Rocky Mountain Sports Features NRA reports

Rocky Mountain Sports Network, of Billings, is airing a weekly 5-minute Northern Rodeo Association rodeo program which can be heard on radio stations throughout the state.

Dave Riley, owner and broadcaster for the network feeds several Montana stations which air the rodeo program on Wednesday eve-

nings. The program is fed over Northern Ag Net lines. (Check local listings for times.)

In addition, Riley says they're planning daily coverage of the NRA Finals in February.

Anheiser-Busch played an important part in developing the program. That company is picking up the tab, according to NRA secretary Jann Parker.

In exchange, each program carries 1 minute of advertising for the Budweiser products. The other 1/2 minute of advertising is available for local sponsors, Riley said.

Riley, who claims he has not previous involvement in rodeo, is amazed at the early feedback on the program which features results and individual interviews. "People really like it," Riley told NRA News.

And it has been good for Riley's sports network. "It has allowed me to add five more stations who specifically wanted rodeo news."

NRA president Tom Holland praises the airing saying it has played an important part in increasing our attendance at NRA approved rodeos. This gives notoriety to our NRA rodeos and people know when we are coming to their towns.

Holland's company, Holland-Bramlette Insurance carries the program on KDBM in Dillon, Riley said.

Other stations which carry the program are KFBN, Laurel; KGHL, Billings; KYBS, Livingston; KERR, Polson; KGEZ, Kalispell; KEIN, Great Falls; KXLO, Lewistown; KIKC, Forsyth; KVCK, Wolf Point, KATQ, Plentywood; KRBN, Red Lodge and KSEN, Shelby.

Polson moves dates

Good news from the Polson rodeo committee. First, they should be applauded for returning their sanction information so quickly.

Also they have added \$5,000 to the purse.

Finally, the best for last, they have moved their rodeo up one weekend to July 14, 15 and 16. This puts them the same weekend and Three Forks NRA rodeo. Also, they're only association on that Sunday, the day they set their short-go. That should simplify contestant scheduling!

Ennis, again July 3-4

Ennis rodeo committee has set for their dates for 1990, also. They'll once again be rodeoing on July 3 and 4.

Membership up in 1989

NRA secretary Jann Parker reports this year, the association registered the largest total membership since 1983.

In addition, total rodeo payoff was up in 1989. Northern Rodeo Association rodeos paid just over one-half million in 1989 -- \$531,503. This is also up from 1988.

Vote on Finals personnel, now

As in the past, all NRA finals personnel are selected by the contestants.

Rough stock judges are selected by the top 15 riders. This year, the NRA is requesting the riders rank their four most qualified judges, in order of one, two, three, four. (The NRA is considering a four-judge system in the future and are discussing this idea at the October board meeting.)

Also, saddle bronc and bareback riders must select their two best pickup men.

Bull riders will select the Bull Fighter of the Year, who'll also work the NRA finals.

Rough stock riders will also select the saddle bronc, bareback and bull of the year on this ballot.

Timed event top 15, you'll be ask to select the timed event horse of the year in your respective event. Also you'll vote on the NRA finals flagger.

SS numbers at NRA office

Any rodeo secretary needing social security numbers and current addresses for 1099's from rodeo payoffs, contact Jann at the NRA office.

Rough stock riders return ballots

Attention Saddle Bronc, Bareback and Bull rider finalist. Your vote is important. When your ballot arrives in the mail, sit down, fill it out and return it.

The stock selection works like this: Stock contractors are sent stock nominations forms. They then select their two favorite animals, which automatically qualify for the Finals.

Additional animals are nominated by the contractor and rough stock riders then select the remaining stock from those nominations.

The top 15 NRA riders will vote on 11 head in each of their respective events. **Your vote is important as the NRA Finals stock is selected only from the ballots returned. Your vote determines also teh judges, pickup men, bulfighter and stock of the year.**

Anyone wishing to bid on the timed event cattle for the NRA finals must submit their bid to the office by Dec. 1.

NRA Board of Directors

The August Board of Director's meeting was called to order by President Tom Holland on August 19, at the Billings Sheraton.

Roll was called and a quorum verified. Those members present included: Tom Holland, Bill Lynn, Ed Miller, Skeeter Nordahl, Lyle Baumann, Bill Ayre, Stacey Baumann, Wayne Kelly, Jim Bushnell, Patti Holland, Joe Murnion, Dr. Howard Holloway, Bob Gravely, and Rodger Nordahl. Those events not represented: steer wrestling, stock contractors, bareback riding and ladies barrel racing.

The minutes of the April 2, 1989 board of directors meeting were distributed and approved as written.

The finances of the Association were discussed the treasurer's report was approved as read, subject to audit.

Old Business: None at this time.

New Business:

Protested fines were addressed.

Contestant draw-outs at one day rodeos will continue to receive the \$20 preference draw out fine for the rodeo, as the contestant is aware of the performance involved,

Slack as a first preference was addressed.

LBAR: Stock contractors are not bringing the needed numbers of cattle for the breakaway roping and the contestant/cattle numbers were not included in the rulebook. Will be included in the next rulebook edition.

Equipment for ground work at the rodeos was addressed.

Mandatory order of slack performance was discussed. The Board felt that slack order is the decision of the stock contractor and committee. However, a recommendation was made by the Board that the contractors/committees make available to central entry prior to callbacks the sequence of the slack.

Recommendation by the board to the stock contractors/committees that the timed event cattle not be run back to back if at all possible during the slack.

Items to be brought before Board at a later date: automatic re-run on barrier malfunction

Let's get the awards!

Dear NRA Board Directors;

A very interesting fact was brought to my attention during the August board meeting.

All of the awards for the 1989 season are now paid for.

This accounts for an overall reduction in the NRA checking account of over \$14,000.

This also results in a possible \$14,000 reduction of the NRA finals purse. However, if all the event directors find sponsors for their event awards, this represents a \$14,000 increase to the NRA checking account and eventually to the finals purse.

This is an approximate addition of over \$1,300 per event (this is over and above the prize money already there).

Divide that into three go-arounds and an average and you come up with a healthy bonus in each event.

If an event's awards do not get sponsored, the \$1,300 is not added to that event. It is not Jann Parker's job to find sponsors. It is the event directors and their regional directors responsibility.

Let's help the NRA have the best finals possible and get your awards donated. The sponsor money needs to be turned in by Dec. 15 to be counted in the finals purse.

If your go-around check at the finals is smaller, don't wonder why.

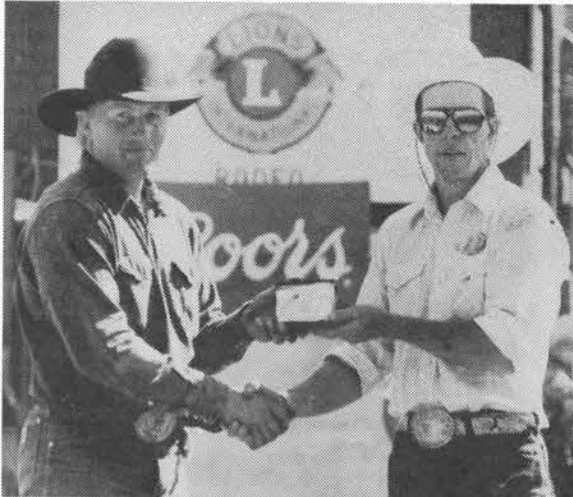

Sweet wrote the the NRA office on October 6 requesting the fine be withdrawn however, the president and board declined.

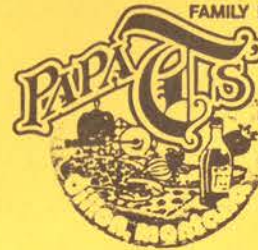
Holland said both he and Ned Zollinger of the Eastern Idaho Rodeo Association agreed to the fine.
