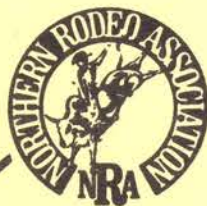

### NILE again plans WPRA barrels

Northern International Livestock Exposition will host its second annual NILE Barrel Race Futurity and Open/WPRA Barrel Races in conjunction with the annual NILE Stock Show and Rodeo, Oct. 19-20 in Billings.

The second annual barrel race futurity will feature a \$1,000 added purse and is open to horses that are five years old and younger. Run under WPRA rules, the Futurity will be run in two go arounds at the Metra Arena.

Total times of both runs determines the championship.

In addition, barrel racers will have an opportunity to enter the regular WPRA Barrel Race with a \$2,000 added purse. Also offered will be an open WPRA Barrel Race with \$200 added, a \$200 and \$900 novice race with \$50 added and a kids' barrel race will be featured.

## College National Finals returns to Bozeman, June 12-16

The quest for supremacy in collegiate rodeo continues in Bozeman, Mont. in June when the 41st annual College National Finals Rodeo kicks off at Montana State University's Brick Breeden Field House. More than 300 competitors from around the country will compete June 12-16 in the premiere collegiate rodeo event of the year.

The annual CNFR opens Monday, June 11 with slack draws ran all day Monday and Tuesday. Evening performances start the evening of the 11 and continue through Saturday, June 16.

Contestants will be vying for both national titles and scholarships.

The rodeo is hosted by the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association, the Gallatin Empire Lions Club of Bozeman and Montana State University.

In addition to the exciting nightly performances numerous other activities are planned throughout the week. Each day the Inland Empire carnival shows will operate in the fieldhouse's

south parking lot. The CNFR parade, sponsored by the Gallatin Saddle Club, is scheduled for Wednesday, June 14 through downtown Bozeman. Another crowd pleasing feature is the "Wrangler Bullfights."

The CNFR was held for the first time in 1949 in the Cow Palace in San Francisco, Calif. Some of the places it went to in the early years were the Will Rogers Coliseum in Fort Worth, Texas; Rose Festival in Portland, Ore.; Colorado Springs, Colo.; Littleton, Colo.; Douglas Wyo.; Vermillion, S.D.; and Deadwood, S.D.

In 1970 it moved to Bozeman, Mont., which has been the home of the CNFR for 18 years. In June of 1991 the present contract with Bozeman and the CNFR expires.

Ticket prices are \$6 for general admission and \$7 for reserved seating, June 12-13. June 15-16 general admission tickets are \$7 and reserved are \$8. Season tickets will be \$35. For further information call 406-587-2637. Tickets go on sale May 14.

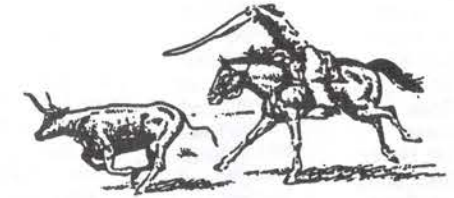

8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. to find out when you are up.

C. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, are recorded on tape, and each cowboy is given verification number for that conversation.

## Health requirements for importing horses to state

Montana Law, 81-2-703 MCA, requires that all livestock being brought into Montana be accompanied by a current Veterinary Inspection Certificate (health certificate) and an import permit. This also applies to Montana livestock returning from out of state shows, etc. Import permits are to be obtained by the Veterinarian issuing the VIC within 10 days prior to entry into Montana by calling 1-406-444-2976. There is no charge for the import permit.

We do have a system by which we will issue ANNUAL import permits for horse. These annual import permits are valid for the calendar year in which they are issued. However, having an annual permit does not relieve the shipper from the responsibility of maintaining a current Veterinary Inspection Certificate on the horses. To qualify for an annual import permit, you must have a permanent (lifetime) brand inspection for your horses.

All pets (i.e. dogs and cats) must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary inspection showing current rabies vaccination.

Canadian Imports: You must meet the requirements of the state of Montana in addition to any federal regulations. To save time and expense we advise that you cross the International Border on weekdays during the following hours: 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mountain Time.

Consignor's health and brand certificates may be checked in this state by State Stock Inspector for compliance. If any animals are not in compliance when they arrive in Montana, the Montana Department of Livestock can refuse to let them unload.

In addition, failure to have the proper documents is a violation of Montana law and can result in a citation and fine.

For further information or if you have any questions, feel free to call for import information 406-444-2976. or write Montana Department of Livestock, Animal Health Division, Capitol Station, Helena, Montana 59601.

Department of Livestock recommends owner/shipper to have permanent/lifetime brand inspections on each animal, If you don't have permanent inspections from the state of origin, they must be obtain a Montana brand inspection before leaving any county.

Page 30, 17 A/also, Page 36, 2 A/also, Page 21, 5: SLIDE WILL BE USED ON AUTOMATIC BARRIER NECKROPES.

Page 56 replaces rule 6: IN THE LADIES BREAKAWAY ROPING EVENT AND JUNIOR BREAKAWAY ROPING EVENT, A STANDARDIZED STRING WILL BE USED AT ALL NRA APPROVED RODEOS SUPPLIED BY THE NRA AND PROVIDED BY THE JUDGES.

Page 31 replaces partial 21: IN THE LADIES BREAKAWAY ROPING EVENT, THE FLAGGER WILL FLAG THE EVENT FROM THE RIGHT SIDE OF ARENA (as viewed from box) UNLESS ARENA CONDITIONS DICTATE OTHERWISE, SO AS NOT TO INTERFERE WITH THE RUNNING OF THE CATTLE.

Page 22, 5 A/also Page 27, 4 A: SLACK IS TO BE RUN IN THE SAME ORDER OF EVENTS AS THE RODEO WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE LADIES BARREL RACING AND JUNIOR BARREL RACING EVENTS WHICH WILL BE RUN FIRST. ALSO, THERE WILL BE NO CONSECUTIVE RUNS ON TIMED EVENT STOCK UNLESS AN EVENT IS ALL THAT REMAINS OF SLACK. INFRACTIONS SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE NRA OFFICE BY THE EVENT DIRECTORS OR REPRESENTATIVES AND A \$100 FINE WILL BE LEVIED AGAINST THE CONTRACTOR AND EACH JUDGE IN VIOLATION.

Page 30, 30 A, IF, IN THE JUDGE'S OPINION, CONTESTANT IS FOULED BY BARRIER NECK ROPE (ONLY NECK ROPE MAY CAUSE FOUL), THE CONTESTANT MUST DECLARE HIMSELF OR HERSELF BY PULLING UP BEFORE CONTESTING ON ANIMAL. ANY PENALTIES INCURRED BEFORE THE FOUL WILL BE ASSESSED (I. E. BROKEN BARRIER) IF BROKEN BARRIER IS ASSESSED, ANIMAL WILL BE GIVEN BACK LAP AND TAP PLUS 10 SECONDS. (JUDGE NEEDS TO BE AWARE OF THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A FOUL AND A MALFUNCTION TO BE AWARE OF THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A FOUL AND A MALFUNCTION AT/OFF THE BARRIER). B. IF IN THE JUDGE'S OPINION THE BARRIER FAILS TO WORK PROPERLY (MALFUNCTION), THE CONTESTANT WILL RECEIVE A RERUN IF A QUALIFIED TIME IS MADE.

Page 11, 8 A: MINIMUM PAY FOR NRA CARD-CARRYING TIMERS WILL BE \$35 PER PERFORMANCE.

Page 11, add to rule 8: NO JUDGE MAY JUDGE MORE THAN TWO RODEOS CONSECUTIVELY FOR ANY ONE STOCK CONTRACTOR.

Page 60, replaces partial rule 3: FOR THE THIRD AND FINAL PERFORMANCE OF THE NRA FINALS, 12 HEAD OF BUCKING STOCK WILL BE SELECTED IN EACH EVENT FROM THE JUDGES SCORES (HIGHEST MARKED ANIMALS FROM THE TWO PREVIOUS PERFORMANCES), HOWEVER, THE CONTESTANTS, THROUGH THEIR EVENT DIRECTOR, HAVE THE OPTION OF REARRANGING (THE BOTTOM FOUR) THE FOUR ANIMALS SCORED WITH THE LEAST AMOUNT OF POINTS. THE TWO LOWEST SCORED HORSES. BULLS IN THE TOP 12 WILL BE THE RERIDES, UNLESS MOVED UP THE CONTESTANTS.

Page 11, 7 A: ONE HOMETOWN RODEO MAY BE WORKED WITHOUT JOINING THE NRA IF PROOF OF RESIDENCE OF REASONABLE PROXIMITY IS ACCEPTED BY THE RODEO SECRETARY OR RODEO COMMITTEE. REASONABLE PROXIMITY TO BE DETERMINED BY EACH COMMITTEE.

Page 7, PERMIT DUES WILL BE \$50.

Page 6: JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP CARD IS \$50.

Page 7: A NON-CONTESTING JUDGE SHALL PAY MEMBERSHIP DUES OF \$25.

Page 19, 8: FOUR PERCENT (4%) SHALL BE HELD OUT AT THE PAYOFF (PRIZE MONEY AND ENTRY FEE), 2 PERCENT (2%) TO GO TO THE ASSOCIATION AND 2 PERCENT (2%) TO THE ASSOCIATION FINAL'S RODEO PRIZE MONEY. THE FOUR PERCENT (4%) SHALL BE TAKEN OFF THE TOTAL PAYOFF BEFORE ANY PAYOFFS ARE MADE.

Page 11, 8: IF SLACK CONSISTS OF 30 OR MORE RUNS, IT WILL BE CONSIDERED A JUDGE'S PAID PERFORMANCE.

Page 56, 9: (Ladies Breakaway Roping): ANYTHING NOT COVERED BY THE ABOVE RULES WILL BE COVERED BY THE MEN'S CALF ROPING RULES OR TEAM ROPING RULES.

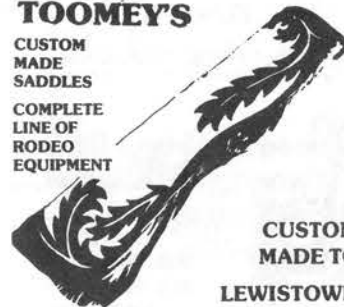

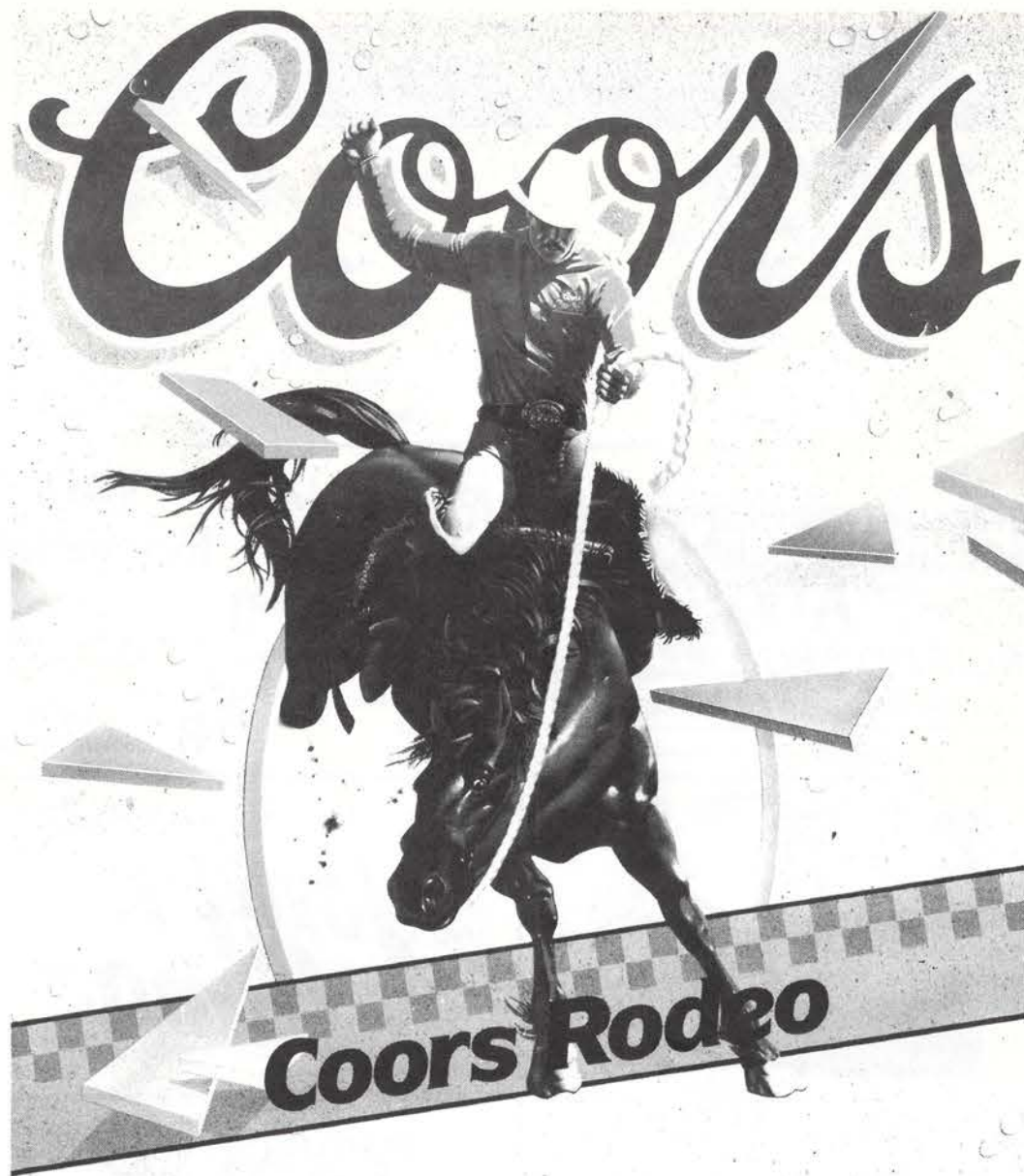

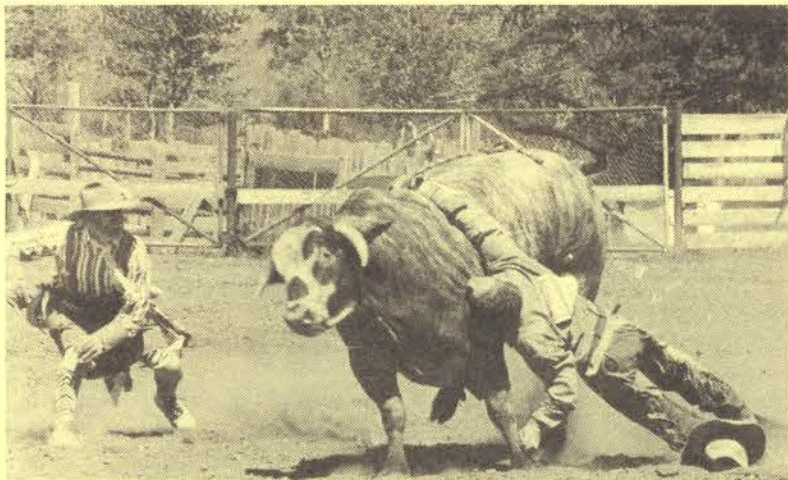
