

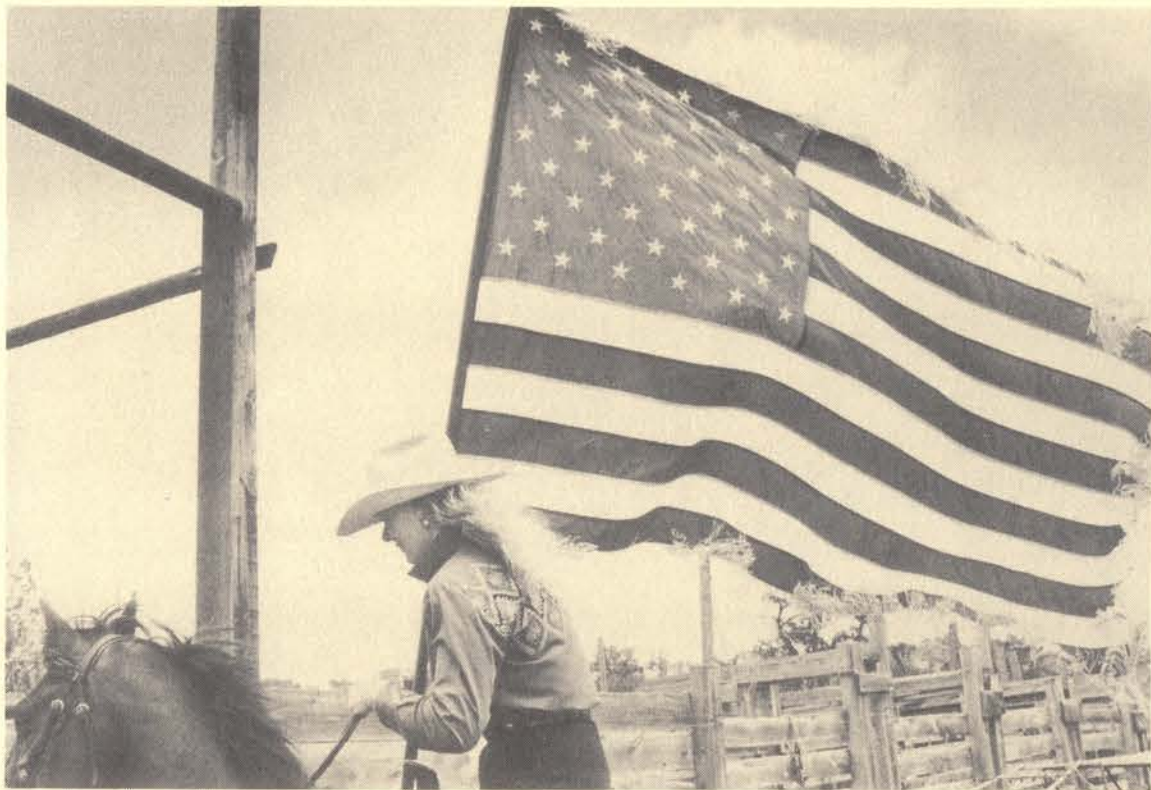

## CHATting WITH CHUCK ABOUT SPORTS MEDICINE...

### Participating When Hurt

There is an old saying in sports that an athlete needs to learn the difference between being hurt and being injured. Most cowboys want to compete, even if it hurts. Most cowboys cannot compete effectively if truly injured especially if the injured part is critical to their event. For example, you can ride with a casted fractured arm, if it is your free arm.

There is a problem in that, as with most things, there exists a gray area between being hurt and experiencing routine pain; as opposed, to being injured and experiencing dangerous pain. To attempt to compete with real dangerous pain may carry lasting consequences; whereas, to attempt to compete with discomfort on routine pain generally will not result in significant lasting consequences. If you are unsure of the status of a potential injury get help from a health care professional that understands the sport. Beware of denial - just because you cannot afford to be injured does not mean you are not injured! If your friends or other caring individuals think you need to get help with a problem, it is probably good advice. Another criteria to help you decide if you should attempt to continue to enter or if you would be better off to go home and heal up is that you cannot perform the skills nec-

essary to your event such that you are wasting good draws, then you are into the deal of diminishing returns.

Having said the above, let's talk about tolerating routine pain and/or discomfort. Some people can definitely tolerate pain more so than others. Some get very adept at blocking out the pain message. There are sports psychologists who advise that pain is an opinion similar to fear and that everyone is unique in how they handle them. Each has the potential to be stifling and debilitating if not handled properly. Stay focused, if you rodeo you expect to hurt, but success is worth it. Besides, the routine pain/discomfort I'm referring to "only lasts a little while".

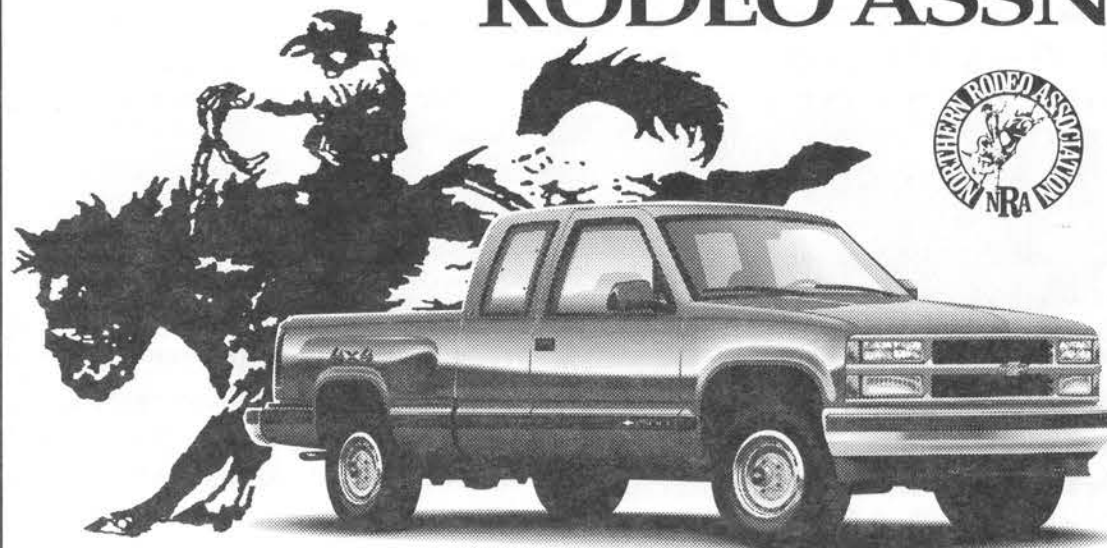
In closing, attitude is a very important part of health care. You have to believe in your own ability to influence personal healing and to participate at an appropriate level, even if it hurts some. Acknowledge your pain, but take control of your situation. Don't give in if you are just hurt; but, if you are truly injured seek out and accept good advice.

Midseason of the 1995 rodeo year is already here and there are some things that should be brought to your attention.

1. The dress code has not been waived because of the hot weather. Remember that you must have western attire on at all times in the arena during slack and all performances and this includes sitting around the roping box. Rough stock contestants need to pay attention to the people helping them, they must be dressed in western attire also. Fines will be assessed to the contestants that don't adhere to this rule.

2. Barrel racers, the judges are going to fine the girls that are responsible for having the electric eye to the judges and taking it back to the rodeo office, if they don't do their part. Please try to make this work or we will have to go back to the barrel racers setting up the electric eye.

3. I have recommended to all the judges to find an impartial spotter in the Breakaway Roping. This is on a trial basis to hopefully

solve some of the problems with legal catches in the breakaway roping.

In closing we have alot of rookie judges this year and some are going to be good judges with more experience. So let's all try to work with them and help them learn and improve as the year goes on. I know that there will be mistakes but try to help these individuals as much as you can and remember that everyone is only human and mistakes can be made unintentionally.

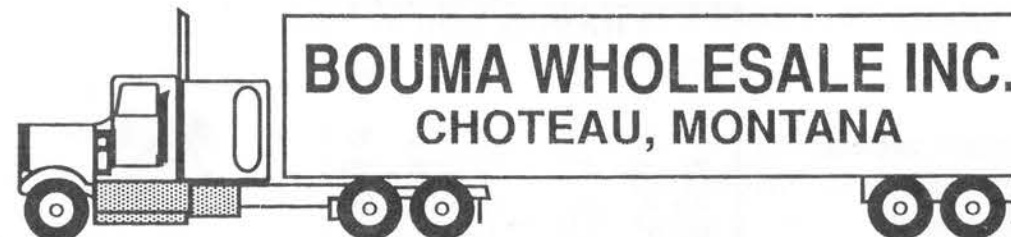

# NORTH AMERICAN RODEO UPDATE!

## Remarks by Governor David M. Beasley World Finals Rodeo Conference June 23, 1995

It's great to be here to throw my support behind an event set to become one of South Carolina's biggest tourism draws...the World Finals Rodeo. North Charleston is about to become host to some of the world's biggest daredevils!

The good people of this state already have to put up with a couple of folks in the Governor's Mansion who keep trying to break their necks!

Holding onto the back of a bucking bronco has to be pretty dangerous and life-threatening stuff, but trust me when I say...that's nothing next to me on a motorbike!

Of course, I'm not a professional like the rest of the cowboys heading our way this fall. But I do know one thing: we landed a big one when we got the World Finals Rodeo.

North Charleston is about to become the new home to one of the biggest rodeo championships there is...the Super Bowl of the North American Rodeo Commission...and the biggest this side of the Mississippi. We're talking about an eight million dollar impact on our state, complete with national TV coverage.

And by expanding into South Carolina, the Commission will be able to double the size of this event and triple the prize money. That's enough incentive to lure competitors from around the world, including Mexico, Canada and Australia.

They'll come to North Charleston to rope and ride and vacation. That's some vacation, if you ask me! But nonetheless, they're coming and they're bringing their families and their fans.

Charleston may be a far cry from the wild west, but I have no doubt that this event will find a home in South Carolina. We've got more in common than some might think.

Not many people realize this, but the horse industry puts about 360 million dollars into our economy every year, making it one of our state's largest agricultural commodities. We've actually got more horses per capita than Texas! So we're excited about the possibilities that this caliber of rodeo will open up for us in horse-related industries.

And of course, North Charleston has the tourism base, the sights to see and a facility with room to grow, all of which will mean big business for the future of this event. Quite simply, South Carolina has what it takes to put on the best rodeo on the eastern seaboard.

Who knows, the rodeo may recruit a whole new rodeo fan club in the state. After all, the top grossing event at Madison Square Garden in all of 1992 wasn't a tennis tournament or

a concert. It was a rodeo. So if New York City can do it, Charleston can.

I understand that North Charleston has Chief Greenberg to thank for the rodeo's decision to end up there. He took on the duties of Rodeo Chairman at the SCLEOA not just out of the goodness of his heart. He wanted this event in his town. And in an area that's staging a comeback from base closure, we're thrilled to see this kind of long-term economic commitment in the Lowcountry.

And of course, we can't say enough about the boost this is going to give our law enforcement officers statewide. Half of the proceeds of this week-long event go straight to the state Law Enforcement Officers Association to help families of fallen officers, to put officers through specialized training and fund college scholarships.

Our law enforcement efforts will be stronger and the citizens of this state better protected because of the World Finals Rodeo.

It's the kind of event that does good all the way around. It supports our law enforcement professionals, it pours new tourism dollars into our economy and it gives families something fun to share together.

And today I'm proud to welcome the World Finals Rodeo to the South Carolina family.

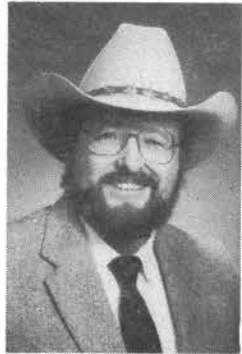

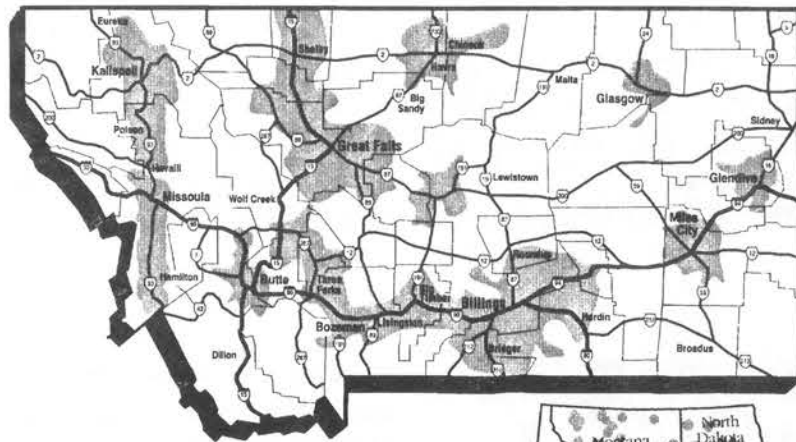

lot of folks will have a chance to meet face to face with the broadcasters that they tune in to every day."

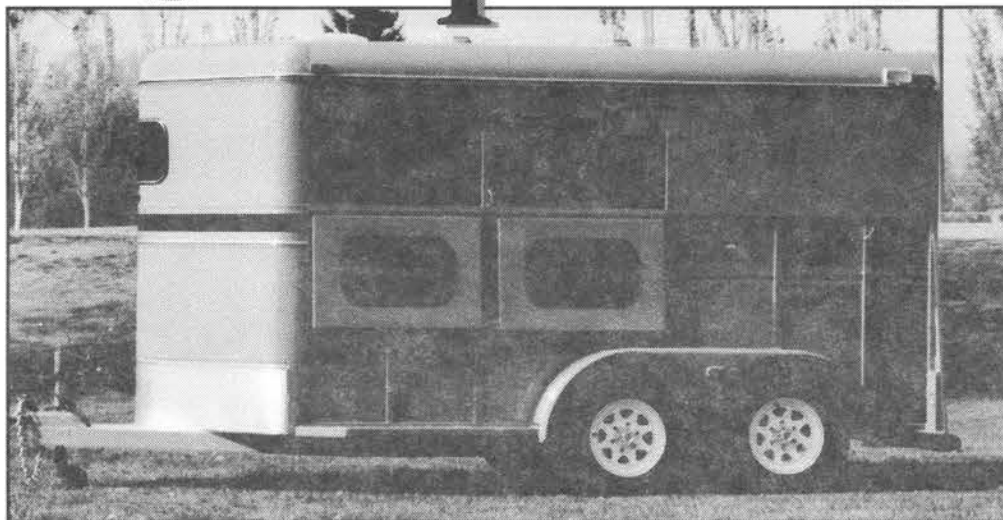

## Home Town Cowboy Herb Harris Wins Big At Polson Rodeo

Pocketing almost \$1,200 during the 14th Annual KERR Country Rodeo in Polson, hometown cowboy Herb Harris had a sweet 8 mile drive home.

Harris came back into the short round in all three timed events. Breaking the barrier in the calf roping cost Harris a sizable check but as his steer hit the Polson arena to win the average in the steer wrestling and \$900, Harris mounted his head horse to spin one for traveling partner Bob Schall. The duo turned in a 4th place short round time and captured 4th in the average for another \$295 for a total of \$1,196 of the over \$24,000 total rodeo payoff.

"I like the big arena and the longer score at Polson," said Harris. He also commented that he liked having two runs. "You have to try to be consistent rather than fast on one."

Harris first began rodeoing when he was 13 or 14 years old. He went to quite a few rodeos until about 4 or 5 years ago and then spent more time on the ranch and hitting the rodeos that were close to home. When his son Josh started showing interest in rodeo, Harris pulled his rodeoing outfit back out of semi-retirement and headed down the trail. His daughter Stacy and wife Violet also run barrels.

Last year Harris qualified for the NRA Finals in the calf roping event. This year he plans to keep going as long as he keeps winning money. "I plan to hit most of the NRA rodeos

that are close enough to drive to," said Harris. "I am traveling with Bob Schall this year. Now that he is ranching too, and not wanting to go as hard as he used to, it's been working well for both of us."

Schall was another big winner at Polson. In addition to his fourth place team roping finish he also took home \$424 in the bareback riding including his first place average. This gave the all-around hand \$720 in KERR Country Rodeo winnings.

Winning the women's all-around division was Mary Salmund of Choteau. Salmund pocketed \$906 over the three days of competition. She won the breakaway roping average and \$720 combined with \$186 in barrel racing checks.

The barrel racing championship runs were turned in by Eureka cowgirl Sandi Nordahl as she claimed \$791. She won the long go, fourth in the short go and captured the top spot in the average.

The junior barrels were dominated by Jackie Jo Smith of Ronan. The cowgirl won the long go, short go and average to take home \$182.40.

Another three number one winner was Zeb Lytle in the junior breakaway roping. Lytle turned in an identical run of 3.9 to win both rounds and the average.

Mike Barthelme came back into the short go ranked 8th out of the top 10. With a 9.9 time in the short round and a total time of 22.6, Barthelme moved to the top winning both the short round and average and pocketing \$642. Jason Levine of Wolf Creek was able to claim more of the prize money with his first

place finish in the long round, fourth in the short and second in the average for a total take of \$773.

The saddle bronc riding title went to Corvallis cowboy Joe Reynolds. He and his brother Josh split 3/4 in the long round, but Joe came back in the short round, splitting 1/2 with Trevor Moss of Ronan giving Joe the total to claim top in the average and \$473. Winning \$505 in the bronc riding was past NRA champion, Kent Robbins of Dillon. Robbins won the long round, split 3/4 in the short round and won second in the average for his share of the saddle bronc riding payoff.

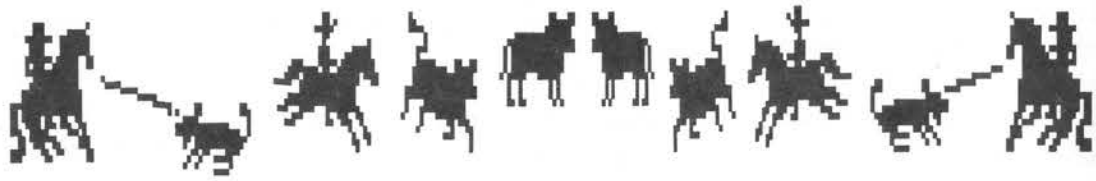
The bareback riding saw Marty Buckingham winning the most money with \$505.

Buckingham finished the first round in the number one position. Finishing 3/4 in the short round the cowboy ended the rodeo second behind Bob Schall of Arlee.

The largest event payoff in the rodeo was the bull riding with a total \$4,224, and Zane Fitzpatrick pocketed \$1,085 over the three days. Fitzpatrick rode Rocky Mountain Rodeo's "H8 Sun Dog" to a 76 point first place finish in the first round. He came back on "#250 Wild Thing" for third place and first in the average. Winning the short round on RMR's "#8 Beetle Juice", Billings cowboy Dan Plummer was another high money earner at the rodeo as he cashed in on \$898.

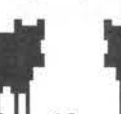
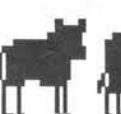

# MAX

There is a champion in the NRA that has not had his name in the headlines before. This champion is an unregistered super horse named Max that stands less than 14 hands high. He has taught four families to love the competition of rodeo.

No one is real sure of Max's age, but Stacey Baumann's dad, Ed Waldhauser, bought him as a two-year old from Mike McCoy of Laurel when Stacey was 6 or 7 years old.

"He was too small and skinny for anybody besides Stacey, he acted gentle, so she got on him with a snaffle bit and went to work on him," says Waldhauser. "He was a phenomenon; the first time she went around the barrels, he turned and never forgot which way to go." Stacey "lived" on this horse for six or seven years at junior rodeos, NRA junior events, and high school rodeos. She and Max won the YRA Championship and the NRA Junior All Around. Stacey borrowed Max from Wilhelms while she was college rodeoing to try to get some all around points.

"We think that he is out of an Appaloosa mare and by an Old Tom Cat stud that belonged to the late Maurice Murphy of Scobey," says Waldhauser. "He was a super-doooper pole horse, a good goat and rope horse too. But he was an ornery bugger to have around. When we sold him to Wilhelms, I told them not to turn him out with other horses. Well, he parked their old horses in a corner of their pasture!"

"Max could open all the latches to all

the gates and barn doors like he had a key to everything on the place. He could go wherever he wanted, whenever he wanted. We had to put chains on everything to keep him in," says Waldhauser.

"One day while I was holding up his front foot putting on a shoe, he picked up his hind foot and scratched his cheek," says Waldhauser. "He is so athletic and has perfect balance...he is a winner. If he could have packed more weight, it's hard to tell how far he would have gone. He was a natural from scratch."

In the goat tying he would stand over Stacey and watch her tie as if he was coaching her. He must have decided the tie was satisfactory, because later he went to playing and bucking in circles around and around the goat.

He has never been sick, never hurt, never any leg problems, a real survivor. He must have been hungry once in his life, because he is very protective of his feed. The other horses left him alone while he was eating.

Wilhelm's of White Sulphur Springs were the second rodeo family to enjoy Max's talents. "There are nine saddles here that are mostly due to Max," says Margaret Wilhelm, mother of Patti Jo and Tana. "He took both girls to the National High School Finals Rodeo in the poles. We think he was 20 when our girls outgrew him, and we sold him to Pat Howie's boy. He was getting grey around his nose."

"He was very arrogant and had an attitude, but he could win and he knew that he was good. He was the boss and ran our horses around, but he took care of our kids," says Wilhelm. "Tana was running him in Helena inside on poles and it looked like a good run. But

he slipped on the last pole and fell. He picked up his one foot so that he wouldn't step on her. He looked awkward getting up on three feet but he didn't want to step on her."

Patti Jo has graduated from MSU and is an intensive care nurse in Deaconess in Billings. Tana is in medical school in Omaha. Patti Jo was 4 years old when she ran barrels at WSS as a local. She started running Max when she was 11. Her dad Gary would not let her rope until she was 8.

At a local 4-H O-Mok-See, Tana entered Max in a flag race that required an unusual pattern of going around barrels. On the way to the finish line Max spotted the last barrel and jumped sideways and turned around the barrel. "He knew that you didn't run by a barrel," says Wilhelm.

The present owners are Markie, 8, and Molly, 5, daughters of George and Holly Cook of Power. They didn't realize the fame that Max has. When visiting with Kathy Workman, Holly mentioned that their family was heading to a rodeo and that Markie was going to ride a horse of Stacey Baumann's. Workman replied, "Max, you have Max?"

Last weekend at a junior rodeo in Cut Bank, Markie placed 2nd in the poles and 4th in the barrels. "If he wasn't 25 years old, I'd run him," says Holly.

"Max evidently has mellowed as he has gotten older," says Holly. "He babysits our yearling horses now and is good to my barrel horse."

"We plan to go to more junior rodeos and more NRA rodeos. Markie will run him this year and maybe Molly (who rides Max around home) will get to compete on him next

summer," says Holly. "I wish there were more horses like him. We'll just enjoy him as long as he lasts."

"He is near and dear to our hearts," says Waldhauser. "I call him 'Max a Million,'" says Markie, "because he's one in a million."

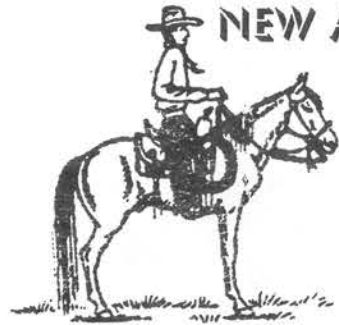

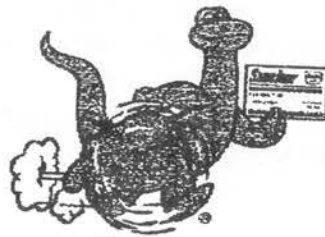

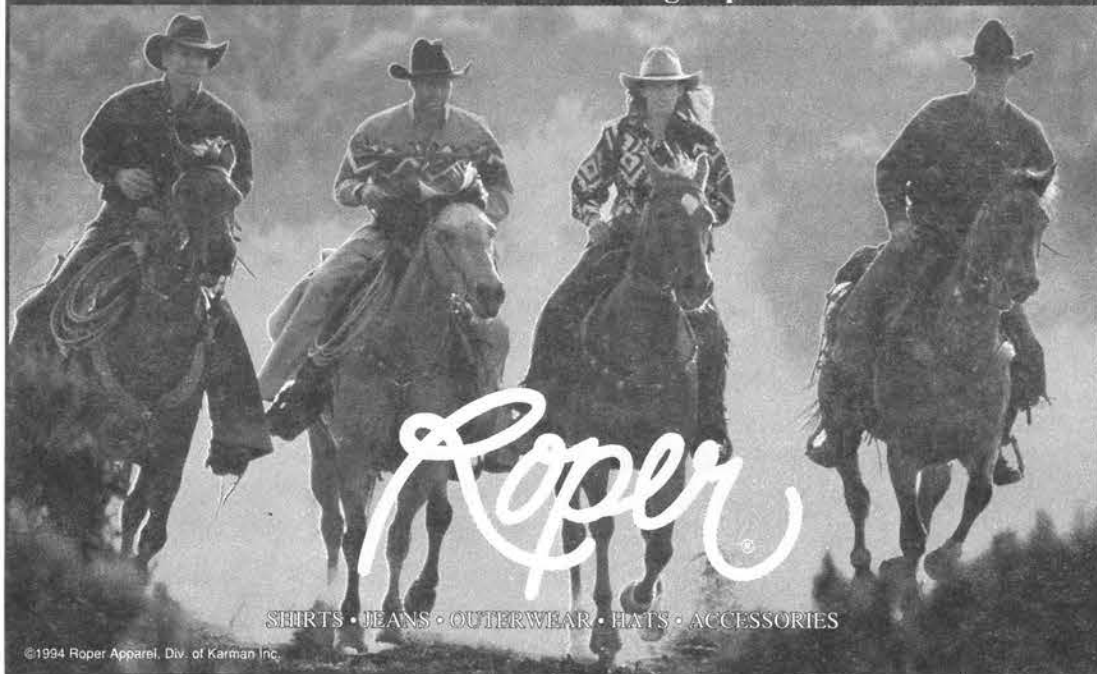

I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

I UNDERSTAND AND AGREE THIS RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to ACCIDENT, INJURY, OR DEATH OCCURRING DURING THE TERM OF MY MEMBERSHIP IN THE NRA. Any subsequent Releases and agreement I might sign in the future shall amplify, but shall in no way limit, the provisions of this document.

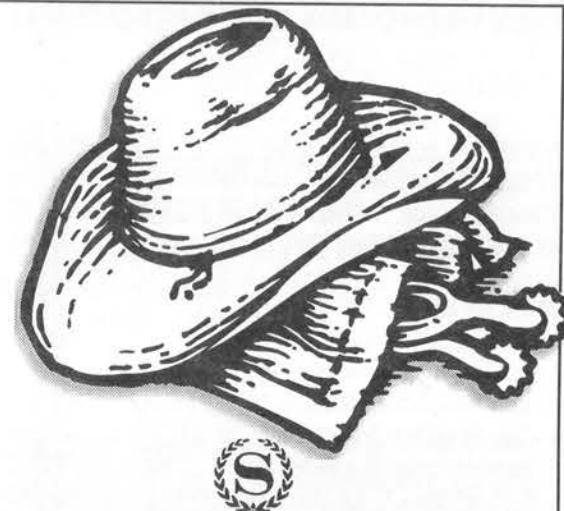

## MontanaFair Rodeo Info

MontanaFair keeps getting bigger and better! Cowboys and cowgirls will again have specific rodeo contestant parking off the new Lockwood Bridge on the Hardin Highway (by the race horse barns).

If you are coming from the interstate, take Lockwood Exit #452, cross the bridge, and take a right towards GATE ONE. (On the southeast edge of the fair grounds).

DO NOT ENTER GATE ONE but turn to the right and about 50 yards, turn left into the special rodeo contestant parking area.

Rodeo Office will also be located in this area.

Shuttles will run between this area and the METRA. Access to METRA will be from this "backside" by the Rodeo Office and Super Barn. Only walk-in and horseback traffic will be allowed through this access gate. No vehicles will be allowed. PLEASE BE COURTEOUS TO THE RACE HORSE PEOPLE AND STAY ON ACTUAL ROADS AND DEFINED PATHWAYS.

Wristbands will be issued by the Rodeo Secretary for CONTESTANTS only and wristbands must be worn as only wristbands will be allowed through the access gate.

METRA access gate will be open to contestants one-half hour before each perf and slack.

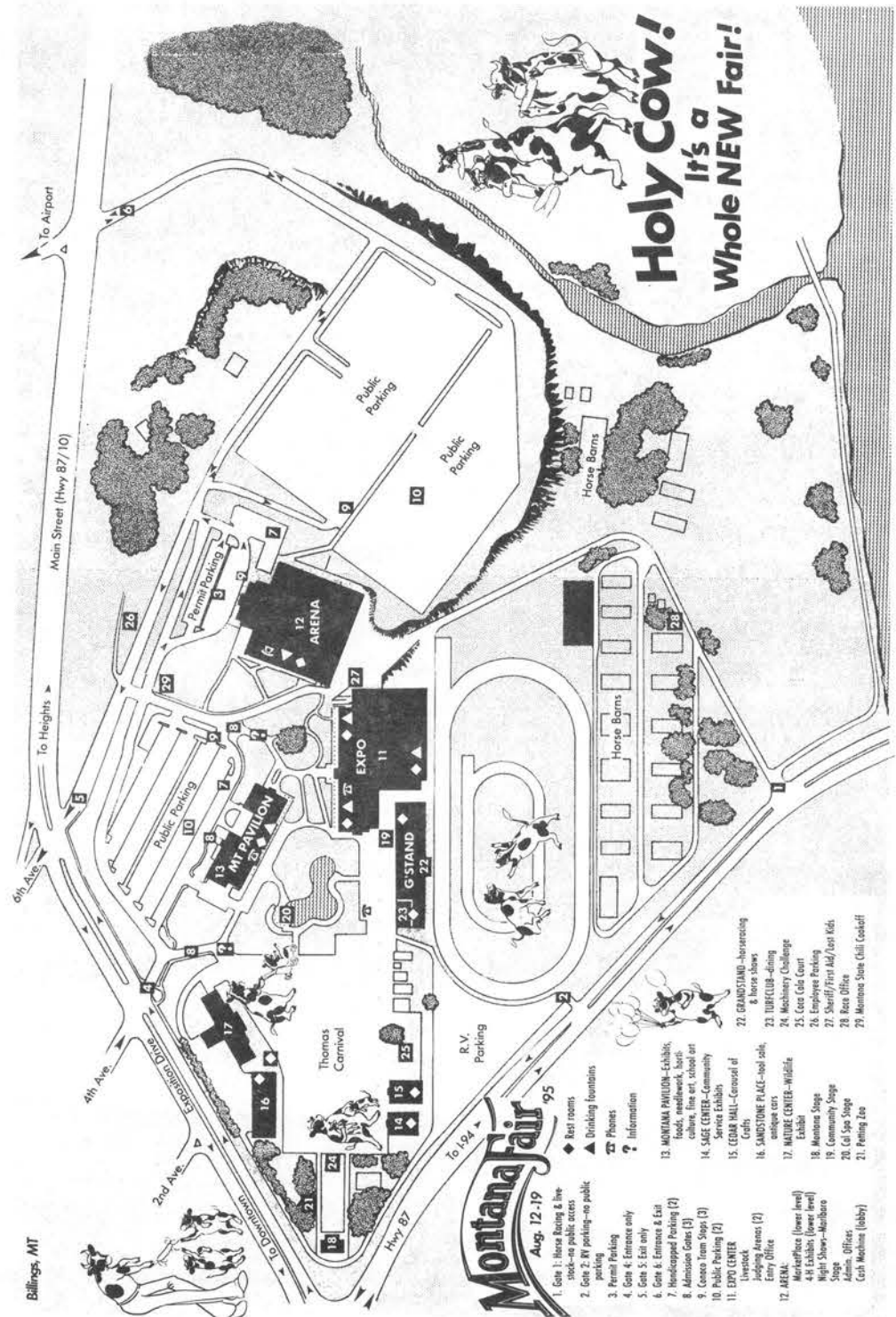

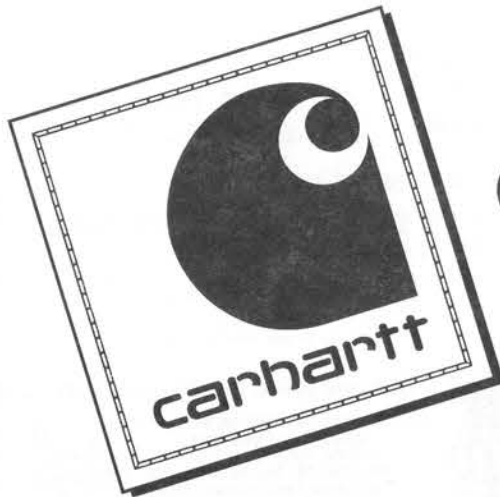

## HOW TO ENTER NRA RODEOS THROUGH BIG SKY RODEO CENTRAL ENTRY DIAL 406-428-2205

Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised. Charge is \$3.50

Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

1. Name of rodeo
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your name
4. The event or events you wish to enter
5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies — two per event, six total.
7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are up.
9. Keep track of the confirmation number the operator gives you, both on entering the rodeo and calling back. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation. YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING HIS FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, you will be charged an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

## Trade-outs and Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADE OUTS."

Trades: A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

Note: a new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

Turnouts: As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judge, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.
