Coach explains rewards

Every person was born to carry out a purpose in life. In Wayne Else's case, he was born to compete and coach. The sport - rodeo.

Else's fondness for the sport took root back at his family's ranch in the Big Hole, the valley of 10,000 haystacks andhome of famous ranchers.

He launched into rodeo competition when he was a senior in high school. The native Montanan went on to join the Western Montana College Rodeo Team and graduate with a degree in physical education, preparing him for his job as rodeo coach for WMC.

"Rodeo is a sport that doesn't have to end after college. It can go on indefinitely - as long as the body can take the abuse,' says the 39-year-old cowboy with a chuckle.

Else, who also ranches running 100 Hereford-Simmentals and 200 sheep, says he's given up competing in the more physically abusive rodeo activities like riding bulls and bucking horses. "I did that in my younger days. Now I stick to steer wrestling and calf roping," he says.

Steer wrestling, commonly known as bulldoggin', is Else's favorite event and his specialty. Last year he placed as one of the state's top 10 bulldoggers.

But the rodeo competitor says he can't take all the credit for his success in steer wrestling. Registered Quarter horses Spiffy Bars and Speedy Bucket helped him grab more than a few ribbons. Spiffy, the bulldoggin' horse, brings the cowboy in close so he can leap off to catch the steer, and Speedy, the hazing horse keeps the steer in line.

"You have a certain pride when your horses perform really well, because you were the one who trained them," says the steer wrestler, who shoes horses and serves on Vigilante Electric Cooperative's Board of Directors.

But Else is even prouder of the performances exhibited by the members of his rodeo team.

"I really enjoy watching the kids compete and seeing them excel," he emphasized. Although the team totals 30 members, only six men and three women compete in a rodeo, so all must vie for those spots.

Last year both teams, men and women's, qualified for the College National Finals. The men's team ranked in the top 10, and the women's qualified in the top 13. Both teams are now sitting second in the region, and it looks like they'll qualify for nationals.

The coach says his motiva-

Dear Barrel Racers;

Below is a list of who is to be in charge of the electric eyes at the rodeos for the remaining NRA season. If there are any problems with the electric eyes, all complaints will be directed towards the person who is in charge of the electric eye for that rodeo. She then can contact the barrel racing director.

Here is what each person needs to do when they're in charge of the electric eye:

Contact the person who was in charge of the eye at the previous rodeo to see where the

electric eye ended up.

2. Find a way for the electric eye to get to the first performances of the rodeo you are in charge of and make sure the electric eye has been charged.

3. Čall Central Entry to find out what girls are up in what performances (you can do this when you

call back for you entries).

Contact one girl per performance and put her in charge of that performance; get all the equipment set up before and during the performance; make sure that the electric eye is shut off and given to whoever is to charge the eye for the next performance (or to whoever is to take the eye to its next destination).

4. Complete the cycle by contacting the person who is in charge of the eye at the next rodeo and decide where the eye needs to go between rodeos (so that it may be charged and sent to the

next rodeo.)

The gals who are in charge of the electric eyes are not the only ones who are on the hook. We are all responsible for our event running smoothly. If you are called on to help, please be sure to do you share; and you are welcome to recruit any other help you may need (that is what the list is for.)

Directions for setting up the eye are also on the

list, that should eliminate excuses.

Thanks for helping out. Hopefully, this will eliminate some of the problems that have occurred this year.


Please cover the eyes



tion to do this job comes from just plain liking kids. "When you work with this calibre of kids, you realize there's a future for this county.

"They;re always willing to pitch in and help with the fund-raising projects, and they have the attitude that 'if there's a will, there's a way," he says.

The rodeo coach recalls a time when one of his

kids displayed such tenacity.

"Two weeks before our first rodeo, Don Nahrgang ran a horn into his groin. The horn went in 8 inches and ruptured an artery. He was lucky to come out alive," Else explains, while reaching for some more chew in his shirt pocket. "Two weeks later he competed in his first rodeo and took first in the bullriding event."

"That's the rewards of coaching. When you see a kid perform that well and realize how much he's grown up," says the WMC coach, who lifes with his wife lola and three children on a ranch near

Dillon.

But Western's rodeo team is also reaping rewards from competing under the reins of a coach who is more than a couple of above other college rodeo coaches.

"Wayne is always around to help in some way." says Joey Nahrgang, a brother of Don. "He's either outside of the chute or standing in the box. And it doesn't matter if you're a member of the team or competing individually. He's always there watching, regardless."

Nahrgang adds, "And he never plays favorites.

It's apparent Coach Else and his 30 team members equal a unique combination - a loyal coach who goes the extra mile and a team instilled with the determination to win.

And the results show in the rodeo arena.




