and Herb keeps all the finances straight. These are but two of the many individuals work so hard all year so that the WFR is the success it is!



AU NRA BARREL RACERS

Tust like last year it is the barrel racer's J responsibility to get the electric eye to the judge prior to the barrel racing.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Last two girls to run will get the eye from the secretary, put the transmitter's on the tripods and give them to the judge in the arena.
- 2. First two girls to run will wait until for you! the juniors have finished then they will get the eye's from the arena, make sure they are turned off then return them to the secretary. Take them apart and put them back in the case.
- 3. The cord should be rolled up and and turned into the secretary. put in the crow's nest after each performance.
- the console and cord in the case also.

This is all very simple and does not take the rule book. a whole lot of effort, but in the past we have had some people not doing their part. If this happens this year fines will be assessed. Let's all help the best possible pattern. each other and thing's should go smoothly!

If any of the new members are not sure how things work don't hesitate to ask!

Tall we only have a little over a month to go before our first rodeo of the 1996 season! Just like last season one barrel racer will be assigned to each rodeo. It will be this persons responsibility to see that the pattern is set prior to that rodeo.

Remember if you do not get drawn up in the first performance it is your responsibility to contact someone who is and have them do it

A few things to remember:

- 1. A judge must be present.
- 2. All measurements must be recorded
- 3. All secretaries have a kit with tape 4. If your's is the last performance put measure, hammer, rope and spray paint.
 - 4. All the official measurements are in
 - 5. Look each arena over and try to set
 - 6. It is also your responsibility to run the electric eye cord down to the score line, and place the console in the crows nest. The secretary will also have these.

Wilsall Rodeo Association on the Grow

T Tome of one of the largest and oldest Northern Rodeo Association approved rodeos, last year's Wilsall Rodeo Association rodeo welcomed 355 NRA contestants.

With a population of nearly 300, when the rodeo is in town, the size of this Montana community more than doubles.

For 43 years the Wilsall Rodeo Association has leased the ground that their arena was on.

"Rent has been \$50 a year since 1953", commented Wilsall Rodeo Association secretary Arnold Hovem.

The land was owned by a family and 20 years ago, Wilsall Rodeo Assocication was able to raise donations and purchase a one-third interest in the property.

Then, this spring, a phone call came offering the rodeo club the remaining two-thirds interest.

After some consideration, it was decided that the average person living in Wilsall didn't want to lose the rodeo.

So, the Wilsall Rodeo Association got busy and raised \$18,000. Not quite enough to fully pay for the property but a good start. They purchased the ground.

A Unique Three Generation Rodeo Family

Rodeo is truly a family affair for the Johnson's of Cut Bank, MT. Sharon Martin of Central Entry thinks they are quite unique because they are the only three generation family she knows about that uses her system.

Bill Johnson, a farmer-rancher, 69 almost 70 years, is the oldest member of the group. He started roping a little later on at about age 29 after his neighbor, Floyd Monroe started the Del Bonita Roping Club. One of the highlights of his career was winning the all around title at the Cowley Lunbreck Rodeo in 1975. In 1980 he broke his leg at a Senior Pro Rodeo and that ended his calf roping, but he still competes in the team roping and breakaway roping in the S.P.R.A. in Canada and the U.S. He was the season leader in the heeling in the 1995 for Canada.

Arnie Johnson is 50. He credits Floyd Monroe with getting him started roping also. He won his first buckle at a rodeo in Browning, MT. in 1959. he joined the P.R.C.A. in 1965 and rodeoed mostly in Alberta and Montana. Now he's a member of the S.P.R.A. both in Canada and the U.S. He competes in the calf roping and in the team roping with his dad and also in the ribbon roping with Mary Devereaux. He is also a member of the Northern Rodeo Association where he calf ropes and team ropes with his sons, Todd and Chad. In 1992 Arnie won the finals and year end titles in all three of his events at the Canadian S.P.R.A. finals. In 1994 he was the calf roping and ribbon roping

finals winner and in 1995 he was the Canadian Champion in the calfroping. Arnie is a rancher and a horse trainer. He and his dad spend lots of hours in the roping building on the place.

The 3rd generation are Chad and Todd Johnson. Todd is 21 and just getting the roping bug. He heels for his dad in the N.R.A. Chad is 23 and has roped in competitions since he was about 8. His first rodeos were at the Alberta Riding & Roping Assoc. where he barrel raced and entered breakaway roping. Since then he has rodeoed through high school and college in the Northern Rodeo Association and the Chinook Association. One of the highlights of his career was winning 2nd in the #9 shoot out in Guthrie, Oklahoma in 1994. In 1995 he joined the P.R.C.A. and is the calf roping "Rookie of the Year."

The most famous part of this group is Charlotte Schmidt. She is Bill's daughter, Arnie's sister, and an aunt to Chad and Todd. Charlotte has qualified for the barrel racing at the National Finals 5 times and barely missed going this year.

Rodeo has been very good to this family for the last 36 years. They have met lots of people and made lost of friends.

Not only are the Johnson's the most unique three generation rodeo family I know, they are very professional in every phase of rodeo, from entering to competing. I am very happy to have entered the special group in many rodeos. They are truly Great "Friends of Rodeo".

Colt Tew

olt Tew of Belgrade, Montana achieved a repeat performance as he won the NRA Junior All-Around title and Barrel Racing championship at the NRA Junior Finals held in Billings on February 4th. Colt, who is eleven, won the All-Around and Barrel Racing championships last year as well.

The youngster, began competing in junior rodeos at the age of 5 years. Besides barrel racing he competes in breakaway, pole bending, steer riding, goat tying and team roping.

Understandably, Colt was pretty pleased with his championship titles. He has been competing in the NRA for the past three years. Although he has placed in the top ten in breakaway each year, Colt has his sights set on winning the championship next year.

This sixth grade honor student has had some other exciting experiences this past season as well. He traveled to Oklahoma City for the World Championship Barrel Futurity on December 4-5 where he competed against 100 other barrel racers from across the country. He finished sixth in the 13 and under category.

Colt competes in the High Winds Rodeo Club, with membership in four southwestern Montana counties. In 1995 he won 2nd in Breakaway and 3rd in Poles in that competition. He won his first team roping buckle this past year, and it took its place in the display alongside an impressive number of buckles the young man has won in his short rodeo career. Colt also competes in the Southern Montana Barrel Racing Association.

Feathers, a nine-year-old Quarter Horse, is Colt's multi-purpose horse that he began riding at the last five rodeos of the season.

She helped him to win at two and place at the other three. "I was real happy, and decided to keep going," Colt said modestly. Previously he had been riding Sunny, a 13 year-old Palamino. "All our kids learned to ride on Sunny. We broke her as a two-year-old, and she is the best automatic old horse. She is honest, consistent, and if they get to messing around, she lines them out," said his mother, Roxie. "She's almost human," Colt admitted.

Colt and his family are looking forward to attending the Josey World Championship Junior Barrel Race in Marshall, Texas on May 3-5. Last year he attended, along with 227 other riders, and he won third, bringing home a saddle. "It is the most prestigious event for kids," Roxie said. "Many of the kids borrow PRCA horses for the competition, so it's a real accomplishment to make it to the short go. It is the world championship for kids who come from 38 states and Canada, and will be televised this year. The winner receives a horse trailer."

Colt is the son of Clay and Roxie Tew. Clay works as a dispatcher for Northern Routes. The couple also by and train junior rodeo horses. It is not unusual for several kids to be at their place practicing with their horses. "When we sell a horse, then the work begins," Roxie said with a chuckle.

Until this year, Colt has attended a private Christian School, but with the recent family move and his competition schedule he is being home schooled along with his brother, Cody and sister, Caddee. He has a baby brother, Casey as well.

Colt likes to play football, especially the position of wide receiver. He is a talented artist who like to draw and paint, especially rodeo

and ranch scenes. Charlie Russell is his favorite artist.

Colt will be working to retain his championship title again this year, and looks forward to competing in high school rodeo in the future.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Saturday, March 16, 1996 1:00 p.m. Sacajawea Inn Three Forks, Montana

President Charlie Briggs called the meeting to order.

Roll was taken and a quorum verified. Those Board members in attendance included: President, Charlie Briggs; Vice President, Rod Brosz; Nancy Petersen proxy for Stan Rasmussen, Director at Large; Travis Caldwell, Calf Roping; Dale McQueary proxy for Mark Salmond, Team Roping; Dick Lyman, Contract Personnel; Rhonda Kountz, Breakaway Roping; George Cook, Barrel Racing; Marty Penrod, Bull Riding; Rob Kountz, proxy for Ed Miller; Buzz Finn, Rodger Nordahl, Leonard Wortman, Bob Graveley, Committee Directors. Those events not represented include: Steer Wrestling, Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, and Stock Contractors.

Minutes of the February 3, 1996 Board of Directors meeting were distributed and approved as written.

Finances of the Association were presented and approved subject to audit.

Committee Reports:

NARC: North American Rodeo Commission held their annual convention March 1-3 in Las Vegas. As of this time, the NRA has not been notified of the results of the meeting.

Friends of Rodeo: Representative not in attendance.

Awards Program: Currently working on the 1996 year-end event sponsorship program in addition to other sponsorships.

NRA Finals Committee: Serving on the NRA Finals committee are: Glen Hough, Stan Rasmussen, Janie Carlson, Ed Waldhauser, Steve Cutler, Ed Miller, Dick and Teri Jo Lyman.

Judges Program: As the new coordinator, Dick Lyman will be working with Steve Cutler, rough stock representative, and Mark Salmond, timed event representative, to make judging assignments, etc. Assignments to be made shortly.

Logan Coach Bonus Bucks Program: Vance Ruff updated the Board on the new Logan Coach Bonus Bucks Program and the final status of the 1995 Instant Rancher Sweepstakes program. This year's plan includes expanding the number of rodeos at which the Logan Coach trailer is displayed. Vance is currently working on coordinating this program.

EXCEL: Nancy Petersen updated the Board. Plans are to have EXCEL information booths at various rodeos. The program received a positive response from the General Membership at their meeting held during the NRF.

OLD BUSINESS: None.

NEW BUSINESS:

NRA Finals: George Runquist has indicated that he would consider the cancellation of the final year remaining on the NRF contract. Discussion. A letter will be written to George thanking him for his years of work and effort on behalf of the NRA and indicating the NRA's wishes to mutually agree to the cancellation of the contract. NRA Finals committee will handle details.

Discussion concerning stock contractors payment increase for NRA Finals voted in at February meeting: With a change in Finals managers/promoters, increase may be too steep for the initial year. On behalf of the stock contractors, Dick Lyman will work out a proposed mileage/animal adjustment and present the proposal at the fall meeting.

NRA Finals host hotels were discussed. A proposal has been presented to the NRA by another hotel. Discussion. It was moved and seconded: Sheraton be given the opportunity to meet the bid. PASSED.

Hometown entry ruling: On behalf of the committee directors, Rodger Nordahl sent a letter to each NRA committee explaining the rulechange passed at the October board meeting concerning the ruling that "All contestants competing at an NRA rodeo be members of the Northern Rodeo Association." Rodger also sent out a proposed rulechange procedure concerning rules affecting committees. Rodger compiled the comments, suggestions, and feedback from the letter. Discussion. It was moved and seconded: NRA rescind the ruling stating: "All contestants competing at an NRA rodeo be members of the Northern Rodeo Association." PASSED.

Continued discussion. It was moved and seconded: A.2.12: All local entries must have their entry fees paid and a release signed

before the rodeo begins. PASSED. UNANIMOUS. This information will be sent to all committees in addition to being printed in the NRA News.

To ensure compliance of the above ruling, the rodeo secretary will highlight local competitors on the judges cards. Judges will ask each hometown contestant before competition if they have fulfilled this ruling.

Membership to the North American Rodeo Commission for 1996 was discussed. It was moved and seconded: The NRA join the North American Rodeo Commission for 1996 if the program, format, dues structure remains the same as in 1995. PASSED.

Discussion concerning equal added money. As discussed and recommended at the October board meeting, equal added money in all events is a guideline, not a requirement, for committees.

Women competing in the rough stock events were discussed.

Discussion concerning the increased number of bull riding entries. The following proposal will be voted on at the FALL board meeting: It was moved and seconded: In the bull riding event, if a committee and stock contractor decide to implement the bull riding limit rule, the bull riding limit rule will be as follows: 25 bull riders per performance minimum. If the rodeo is held prior to July 15, the top 25 bull riders from the previous year-end standings will receive preference with the remaining bull riders selected by random draw. If the rodeo is held after July 15, preference is given to the current seasons' top 25 bull riders, with the remaining bull riders selected by random draw. PASSED.



It was moved and seconded: For the NRA Finals rodeo, the ladies barrel racers will run in the 1st through 10th position for the first go; For the second and third go-arounds, the order of the event will be the contestant's finish in prior go-arounds. There will be no trading of positions at the NRA Finals. PASSED.

It was moved and seconded: The top two (2) voted bullfighters work the NRA Finals rodeo. PASSED.

It was moved and seconded: Pay for each NRA Finals bullfighter be \$450. PASSED.

Quality of timed event cattle was discussed.

Meeting adjourned.



I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer. I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of the facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

HOW TO ENTER NRA RODEOS THROUGH BIG SKY RODEO CENTRAL ENTRY DIAL 406-428-2205

Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised. Charge is \$3.50

Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

- 1. Name of rodeo
- 2. Your NRA card number
- 3. Your name
- 4. The event or events you wish to enter
- 5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
- 6. Name of buddy or buddies two per event, six total.
- 7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
- 8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m.(unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are
- 9. Keep track of the confirmation number the operator gives you, both on entering the rodeo and calling back. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation. YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.

ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING HIS FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, you will be charged an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

Trade-outs and Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADE OUTS."

Trades: A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved <u>before the draw</u> in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

Note: a new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earier.

<u>Turnouts:</u> As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

- 1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.
- 2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judge, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.
