CHATTING WITH CHUCK ABOUT SPORTS MEDICINE...

Increasingly so, athletes who have had a great series of performances, an excellent season, or a hall of fame career give mental training considerable credit for their successes. I will introduce the common components of mental training in this issue and then elaborate on them in future issues this winter.

- 1. Goal Setting: The drive to achieve must come from within. It must be our choice, not someone else's choice or want for us. First we must know what we want. A goal is a specific, positive personal aim, wish, or dream. Once you feel clear about your goal, lay out a plan or a step-by-step process to achieve it.
- 2. Positive Self-Statements: Your thoughts control your actions. After setting goals for yourself, begin writing positive self-statements in support of your goal. Self-statements are always positive, personal, in the present tense, and usually begin with "I". Positive self-statements are necessary to combat the destructive self-beliefs and feelings we have from time to time which can interfere with performance.
- 3. Creative Visualization: It is important to "see" yourself succeeding and achieving your goals. "See" in your mind's eye the whole pro-


cess and routine of achieving your goal in as much detail as possible. Visualize the setting, the people, the environment, the stock; everything.

- 4. Mental Log Keeping: Disciplining yourself to keep a journal or log of your results will being to show you the situations in which you do well and the situations in which you do less than well. It is important to include a recap of your thoughts and feelings prior to and leading up to your rides or run.
- 5. Progressive Relaxation: Prior to performing creative visualization and imagery is important to be relaxed. Progressive relaxation is the tensing and relaxing of major muscle groups.

This introduction will suffice for now, I'll elaborate in successive issues.





Parents!!! I am at this time trying to get awards down to 10th place. If you have something that you could donate or could get donated let me know.



"Centennial just likes to buck - but because of his early training, he is nice to handle," says Larry.

The 1995 Bull of the Year was initially purchased as a 250 lb roping calf. Over the last five years, Newman Rodeo Company's bull #20 Twenty Grand has gained 1,250 pounds and the respect of the NRA's top cowboys.

The horned, black brahama-angus cross bull "jumps high and kicks as hard as any horse", says Sid Newman of Newman Rodeo Company.





A mother of four is back in the saddle with a successful...

RETURN TO THE RODEO

The thrill of galloping down a rodeo arena makes barrel racing fun, says Charlene Murphy, of Billings.

So does winning.

Murphy has had a lot of fun in recent years.

Last year, she was named Montana Pro Rodeo Rookie Barrel Racer, based on her earnings in rodeos sanctioned by the Women's Professional Rodeo Association.

Murphy isn't doing too badly this year, either. Out of the 50 rodeos she has raced in so far, she has won money in at least 75 percent of them.

She has earned \$6,374 in Northern Rodeo Association rodeos this year, elevating her to second place in NRA barrel-racing standings. In WPRA rankings in the state, Murphy is seventh with earnings of \$2,179.

In light of her winning season, it's even more interesting to note that the slender, dark-haired mother of four turned 40 this year. Forty may be over the hill in some sports, but not in barrel racing.

Of the top 15 NRA barrel racers, seven



are 40 or older, says Jann Parker, NRA executive secretary.

Murphy's top rankings weren't easy to come by.

She grew up riding at the Billings Saddle Club. And Murphy barrel raced at a few junior-circuit and high-school rodeos, but gave it up more than 20 years ago when she married Mike Murphy, a former rodeo bareback rider.

The Murphys and their two youngest children, Clint. 17, and Sterling, 12, live south of Billings on Pryor Creek Road. Son Wade, 20, attends Dawson Community College in Glendive. Their daughter Darcy, 19, is a student at Miles Community College in Miles City and a member of the rodeo team.

About 10 years ago, Murphy's husband

encouraged her to start barrel racing again.

"He pushed me to do it," she says. "Everything I owe to him. He found the horse I'm running, and he stays home and keeps the home fires burning."

When Murphy climbed back into the saddle to race after several years absence, she found it was a humbling experience.

"You go out there, work your hardest and get your doors blown off," Murphy says.

The first few years, she made plenty of "donations," rodeo lingo for entry fees she paid in races in which she won no money. "the o

Barrel races are won or lost by slivers of seconds and are over in 14 to 17 seconds.

To get ahead, Murphy sharpened her skills at several schools and clinics, including a Texas clinic run by Martha Josey, one of the country's best barrel racers.

Barrel racing is more than just quick dash around three barrels and a fast trip home. It takes more work, concentration and mental preparation than most people realize, Murphy says.

The right horse, agile enough to dart around a barrel and fast enough to fly home, also is a major factor in a racer's success.

Murphy's 9-year-old quarter-horse mare, "K.C." is such a horse.

"She is a natural barrel racer, who was easy to train." Murphy says.

A horse, even a good one, doesn't do all the work. A barrel racer must anticipate the quickly approaching barrel and fine tune the horse's trajectory. She also must adapt for changing conditions and different sizes of arenas.

In addition to Mike's encouragement and K.C.'s winning spirit, Murphy attributes her success to her traveling partner, Shirlee Fossum. Fossum, like Murphy, is among the top barrel racers in the state. She trails Murphy in NRA standings in third place, but is fourth in the WPRA's Montana circuit.

When one of the women comes up short on a race, the other is there for support.

A successful race boosts the morale of both.

"When one of us wins," Murphy says, "the other wins, too."

The women get along well, a necessity during long trips they make together. They routinely drive 1,000 miles or more in a single weekend. During one weekend this summer, they raced in a rodeo at Wolf Point at 7:30 p.m. and then drove all night to be in Helena to race by 7 the next morning.

Those early-morning races are called "slack." When large numbers of cowboys or cowgirls sign up for an event, the rodeo schedules slack competitions, usually earlier in the day before a performance. The times for slack rides are considered equally with rides in performances for prize money.

Holiday weekends are particularly busy. Over the Labor Day weekend, they raced in rodeos in Hamilton on Thursday night, Plains on Friday, White Sulphur Springs on Saturday, Helmville on Sunday and Dillon on Monday.

Many of the things that seem a natural part of barrel racing are, in fact, guided by rules and official encouragement.

Barrel racers are urged to wear bright colors. Murphy makes most of her colorful

Western wardrobe, including jeans.

The women also are required to wear hats and keep them on during a race. In WPRA rodeos, barrel racers who lose a hat are fined \$25. Murphy keeps her hat firmly secured with a stampede string.

In the last couple of years, the number of women competing in barrel racing has increased dramatically.

This summer, as many as 50 to 70 women would compete in a single rodeo.

One factor helping the numbers increase is a rule change allowing WPRA card holders to participate in NRA events, Murphy says.

The popularity of things Western, televised rodeo events and the increasing number of barrel-racing clubs also have nurtured an interest in the sport.

Later this month, Murphy will compete in barrel racing at the NILE rodeo.

In addition to being one of the last PRCA rodeos to qualify for the National Rodeo Finals in Las Vegas and a rodeo with a sizable purse. NILE also is blissfully close to home.

"Maybe we like it because we don't have to drive to it," Murphy says.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Tuesday, October 17, 1995 Northern Rodeo Association Office Billings, Montana

President Charlie Briggs called the meeting to order.

Roll was taken and a quorum verified. Those members present included: President, Charlie Briggs; Glen Hough proxy for Stan Rasmussen, Director at Large; Steve Blixt, Steer Wrestling; Steve Cutler, Bareback Riding; Kent Robbins, Saddle Bronc Riding; Ty Steinbach proxy for Mark Salmond, Team Roping; Rodney Newman, Stock Contractors; Dick Lyman, Contract Personnel; Janie Carlson, Ladies Breakaway Roping; Theresa Caldwell proxy for Heather Hart, Ladies Barrel Racing; Teri Jo Lyman, Junior Events; Marty Penrod, Bull Riding; Advisory Board Members: Alvin Wagner, Ed Waldhauser; Committee Directors East: Joe Murnion, Dr. Howard Holloway; Committee Directors West: Leonard Wortman. Bruce Martin representing Steve O'Hern, Judging Program Director.

Financial Report was read and approved subject to audit. Association finances were discussed and an overview of the 1995 rodeo season given.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

North American Rodeo Commission: WFR will be held Nov. 7-12 in Charleston, SC. NRA will be represented by 21 contestants.

Awards Program: Overall program was discussed. Average and Rookie buckles have been sponsored and have arrived. Buckles were shown to the Board. Discussion concerning Championship buckles.

NRA Finals: The NRA Finals were discussed. A new finals committee was formed to work on specific items for the upcoming Finals in 1996. Those Board members serving on the committee include: Steve Cutler, Glen Hough, and Janie Carlson.

Logan Coach Judges Program: Current judging program was discussed. There is a PRCA Judging Seminar this coming weekend, Oct. 20-21 in Billings. All NRA Judges are encouraged to attend. Dick Lyman presented the Board with additions/changes to the current program. Dick had visited with prior NRA judges and had researched the proposed additions/changes. Discussion. The Board asked Dick to make any final changes and submit to the NRA Office to run in the December issue of the NRA News with the General Membership voting on the proposal in February, with final Board decision at the February Board of Directors meeting.

Instant Rancher Sweepstakes Program: Vance Ruff gave an overview of this year's program including the Logan Coach promotion. It worked very well selling the Instant Rancher tickets at the various rodeos and having a Logan Coach trailer on site; Instant Rancher Drawings at the rodeos were successful. Discussion. It was moved and seconded: At the NRA Finals, the drawings be split to include both the current year and, to encourage pre-sales on the upcoming year, hold the Sunday drawing on the next year's tickets. PASSED. Specifics to be worked out by the Instant Rancher Sweepstakes committee. Those serving on the committee include: Dana Parini, Charlie Briggs, Jerry Matt, Vance Ruff, Jeanne Carpenter, and Gary Zipperian.

Excel Telephone: At the March meeting, the NRA Board voted to accept the Excel Telecommunications program. Discussion concerning the program. It was moved and seconded: After six months, the NRA evaluate the program and if the NRA has not saved money, discontinue the program. Seconded. PASSED.

NEW BUSINESS:

L and B Cattle Company d/b/a Lillian Rodeo Company, Whitehall, Montana has requested approval as an NRA stock contractor. All necessary information has been received by the NRA, including all obligations set forth in the NRA rulebook for stock contractor membership. Boyd McMillan, President of Lillian Rodeo Company, addressed the Board. It was moved and seconded: Lillian Rodeo Company be approved as NRA Stock Contractors. PASSED.

Entry fee scale was discussed. It was moved and seconded: Entry fee scale be used as a guideline, not a requirement, for committees. Information to be sent out with spring committee packet. PASSED.

Equal added money in all events was discussed. Equal added money can be used as a guideline, not a requirement, for committees.

Issues at the Poplar Rodeo were discussed.

Clarification on Bull Riding Day Money ruling: It was moved and seconded: add to rule A6.5.1: If a contestant turns out of a performance and pays his fees AFTER the day money for his performance has been paid out, day money to be included in overall payoff for the rodeo. PASSED.

Clarification on conflicting rules R.9.1.1 and R.9.1.6. It was moved and seconded: R.9.1.6 was to be replaced by R.9.1.1. PASSED.

Clarification on "extra" animal drawn in the timed events. Some judges "issue" the "extra" from the first draw to the first contestant in the next draw. Proper procedure is not to "issue" animal, but put animal back in draw and redraw.

Discussion concerning Rookie Bareback Riding event.

Discussion concerning local/hometown entries. It was moved and seconded: All contestants competing at an NRA rodeo be members of the Northern Rodeo Association. PASSED. UNANIMOUS. One-rodeo permits are available for \$25 in addition to permits for \$50, and memberships for \$80 and \$100.

One-day NRA rodeos held in conjunction with two or three day NRA rodeos were discussed. It was moved and seconded: Clause in the Central Entry contract allowing contestants to work all NRA sanctioned rodeos in a given weekend or time period be evaluated. PASSED. Findings to be brought to the Board at the February meeting.

Problems with rodeo arenas using overhead pull barriers were discussed. Committees are strongly encouraged to replace the overhead pull barriers with side pull barriers. Item to be included on committee suggestion listing.

Lowering the age requirement in the junior events was discussed. It was moved and seconded: Junior age requirement be evaluated. PASSED. To be discussed at the February meeting.

Rule A.6.5.8 "When less than the number of contestants place in an event than the proper payoff for that event..." was addressed. It was moved and seconded: Add to rule A.6.5.8: Contestant will receive official points only for the proper payoff percentage for placing received. PASSED. To be voted on and discussed at February meeting.

Meeting adjourned.

I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.
