If your activities in the NRA can be categorized as "contract personnel" and you would like to serve as a representative, please let me know. Better yet, if you fall into that elite group of NRA members and have problems or concerns you would like voiced to the board, please let me know.

A reminder to all the stock contractors and committees who hire the timers at their rodeos: a rule was put into effect in 1990 which stipulates that the minimum pay for timers possessing an NRA membership is \$35 per performances, the same as judges. I am aware that in 1990 this rules was not strictly adhered to, nor was it enforced. Let's turn over a new leaf in 1991.

Just because I am a rodeo timer, those are not soley the people I hope to represent; add to the category of "Contract Personnel" announcers, secretaries, clowns, bullfighters, pickupmen, judges (non-competing), along with timers and any other contract personnel who do not compete for prize money in a rodeo and you have the group of people I represent. Please let me hear from you.

The 17th revised edition of the NRA rules, articles and by laws is off the press. Tootie Rasmussen came out of retirement and set the rulebooks into type.

NRA rulings and procedures on Trade-outs/ Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are tradeout rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADEOUTS."

A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade <u>must</u> call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Turnouts:

As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m.

the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary/judge/contractor that you will not be there, you fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors/judges/secretaries/spectators/ announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.



Cheyenne honor Hawkeye Hensen and Phillip Whiteman

May broke cold and wet in Cheyenne country. Snow lingered in the shadows and on pine boughs in the hills above the bronc riding school arena. Clouds smothered the sun. A chill wind raked the reservation.

World champion saddle bronc riders, Hawkeye Henson of Texas and Lame Deer's Phillip Little Whiteman, rode the line of chutes trading banter with the cowboys manning the gates and shooting bits of last minute advice to students settling onto their mounts.

Aspiring rodeo stars from Canada to the Mexican line, hung on every word from the champions' mouths.

The students were a mixed lot - Cree from Canada, Hidatsa from North Dakota, Navaho from Arizona, young white cowboys from Wyoming.

Hidatsa youth Myron Johnson looked younger than his 13 years as he sidled up to Hawkeye to plead for "one last ride."

Hawkeye smiled. "You rode three head this morning. You did good, kid. Tomorrow's another day."

Just then, young Navaho Henry Hildreth burst from the chute on a horse that took two jumps, wheeled and fell.

"Jump off," Phillip shouted.

"Get yourself clear," Hawkeye urged.

Hildreth had come all the way from Arizona, paid his tuition and was determined to get his share of riding - wreck or no wreck. Holding the bucking rein high he braced himself for the bronc's lunge to his feet.

Hawkeye smiled. Phillip shook his head.

The morning's broncs, tough Indian horses provided by Contractor Leroy Comes Last, broke cleanly from the chutes and seldom failed to fire.

Tall, lean Crow teenager, Allen Joe Old Horn. bolted from the chute aboard a big paint.

"Lift! Lift! Lift!" Hawkeye shouted.

Hawkeye came to the Northern Cheyenne Reservation, where cowboys were indians, to help an old friend and receive an honor never before accorded a white man.

Three-time Pro Rodeo Cowboys Association world champion saddle bronc rider Henson, had met Phillip, an Indian Rodeo wold champion, on the pro circuit. The two had toured Europe with a show featuring Indian dancers, trick riders, and bronc riders.

Phillip's road to the world championship had been a long one. He battled both racism and booze. Fighting his way free of alcohol addiction, he was determined to help Indian youth walk the same trail. He would boost their selfesteem in the best way he knew how, teaching them to ride.

After consultation with Phillip, tribal officials and elders agreed to honor Hawkeye with a Cheyenne name and the eagle feather traditionally reserved for warriors.

The honor wold be bestowed upon Hawkeye by spiritual leader Austin Two Moons.

If honoring a white man was a break with tradition, so is Two Moons' mission in life. Named for the war chief who lead Chevenne warriors in a head-on assault of Custer's men at the battle of the Little Bighorn, Austin has been a tireless promoter of world peace.

The Cheyenne holy man who was once summoned to the Vatican to confer with the Pope, prayed over the white bronc rider and gave him a Chevenne name.

Locals in the auditorium nodded approval. It was a good name, fitting and appropriate. Sounds familiar to a native ear but difficult to capture with a typewriter, spelled "Hawkeye" in Chevenne.

The next day Phillip and I chatted on the phone. He was still excited about the award bestowed on his friend.

"You don't get it, do you?" I asked.

"What do you mean?" he said.

I shook my head. Phillip believed folks filling the auditorium has come to honor Henson. He was wrong. Henson IS an outstanding bronc rider, one of pro rodeo's greatest. But the people packing the tribal hall were paying their respects to one of their own.

They came to bask in the glory of a warrior (Continued on page 8)



I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

I UNDERSTAND AND AGREE THIS RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to ACCIDENT. INJURY, ACCIDENT, OR DEATH OCCURRING DURING THE TERM OF MY MEMBERSHIP IN THE NRA. 
