BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Saturday, Sept. 18, 1993 — 11 A.M. Northern Rodeo Association Office, Billings, MT

President Stan Rasmussen called the meeting to order.

Roll was taken and a quorum verified. Those members present include: president, Stan Rasmussen; vice president, Ron Shoen; steer wrestling, Steve Blixt; bareback riding, Steve



Cutler; calf roping, Vaughn Smith (proxy for Jody Wacker); saddle bronc riding, Paul Solberg; team roping, Mark Salmond; contract personnel, Will Rasmussen; ladies barrel racing, Phyllis Brosz (proxy for Gail Shoen); breakaway roping, Mary Ellen Hill; bull riding, Marty Penrod; advisory board: Alvin Wagner, Ed Miller; committee representatives, Joe Murnion, Dr. Howard Holloway. Those events not represented include: stock contractors, junior events. Also present was Tootie Rasmussen, interim newsletter editor, and Karen Miller, Montana executive director of Friends of Rodeo.

Minutes of the Sunday, April 18, 1993 Board of Directors meeting were distributed. It was moved and seconded that the minutes be approved as presented.

Finances of the association were discussed. It was

moved and seconded that the treasurer's report be accepted subjected to audit.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Judge's Committee: Judging co-chairman, Ron Shoen, informed the Board of the current program. Judging program is now a permanent part of the NRA and feedback has continued to be positive. Event directors will receive an evaluation on the program and will be asked to make constructive comments. The possibility of utilizing NRA judges at Montana High School Association rodeos was addressed and will be followed up on. In addition to stock contractors and actual judges, event directors would like to receive the listing of judging assignments when compiled and released. Discussion concerning possible timers/secretary/judges seminar during NRA Finals. Skeeter Nordahl's work and dedication in revising the entire NRA judging program was gratefully acknowledged.

Awards Committee: Current status of the 1993 Year-End Event Sponsorship program was discussed in addition to the Saddle Maker's Program. Possible silver makers program for

1994 was suggested.

North American Rodeo Commission: At the spring NRA Board meeting, the NRA voted to join the NARC for \$2,250, as in 1992. A dues restructuring of the NARC took place at the end of June. NARC contacted our office and informed us of the new \$5,000 membership dues for 1993. A telephone poll was taken of the voting directors with the majority voting to NOT join NARC for 1993. At that time a letter was written explaining the NRA's position. We have received no acknowledgement from the NARC office.

NRA Finals Committee: Ron Shoen, chairman: It has been suggested and discussed that the cocktail parties and calcutta/cowboy auctions be held separately for 1994. Discussion. Stan Rasmussen to be the liaison/contact person for calcutta/cowboy auction.

A discussion was held concerning companion passes. Possibility of purchasing an access armband will be researched.

Junior events: possible sponsorship opportunity; invite schools to attend at no charge. **Rocky Mountain Association of Fairs:** 1993 convention scheduled for Nov. 11-13 in Great Falls. NRA Directors are encouraged to attend and spend time in the NRA Hospitality Room. *BREAK FOR LUNCH*

OLD BUSINESS

Rule Book: Some items that did not make the transition into the newly revised rule book

include: terms of directors, stock contractor member requirements. These will be included in the 1994 NRA Rule Book Supplement. Members should call if they notice any other deletions.

Rookie Bareback Riding: Question concerning re-rides: RBB rules revert to Bareback Riding rules, thus re-rides will be given.

NRA Office Personnel/Finals Personnel: It was moved and seconded that the NRA fund for this position.

NEW BUSINESS:

Rule changes: Proposed Rules of Competition bylaw changes were brought before the Board at this time. (the following will be voted on at the February board meeting).

Ladies Barrel Racing: It was moved and seconded: Rule R.14.11.13. It is the judge's responsibility and a judge must be present when the barrel racing pattern and electric eye positions are marked. Passed. Unanimous.

It was moved and seconded that the following rule change proposals be accepted:

Add to rule book: If the rodeo has additional events



requiring the use of a barrel, barrels must not be put on NRA barrel markers.

Add to rule book: There shall be absolutely no practicing or turning around the barrel markers after they have been marked.

Add to rule book: In the slack, ground around the barrels must be worked with a tractor, if one is available, before the barrel race and after the equivalent number of contestants drawn for a performance have competed. Example: with 26 entries drawn to run during slack and 10 entries drawn to compete in the performance, then the ground is to be raked before #11 and #21. The rake is based on your position drawn on the official secretary sheet posted, regardless of any turnouts after the official draw is completed.

Add to rulebook: All contestants should run with a closed gate. Revision of R.14.1, add to existing rule: "with both ends intact."

Change R.14.11.9 and R.14.11.10 to read:

Barrel Pattern

The standard course for barrel race is:

90 feet between barrel 1 and 2

105 feet between barrel 2 and 3 and between 2 and 3

60 feet from barrels 1 and 2 to scoreline. Scoreline should be at least 45 feet from end of arena.

Maximum distance of 105 feet between barrels 1 and 2 and 120 feet between 2 and 3, and 1 and 3. Scoreline must never be more than 90 feet. Above rule is for unusually large arenas.

The following shall be used in small arenas:

The scoreline should be at least 45 feet away from the end of the arena, unless there

is a center alley or size does not permit.

Barrel 1 and 2 must be at least 18 feet from the sides of the arena. In extra small arenas they may be less. In no instance should they be any closer than 15 feet from the sides of the arena.

Barrel 3 should be at least 36 feet from the end of the arena, and no closer than 25 feet. In narrow arenas, the third barrel should be set at least 15 feet longer than the first and second barrel.

If arena size permits, barrel must be set 60 feet or farther apart.

In small arenas it is recommended the pattern be reduced proportionately to a standard barrel pattern.

**A graphic drawing as shown in the WPRA rule book listing minimum distances must

be included with this rule update/change.

LBR and JUNIOR BARREL RACING: There will be no circling horse in arena. One spin or pivot in either direction is acceptable. When contestants are not required to run in and out, they must keep forward motion toward first barrel, prior to crossing score line.

Promotions: Discussion concerning promotional possibilities. It was moved and seconded that President Stan Rasmussen negotiate a contract. PASSED.

Newsletter: It was moved and seconded that the newsletter be incorporated into the NRA Office. Discussion. Passed.

Nominations: Nominations for open positions on the board were accepted. Nominations remain open until Dec. 15.

Rule changes: Proposed Rules of Competition by-law changes were brought before the board at this time. The following will be voted on at the February board meeting.

Page 50: R.9.1. Delete the following: A 10-foot tape must be on hand for the barrier judge to measure the broken barrier where the 10 foot rule applies. The 10 foot barrier rule is: if it is over 10 feet from the bottom of the post, at the pin side, it is not a broken barrier. PASSED TO DELETE.

Clarification of NRA Finals team roping rule accepted: F.1.4 "....must have competed in five (5) NRA rodeos and won a team roping minimum of \$500."

Add: ALL PASSED:

Barrier equipment must be inspected by the judge before each timed event. If equipment is faulty, it must be replaced. Should barrier break at any point other than designated breaking point, decision is up to the barrier judge. If contestant obviously beats barrier, or barrier rope is broken and string unbroken, barrier judge may assess a 10-second fine.

In order for time to be considered official, barrier flag must operate. The barrier flag should be on the barrier pole or barrier instead of on the neck rope of the timed event cattle whenever possible.

If neck rope fails to work, but time is recorded, contestant or team will get time. Barrier penalty will be waived unless obviously beaten by contestant.

If, in the opinion of the line judge, contestant is fouled by barrier, ropers shall get their calf or steer back providing contestant declares himself by pulling up immediately.

All timed event cattle must be permanently identified.

Stock Contractor requirements were addressed.

Friends of Rodeo was discussed. It was moved and seconded that the funding be addressed at the February meeting.

Meeting adjourned.

OFFICIAL JUNIOR STANDINGS

All Juniors who have won money in the 1993 season are eligible to compete in the Northern Rodeo Finals

Annual Fair Convention Scheduled for Great Falls



We are addicted to the only sport in the world that is based on true sportsmanship. In what other competition can you see a world class champion helping a fellow competitor get a better score or a faster time by letting his competition mount his horse or by giving that one piece of advice about a bronc that would allow "the other guy" to win the round?





Film crew trains Montanans in the art

WILSALL — What would happen if you gave a rodeo and everyone came?

Thanks to the Northern Rodeo Association, that's what happened Tuesday (Aug. 31) so the movie "F.T.W." (short for Frank T. Wells) could film the ridin' and ropin' activity.

"I'm not into bull riding. I'm bull filming," quips Producer Tom Mickel with a quick grin as daylight darkened on the rodeo set.

"I got some great stuff." He shrugged and smiled. "I got some bad stuff too."

Mickel is the "M" behind HKM Productions, with partners Director Michael Karbelnikoff ("Mobsters" 1991) and Graham Henman.


Calling themselves Big Truck Productions, they are making their first joint feature movie this year. They hope to complete one film a year in the future.

"When we first came up (to Montana) about eight years ago, we brought everybody from Los Angeles with us," says Mickel. "Now 20 to 30 employees are Montanans." The movie crew totals 80.


"I love shooting in Montana, any time of the year. What was important was finding the necessary rodeo and wilderness and a pool of cowboys to draw off."

Screenwriter Michael Davis agreed. "I think this is where it was supposed to be," he said of the original Texas setting. "The production people had been here and Montana is one of the best places for rodeo."

"Montana has a great film community," says Mickel. "It also has one of the better film commissions I've worked with."

production company is spending most of its money here.

With a budget of around \$5 million, something like \$3.5 million is a hefty sum that will be spread throughout south-central Montana.

The film's technical adviser is Larry Mahan, perhaps the most famous modern cowboy around. He winced and smiled as another rider bit the dust.

Youthful, lean-faced and silverhaired at 50, Mahan perched on a corral rail during the filming. He was wearing a denim turquoise shirt, part of his own clothing line. His monthly TV show, "Horse World," airs on the Prime Network.

The six-time all-around world champion was a blitzkrieg on the rodeo scene in the 1960s and '70s.

Meanwhile, over in the grass behind the rodeo grounds, Indian star Rodney Grant has just completed a scene with Mickey Rourke. "They won't let me ride on the set because of insurance," he complained good-naturedly.

Filming, which began Aug. 9, ended Sept. 25.

Mickey Rourke: On movie comeback trail

WILSALL — Once in a blue moon these days, it seems, he talks to the press. The American Press.

Cigarette in mouth, tattooed shoulders hunched against cooling air coming off the blackening Crazy Mountains, film star Mickey Rourke swaps a black and white rodeo shirt for warmer duds.

By the light of the blue moon hovering over his right shoulder, Rourke emerges, wry but exhausted. His last scene of "F.T.W." completed in two takes followed by alternate shots, it's 8 p.m. Some 200 townspeople and crew line Maine Street.

Rourke wrote the 30-page screen treatment — of a love story featuring a fictional Kalispell ex-con rodeo cowboy, Frank T. Wells — that catapulted this \$5 million Big Truck Productions film into production in southwestern Montana this summer.

Lori Singer ("Footloose," "Drugstore Cowboy," "Short Cuts") plays his love interest, Rodney Grant ("Dances With Wolves") plays Bucky, a bull rider.

It's Rourke's third trip to Montana. In 1979 he had an often-overlooked small role in Michael Cimino's "Heaven's Gate."

In 1986, he filmed "Angel Heart," the American Gothic yarn filmed in Billings, based on the novel by Paradise Valley's William Hjortsberg.

"Ilove Montana. I'dlike to move here if I could afford it." He casts a rakish grin at producer Tom Mickel. "I've got an ex-wife and IRS prob-

lems."

He's a wiry 5-foot-7 or so, dark hair cropped short above those cautious eyes. He's direct, affable, yet oddly vulnerable."

"I like it a lot. I've been looking at land around Flathead Lake," Rourke continues.

It seems, at 36, he's making a comeback.

He's just come from the Santa Fe filming of "The Last" for HBO.

Next year he'll return to Montana in September to film "The Ride," co-written with Michael Davis (who also worked on the "F.T.W." screenplay, along with Mari Kornhauser).

The production crew and actors on the set praise Rourke.

Says Davis, a former spy thriller novelist who emigrated from Scotland to Los Angeles six years ago, "Mickey is a very hands-on person. He's very particular on development. I find I work so well with him."

Adds saddle bronc back-up stunt rider Casey Fredericks of Great Falls, "He is really concerned about the riding. He asks for our (stunt riders Kevin Small and Chad Onstad) input because he wants to get it right. He is really concerned with how it comes off."

While he's off to a new start in the U.S., Rourke's popularity in Europe and Asia continues. Japanese press interviewed him in Wilsall this week.

In France, he's reportedly the most beloved American since comedian Jerry Lewis. Women in Japan swoon over him.

"They enjoy his offbeat character," says Producer Mickel.

Rourke explains his popularity in simpler terms.

"Somebody has to," he deadpans.

"Boxing keeps me humble," says Rourke of his first love. He dropped from a light heavyweight at 200 pounds to a super middle-weight at 168 pounds in recent months. He's fresh from a Joplin, Mo., third-round win two weeks ago, says trainer Freddy Roach of Las Vegas.

Rourke, a Schenectady, N.Y. native who grew up in Florida, had 26 amateur boxing bouts as a teenager and now has a pro record of five wins: one draw, four knockouts.


He will box again five weeks after filming.




Left, the "grub wagon" from New Jersey put out marvelous gourmet food to cast and crew.
