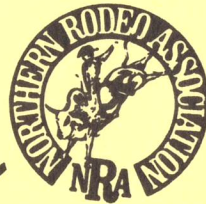
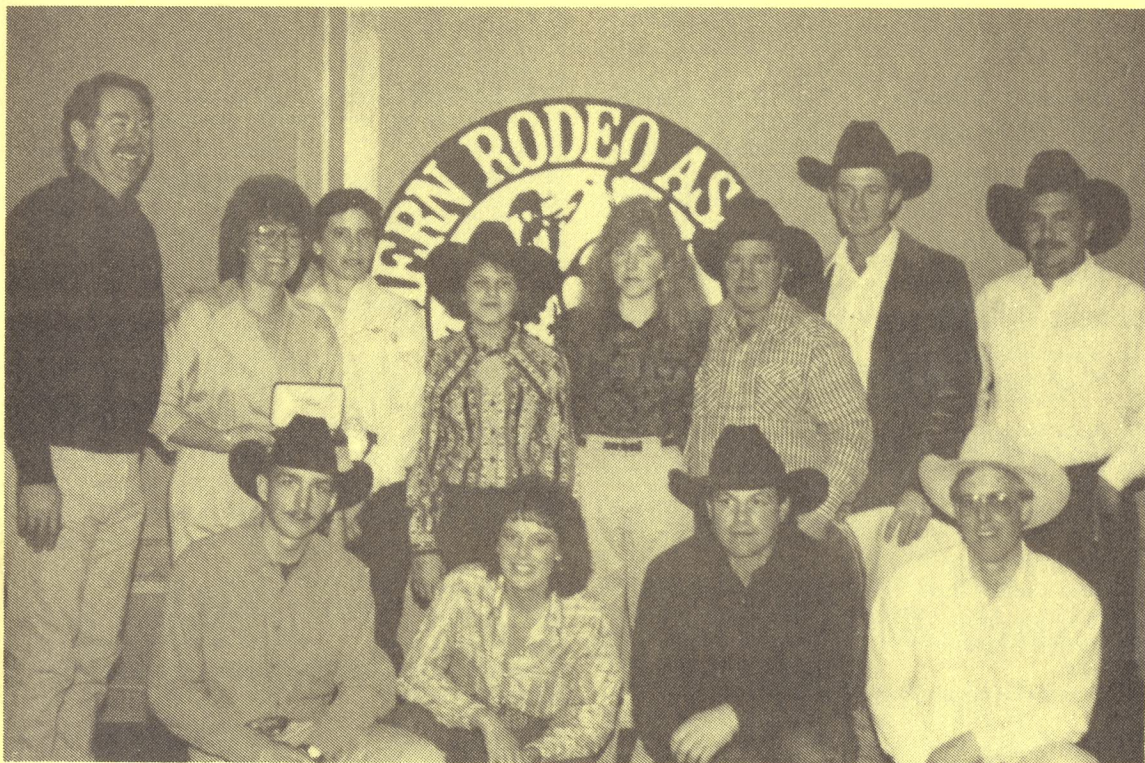

Winners of NRA rodeos this season could find it a rich year for prizes and cash. Rodeos throughout the season are offering special awards and bonuses along with the usual added money.

Larry Wirtz plans to add a \$600 cash award to the top bareback rider at his seven rodeos. Qualification requires that the rider enter all seven of Wirtz' rodeos.

Gardiner will give buckles in each event and to the all around winner. That Upper Yellowstone Roundup Association has a weekend of plans that mid week in June. A dance at 9 p.m. at the Eagles Club will follow the Saturday performance. The Gardiner committee also plans a parade on Saturday at 11 a.m.

At Opheim, a trophy saddle will be given to the top all around winner who is entered in both a rough stock and timed event.

Ennis Rodeo Association will be raffling a Hereford Brand Saddle donated to the club by Black Velvet Rodeo Preservation Fund. Tickets are \$1 and are available from the Ennis Rodeo Association members and will be sold during the rodeo. Drawing will be during the July 4th performance.

Ennis will once again have the high six saddle bronc ride off with \$500 going to the winner.

Polson will award trophy buckles to each event, this an extra enticement to entered the rodeo where the cowboys water ski.

East Helena has upped their added money to \$300 per event.

One of the NRA's new rodeos, the Kalispell Centennial, has the Gator Rope Bonus offering \$100 to fastest team using Gator rope, split if both partners are using Gators. Kalispell committee is also giving a \$1,000 scholarship in each junior event.

Ingomar again will also have a saddle bronc ride off. Top 4 saddle bronc riders will ride off for \$100 and jacket. Winner take all.

This is the fourth year for the Superior Lion Clubs Go for the Gold buckle offer. The person

to win the all around for three years will win a gold buckle from that committee. They will also be giving a buckle to the all around champion this year.

Helmville plans a top six saddle bronc ride off at their late August rodeo.

White Sulphur Springs will again host the Montana Barrel Racing Association at their Meagher County Fair rodeo. Check the sanctions listing for more information.

Team roping, barrels at Forsyth

Tradeout procedure for NRA rodeos

Trade outs in the NRA follow these guidelines:

1. If a trade is to be made before call backs are over, trade will take place through the central entry office. Trades can continue to be placed through central entry office up until 10 a.m. the day after call backs.

2. After books are closed or after 10 a.m. they day after call backs, all trades will be handled through the NRA office. Both parties involved with the trade are required to contract the office to verify trade. Trades can be handled through NRA office up to the last working day before the first performance of the given rodeo (same time frame as Notified Turn Outs.)

Trades can be made at the Rodeo, upon consent of both parties involved, before the draw is made in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

THE NRA OFFICE AND/OR CENTRAL ENTRY CAN ASSIST WITH PHONE NUMBERS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR THOSE WISHING TO TRADE AT A GIVEN RODEO. REMEMBER, ALL RODEOS ARE TRADEOUT RODEOS UNLESS SPECIFIED OTHERWISE.

Wirtz' awards \$600 in bareback

Rodeo must assume an offensive position

Society's new wave of concern for animals has placed a burden of change on livestock producers and rodeo contestants, says Dr. Bernie Rollins, of Colorado State University's philosophy and animal science departments

Speaking to the Northern Rodeo Association's Board of Directors meeting in Billings in February, Rollins quotes a recent Parent's Magazine poll showing 70 percent of Americans believe stockmen do a good job of taking care of their livestock, but 80 percent want the industry regulated by the government.

A poll in another popular women's magazine reflects that readers disagree with cosmetic research involving testing on lab animals.

"If society is willing to apply their belief to things that apply to them," he warned, "They sure as hell are going to apply it to you."

In his lively, humorous speech, Rollins stressed rodeo is vulnerable to animal rights concerns.

"I am not anti-rodeo," clarified the New York City native noting a trip to the Madison Square Garden rodeo in the late '40s had a profound influence on his life. "I found I was a 'transcultural.'"

But the sport is vulnerable to animal rights factions, 78 of whom signed a position statement calling for the elimination of the sport.

Assume an offensive position, Rollins encouraged, rather than face a "a showdown with the animals rights ethic which rodeo can not win."

Rodeo enthusiasts must beat animal activist to the draw by writing compromise legislation addressing animal cruelty issues.

"It would behoove you to do it, before it is done to you," he said reminding the group that a 10-square block area of New York City can out-vote Wyoming.

National Institute of Health maintains that Congress gets more letters on animal rights issues than any other. National Cattlemen's Association says it is the American public's third most popular concern.

"Let's not split hairs," Rollins says, "the new concerns are mainstream."

The change evolved with the urbanization of America, Rollins said. While 100 years ago society defined "animal" as horse or cow. Today, it is dog, cat or "pet."

Zeroing in on the rodeo crowd, the delightful, upbeat speaker said that cattlemen and livestock groups, including Colorado 4-H leaders, Colorado Farm Bureau and Colorado Cattlemen's Association groups distance themselves from rodeo because many agree it is cruel to stock.

Feedlot operators and ranch managers will not hire rodeo kids, Rollins said, "Because they are too prone to cowboy the stock."

The sport is particularly vulnerable to animal protection groups because, unlike medical research and livestock agriculture, it does not have a necessary purpose. "They see it as frivolous," he said.

The sport has a winnable case, however. "Rodeo has a very American symbol, the cowboy."

But to ensure the continuance of "the rich cultural phenomenon," rodeo proponents must exploit the positive and correct the negative.

Promoters can win the political battle if they sit down with "mainstream or moderate" humane society groups and write agreeable legislation for rodeo.

"If you write and pass legislation admitting, 'a lot of what we do is wrong and we want to fix it,' " the philosophy professor says, "legislators won't look at you with more stringent laws in the next session."

He suggested adopting the bill written by a California group which covers four simple objectives: notify the humane society 30 days prior to a rodeo; have a large animal vet on hand (paid for by the committee); supply a way to remove injured animals from the arena; and eliminate the use of electric prods.

This bill is less radical than most would expect, he said. And, if passed, it's unlikely

lawmakers would reopen the issue in the next session.

"They'll say, 'We dealt with rodeo last session.' "

Rollins himself is not sure those objectives are strict enough.

"At the very least, enforce a no-jerk rule," in the calf roping, he encouraged. Contestants must consider eliminating steer tripping.

Rewriting rodeo rules so they more closely replicate ranch conditions would be a positive step. He recommended moving to events that "stress cooperation with animals and not domination," he said "Restructure rodeo to include more cutting-horse-type events."

Rough stock contestants should focus on the misunderstanding of the flank strap and spurs, and perhaps eliminate the spurs because of the public's perception and misunderstanding that spurs injure the animals.

Electric prods should also be outlawed. Referring to their use in bull riding, he said hot-shots "degrade an event that is otherwise perfectly defensible."

In an interview following the meeting, Rollins said cattlemen also must police themselves. "Everything you do with animals, assume that '60-Minutes' will film it," he said.

Eliminating hot iron branding would be a positive political move for the beef industry, he said. Macho-hero Clint Eastwood could announce to the national animal groups that cattlemen really do care about their stock.

Rather than fighting, the beef industry could "trump" on the issue which animal rights groups are most sensitive.

"If I was in the beef industry, I would fix it and sell beef as an ethical product," he said.

Creditability as "husbandry-men" would be gained if cattlemen eliminated branding, castration without anesthesia and hormone transplants

If the stringent legislation passed protecting animal rights, the beef industry would be the quickest in livestock agriculture to respond. Feedlots are the "least offensive and most eas-

ily fixed" confinement animal operations.

The entire beef industry is credible to the animal protection groups because most beef animals "live a significant part of their lives under natural conditions."

"You don't have to worry about the radicals," he said. "You have to worry about society in general. And society in general has a greater interest in the humane treatment of animals than ever before."

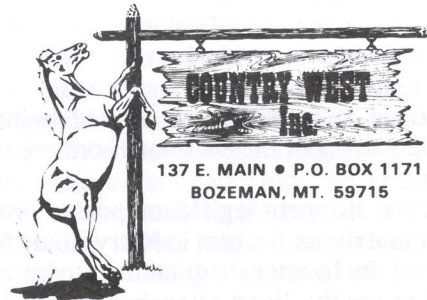

C. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, are recorded on tape, and each cowboy is given verification number for that conversation.

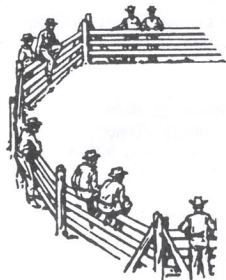

Health requirements for importing horses into Montana

This is to inform you of the health requirements for importing horses into Montana.

Montana Law, 81-2-703 MCA, requires that all livestock being brought into the state of Montana be accompanied by a current veterinary Inspection Certificate (health certificate) and import permit. This also applies to Montana livestock returning from out of state shows, etc. Import permits are to be obtained by the veterinarian issuing the VIC within 10 days prior to entry into Montana by calling 1-406-444-2976. There is no charge for the import permit.

Montana Brand Inspection Service does have system by which they will issue ANNUAL import permits for horses. These annual import permits are valid for calendar year in which they are issued.

However, having an annual permit does not relieve the shipper from the responsibility of maintaining a current Veterinary Inspection Certificate on the horses. To qualify for an annual import permit, you must permanent (lifetime) brand inspections for your horses.

All pets (i. e. dogs and cats) must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection showing current rabies vaccination.

Canadian Imports: You must meet the requirements of the State of Montana in addition to any federal regulations.

To save time and expense we advise that you cross the International Border on weekdays during the flowing hours: 8 a.m. to 4:30 p. m. Mountain Time.

Consignor's health and brand certificates may be checked in this state by a State Stock Inspectors for compliance. If any animals are not in compliance when they arrive in Montana, the Montana Department of Livestock can refuse to let them unload.

In addition, failure to have the proper documents is a violation of Montana law and can result in a citation and fine.

A North American Rodeo Commission new ruling requires the NRA to honor all NARC member organization's suspended lists. Therefore, if your name appears on the following associations fine lists, you will be required to pay those fines before you can compete at a NRA rodeo:

North Dakota Rodeo Association, South Dakota Rodeo Association, Northwest Ranch Cowboys Association; Wyoming Rodeo Association; Northern Plains Rodeo Association, and Eastern Idaho Rodeo Association, Etc.

New Rule Changes for 1991

Page 28, #6: A RODEO OFFICIAL'S EVALUATION will be sent to the rodeo secretaries, given to the judges and returned to the NRA office with the result sheets, etc., for each rodeo.

Page 9, #7: Added money for a rodeo can not be changed after the final official advertising for that rodeo. Additional added money maybe included, however, it will not be counted as "Official Point" earnings.

Amendment to Article 2, page 2: NRA Board of Directors will be expanded to include a representative for contract personnel, with a two-year term, to be voted on at the end of the fiscal year in the even numbered years.

Additional change to page 22, #5A and page 27, #4A: Ladies Barrel RACE event will be run before the junior barrel racing events at all rodeos and slack.

Page 20, #2: An incidence of animal abuse or mistreatment of stock, in or our of the arena, witnessed by two NRA members and reported to the NRA office or rodeo official, will result in a \$50 fine for the first offense; \$500 fine, second offense; disqualification from participation at NRA rodeos for the remainder of the season, third offense. This also applies to any co-approved rodeo with the NRA.

Page 35: Scoreline (not neckrope) will be set: SW: (Minimum) length of box minus 6 feet; CR: (Minimum) length of box minus 4 feet; TR: (Minimum) length of box minus 2 feet; LBAR: governed by type of cattle roped.

Scoreline will be set according to arena and box length and conditions, but when conditions warrant, the score shall be set as stated above.

PAGE 56, #5: One loop only will be carried in the ladies breakaway roping event.

I understand that this document maybe treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

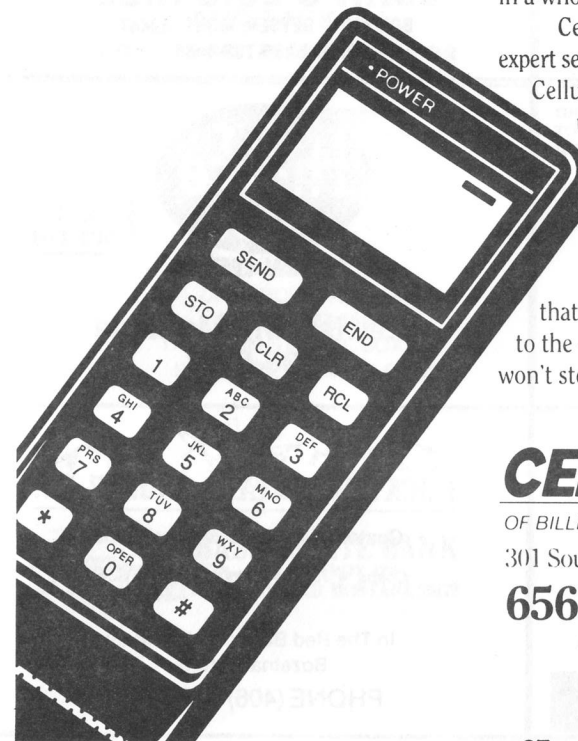

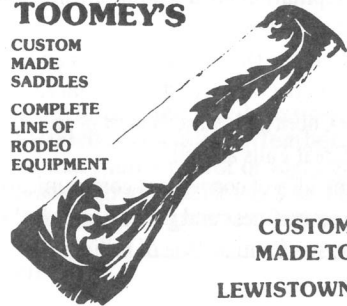

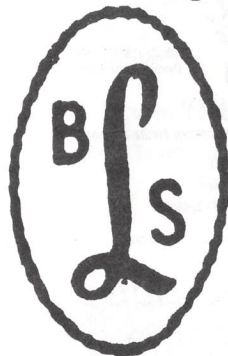
