World Finals - Nov. 6-14, NRA compete Nov. 10-14

World Finals Rodeo dates are set for Nov. 6-14 in El Paso.

A change in this year's format is the rodeo will feature two groups of associations in 4-day drafts. The first half of the contestants will compete from Nov. 6-9; the second half, which will include members from the NRA, will compete Nov. 10-13. Top contestants in each draft will compete for the short go-round on Saturday.

NRA CONTESTANTS WILL ENTER THROUGH THE NRA OFFICE (252-1122) ON MONDAY, SEPT. 28, 9 A.M. TO 4 P.M. THREE PER EVENT WILL BE ACCEPTED, WITH THE TOP THREE IN EACH EVENT STANDINGS GIVEN PRIORITY. ALTERNATES WILL ALSO BE CHOSEN. BE SURE AND ENTER IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN GOING TO THE

NARC FINALS. FEES ARE \$203 PER EVENT.

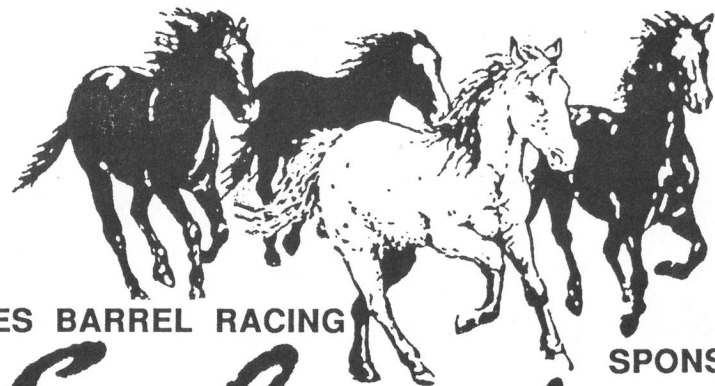
PERFORMANCE TIMES are 7:30 p.m. each evening from Friday, Nov. 6 through Saturday, Nov. 14 with the exception of an afternoon performance on Sunday, Nov. 8 which starts at 3 p.m.

SLACK TIMES are 9 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 8, Tuesday, Nov. 10 and Thursday, Nov. 12. Slack will be at noon on Friday, Nov. 6.

ORDER OF EVENTS IS: Bareback, calf roping, breakaway, saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling, clown act, team roping, barrel racing, bull riding.

CONTESTANT NUMBERS: 70 contestants will be allowed per event, 35 in the the first half of the rodeo; 35 in the second.

STOCK: Stock consists of 74 bareback and 74 saddle bronc horses; 76 bulls (includes two fighting bulls); 72 calf roping calves; 36 breakaway calves; 36 steer wrestling steers; 36 team roping steers

When the stock arrives in El Paso, they will be drawn into two pens; pen one will be the stock used in the first half of the rodeo; pen two will be the stock used for the second half contestants.

In the rough stock, there will be 14 feature animals per event; these feature animals will be drawn into pen 1 and pen 2 so the same number of feature animals will be in each pen.

Stock that is drawn into pen two will not be used until the second half of the contestants compete.

More saddlemakers...

Two saddle makers not included in the July announcement of NRA award saddle makers are Earl Twist of Western Outdoors, of Kalispell, and Bob Johnston of G & J Tack and Saddle, Manhattan.

Hard work and attention to detail have made Earl Twist's saddles popular with cowboys and movie directors alike. Builder of the NRA 1992 All Around Cowboy saddle, Twist has a nationwide reputation and knows the thrill of seeing his work on television. The Kalispell resident has built custom saddles since 1970. Hollywood directors took notice of his work during the filming of "Heaven's Gate," in which the extras rode Twist's saddles. Now, Hollywood actors order them. Stop by Western Outdoor in Kalispell and visit with Earl and check out his fine handwork.

Bob Johnston, a reining horse trainer and National Finals Rodeo Qualifier, will build the NRA junior All Around saddle. Bob has built saddles for the Senior Pro-Rodeo Association in addition to custom made saddles for rodeo contestants and horsemen alike. Bob's shop is located in Manhattan, ah, Montana, that is.

In the timed events, the contestants that make the short-go will bring back the stock they competed on in the previous two rounds. If they competed in the first half, the stock will come from pen 1; if they competed in the second half; the stock will come from pen two.

In the rough stock, the stock will be selected from both pens just as it has been in the past.

Pen 1 and Pen 2 will each consist of 37 bareback horses, 37 saddle bronc horses; 37 bulls; 36 calf roping calves; 18 each breakaway calves, steer wrestling steers, team roping steers.

The amount of stock used in this year's rodeo is the same amount of stock used other yeas as per number of contestants.

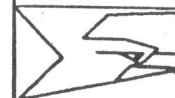

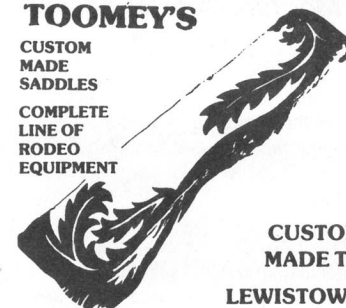

Melaney top money winner at end of regular season

At the close of the Northern Rodeo Association regular season run this past Labor Day weekend, Choteau's Mary Salmond has combined Northern Rodeo Association winnings in the team roping, barrel racing and breakaway roping events of \$8,309. This is more than any other NRA member has in regular season earnings including the cowboys. She leads the All-Around cowgirl race by \$1,700.

Salmond is also sitting in the number two spot in the Ladies' Breakaway Roping event, \$300 behind high school cowgirl Jody Petersen.

Winning the most money in a single event in the 1992 season is nine-year-old Kera Washburn, of Cody, Wyo. She has tallied up \$6,451 in the Ladies' Barrel Racing. Sidney cowgirl Rayna Prewitt trails Washburn by \$200.

Only \$700 separates the top five team ropers in the 1992 NRA standings. Enoch Schaffer, Broadus, currently has \$4,219 - ahead of Guy Howell, Powderville, with \$3,853. Schaffer

and Howell roped together throughout most of the 1992 rodeo season as they climbed to the top in the team roping.

The 1990 Steer Wrestling Champion Charlie Briggs, Bozeman, must ward off a close field of steer wrestlers as the tenth position cowboy is only \$1,258 behind Briggs, the leader going into the finals.

Calf roping is also led by the 1990 NRA Champion Chris Witcher, Miles City, with \$4,900 to his credit.

And, reigning NRA Champion Bull Rider Marty Penrod, Miles City, is maintaining a substantial lead in his event.

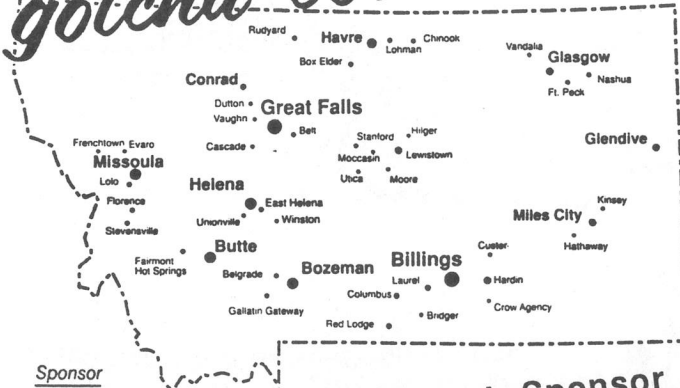
The 1991 NRA Rookie of the Year, Toby Hawks, Billings, currently holds the lead in the Saddle Bronc Riding.

Many-time NRA champion Bob Schall, Arlee, leads the Bareback Riding by \$679 over Australian Cowboy Darryl Lamb.

Schall is also is the All-Around Cowboy leader with \$7,921.
