

Derick Fleming leads NRA all-around by just \$56 margin

Lisa Scheffer has big lead in women's all-around race

The Northern Rodeo Association season has come to a close.

The competition wasn't for the top spots in each individual event. The most heated battles came at the 10th and final spot which gets a cowboy or cowgirl into the NRA Finals scheduled Feb. 5-7, 1999 at Metra in Billings.

Less than \$5, the price of a fastfood meal, got Beau Franzen of Sidney into the steer wrestling finals over Harlem's Bernard "Eddie" Getten.


Rhonda Kountz of Bozeman got into the top 10 of breakaway roping by less than

\$7 over Helena's Mary Goyins. Marcey Chaffee of Billings took the No. 1 spot in breakaway by just \$72 over Jordan's Tracey Currey.

Less than \$43 separated No. 10 from No. 11 in barrel racing. Colstrip's Kris Bartholomew qualified for the Finals while Monica Gruel of Great Falls will stay home.

Roddy Cameron of Ingomar won enough late to get the No. 10 spot in the steer wrestling standings by \$15 over Cascade's Michael Gollaher.

The all-around cowboy race is one of the tightest in NRA history, with just \$904 separating the top five and \$56 separating No. 1 Derick Fleming of Broadus from Bozeman's Rob Kountz. Lisa Scheffer of Hamilton has a healthy lead of almost \$3,000 in the all-around cowgirl standings.

Northern Rodeo Association Introduces The Northern Women's Rodeo Association

As you have probably heard, the N.R.A. received a request this summer from a man to be allowed to compete in the Ladies Barrel Racing event in the N.R.A. rodeos. This person was advised that in order for him to compete, there would have to be a rule change, which could not take place until the Fall meeting of the N.R.A. Board.

N.R.A. Board members received and reviewed copies of the correspondence that alluded to litigation if the N.R.A. did not grant this request. The N.R.A. attorney was asked by the Board to review the Bylaws and Rules, a similar case involving the W.P.R.A. and advise the Board on the best course of action to take in light of the threatened litigation.

At the Fall Board meeting the Board heard a proposal from the N.R.A. attorney to eliminate the ladies events from the N.R.A. and allow the lady contestants to form a new organization, the Northern Women's Rodeo Association (N.W.R.A.), which would co-sanction the Ladies Breakaway Roping and Barrel Racing events at all future N.R.A. rodeos. This would occur in much the same fashion as the W.P.R.A. works with the P.R.C.A. in conducting the barrel

racing events at the P.R.C.A. rodeos. Because of threats of litigation, the Board decided it was in the best interests of the N.R.A. and the competitors in the ladies events to amend the rules per the N.R.A. attorney's proposal. The N.R.A. will no longer sanction the ladies events after the 1998 N.R.A. finals. The N.W.R.A. will now co-sanction these events with the N.R.A.

The N.R.A. attorney has prepared draft Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws and Rules for the new N.W.R.A. Now we need you to come together at a meeting to discuss the new organization and complete the paperwork to have the N.W.R.A. ready for the 1999 rodeo season. The N.R.A. Board and its attorney are willing to provide the initial support for this effort. We hope you can meet at the NRA Finals on February 6, 1:00 p.m. at the Billings Hotel and Convention Center. We'll look forward to seeing you there with your questions, concerns and great ideas for an active N.W.R.A.


The original plan for Three Way was to become a roping steer but as luck would have it, Rodney bought him from Sid and used him at High School Rodeos as a 3 year-old.







I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

Good-Bye, Lila Mae

"If she could have written her life's script, that would have been how she'd have ended it," said Earl Stewart, Lila Mae's husband.

Lila Mae Bean Stewart died of injuries received when her horse stepped in a badger hole and fell while they were working some cows.

Anyone who ever turned a barrel in Montana or any of the northwestern states knows the name of Lila Mae and many were fortunate enough to know the grand lady of barrel racing. "Her eyes were always smiling," a fellow barrel racer remembered.

Born Lila Mae Bean on April 14, 1928 in Helena, Montana, she began her rodeo career in cow cutting at MSU. At that time no one had any cow cutting knowledge, but Lila Mae's very "cowey" calf horse, great riding skills and finesse combined to give her victory. She won the very first pro rodeo barrel race in Montana and went on to win every rodeo in the state during her career. She made two trips to the NFR and in 1973 was runner-up World Champion. In 1974 she and "Bomber" posted the fastest time at the NFR.

Her favorite win was the 1974 champion buckle from Cheyenne Frontier Days.

Lila Mae was instrumental in organizing the WPRA in 1965 and served as the northern region director for six years.

Earl met Lila Mae while working in a saddle shop in Helena. They attended a horse sale on their first date. They married and moved to Missoula where they both worked in the stock yards. Later they opened Stewarts Saddlery which was known as one the best "real cowboy" stores in the area.


Earl was an RCA calf roper, team roper and past president and long-time board member of the Montana Quarter Horse Association. Earl and Lila Mae's children, Curt and Jackie, are also avid riders. Earl says Curt is a "pretty tough team roper" and Jackie and her daughter barrel race.

The legacy goes on and Lila Mae Stewart won't soon be forgotten.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING Friday, October 16, 1998 NRA Office • Billings, MT

President Charlie Briggs called the meeting to order.

Roll was taken and a quorum verified. Those members present included: President, Charlie Briggs; Travis Caldwell, Calf Roping; Kent Robbins, Saddle Bronc Riding; Rob Kountz, Team Roping; Rodney Newman, Stock Contractors; Dick Lyman, Contract Personnel; Rhonda Kountz, Ladies Breakaway Roping; Paula Harris, Ladies Barrel Racing; Teri Jo Lyman, Junior Events; Advisory Board Members: Alvin Wagner, Karen Miller, Ed Waldhauser; Committee Directors East: Joe Murnion; Association attorney, Max A. Hansen.

Financial Report was read and approved subject to audit. Association finances were discussed and an overview of 1998 rodeo season given. Ed Waldhauser is to work with the NRA Office to set up separate accounts for the general fund and NRA Finals.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

North American Rodeo Commission: Ed Waldhauser reported that there will be no NARC rodeo held this year. The NARC is continuing it's search for an appropriate location to hold the rodeo.

Friends of Rodeo: Karen Miller updated the board.

Awards Program: The overall program was discussed. It was moved and seconded: That the yearend awards will be ordered by the NRA Office. PASSED.

NRA Finals: Jann Parker updated the board on NRA Finals. The NRA Finals committee was discussed and a new committee formed: Dick Lyman, Max Hansen, Charlie Briggs and Paula Harris.

Judges Program: Judges Evaluations were discussed. Discussion were had on a judging seminar. It was moved and seconded: That a judging seminar will be held during the NRA Finals and it is mandatory for a level 3–5 judge to attend this seminar to be eligible to judge NRA rodeos the following year.

Logan Coach: Theresa Caldwell updated the board on Logan Coach finances.

Fair Convention: Theresa Caldwell updated the board on the dates of the RMAF Convention.

Old Business:

Membership rule M.1.10.1 was discussed. It was moved and seconded that the Board: amend rule M.1.10.1: All individuals must purchase their card through the NRA Office before they can enter a rodeo. The application must be signed, witnessed or notarized and have correct amount of money or it will be refused. The application and membership fee must reach the NRA Office no later than on the day entries are taken. Applications received on or before the last business day before entries are takenshall be subject to the dues set forth in M.2.1.1. Late applications shall be subject to an additional \$25.00 late fee. Passed.

New Business:

Mark Bugni addressed the board with his request to compete in the Ladies Barrel Racing event. Some discussion ensued and questions were asked of Mark by the Association attorney. Upon the recommendation of the Association's attorney this matter was deferred to later in the meeting and Mark was told that he could remain until that time for the Board's decision.

Phil Luman's letter regarding his judging status was read and discussed.

Dale McQueary's letter concerning past interpretation of the rules and Central Entry was read and discussed.

Discussion followed regarding Marcey Chaffee's letter and rule issues raised concerning stock for Calf Roping and Ladies Breakaway Roping. It was moved and seconded: to add a rule: R.10.11. Livestock used for calf roping shall not be used for breakaway roping and vice versa unless approved by the stock contractor and the event directors. Passed.

Discussion followed concerning Rule R.9.10 and Marcey's comments. It was moved and seconded that the Board: amend rule R.9.10.: If an animal in timed events escapes the chutes or pens before it is called for by a contestant, or another contestant competes on the wrong animal that same animal will be brought back for the contestant to compete on. The animal will be returned by the arena director and the labor crew during or at the end of that performance or slack in the same manner he was originally worked or brought to the pens for contesting. At least 3 head of animals will be brought back together. No animal may be repenned by himself. Decision will be made by arena director about when stock is re-penned. Passed.

Discussion also followed concerning hotshotting animals from the roping chute. It was moved and seconded that the Board: amend rule H.1.5.: No animal shall be beaten, mutilated, or cruelly prodded. Standard electric prods shall be used as little as possible. Animals shall be touched only on the hip or shoulder area. No animal shall be electrically prodded from the roping chute during any performance or slack for a contestant's competitive run. Passed.

Discussion then followed concerning Central Entry. Sharon Martin was present and discussed the Central Entry issues in general. Sharon is going to get an estimate on the cost of programming her computer to draw for order in events after she has drawn for performances. Sharon was asked how many phone lines she used and she told the board that she used three phone lines at all times. The old rule of guaranteeing contestants that they could make it to all rodeos was discussed and the board felt the rule should not be reinstated.

Discussion was held concerning admission to NRA approved rodeos for card holding photographers. It was determined that card holding photographers will be subject to admission policies established by the local committees.

Discussion followed concerning forming a budget committee. Committee members appointed are: Ed Waldhauser, Paula Harris, Karen Miller and Theresa Caldwell.

We then had discussions concerning a membership drive. Some ideas were advanced and the Board members will all work on increasing membership.

Discussion followed concerning recruiting new rodeos. The NRA will continue to work on attracting new quality rodeos.

There was discussion concerning timed event cattle being used for jackpots held during a rodeo. It was decided that this will have to be left to the good judgement of the event directors and the stock contractors.

There was some discussion concerning Central Montana Fair and MontanaFair slack times. Rodney Newman indicated he will try to work out something better for the contestants.

Max Hansen outlined the proposed amendments to the Northern Rodeo Association Bylaws to be effective at the end of the 1998 rodeo season to eliminate the Ladies Barrel Racing and Ladies Breakaway Roping events from the N.R.A. events. It will be necessary for the person's interested in those events to form a new Association to sanction those events at N.R.A. rodeos. The proposal advanced by the ladies contestants would be to uti-

lize a system like that currently employed by the PRCA and WPRA. It was moved and seconded that the proposed amendments to the Northern Rodeo Association Bylaws will be effective as of the end of the 1998 rodeo season and after the N.R.A. Finals. Passed unanimously.

Due to the amendment and bylaw changes the Northern Rodeo Association Board of Directors found that it was not necessary to take further action on the request made by Mark Bugni. The Board thanked Mark for appearing before the Board and advancing his proposal. However, because of the Bylaw change eliminating the lady's events, any action on Mark's proposal was rendered moot.
