

### It's A Girl!






### RMAF Convention



I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.



### **Best of the Century Rodeo Legends**

The idea for the sweepstakes-winning float in the 1999 Labor Day Parade came out of a group discussion. After all, this is "rodeo weekend" in White Sulphur Springs, Montana, and the theme for the parade was "Best of the Century." After much input from local "rodeo experts," there were a number of rodeo greats to contemplate as "Best of the Century." The local "experts" were good at coming up with names and approximate dates, but the organizers wanted to cover the entire century and represent some of the women rodeo greats. As a result, they went "online" and consulted the internet, of course.

Local flavor was the highlight of the float. Howard Zehntner, a local legendary calf roper, earned second place in the event at the National High School Rodeo in 1957. He was a member of the Montana team that won the National High School Rodeo that year. He also took first place in the District and third place in State. Walt Linderman, another local cowboy legend, holds the runner-up title in steer wrestling at the World Championships in 1966, 1970, and 1972.

After entering web sites for Rodeo Hall of Fame, Cowboy Hall of Fame, Cowboy.net, and the P.R.C.A. Record Book, the group came up with the following Rodeo Legends of the Century:

Bill Pickett, a black cowboy in the 1920's who not only created the sport of steer wrestling, but also dominated and perfected the sport. He was portrayed on the float by

George Knight. Alice and Marge Greenough, sisters from Deer Lodge, who were legendary saddle bronc riders in the 1930's, were depicted by Darci Roatch and Nancy Walter wearing clothing that came as close as possible to the ones the sisters wore.

Casey Tibbs, the only saddle bronc rider to hold three consecutive World Championship titles, 1951-1954, was represented by Rodger Shroyer. Doug Johnson was Ike Rude, the oldest cowboys to win a championship, winning the steer roping in 1953 when he as 59.

Jim Shoulders, a true legend among the rodeo legends, has six consecutive World Champion bull riding titles, 1954-1959, five time All-Around cowboy, and won 16 world titles. Milton Theriault and Shawn Paulson, in full bull riding gear, took turns portraying this accomplished rodeo legend. Jim Rodriguez, Jr. was the youngest cowboy to win a World Championship, winning the team roping world title when he as 18 in 1959. Brenda Paulsen acquired a painted on mustache to be this young cowboy.

The organizers learned that there have been bulls used in world champion competition that have been retired because the cowboys could not ride them. The most famous in contemporary times is "Bodacious." However, no one would ride the float with an actual bull, so they settled for a black steer with horns owned by Charlie Hubbard to represent "Crooked Nose." The steer was very accommodating. 

On behalf of the Northern Rodeo Association and the Northern Women's Rodeo Association Board of Directors, cowboys and cowgirls, and office staff, we extend a sincere Thank You to the saddle makers who have chosen to share their talents with us by participating in the NRA/NWRA Saddlemakers Program. Thank you for making this one of the most unique and prestigious award programs in the country. Duncan Vezain, Red Lodge, MT, of High Country Cowboy Tack and Saddle Shop is this year's builder of the Bareback Riding Champion Saddle. This former NRA Bull Rider learned his trade from Jim Darden in Cheyenne, Wyoming, and has spent two years in his Red Lodge shop. Duncan enjoys doing repairs and hand carvings because he feels he can always learn from them. Tim Martz, Wilsall, MT: A fifth-generation Park County native, this Montana saddlemaker is building the trophy Saddle Bronc Riding saddle for 1999. Tim became interested in leatherwork at a young age, watching his great-uncle build saddles and do rawhide work. In 1989, Tim became serious about saddlemaking and began working with Wilsall saddlemaker, Bob Pletan. Tim now builds custom saddles and tack at Pletans Custom Leather, located in Wilsall. Wes Schenk, Harlowton, MT: This self-taught saddlemaker was raised on a ranch near Winnett and now feels lucky to be able to make a living doing what he loves. Wes, his wife Tammy, and son's Will and Clay all contribute to the shop, located in Harlowton. In his 17th year as a saddlemaker, Wes' shop repairs boots,

chaps, bridles or anything else that can be drug in the door. Lindsay Talkington, Choteau, MT: This year, Lindsay will be building the 1999 Championship Steer Wrestler saddle. He grew up near Miles City, but now works at his shop, located in downtown Choteau. He learned his trade of making saddles from Jesse Bleecker about 20 years ago. Lindsay says, "You name it, we can make it." Bill Murch, Glasgow, MT: In his second year of participation in the NRA/NWRA saddlemakers program, this Glasgow man will be building the saddle awarded to the 1999 Calf Roping Champion. This selftaught saddlemaker has been working with leatherwork for twenty years. Dennis Schuchard, Harlowton, MT: Dennis has been doing leatherwork since he was a senior in high school. Then, just three years ago, he started building saddles with the help of Wes Schenk. He also keeps busy within the brand inspection business. He has three children, four grandchildren, and of course his wife, Shirley. Dennis is the builder of the 1999 Team Roping Heading Champion Saddle as well as the Heeling Champion Saddle. Allan Pursley, Great Falls, MT: For over 25 years, Allan has been building saddles and doing leatherwork. He built World Champion Dan Mortensen's bronc saddle as well as Charlotte Smith and Molly Swanson's barrel racing saddles. Alan has been building the NWRA Barrel Racing Champion saddle since 1992. Mike Witt, Billings, MT: Builder of the Ladies Breakaway Roping Championship saddle since 1994, Mike's

interest in leatherwork began while he was in sixth grade. He grew up North West of Jordan and had now been building saddles for over 25 years. Stop by his shop, located two blocks west of MetraPark in Billings. Rodger Hollowell, Lewistown, MT: Builder of the Junior Barrel Racing Champion saddle, the gentleman's shop is located in Lewistown. Rodger says that his craft could be labeled as "Trial by Fire." He had some help from Wes Schenk, but says he became interested when he was younger and was working on the Jordan area ranches. He made leather equipment for himself to use. Look for Rodger's saddle when you stop by the Billings Hotel and Convention Center's lobby.

Lee Patterson, Whitefish, MT: In the early 1980's, if you won a saddle from the NRA, bets would say it was probably made by Lee. This year, he is building the Junior All-Around Champion saddle. Lee says he got started making saddles about 25 years ago with help from Earl Twist and Jim Lathrop. He has worked in and owned several leatherwork shops, but always stayed within the Whitefish area. 
