Breakaway catch rule should be left as is

To: Breakaway Ropers

Subject: Proposed Catch-as-Catch-Can Rule change

Before you make up your mind on which way to vote on this rule change, be sure that you think about the total NRA image, not just the illegal catches that you had last year that cost you money.

REMEMBER: The present rule (neck-only catch) was made so that 1) we would bring a little something special to our region and 2) to improve the quality of breakaway roping. We accomplished both.

1) "NRA Rules" is what the rest of the world calls the neck-only catch. 2) In the past, a lot of money was won with the loop lying on the arena floor - - many people in the stands did not even see the catch. Most ropers don't like to get beat by someone who doesn't even leave the rope on the calf.

With our present rule, flagmen are making fewer errors now than ever before.

We should leave the rule as is.

The 1991 Coors World Finals Rodeo will be held in El Paso, TX, Nov. 2 - 9. The rodeo will consist of 8 paid performances and 4 slack times. You will be required to arrive in El Paso no later than Nov. 1st. and to be at all performances and slacks on a timely basis.

Pickup men will be required to bring no less than 6 horses each to be used in their position. We will furnish hay and stalls for those horses and for the flaggers horse.

The final selection of personnel will be made at the June meeting of the N.A.R.C. Board of Directors and all applicants will be notified of the results of that selection.

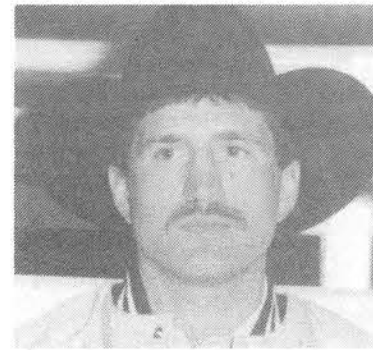

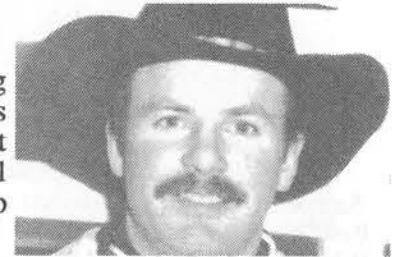


1. Greg Jambor, Billings- \$4,153.86

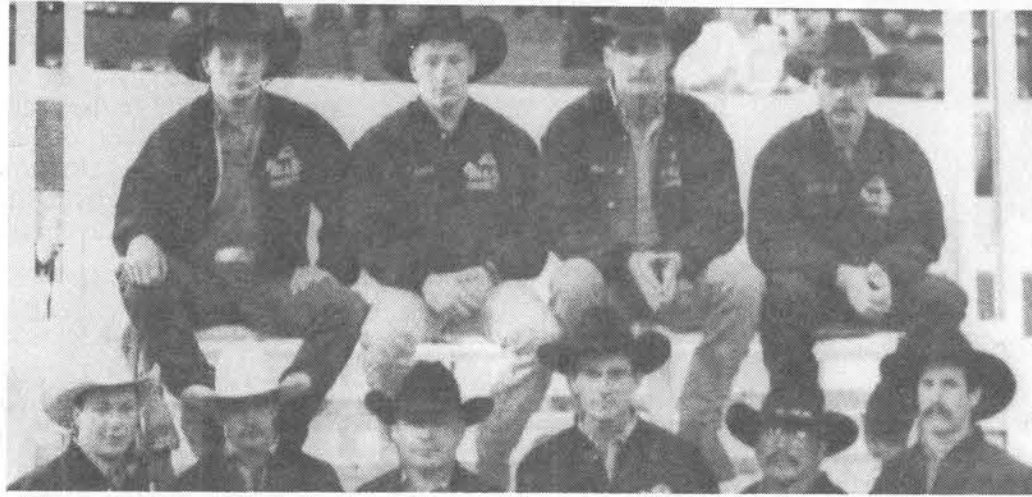


5. Bruce Martin, Lewistown - \$ 2,516.06

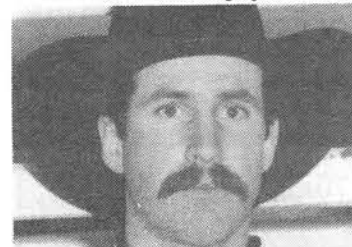
4. Phillip Whiteman, Jr., Lamedeer - \$ 2,438.60

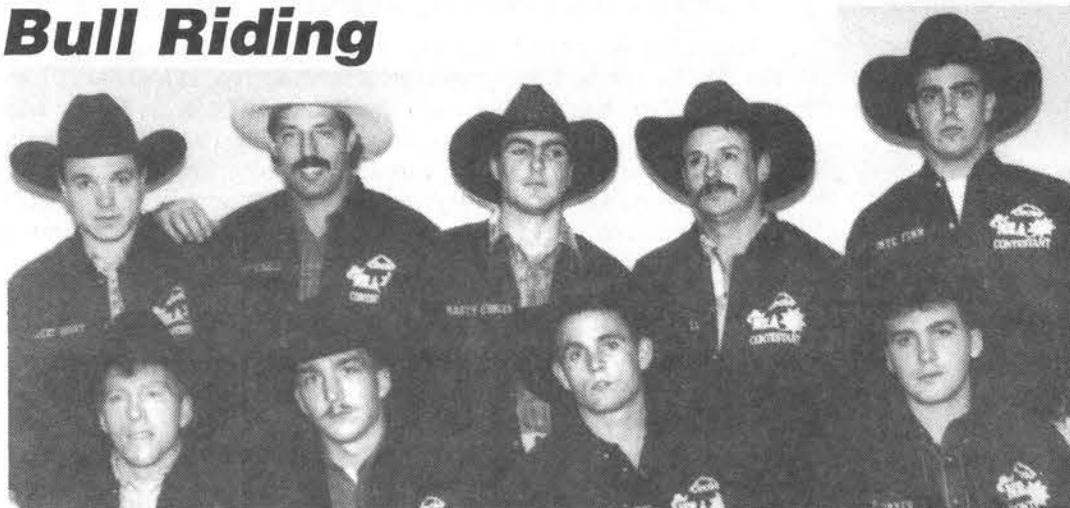


5. Kent Robbins, Corvallis - \$ 2,332.78

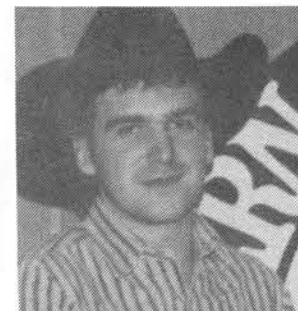

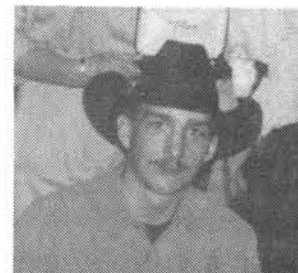


4. Marty O'Brien - \$4,273.35

5. Betsy Evans, Glendive - \$3,202.88

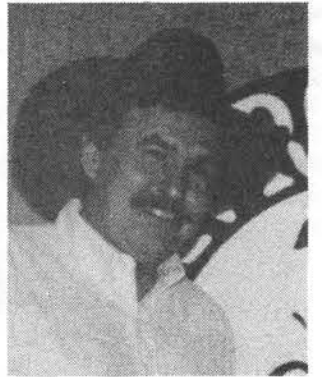

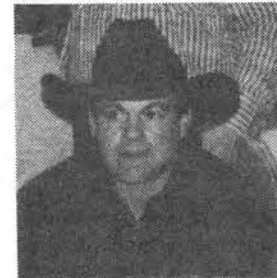

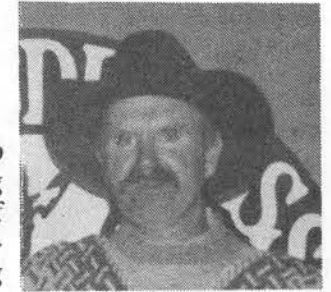
1. Chris Witcher, Miles City - \$4,641.11

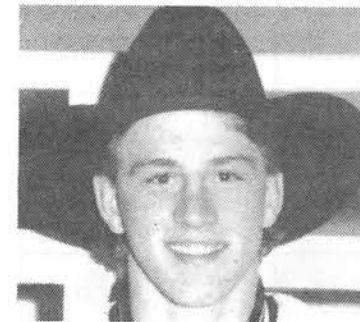


3. Lyle Baumann, Hardin - \$ 2,859.61

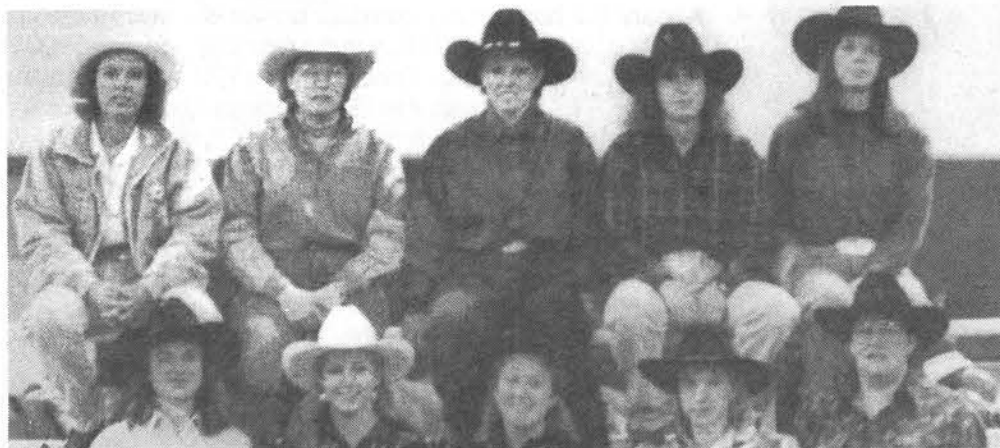

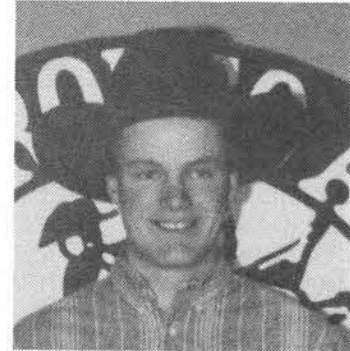


1. Charlie Briggs, Bozeman - \$ 5,953.32

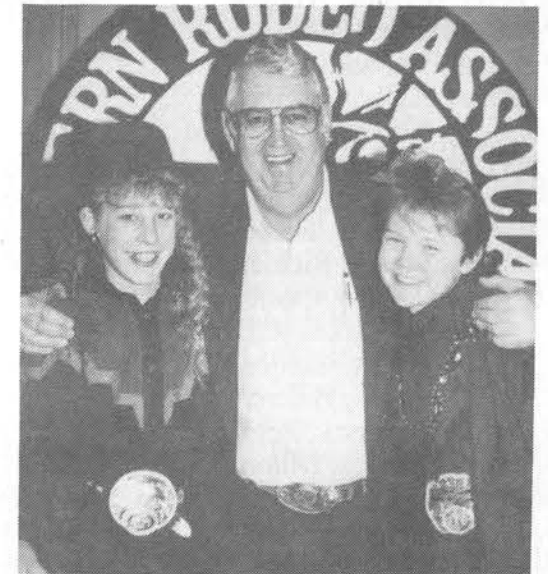

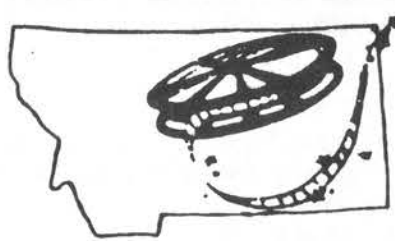

El Paso, Tx
Feb. 15

NARC President Tom Harvey opened the meeting with a welcome to all associations and introduced his board of directors. All associations representatives introduced themselves. Seventeen associations were represented at the meeting.

Tom Harvey talked about his new slogan, "Team Work means Success." He feels the organization has been stagnate. He stated, it is time to move forward with teamwork. Tom also discussed with associations, complaints about the office in 1990. Tom assured everyone that things would be better in 1991. He assured association that someone would be at the NARC office from 9 - 5 everyday to take their calls.

Tom read the financial statement for 1990. Advising associations that an updated report would be sent from our accountant shortly. Tom stated NARC netted \$31,000 of the CWFR this year.

Tom stated that due to the war in the Middle East, the economy in El Paso was down making it hard to get local sponsorships. Tom asked if there were any questions and Bob Moore representing MSRA asked about relations with the Rotarians. Tom answered they need to do a better job for the rodeo. Rotarians committed for the 1991 success. Tom stated that if not, we will have to make a change.

Tom explained Coors Contract to the Associations. Stressing the point of getting association finals reports in on time. Tom also informed associations of Resistol adding \$5,000 more for sponsorships.

Sower Silver Company then presented their buckles, pins, etc.

Tom introduced Don Sober of Coors. Don explained Coors involvement with CWFR and Associations. Don Stated that Coors had been involved for 13 years with NARC and is the exclusive beef for the NARC. And what this means is associations shouldn't go after Budweiser or Miller or Don will go after Tom and cuss him. Don says to call with problems at

any time.

Marv Pulman at this time discussed corporate sponsors. Marv stated that he had sent out 14 proposals this year thus far. He sent out proposals to motels, petroleum companys, Coca Cola, and many more. He explained how to make up a proposal. Stating how important follow up calls are. Also do what you promise in the proposal and send in a production report so the sponsor will know these promises have been fulfilled.

Pat York from Resistol was introduced by Tom Harvey. Pat went over Resistol contract with members explaining the program. Member associations requested new ad from Pat for programs. Pat sent promo packs to each association from Resistol. Resistol sponsorship for 1991 to NARC will be \$15,000. Regional associations will receive straw hats and 15 X hats for yearend CWFR champions.

Trev Wilde represented Western States Rodeo Association for membership into NARC. Western States was accepted to NARC on a one year probation.

Tom Harvey presented Hawaii Rodeo Association to the members and the board for approval. Decision was to get more information from them before a decision could be made.

Northern Plains Rodeo Association was presented for membership by Jim Mosbrucker. After much discussion between members and board, they moved: to think about it and decide the next day. There was much questioning about whether or not each association should have a board of directors. David Loyd made a motion that each member association needs a board of directors. Tom Holland seconded the motion, motion carried and passed.

Bill Geipel from National Entry System made a presentation.

Tom addressed members on selling raffle tickets to pay their dues for 1991. Everyone agreed it was a good idea. Membership dues will be set up for first payment due March 1991 in the amount of \$1,000. The balance due in April and May.

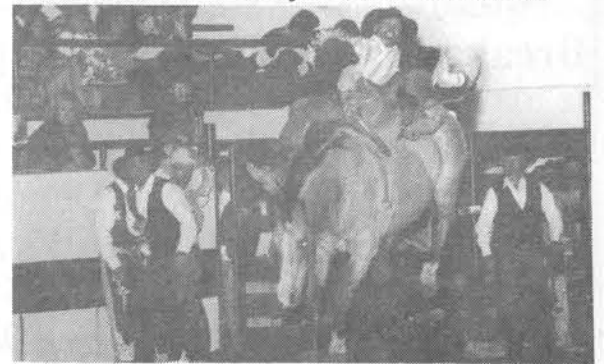

I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.
