arena," Reichert said. "You can't teach someone to be funny. But you can spark ideas into their head."

The all-day class—it started at 8 a.m. and ran

through mid-afternoon—began with Reichert in street clothes addressing the students. All sat attentively in chairs, some taking notes. As Reichert spoke about makeup, props, and jokes, he slowly transformed himself into a rodeo clown.

"Like ranching, rodeo is a family affair. Use good judgement," reminded Reichert. "You've got to be careful of whatever you do or say. Don't get too deep into things like religion. Don't get too deep into anything."

"Make fun with people. Not fun of people."

"There is definitely a void for comedy in the arena," Reichert said.

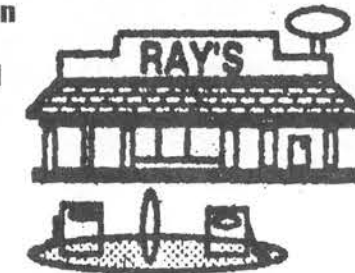

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

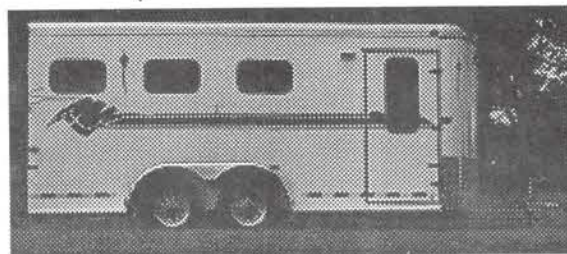

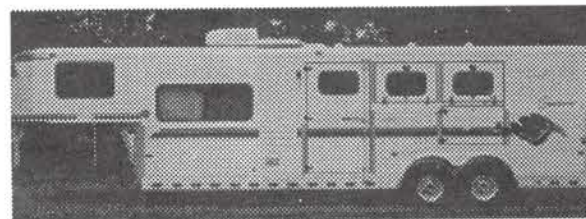

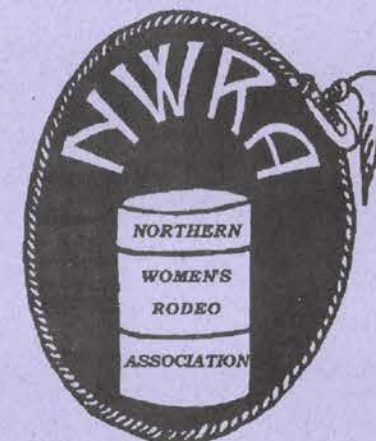
