CWFR Entries open to all NRA Members

ENTER SEPTEMBER 30

Any Northern Rodeo Association member interested in attending the 1991 Coors World Finals Rodeo at the El Paso County Coliseum, in El Paso, Texas, on Nov. 1 - 9 should call the NRA office and enter on Monday, Sept. 30, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

NRA needs to fill a team with three in each event plus alternates will be selected. High money winners in the 1991 NRA standings will be given preference choice. However, if you are interested in attending and competing in the CWFR call Jann.

Entry fees must be received by NRA office by Oct. 2 to be officially entered. No exceptions!!.

Association Suspended Lists

The NARC will honor all member association suspended lists in taking entries for the CWFR. This list must be submitted to the NARC office prior to entry date to be considered. Do not bother to send the list after entries are taken-it just causes undue and unnecessary confusion. A suspended list should be sent to the NARC office Sept. 15 and a phone call to update would be appreciated prior to Oct. 1.

Alternates:

Each Association will have the opportunity to name contestants interested in coming to the CWFR as alternative for an association which can not send a full team. Alternates winning do not count for team awards. Alternates in each event are drawn from those named by the association and will be notified not later than Oct. 10.

Entry Fees and Insurance:

Entry fees in all events, bareback, saddle bronc, steer wrestling, calf roping, bull riding, ladies barrel racing, team roping (per man), ladies breakaway roping are \$200.

Of the above entry fees, \$200 will be put in the prize money. Medical and accidental death insurance for each contests is an additional \$3. This cost is mandatory and will be added to each person's entry fees. (This is per person and not per event.) This money collected and forwarded to the NARC office along with the entry fees..

Added money

The Adolph Coors Company will add \$31,400 to the prize money at the 1991 Coors World Finals Rodeo. Team awards will receive \$2,400; The remaining \$29,000 will be split equally among the eight events, double the added in the team roping.

Prizes:

Handmade custom trophy saddles donated by Circle Y Saddlery will be awarded to each event and to the Men's and Ladies' All-Around Champions. Hand engraved trophy buckles from Sower Silver Company will be awarded to the Champions and All-Around Champions.

Championship buckles will be awarded to the the go - round winners of each event in each of the two full-goes and the short go-round. Coors has donated a customized Circle - J, 2-horse trailer to the high money all-around champion. Resistol Hats will give each champion a 15 X black hat.

Minor Contestants:

All contestants under the age of 18 must provide the NARC office with a release form signed by the contestant's parents or legal guardians and notarized. Minors will not be allowed to compete under any circumstances until this requirement is on file in the NARC office. As association representatives, it is your responsibility to alert me to the fact that any of your contestants are under the age of 18.

Stalls

Stalls for contestants' horses will be available for \$20 per horse for 1 night or for 10 nights. All horses will be registered and be issued a leg band which must remain in place for the duration of the rodeo. All horses kept on coliseum grounds must have a leg band.

Livestock Health Requirements:

The Texas Livestock Board is actively monitoring all livestock coming for out-of-state and those coming to coliseum activities especially. Please be aware of the livestock health requirements in time for them to acquire the necessary documents.

Headquarters Hotel:

The headquarters hotel will be the Rodeway Inn located on I-10 between the airport and the Coliseum. The hotel is about five minutes from the coliseum. Special room rates are offered to all rodeo participants.



NRA board meeting, August 16, during MontanaFair

Meeting was called to order by President Stan Rasmussen

Minutes of the April 6, 1991 board of directors meeting were distributed and reviewed.

Roll was taken and a quorum was verified. Those members present included: President Stan Rasmussen, Tom Holland, Director at large; Ed Miller, advisory board; Tootie Rasmussen, contract personnel; Charlie Briggs, steer wrestling; Lyle Baumann, calf roping; Nancy Petersen, ladies barrel racing; Stacey Baumann, ladies breakaway roping; Monte Finn, bull riding; Dave Wagner, junior director; Glen Hough, Proxy for Bill Parker, team roping; Dr. Howard Holloway, Leonard Wortman, Bob Graveley and Rodger Nordahl, committee members.

Those not represented included bareback riding, saddle bronc riding, and stock contractors.

Old Business: NRA finals settlement and renewed Runquist contract was discussed.

Rookie bareback riding event was discussed. Participation and reception on behalf of the contractors, committees, and rookie bareback riders has been outstanding. However, additional guidelines for payoffs, percentage holdout by association, membership to association, etc., needed to be considered. Ed Miller moved; BAREBACK RIDING DIRECTOR TO DRAW UP ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES FOR THE ROOKIE BAREBACK RIDING EVENT AND BRING TO THE FALL BOARD MEETING. Leonard Wortman, seconded. Passed

New Business:

Central Entry: Sharon Martin of Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry was asked to be in attendance at the board meeting to answer questions regarding the central entry system which is contracted by the NRA.

Directors asked Sharon to have available at the February meeting facts and figures regarding the implementation of a toll-free entry and callback number.

Rodeos: Length of rodeos and number of timed event contestants included in the performance was addressed, with no action taken.

Secretaries and contractors have been asked to save the draw sheets from their rodeos and compile them from rodeo to rodeo. New triplicate timers cards will be looked into for use in 1992 NRA rodeos thus official timers cards and 2 additional copies available — one for judges, one to post.

Withholding of stock charge at NRA rodeos with insufficient numbers of cattle for the number of contestants entered in an event was addressed. After much discussion, the board asked that letters be written to each committee for the 1992 season making them aware that their contractors need to provide a sufficient number of healthy timed event cattle for their rodeo as stated in the NRA rulebook, thus ensuring humane conditions for the animals and a fairer contest for the contestants.

Direction for a rule governing fining procedures for contractors who do no supply the proper number of cattle for an event was addressed. A committee was formed to work on the rule addition.

North American Rodeo Commission: Possible dues increase for this past year. NARC president, Tom Harvey will be contacted for clarification.



Rodeo fans mourn death of "Punch" Rosssen

The tie makes them all part of a large rodeo family, No matter where, no matter how far est bull ride they ever saw in their lives. It away, news concerning part of that family travels and travels quickly.

On Friday night and Saturday morning, the news traveling through the rodeo community was bad.

On Friday afternoon, rodeo and Montana itself suffered a great loss when Ronnie Rossen was killed by a bull during a rodeo in Rocky Ford, Colo.

The tragic news about one of their own traveled quickly up through Wyoming and Montana. Details were sketchy, everyone wanted an answer and everyone felt the loss immediately.

Those involved in rodeo are special people. Competing head-to-head for the same money, they don't hesitate to help each other - sharing advice and knowledge accrued through experience. The older competitors help the younger competitors, just like it has been since the first cowboy got on a bucking horse.

Rossen was one of those special rodeo people. I never met Ronnie Rossen, but heard his name mentioned often. But in talking with people and reading past stories about him, it was obvious that Rossen was a true cowboy.

Born in Nebraska, Rossen made his way to Broadus as a young man, working on ranches and riding rank horses and bulls. He began riding hard in the mid-1950's on the Rodeo Cowboy Association circuit.

In past interviews, he credited the jump-start on his world-class success to a fateful ride on the bull, Speck, at an August 1961 rodeo in Burwell, Neb. Speck, at the time, had not been ridden in six years.

As a raw-boned 25-year-old ranch cowboy, Rossen matched the bull jump for jump, twist for twist, completing the eight-second ride to a standing ovation from fans and competitors.

"I just went in there with the idea of 'Don't They came from all walks of life and when it let go,' That's probably why I have so many scars on my face, I never let go when I should Yet, there is a strong unwritten invisible tie have," Rossen told the Billings Gazette in an

> "The other cowboys thought it was the greatprobably wasn't. But Speck got rode and they thought it was great. It was the idea that Speck got rode that made it great."

> Rossen's ride aboard Speck was immortalized by artist R. F. Rains in a bronze sculpture. The piece, including all the details from that important ride, down to the "R.R." for Ronnie Rossen on one chap [leg], the cowboy's lament of "NRY" for "No Ranch Yet" on the other and a miniature bull rope designed by his old rope maker Kent Fillingham of Hardin.

> Rossen used that ride enroute to his first world championship. He would finished in the top 15 in the world in 1962, '64, '65, '66 and

> He won his second world title in 1966 and was the top bull rider in the average at the National Finals Rodeo in 1964 and 1965, the latter when he finished second in the world. He made nine appearances at the NFR during his storied career.

> As his career tapered off, Rossen ran bullriding schools in Thompson Falls, Broadus, Rapid City, Jackson Hole and Longmont, Colo. After one of his students was killed at his bullriding school, he closed down his school, sold whatever could be sold and gave the money to the young cowboy's family.

He was rodeo and rodeo people take care of their own.

Rossen, who had lived in Absarokee the last seven years, never did completely quit riding bulls. He was a founder of the National Old Timer's Rodeo Association circuit and had won its bullriding title three times.

He was doing what he loved on Friday afternoon, matching his wits and experience against (Continued on page 14)





Two Aussie barrel racers bring horses to Montana's NRA

What? They brought their horses with them on the airplane? From Australia?

Those are some of the questions being asked about Gem Lloyd and Kerrie Holder. These two have fulfilled a childhood dream of being the first to export their barrel horses from their homes in Australia to the United States to compete.

Gem Lloyd has competed in rodeos in the United States for four years, but until his year she merely purchased a horse when she arrived in the states.

This is Kerrie Holder's third trip to the USA. When she started to get cold feet about making the trip with her horse, he dad said, "If you don't go now, you never will."

So she started packing.

And pack they did. "We hardly could make it to the airport with all our our tack and belongings," Holder said.

An added mystique was that the two were not acquainted before the trip "I heard that Gem was considering going to the States to run barrels, so I rang her and introduced myself and said, "you don't know me but" laughs Holder.

The airline requires that three horses be on the same cargo-passenger plane. At the last minute, the third horse backed out. "We were devastated when we heard the third horse was not going. We knew we could not afford to pay for that horse, too," says Lloyd.

"It must have been meant to be because the airlines agreed to let us board with our two horses at no extra cost."

"The airlines people told us that the horses would need only one bale of hay and one bucket of water for the 20-hour flight," Holder said. "But we took an extra bale of hay and it is a good thing! My horse ate one whole bale by himself and we had to get more water when we stopped at Tahiti!"

"My horse slept the whole way and ate only a biscuit." claims Gem.

The horses will make the United States their permanent home, but the barrel racers will fly home to Australia when their yearlong visa is exhausted. Holder's mother told her daughter before she left home, " you know we can't afford to fly Tex back home - he only has a oneway ticket." Sadly the daughter agreed.

The two are not strangers to running barrels. They have been successful in the WPRA (Women's Professional Rodeo Association) in Australia finishing in the top 10 for the last four vears.

Holder was the 1982 junior barrel racing champion and ended up second in the WPRA finals average in 1990.

Lloyd has conducted a horsemenship and barrel clinic.

Bullet, her handsome 9-year-old gelding is a grandson of the famous Doc Bar.

Kerrie Holder's family raised her nine-yearold gelding, Tex. He is by Warning Flag, a racing stud, buy Capicorn Bozo by The Ole

"Our horses had to adjust to the harder ground in parts of Montana and Kerri's horse seemed to get an allergic reaction to the quarantine pen's disinfectant," says Lloyd.

"Other than those adjustments, barrel racing is the same competitive event everywhere."

"I've been to Texas, California, Wyoming and chose Montana to locate because of the good summer NRA rodeos," says Lloyd.

Lloyd's mother is an Australian National Champion Camp Drafter. Her parents have a station (ranch) in Rock Hampton, Queensland, Australia.

"My father was on the first Australian rodeo team to compete in the States. They rodeoed throughout Texas," says Holder. Her parents operate a real estate business in Cootmundra, New South Wales, and raise running Quarter Horses.
