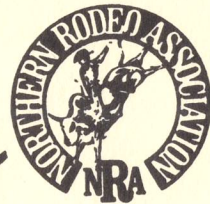

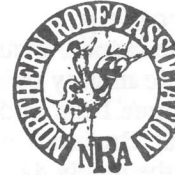

### Junior events at Askins, Aug. 18

Junior events during the Billings Fair will be on Aug. 18 at 8 a.m. in the Jerry Askin Arena in Laurel. Entry fees are \$20 with \$75 per event added. Junior breakaway will have one steer for each entry. Jerry Askins has donated his arena.

The added money is donated by Bud and Bert Roberts of Ballantine and Corral West Ranchwear in the Billings Heights.

An open and matched team roping will be in the same location following the junior events (10 a.m.) See ad on page 16 for more information.

**DIRECTIONS:** Get off Interstate 90 at Laurel (Refinery) exit. Go under railroad underpass and turn left at the 4-way light. Three miles on highway 10 and turn north 1/4 mile. Permanent signs mark the way to Askin arena.

### Rules require long sleeve shirts, hats be worn in the arena

NRA judges and officials remind contestants, working personnel and parents that you are required to wear a long sleeve shirt and hat in the arena at all times during an NRA performance or slack. Several reported violations of this over the July 4 weekend.

Held during the annual Broken Horn Stampede, 29 ropers enjoyed the lovely day at the beautifully remodeled Miller Arena on the highway between Columbus and Absarokee.

Chris Melaney, of Wolf Creek, won the roping with a total time of 11.9 on three. She was 4.6, 4.3, and 3.0.

Sally Jane Mosby of Bozeman won second with a 12.4, and Janie Carlson won third with a 13.5. Rhonda Ragland and Jody Petersen were third and fourth respectively.

Jody Petersen, Sally Jane Mosby and Stacey Baumann each won a go-round winning \$30 each for their fast times of 3., 3.6, and 2.6, respectively.

Average winners were paid \$218.30 to Melaney for first; \$159.30 to Mosby for second; and \$122.10 to Carlson for third.

## Mathison becomes Witcher and remains top-notch roper

A man's name. It is the only thing that he carries his entire life.

It is his link to a proud past and the cornerstone of a promising future. A man's name is the strongest bond between father and son.

Chris and Jack Witcher are more than two men with the same surname. They are traveling companions, team roping partners, ranch workers, each others helper and more importantly, friends.

And in December of 1989, in a courthouse in Miles City, the bond between Chris and Jack became complete. They, officially in the eyes of the law, became father and son.

For the first 20 years of his life, Chris was known as Chris Mathison.

Jack Witcher entered Chris' life less than 20 years ago, when Jack married Chris' mother, D'Ann. Jack become part of the family when Chris was just old enough to walk and his hands just starting to be large enough to hold a rope.

"We're pretty close," said Chris, as the friendly, easy-going cowboy leaned up against his pickup truck last week at the ranch of his friend, Jody Wacker of Roundup.

"He pretty much raised me. He had a good hand on me, making me grow up right. Making me mature and making sure I made the right decisions.

"It's nice to have his name I've looked up to him more than anyone else."

Through the years, Jack Witcher helped young Chris, showing him the finer points of roping, helping him when he failed and standing back with quiet pride to let Chris enjoy his successes. And as the years passed, those successes became more frequent, almost matching Jack's successes, a top roper himself.

As Chris proved he could hold his own, he and Jack became roping partners. While other teams squabbled and switched partners every other week, Chris and Jack criss-crossed Montana during the summers, sometimes cashing a check, sometimes leaving with nothing but the sound of the applause from the crowds.

"We communicate really well," said Chris,

one of the nation's best collegiate calf and team ropers competing for Montana State and now preparing for this week's College National Finals Rodeo in Bozeman.

"We think very much alike. We do the same things when we rope, the way we train horses, the way we rodeo. Traveling has never been a problem. He's pretty quiet and when he goes to sleep, I just turn on my rock 'n roll."

When Chris was 18, the idea of he become officially adopted by Jack came up in the family discussions. But Chris wasn't really sure about the idea.

"It was, 'Gee, a name change . . . ' I didn't know, I wasn't sure it would be confusing or not," said Chris with a small smile. "Then for the past year, six months or so, we talked and pondered about it some more. It was a family decision and [we] decided it would something really nice."

So in December, among family, Chris walked into the courthouse and after a couple minutes of signing documents, left the doors as Chris Mathison Witcher.

"When we got out of the court, it hit me it was for real," remembered Chris. "It (name change) hasn't been too rough. People who knew me best, knew me as Witcher anyway."

But there has been some confusion. Because after the fall rodeo season, the Chris Mathison who finished third in the nation last year in the calf roping seemed to disappear. Listed in his place in the standings was the name Chris M. Witcher.

"Oh, it's thrown a curve at some people," Chris said. At the NRA (Northern Rodeo Association) Finals, people had no idea who I was. And now with friends, they correct themselves quicker than I do when I'm being introduced."

"I finally got new checks and read them and it's sometimes hard to believe. The hardest part was waiting in line three hours to get my driver's license changed.

Now, for the rest of his life, he will be known as Chris Mathison Witcher. A name, someday, he will pass along to a son of his own.

"He (Jack) was really pleased," said Chris. "We've done so much together."

As father and son.

## Roundup Cowboy wins Big Sky Region Calf Roping

ROUNDUP - As he walked around his family's ranch, Jody Wacker casually swung a rope as some people would a baseball bat. Effortlessly and with a purpose.

With a flick of his wrist, Wacker would send the rope out at imaginary targets and just as quickly, have it back in his hands, ready and poised to reach out again.

And while the rope came back empty each time, when it counted the most this rodeo season, the Roundup cowboy was right on target.

Wacker, who ropes for Western Montana College, enters this week's College National Finals Rodeo third in the National calf roping standings, just 40 points shy of leader K. C. Jones of Eastern Wyoming.

But while other calf ropers have been up and down, spectacular times one go and nothing the next, Wacker has been a model of consistency. He place in all 10 rodeos this fall and spring to easily win the Big sky Region calf roping championship.

"I feel I have a good shot at it," said Wacker, a cowboy who is in the CNFR for purpose. "I am looking for a national title. You bet I'm looking forward to this. Last year, I didn't do so well. I broke a barrier, caught a leg on a calf . . . had those little things go wrong."

"It's a matter of experience. Every time you're in that box, you learn something."

At last year's CNFR, Wacker learned plenty. He learned the gathering of the best intercollegiate ropers and riders is more than just another weekend rodeo.

"You're in awe the first time," Wacker said of the competing in front of the large crowds and the pressure associated with chasing national titles. "You go, 'it's such a big rodeo.'" And actually, it's easier than a guy thinks."

"You start think you have to be a lot quicker to place and then you start to push and then you

have problems. The important thing is to make good solid runs with no mistakes."

While he achieved one goal this rodeo season - winning the calf roping title - he came up just a bit short in another. He finished second to Montana State's Dan Mortensen in the all-around standings. They took different routes, with Wacker competing in calf roping and team roping along with throwing an occasional steer. While Mortensen concentrated on the rough stock events, bull riding and saddle bronc competition.

"My goal was to win it," said Wacker, not afraid to hide his ambition, but also very realistic to his goals. "But there is not shame to finish behind who I did."

Wacker, who will also be in the team roping competition with MSU's Chris Mathison Witcher, enters 14th in the all-around standings and is fully aware that much can change in a week of rodeo.

But coming into the CNFR, Wacker is concerned about his horse, Hoot.

"She's got tendon trouble," Wacker explained about his horse which to a calf roper can be all the difference between winning and losing, national titles and no times. "She turned a ankle somewhere. We just have to baby her along and see what happens."

Wacker's ascension in the college standing's has mirrored that of Western Montana College's, a school that operates on a very limited rodeo budget, yet contends for the Big Sky Region title and puts individuals in contention for national titles.

"My freshman year, we got a new coach, Wayne Else, and he's done a really good job coaching," said Wacker. "And the town and people around the community really support us and that makes a difference. I feel next year, we'll be really competitive."

Which would not be surprising, because as long as Wacker has a rope in his hand, he'll be right on target.

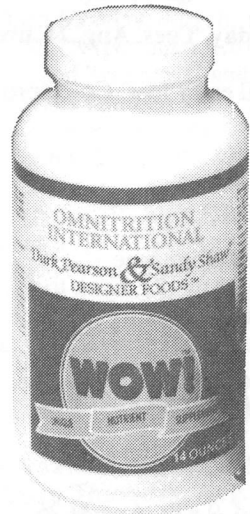

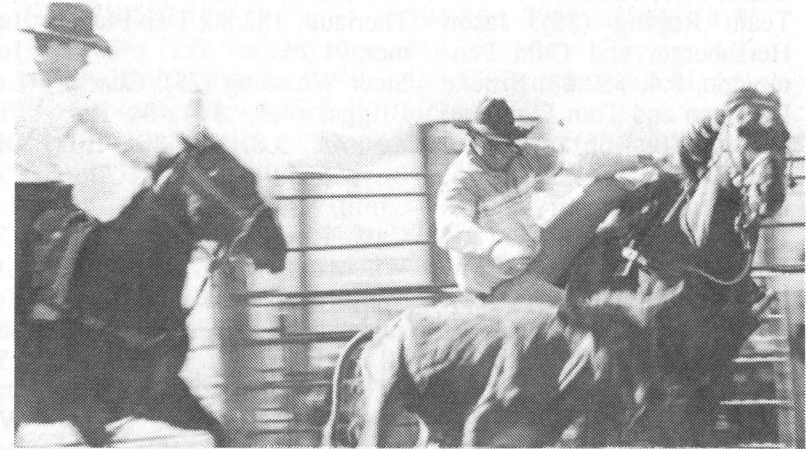

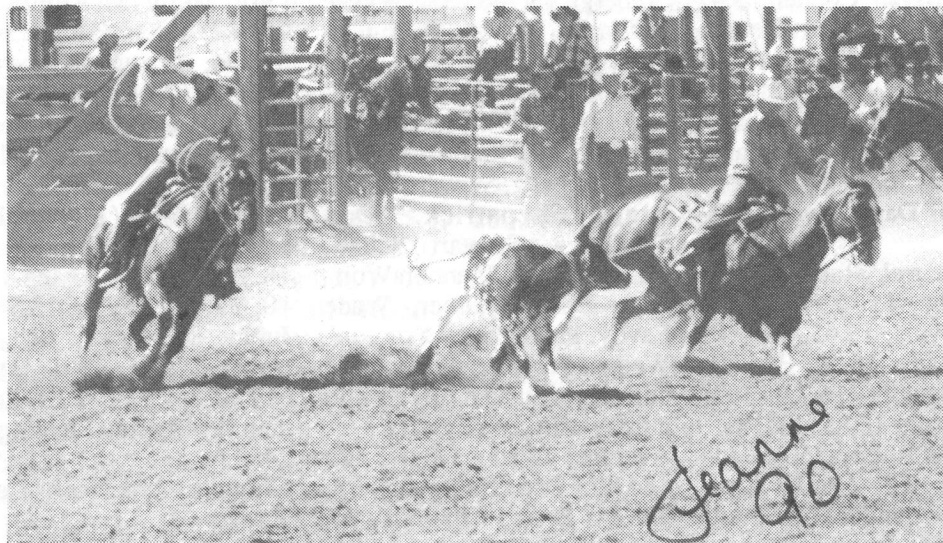

## Montana High School Rodeo is 40 years old

Montana High School Rodeo is celebrating its 40th year during the 1990 rodeo season.

Montana High School Rodeo Association and the Glasgow Chamber of Commerce recognized the founders of Montana High School Rodeo as well as the year-end champions of 1950.

About 40 years ago, an Augusta, Mont., high school student Lloyd Paul read an article in a Western magazine about high school rodeos held in Texas. After contracting Claude Mullins, the founder of High School rodeo, and trying to enter, Lloyd learned that the rodeos were exclusively for Texas high school students.

Mullins told Lloyd how to establish the same type of rodeos in Montana. The young student contacted his school superintendent, Elmer Tuomi and the owner of the Manix Store in Augusta, Jim Manix. He also talked with fellow students: JoAnne, Mary Faith and Nancy McLean, Kenny Hoeffner, Bob and Bud Hubbard, Bob Garrison, Ernie Austin and Don Kelly.

They joined forces and put on the first high school rodeo. Others from around Augusta who helped included: Art Nett, Bud and Opal Swanson, Kenneth and Faith McLean, Pat and Catherine White, Vic Kruger, Roscoe Geise, Oral Zumwalt, Tom Nett, Bill Shortridge, Steve and Bob Mosher, Jay Overman, Pete Geldrick, Dick Gray, Henry Cottle, Ray Krone, Ray Snyder, Joe Flom, Jim and Laurence Christian, Walt Pattola, and Ethel Bean.

From other areas Mr. and Mrs. R. Buckle of Big Timber, and Doug and Nancy Dear of Simms donated their help.

After the first State Rodeo in August some competitive young high school cowboys and cowgirls were crowned winners.

Charles Henson, Lodge Grass, the son of Marge Greenough, was named all-around champion. Runnerup was John Reilly of Helena.

Montana McClintock of Joliet was all-around cowgirl after placing in the girl's cow cutting and the barrel racing. All three of these champions received a yearling colt.

During the 1990 rodeo season, Montana High School Rodeo teams have 34 qualifying district High School rodeos. The state champions were crowned in 13 events following the State Finals in Glasgow in late June. The National High School Finals will be in Shawnee, Okla on July 22-29.

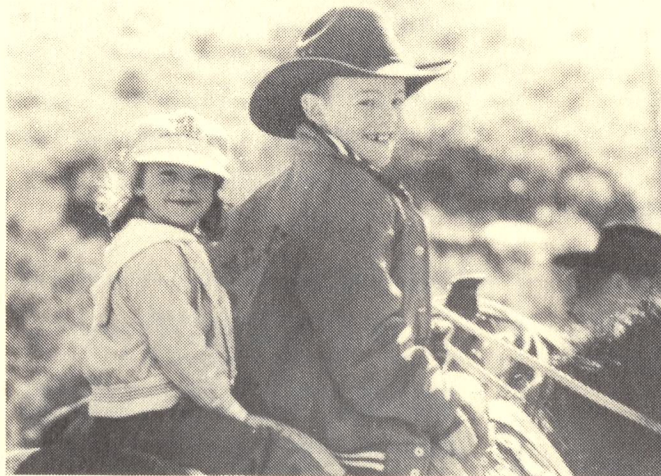
