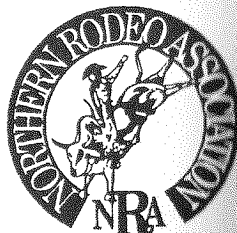

NRA/NWRA Office Updates

Membership Fees Increase

The 2001 NRA Membership fees will increase by \$20 for a contesting card, permit, and other. The junior membership and timers cards will remain the same. High School memberships will remain half of the contesting card.

Cards will be as follows:

Full Contesting before May 1st: \$120

Full Contesting after May 1st: \$140

Permit: \$90

High School Card before May 1st: \$70

High School Card after May 1st: \$80

Junior Membership: \$25

Timers Membership: \$25

Other Membership: \$70

Spring Board of Directors Meeting Set

The Spring Board of Directors Meeting is set for March 31, 2001 in Helena.

Both meetings will be held at Bullwinkles Saloon on the west side of Helena. The NWRA meeting will begin at 8:00 a.m. The NRA meeting will begin as 12:00 p.m.

Topics to be discussed are the NRA/NWRA Newsletter, Saddlemakers Program, Judges Program, branding of timed event cattle, box pads at each rodeo, increase in the NWRA membership fees.

Unlimited One Rodeo Permits Available

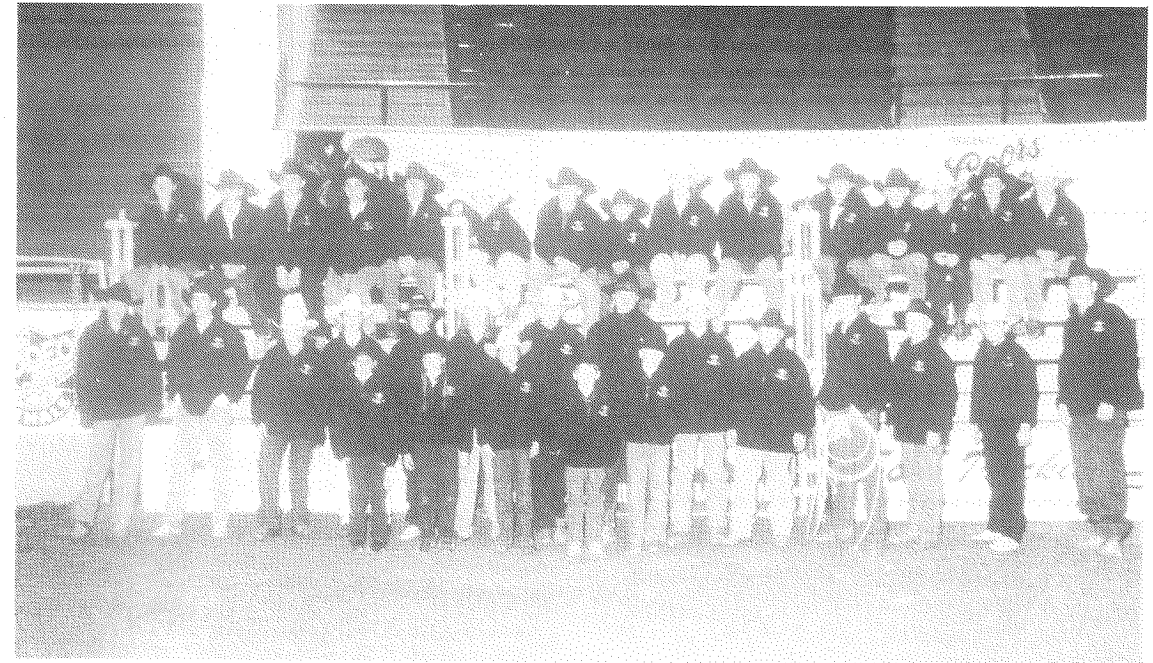
Any one may now buy a "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" for any or all of the NRA/NWRA regular season rodeos.

How this permit will work is that the contestant must purchase a permit for each rodeo that he/she wishes to enter. This contestant must purchase the permit through the office before they are able to enter. Any money won on this permit will not count towards year end standings.

The permit will cost \$15.00 per permit per rodeo.

If a contestant wishes to purchase such a permit they must contact the NRA/NWRA Office on or before the day of entries for the rodeo that they wish to enter. They may send in a check before or pay with a credit card on the day of. The permit must be paid for before the contestant will be able to enter.

Contestants wishing to purchase a "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" will be subject to any and all fines that are applicable per the NRA and NWRA rulebooks. For example: turnouts or not paying entry fees. All "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" holders must pay their entry fees in cash to the rodeo secretary.

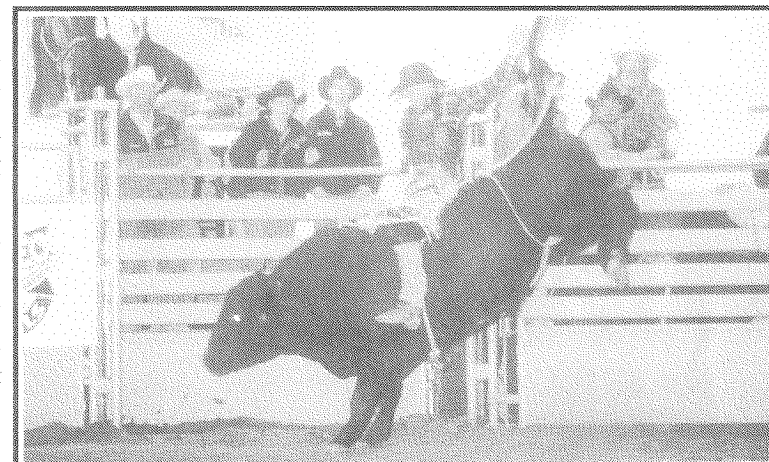
Check it out! And, possibly the biggest thank you goes to the fans that showed up and bought tickets. God Bless them all.

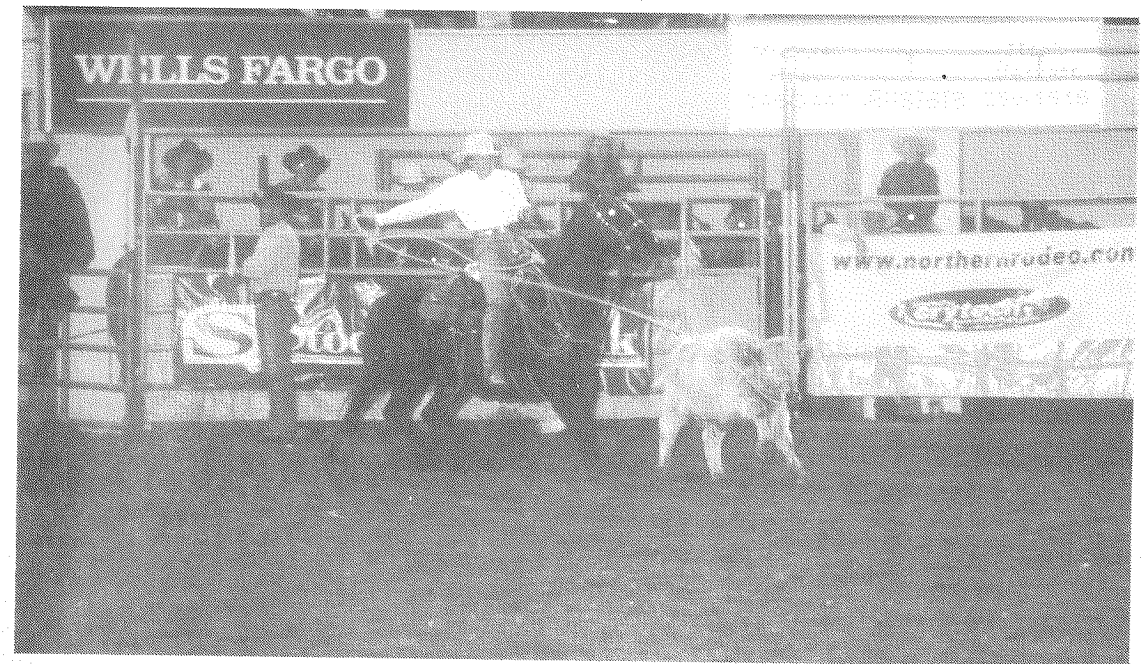
The NWRA has been successfully

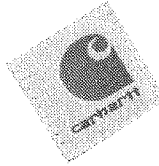

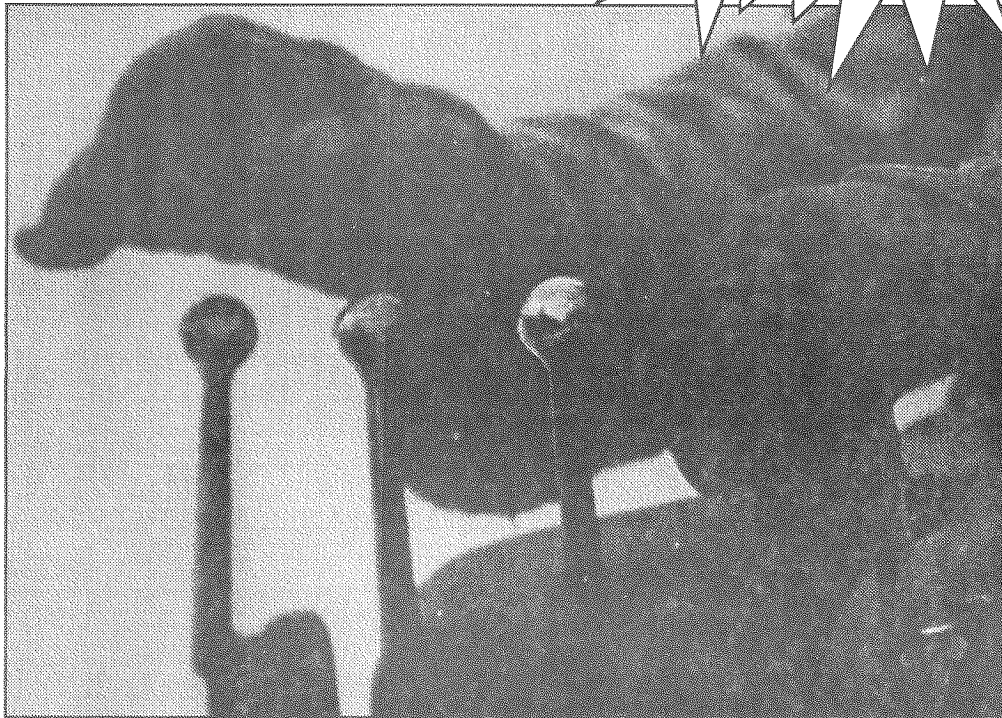

With everything that Rodney and Marsha Newman have done for the NRA/NWRA it was a fitting that they be recognized as the 2000 Personality of the Year.

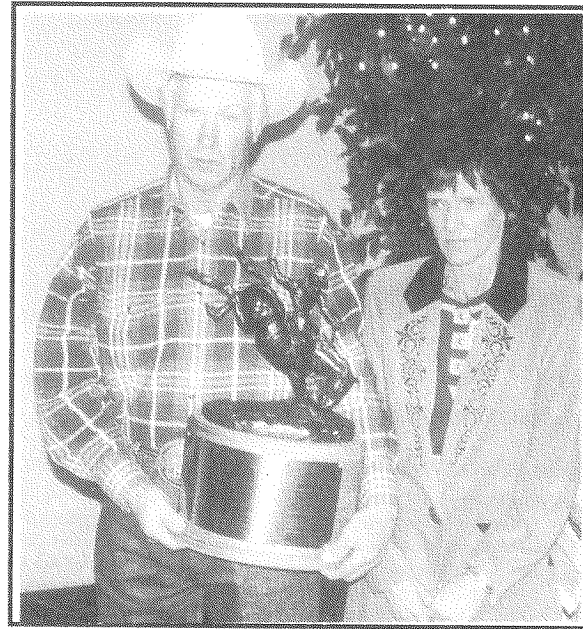

MetraPark to host this rodeo. They worked long hard hours to see that the contestants had a good rodeo to compete at during the Billings Fair.

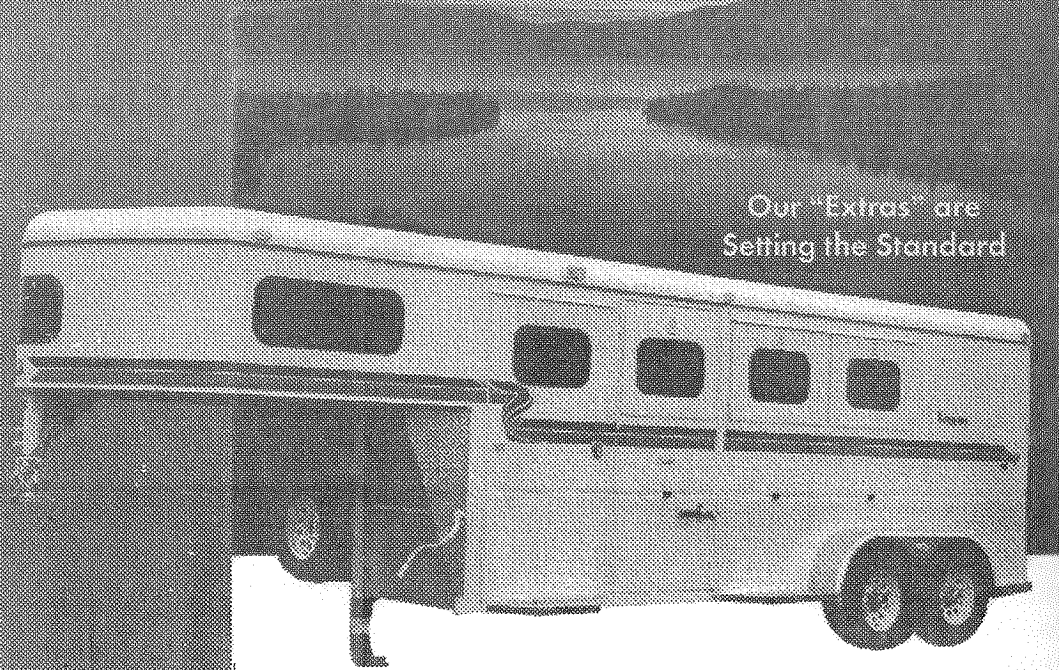
"It is an honor to be among those that have won this award previously." Newman's said. "It is an honor to give back to the association, the contestants, and the personnel."

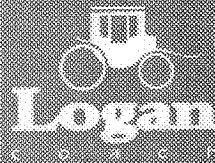

The Winners Are:

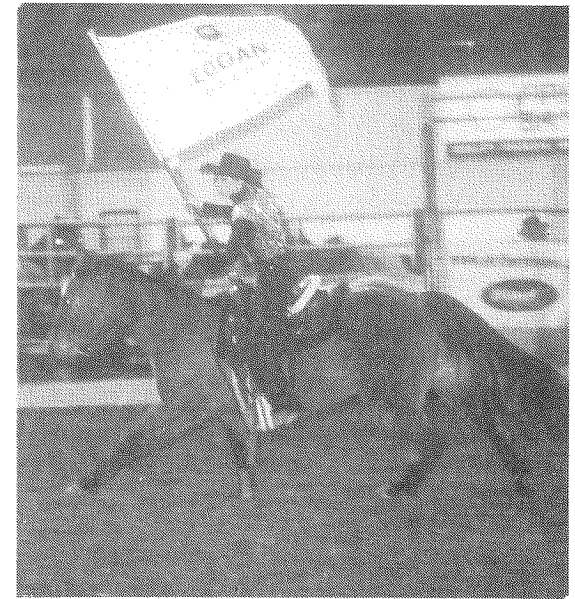
This was the sixth consecutive year of the Logan Coach Judges Program. The NRA/NWRA once again named the winners of the Logan Coach packages:

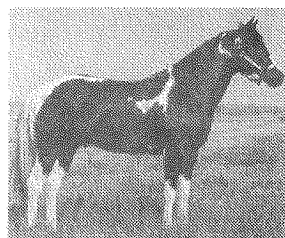

Barrel Breeders Incentive Grows

It's only February and BBI's payout is all ready at \$5,000.00 & growing! Barrel Breeders Incentive offers added money & awards to barrel horses by nominated sires. The Barrel Breeders Incentive (BBI) was formed to help promote stallions as well as the sport of barrel racing. BBI added money comes from stallion owners nomination fees, all registered breeders are welcome. The money works as a "side pot" going to only eligible horses. Riders may enter any or all of the Futurities & Derbies offering BBI added money. Three BBI events are planned for 2001. They will be named in an upcoming issue of this publication. 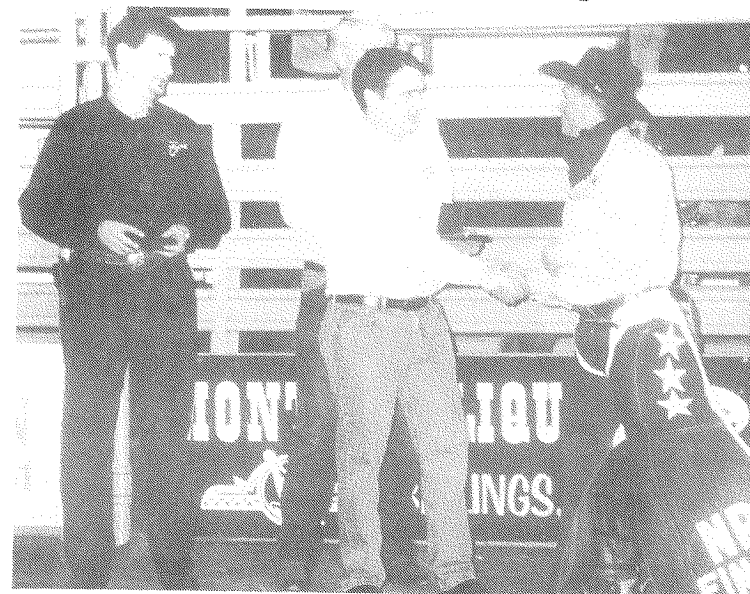

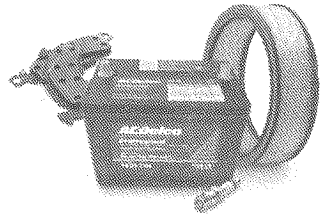

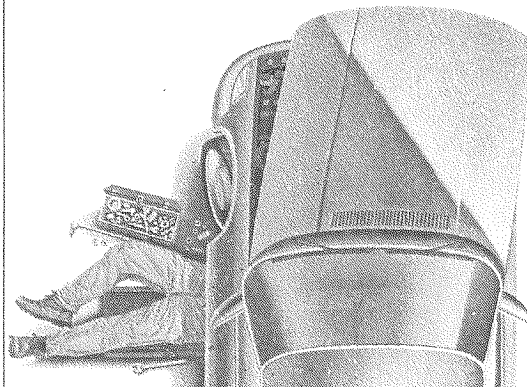

Hoyt Wins Seventh Annual Poker Tournament

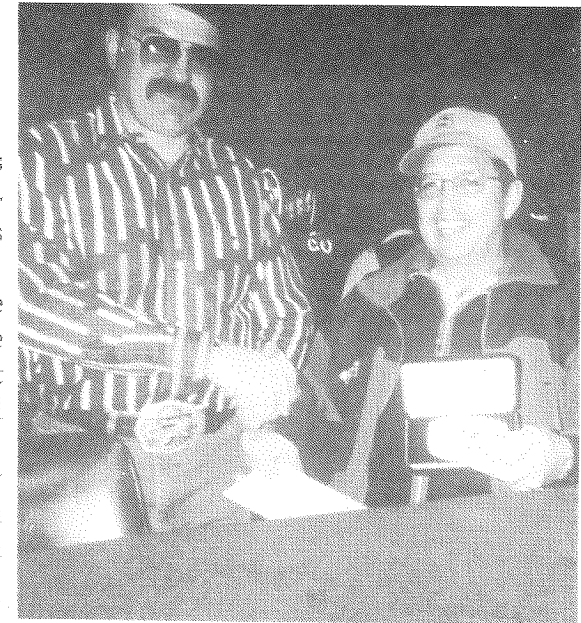

Seventeen players played for the cash awards and the Champions Choice Buckle. When it came down to it, Ted Hoyt of Browning, took home the big money and the nice buckle.

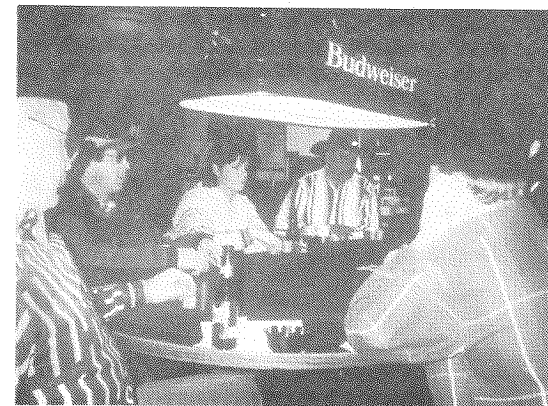
Other money winners included: Jay Murnion, Les Best, and Harlan Lund. Each of these three gentlemen received cash awards.

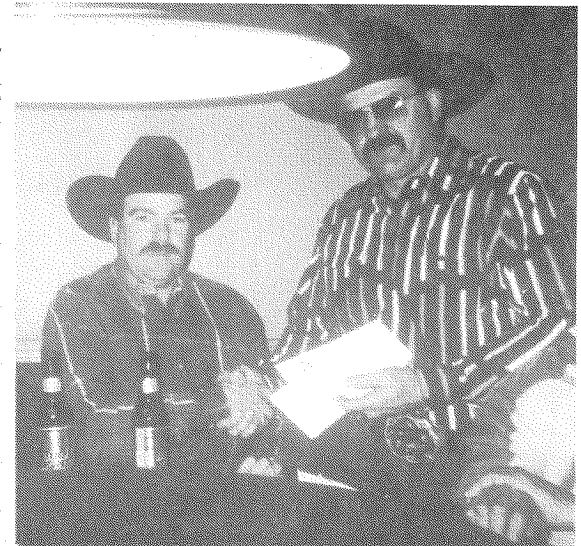

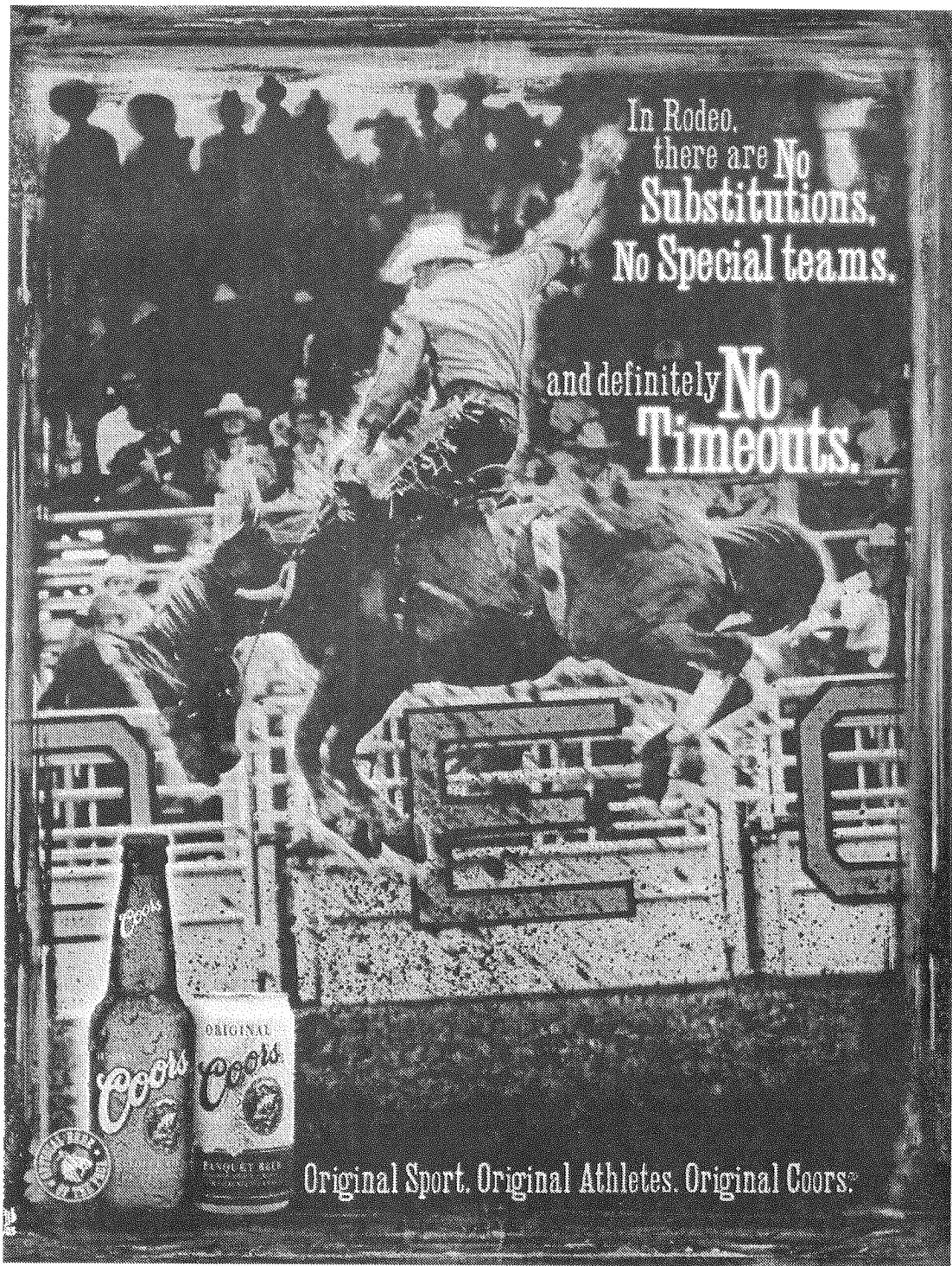
Ted Hoyt accepts his NRA/NWRA Finals Poker Tournament Championship buckle from Kennedy Walsh.

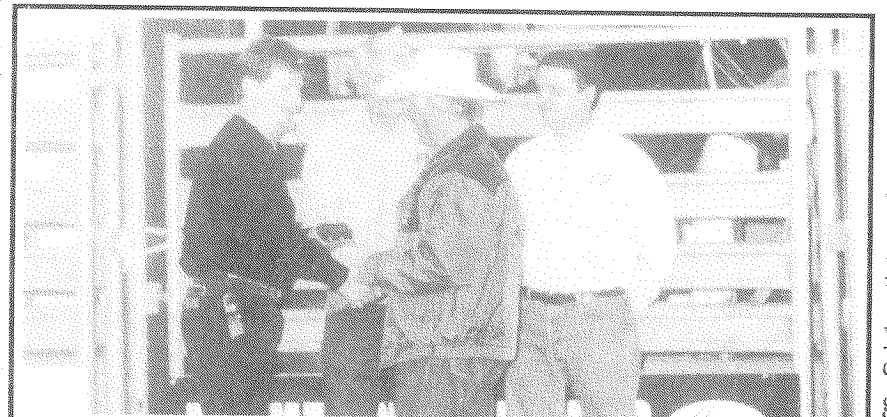
Rodney and his son Sid have developed a fantastic breeding program to produce bulls that are tough, strong, and somewhat hard to ride. The cowboys know when they

**NRA Board of Directors Meeting
Saturday, February 3, 2001 10:00 am
Billings Hotel and Convention Center
Billings, Montana**

President Joe Warner called the meeting to order.

Roll was taken and a quorum verified. Those members present were: President, Joe Warner, Matt Gilstrap, Bareback Riding Director, Craig Miller, Saddle Bronc Riding Director, Monte Finn, Bull Riding Director, Eddie Getten, Steer Wrestling Director, J. Billingsley, Calf Roping Director, Sparky Dreesen, Junior Event Director, Dick Lyman, Contract Personnel Director, Rodney Newman, Stock Contractor Director, Advisory Board Members: Lois Hill and Stan Rasmussen, East Committee Director, Joe Murnion, West Committee Director, Ray McGowan, NWRA Liason Director, Nacona Cameron proxied for Deena Witcher.

Minutes were read and approved.

The Financial report was read and approved for audit. Discussion was held concerning the finances and the loan taken out for the increase in the Finals payoff.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Friends of Rodeo: Linda Hegle updated the board on the House Bill 315 that concerns the humane treatment of animals. The Board was informed that this bill could have an affect on rodeo as well as other livestock practices. The Board members were encouraged to write a letter to their representatives to amend the current language used in House Bill 315.

Awards Program: Joe Warner updated the Board on the 2000 Awards Program. Linda Hegle updated the Board on the current state of the 2001 Awards Program.

NRA/NWRA Finals: The Board discussed the Friday night performance. Discussion was held regarding an amendment to rule F.2.1 pg 69 of the 2000 NRA RuleBook. Motion was made to amend the rule to read as follows: The top 10 contestants in each event and the event director will vote on all eligible judges to judge the Finals. If one of the top ten (10) contestants is an event director, that person shall only be entitled to one vote. The four (4) judges receiving the greatest number of votes shall officiate at the Finals. The motion was seconded and passed.

Judges Program: The current judges program was discussed. Clancy Sivertsen's proposal, regarding rules J.1.0, J.1.1 and J.1.2 pg 41 and 42 of the 2000 NRA RuleBook was read to the Board and discussion was held. A motion was made to address Clancy Sivertsen's proposal at the spring meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

Logan Coach Program: Linda Hegle updated the Board on the current funds of the Logan Coach Program and the Finals Logan Coach booths. The Board was informed that the Finals Logan Coach Booths were doing well.

Central Entry: Joe Warner thanked Sharon Martin for her hard work this past summer. Sharon Martin informed the Board about some of the scheduling problems that need to be addressed during the committee seminar.

OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion was held regarding the current 25/75 percentage split between the NRA and NWRA on income and expenses. A motion was made to accept the amendment to change the split to be an 80/20 percentage split between the NRA and NWRA. The motion was seconded and passed.

A rule addition of a "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" was discussed. Motion was made to issue a "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" at \$15.00 fee with money won not counting towards NRA year-end standings. Seconded. Passed.

Discussion was held concerning the removal of rule A.4.13 and re-instating the 1999 NRA rule A.4.13 to read as follows: Members wishing to draw out of rodeo must do so during the advertised call back time. A motion was made to accept the amendment, was seconded and passed.

Rule A.7.5, pg 33 of the NRA Rule Book was discussed to change the percentage take of each rodeos added money and entry fees from four (4) percent to six (6) percent. A motion was made to increase the percentage take of each rodeos added money and entry fees from four (4) percent to six (6). The motion was seconded and passed.

The Entry Fee Scale was discussed including increasing the minimum entry fee from \$35 to \$45. No action was taken.

Discussion was held to amend rule F.5.2 to read as follows: The NRA event directors shall receive a list from each eligible NRA stock contractor of their eligible livestock eligible for the Finals before the ballots are sent to the top 15 contestants in the respective events. The event director and the stock contractor will agree upon the Finals eligible stock ballot list. In the event that the director and stock contractor cannot agree upon a particular animal, the stock contractor's decision is controlling. The ballots shall then be sent to the voting contestants. A motion was made to accept the amendment, was seconded and passed.

Discussion was held concerning rule B.2.1.1 increasing the number of votes that the committee directors receive on the board to three votes for the east and three for the west. A motion was made not accept the rule amendment was seconded and passed. Discussion was then held regarding the increase of the number of votes that the NWRA receives on the NRA Board of Directors. A motion was made to accept the amendment that reads as follows: Voting members of the Board of Directors shall include: president, vice president, director at large, stock contractor director, two committee director votes (one for the east, one for the west), contract personnel director, junior events director, three advisory members, one director representing each contest event (6), and one vote for each of the NWRA contest events (2) for a total of 19 votes. The motion was seconded and passed.

The Board discussed an amendment to rule R.8.7, pg 52 of the NRA Rule Book. A motion was made to accept the amendment as it reads: All horned animals used in the NRA bull riding event shall have their

horns blunted to at least the diameter of a half-dollar. The motion was seconded and passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion was held concerning the Finals Stock Payment.

Rule F.2.1 concerning the Finals judges limitation of the number of years that a judge may consecutively judge the Finals was discussed. It was determined that the previous rule amendment covered this issue.

OTHER:

Eddie Getten made a motion to increase the membership fees by \$20. Discussion was held. Matt Gilstrap made a motion to amend the membership fee increase to that the membership fees for a contesting adult card shall be increase by \$20.00 with the High School membership card to remain one-half (1/2) of the price of the adult contesting card. The motion was seconded and passed.

Ray McGowan addressed the Board about the how the Logan Coach Rodeos are picked each year.

Eddie Getten proposed that the rough stock contestants vote on the Finals judges that judge the mark out in the rough stock events and the timed event contestants vote on the Finals judges that flag the timed events from the four (4) judges that are voted to officiate the Finals. The Judging Committee will handle this process. Motion was made to address this proposal at the spring meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

Discussion was held concerning the west committee director that has not been present for two consecutive meetings without a proxy directorship. Joe Warner removed Bob Gravely from his directorship as a west committee director and appointed John Walsh from the Broadwater County Rodeo Committee to finish out the term. The action of the president was approved by the Board.


Eddie Getten proposed that all the timed event cattle need to be branded with permanent numbers. The Board will address the proposed rule change at the spring meeting.

Discussion was held concerning box pads at the regular season rodeos. The Board will address the matter at the spring meeting.



I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

Roll was taken and a quorum verified. Those members present included: President: Deb Lloyd, Mary Goyins, Vice President, Chris McQueary, Director at Large, Peggy Smith, Ladies Barrel Racing Director, Nacona Cameron proxied for Deena Witcher, Ladies Breakaway Roping Director, Advisory Board Members: Kris Bartholomew, Marcey Chaffee, and Ray McGowan proxied for Mary Salmond.

The financial report was distributed and read to the board. Discussion was held concerning the Finals payoff and the loan that was taken out for the payoff increase. A motion was made and seconded to approve the financial report and the motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Friends of Rodeo: Linda Hegle updated the Board on Friends of Rodeo and the current House Bill 315. The Board was informed that House Bill 315 was a Humane Treatment of Animals bill that could affect rodeo as well as any livestock practices. The Board was encouraged to contact their representatives concerning this bill.

Awards Program: Linda Hegle updated the Board on the 2000 Awards Program. The Board was informed that all the jackets were paid for this year.

NRA/NWRA Finals: The Board discussed the Friday night performance. Discussion was had regarding the length of the Ladies Breakaway Roping barrier.

Judges Program: The Board was updated on this past years judges program.

Logan Coach: Linda Hegle updated the Board on the status of the Logan Coach funds as well as the Finals Logan Coach Booth and how they did Friday night.

Central Entry: Sharon Martin addressed the Board. Discussion was had regarding the in house central entry system.

OLD BUSINESS:

An "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" rule addition was discussed. Anyone may purchase this permit for \$25.00 per rodeo that they may wish to enter. There was concern over the 'preference' rule with these "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" holders. A motion was made to issue a "Unlimited One Rodeo Permit" at \$25.00 fee with money won on such a permit not counting towards year-end standings contingent on the NRA Board of Directors decision. A motion was made to increase the number of NWRA votes on the NRA Board of Directors from one (1) vote to two (2) votes to represent each of the NWRA contesting events. The motion was seconded and passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion was held concerning rule R.3.4, page 40 of the NWRA rule book. Motion was made to amend the rule to read as follows: When roping muley cattle, the rope must pass over the head of the animal and come tight within the legal area (behind the ears, in front of the hooves) and breakaway. The motion was seconded and the change will be addressed at the Spring meeting for final vote.

A motion was made to adjourn, was seconded and passed.

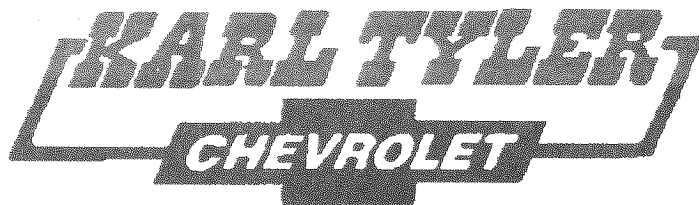

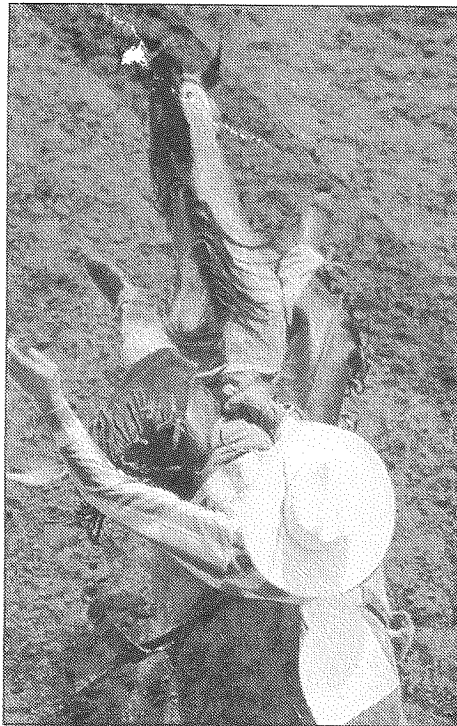

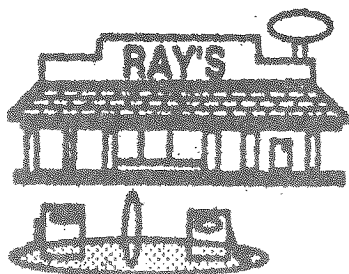

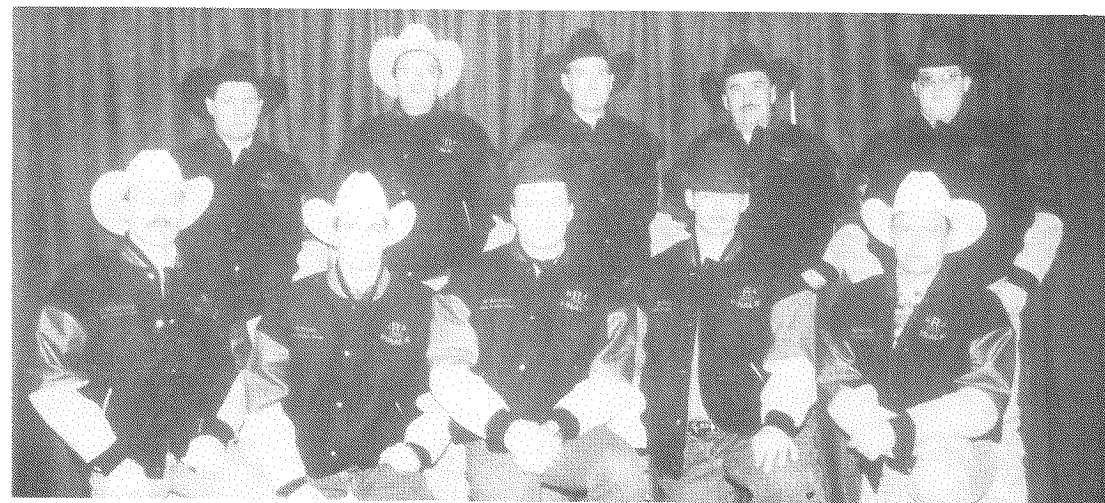


Rob Kountz:

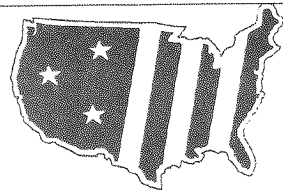

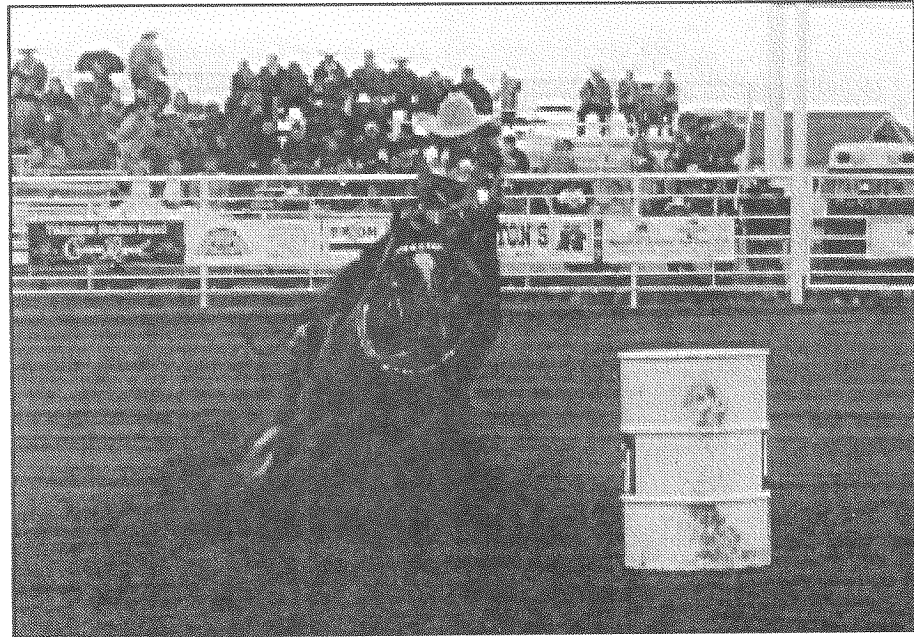

NRA Rule M.1.10.1. All individuals must purchase their card through the NRA/NWRA Office before they can enter a rodeo. The application must be signed, witnessed or notarized and have correct amount of money or it will be refused. The application and membership fee must reach the NRA Office no later than on the day entries are taken. Applications received on or before the last business day before entries are taken shall be subject to the dues set forth in M.2.1.1. Late applicaitons shall be subject to an additional \$25.00 late fee.
