


Coming Soon to a Mail Box Near You!



MEMBERSHIP: Entiltles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos without restrictions, to share all advantages of a member in good standing including such items as a guarantee to your entry fee; check writing privileges after the first year initiation period; and a subscription to the newsletter.

PERMITS: Entitles purchaser to work all sanctioned rodeos accepting permits as listed in newsletter until \$500 is won. After \$500 money limit is won by permit holder, a card must be purchased, the price of card to be the dollar difference between the cost of a permit and the cost of the card. Permit holder's points will be credited to the year-end standing, however, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the NRA Finals. The \$500 money limit will be accumulated from year to year, allowing the contestant to purchase a permit each year until the \$500 is won. A card holder the previous year cannot purchase a permit the following year.

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Northern Rodeo Association sanctioned events and membership in the Association,I and my heirs, successors, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE and agree to HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Northern Rodeo Association, the rodeo committees, stock contractors, sponsors, arena operations or owners, their agents, representatives (collectively referred to as the NRA) from all liability me and my personal representatives, heirs, successors, and next of kin from any and all claims and liability for all loss of damage, and any claim of damages therefore on account of any injury to my person including death or damage to my property while I am utilizing NRA facilities or participating in NRA events.

I, hereby represent to the NRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.


I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.





Letters of Response

The following are letters written in response to a article in the Billings Gazette by Lois Hill.

StanSteen's Letter to the NRA/NWRA

T'd like to address the confusion and frus Ltration that Lois Hill has written about in the Billings Gazette and, now, the NRA/ NWRA Rodeo News regarding rodeo at Montana Fair.

I'm a little confused myself. Apparently Lois and I were at different meetings. The initial cancellation of our NRA rodeo had nothing to do with dirt costs. The Chris LeDoux concert with the Invitational Bull Ride and the Arena Cross motorcycle event were in place when this meeting took place (but not public knowledge at that time). I recall no statements by our board or management that dirt costs had anything to do with it.

The reason was forthright and simple and it still is. Our paid attendance dropped from 16,000 to 8,000 in four years and this event was no longer paying its way. We removed professional wrestling for the same reason. To say we did not want the NRA fair rodeo to succeed is ridiculous. like saying we wanted to cut our own throat to watch the blood.

We believe the reasons for this drop off has little to do with our advertising skills. The NILE PRCA rodeo and the NRA Finals attendance over the past several years have mirrored ours. We are all well promoted rodeos. On the other hand, specialty rodeo events like the NILE Bull Ride and the Chase Hawks Rough Stock event are grow-

ing at an accelerated rate. This is not what the NRA and all fans of traditional rodeo want to hear but in our market (with the unbelievable competition for the entertainment dollar) traditional rodeo is in a downward trend right now. It may not be that way in smaller communities where the yearly rodeo is the one big event of the year. Perhaps another 'Urban Cowboy' or 'City Slickers' movie will come along and rejuvenate its popularity. We hope so.

We have been chewed up in the press by the statement that we pulled this big surprise on the NRA. That is not true. I personally met with the Exec. Secretary, the NRA President and a Director at the Rocky Mountain Association of Fairs in early November of 1999 and explained the problems we were facing. I asked if the board, or at least some of the directors would meet with us to try to work something out. They said they would get back to me and never did.

Some people from the NRA met with our board and a congenial meeting resulted in the request from the NRA to move the rodeo to the Grandstand. Our board agreed we would continue to offer rodeo if a private producer could be found. We made the calls and found a willing producer. Lois complains we put it in the afternoon on weekdays. Where would she have us do it? Surely not on our last Saturday against our own bull riding/Chris the race cars. LeDoux concert event? Surely not in the arena?

At this time Mr. Steen approached the NRA with the idea of having the Billings Fair Rodeo as a Mid Season Top 10 Championship rodeo. The idea was discussed, and Mr. Steen was informed to be able to change to such a format, the NRA and NWRA Board's of Directors would have to make a change to the bylaws of each association.

Mr. Steen was informed that the two Board's of Directors would not meet again until February during the NRA/ NWRA Finals. It was suggested that Mr. Steen and MetraPark meet with the Stock Contractor to see if there was anything that may be done for the 2000 rodeo. This

The NRA and NWRA were not informed that there was a possibility that there would not be a rodeo at all during the Billings Fair. The NRA and NWRA was informed of the MetraPark's decision to eliminate the rodeo by written letter.

The NRA and NWRA approached the MetraPark Board with suggestions during a regular meeting. At the conclusion of the meeting, it was decided that two or three members from each Board of Directors would meet and decide the final details. concerning the Billings Fair rodeo. The following day, Mr. Steen contacted the NRA/NWRA office to inform Linda Hegle that a private producer had been found. There was never any meeting between the boards to discuss the possibilities.

The NRA and NWRA agree that there needs to be a close working relationship with MetraPark. We do appreciate the hard work and effort that MetraPark provides to help put on the NRA/NWRA Finals each year. We do understand that every event in the Metra needs to be looked at economically.

The letter from MetraPark and Mr. Steen and the rebuttles by Lois Hill, Joe Warner, and Linda Hegle were included to clear the air and clarify the two points of view concerning the relationship that the NRA/NWRA has with MetraPark.







Drawouts, Tradeouts and Turnouts

The NRA and NWRA Guidelines: for complete information, please refer to the NRA rulebook section A.8.0. The following is provided for your convenience.

DrawOuts: NRA MEMBERS: All Rodeos are NO DRAW OUT Rodeos per amendment to rule A.4.1.3, All rodeos will be no draw out rodeos. NWRA MEMBERS: At the time of call back, a contestant may draw out of a rodeo(s), unless advertised in the rodeo listing as "No Draw Out". There is not a charge IF you did not receive your preference of performances. However, NWRA rule A.4.1.4 states: "Any contestant who draw out of a rodeo after receiving their first preference of performance at a given rodeo or rodeos will be ifined \$20 per infraction."

TradeOuts: All NRA/NWRA rodeos are tradeout rodeos unless advertised in the rodeo listing as "No Tradeouts".

A contestants may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the stock draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA/NWRA Office 406-252-1122. Both parties involved in a trade must call the NRA/NWRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be nofitifed of trade by both parties. NOTE: The timed-event draw must be made in the presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

TurnOuts: As stated in the rulebook, if a con-

testant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA/NWRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout:

- 1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at this rodeo, call the NRA Office. You will be responsible for your entryfees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in.
- 2. If it is too late to notify the NRA Office, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judges, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus the payment of your fees at the rodeo).

Courtesy, please. Contractors, judges, secretaries. spectators, announcers, and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

Medical and Vet Releases: As soon as

you are aware that you will be unable to compete at an NRA/NWRA rodeo you have entered due to a medical or vet release, contact the NRA/NWRA office. With a medical or vet release you are not responsible for your fees but releases must be sent into the NRA/ NWRA office within five days after the rodeo along with a \$10 processing charge per rodeo.

Vet releases are accepted in the barrel racing event only. Keep in mind, when you medical or yet release. there is a five day waiting period before you can participate in another NRA/NWRA rodeo.

ANY NOTIFIED TURNOUTS OR MEDICALS NEED TO BE CALLED INTO THE NRA/NWRA OFFICE at 406-252-1122. NOT THE CENTRAL ENTRY OFFICE.

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Northern Women's Rodeo Association sanctioned events and membership in the Association, I and my heirs, successors, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE and agree to HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Northern Women's Rodeo Association, the rodeo committees, stock contractors, sponsors, arena operations or owners, their agents, representatives (collectively referred to as the NWRA) from all liability me and my personal representatives, heirs, successors, and next of kin from any and all claims and liability for all loss of damage, and any claim of damages therefore on account of any injury to my person including death or damage to my property while I am utilizing NRA facilities or participating in NWRA events.

I, hereby represent to the NWRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NWRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NWRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

I UNDERSTAND AND AGREE THIS RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to ACCIDENT, INJURY, OR DEATH OCCURRING DURING THE TERM OF MY MEMBERSHIP IN THE NWRA. Any subsequent Releases and agreement I might sign in the future shall amplify, but shall in no way limit, the provisions of this document.

I further state and certify that I have carefully read the foregoing Release, know the contents thereof and sign this Release and Agreement Not to Sue as a free and voluntary act. I am not relying on any statements of representations of any party released herby. How to enter NRA/NWRA Rodeos

Welcome to the Northern Rodeo Association/Northern Women's Rodeo Associaiton. NRA/NWRA rodeos have utilized Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry since 1984 and offer the following guidelines to assist you. Take a moment to familiarize yourself with the NRA and NWRA rules on Central Entry. They can be found in section A.4.0 in the NRA rulebook and in section A.4.0 in the NWRA rulebook. A thorough knowledge of the NRA and NWRA rules which apply to entering will help you better achieve your entry objective.

NRA/NWRA Rodeo entry procedure through Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry • 406-428-2205

UNLESS OTHERWISE ADVERTISED, rodeo entries will open at 10 a.m. and remain open through 6:30 p.m. every Monday preceding a rodeo weekend. Call backs open at 12 Noon and remain open through 6:30 p.m. every Tuesday. Per rodeo charge of \$3.50 per contestant. Please read your rodeo listings carefully as the entry dates that fall on days other than the Monday before the rodeo will be in bold lettering.

When entering, be prepared with the following information for the central entry operator:

- 1. Name of rodeo(s) you wish to enter
- 2. Your NRA card number
- 3. Your name
- 4. The event (s) you wish to enter
- 5. Preferences you have on which performances you wish to work.
- 6. Name of buddy or buddies NRA rules allow for two per event, six total. (To buddy together you must enter together.)
- 7. If a multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
- 8. Call back Tuesday between 12 Noon and 6:30 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are up.
- 9. Keep a record of the confirmation number the central entry operator gives you, both upon entering the rodeo, and when you call back. Every conversation, both entry and call back, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation.

In the event of a discrepancy, you **MUST** have your confirmation number available. No complaints against Central Entry will be considered valid unless a confirmation number is given.

If you do not call back during the specified call back times, late call backs will be accepted at the late call back number 406-428-2398. There is an additional charge of \$2.50 per rodeo for this service.
