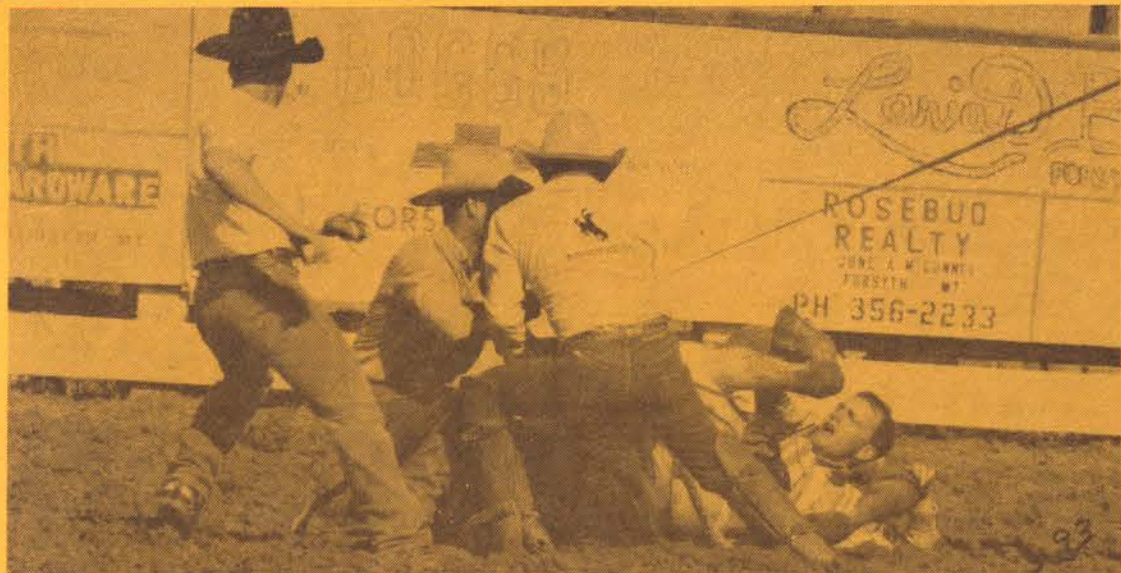

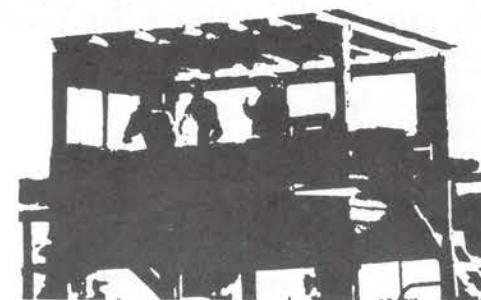

# An unsung hero of rodeo

## Dick Lyman is one of the best pickup men in the business

Lacy Lyman had never before seen her father unconscious.

But there was Dick Lyman, victim of a freak accident in the rodeo arena, bleeding like anything from deep scalp wounds. Lacy, 13, sat in the ambulance and worried, watching her dad.

And then she heard him swear.

"Finally he started cussing," Lacy later told her mom. "I started to cry, I was so happy. I knew he would be OK."

Lacy should have known better. It takes more than a little collision with a steel gate to get the best of her father. For in a tough sport where only the toughest thrive, Dick Lyman has proven himself capable many times over.

Lyman, whose younger brother Rod is one of the best steer wrestlers in the rodeo world, is one of the sport's best pickup men. He's also one of the toughest, but he won't tell you that.

"I've been very, very fortunate," he said. "To be perfectly honest, I have no kicks with my life right now."

Lyman and men like him are unsung heroes of the rodeo. They don't ride bulls or rope calves or wrestle steers. They don't earn high marks from the judges or applause from the fans.

They just save lives.

"I really have always liked the thought of savin' somebody, of bailin' somebody outa trouble," Lyman said. "You keep 'em healthy so they can keep going."

A pickup man's job begins when a cowboy's eight second ride ends. Pickup men rescue the cowboys from the bucking stock, often lifting them from trouble with one strong arm. Pickup men then herd the wild broncs — or bulls — out of the arena.

Horseman skills are a must. Courage doesn't hurt either.

Lyman doesn't lack for either.

"He's just so tough, said Don Jacobs, Lyman's stepfather and owner of Jacobs Livestock Co., a rodeo stock contractor. "Nothing scares him."

But it was a frightening ordeal three weeks ago at the East Helena Rodeo. Lyman was working to undo a bucking rein from a bronc, galloping up the side of the arena with his head turned.

An inexperienced chute man, standing outside rather than inside the arena, opened the steel gate a bit to sneak a peak at Lyman barreling up the sideline.

He gave Lyman no time to react, and the big pickup man never saw what hit him.

Lyman hit the gate full force with his head, causing deep wounds to the scalp. Knocked cold, Lyman was tossed about by his horse before finally falling to the ground, where, for good measure, the bronc trampled him.

"It really wasn't anybody's fault," Lyman said. "But it wasn't a good deal. It's the kinda thing where you're doing good if you can walk away from it."

They hauled the 6-foot-5, 280-pound cowboy to the hospital, where doctors worried about internal bleeding.

"From 8:30 to 1:30 they sewed on me," Lyman said. "I was really pretty coherent the whole time and I asked the doctor how many stitches so I could brag about it. He said he didn't know, but that he'd used up three rolls of suture material."

But that didn't mean a night in the hospital.

"That's just the way he was raised," said Lyman's wife, Teri Jo. "You're not hurt unless you're bleeding. Dick said he was OK, that it was just a couple of stitches."

And a couple of compressed discs in his back. But Lyman isn't very good at convalescing.

"I don't know how I never got a headache, Lyman said. "But I really didn't feel too bad. Everything was in pretty good shape so the doctor said I could spend the night in the motel."

"What's giving me the most trouble now is getting my back back in shape."

Lyman took a weekend off from the rodeo. But last week, he picked up cowboys at a rodeo in Eureka. "I admit I'm hard-headed," Lyman said. "But I like the action."

Her husband's hankering to get back to work didn't surprise Teri Jo. "This deal with his head, they said it should've killed him," she said. "I don't know..."

But death doesn't scare Dick Lyman any more than a loose bull.

A former football star at Great Falls High, Lyman earned a scholarship at Montana State. He made all-Big Sky Conference as a 270-pound defensive tackle in 1976. He could run 40 yards in 4.9 seconds, and scouts from the Dallas Cowboys took a special interest.

But Lyman came down with colitis, a disease that affects the large intestine. It got so bad that Lyman quit football.

A few years later he almost quit this world.

"I was virtually in a deathbed," he said. "My wife called Rochester (Minn. and the Mayo Clinic) and they made an appointment two weeks away. She called back three days later and said we ain't gonna make it two weeks."

The Lymans flew to Minnesota the next morning. Two days later Lyman had a new type of surgery previously tried only a few hundred times. It worked.

"It gave me my life back," he said. "It's been eight years now and I've been feeling great. I have a lot to thank the Good Lord for."

Of course, a lot of cowboys have a lot to thank

Lyman for. He's been the Northern Rodeo Association's Pickup Man of the Year nine times, including an unprecedented seven straight years. But he's not a "professional."

Lyman works as an outfitter, operating a fishing camp, and helps his stepfather with the stock business. He also helps Teri Jo raise their four daughters.

"I do what I do on the weekends because it's what I like," Lyman said. "I've always liked cowboying. It's been a big part of my life. I guess it's something bred into you."

But why? After major surgery why continue with the dangerous job? Why flirt with disaster only weeks after suffering serious injury?

Lyman smiles and shakes his head. "I'm not saying it's the right thing to do," he said. Then he thought for a second.

"In the arena, everything's a spur-of-the-moment deal," Lyman said. "You've gotta react, you can't plan anything. I like the excitement. And it really means a lot to me not to get anybody hurt."

Rodeo cowboys would say likewise to you, Dick Lyman. Likewise.

## HOW TO ENTER NRA RODEOS THROUGH BIG SKY RODEO CENTRAL ENTRY DIAL 406-428-2205

Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised. Charge is \$3.50

Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

1. Name of rodeo
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your name
4. The event or events you wish to enter
5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies — two per event, six total.
7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are up.

9. Keep track of the confirmation number the operator gives you, both on entering the rodeo and calling back. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation. **YOU MUST HAVE THIS VERIFICATION NUMBER IF THERE ARE ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING YOUR ENTRY OR CALL BACK.**

**ANY CONTESTANT WHO DRAWS OUT OF A RODEO AFTER RECEIVING HIS FIRST PREFERENCE OF PERFORMANCES AT A GIVEN RODEO OR RODEOS WILL BE FINED \$20 PER INFRACTION.**

Late call back number is 428-2398. If you have to use the late call back number, you will be charged an additional \$2.50, so please call during regular hours.

### Trade-outs and Turnouts

All NRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADE OUTS."

**Trades:** A contestant may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties.

**Note:** a new rule passed at April 1992 board meeting states timed-event draw must be made in presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

**Turnouts:** As stated in the rule book, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in. You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered.

2. If it is too late to notify, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judge, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcer and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

## Grizzly develops taste for tender spring lamb

The ongoing saga of the pork loving grizzly bear in the Lincoln area came to an abrupt halt when he changed his tastes to spring lamb.

The Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks said that a four-year-old male grizzly bear, dubbed "Number 105" because of his ear tag, was destroyed recently after killing 35 sheep near Lincoln that were owned by the Sieben Ranch Co.

The bear was first captured in May 1991 after killing sheep on the Blackfeet Reservation and was relocated to the Sun River Wildlife Management Area west of Augusta.

This spring he was trapped near Lincoln after attacking Bryan and Blair Barthelme's 4-H pigs in the barnyard, and was taken back to the wildlife management area.

It only took a few days and he was back in the Lincoln area, sniffing around the Barthelme pig pen, eating their food, but not bothering the pigs at all.

However, he developed a taste for tender spring lamb, and killed 35 of the woolies belonging to the Sieben Ranch.

His new-found taste in meat led to his untimely demise at the hands of FWP officials, who said that because the bear was now considered an adult and still was attacking livestock, he was killed under the Interagency Grizzly Bear Guidelines.

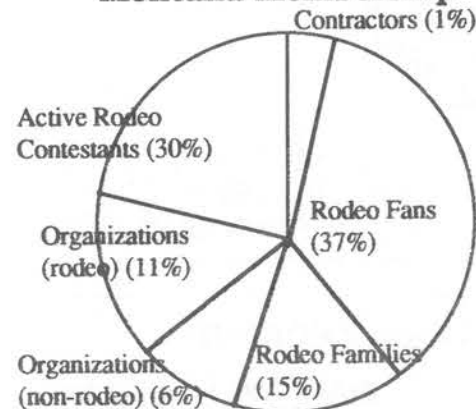
## Who joins Friends of Rodeo?

## Coors support of NRA rodeo spans the years

Will Metz of Billings is the liaison between the NRA and the Montana Coors Distributors and works closely with Executive Secretary Jann Parker in the selection of the jacket style, color, manufacturer, etc. Jim Haney is the Coors Brewery representative and also directs the work of the NRA with Coors.

Metz said that the Coors support of rodeo over the years has proved to be exceptionally positive, and cowboys have always been the most loyal to the

product. "We always get the most return for our money with rodeo sponsorship," Metz said. The grass roots support of individual rodeo probably contributes to the success of the Coors program.

Metz also mentioned that he still notices the Finals jackets from "way back when" when he attends an NRA rodeo, so the benefit is perpetual.

Coors support of NRA rodeo has been one of the dominant factors of the NRA awards program over the years, and was especially evident when the North American Rodeo Commission worked with the Adolph Coors Company in supporting their member rodeo associations. Since Coors has cut back its support of the NARC Finals, the Montana Coors Distributors jumped right in to take up the slack, and Coors' support of the Northern Rodeo Association is even better and bigger than when NARC was involved.

The good exchange between cowboys and Coors can be found at any rodeo when it is obvious that the beer of individual choice is Coors.

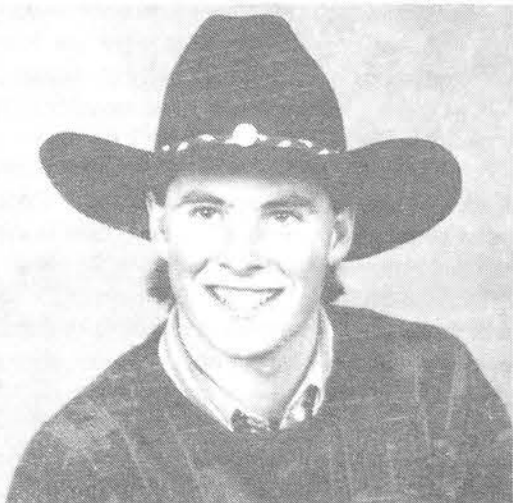

## NRA no longer NARC member

Northern Rodeo Association members who have traditionally competed in the NARC (North American Rodeo Commission) Finals in El Paso need not worry about meeting the entry closing date this year.

It appears that the NRA, a charter member of the commission, is no longer a member.

At the annual meeting of the NARC in February, the dues structure was revised upward from the annual \$2,500 in dues, and instead called for \$1 per contestant, per rodeo to be sent to the NARC office as 1993 dues. With the number of NRA rodeos and the number of contestants competing in them, this would amount to roughly \$10,000 in membership dues for the North-

"If I can pay my bills, I'm happy," he says.

Affectionately known to his friends as "V.R.P.R.", Ruff is especially interested in helping committees set up a series of rodeos, in which competitors tally up their winnings from several rodeos to win a prize at the end of the series or the end of the season, whichever they desire.

NARC countered in July with a request of \$5,000 annual dues for the NRA.

A telephone poll of the NRA board turned this proposal down also.

Allegedly, NARC is experiencing some internal upheaval, and loss of sponsorship dollars has also presented some financial squeezes.

Big Truck Productions has been working closely with Jann Parker and the Northern Rodeo Association in selecting filming sites, securing extras and other personnel for the movie, and in gaining knowledge

and insight into this game called rodeo.

The Livingston matches will take place on Wednesday and Thursday, Aug. 25 and 26, and the Wilsall match will take place on Tuesday, Aug. 31. People are urged to attend the matches so that the stands are full, and in return they will get an inside look at the movie industry.

## Montana cowboys helping drugstore kind film movie, "Lonesome Dove"

DRUMMOND (AP) — There were times when Jess Martin lit up this end of the Flint Creek Valley. Sunday wasn't one of them.

Just a few weeks off a couple of great saddle bronc rides at the College National Finals in Bozeman, Martin drew poorly at the Drummond Kiwanis Rodeo last weekend and made some technical errors to boot.

His 68 points aboard a horse called "Owl Hoot" didn't compare with the seven touchdowns he once scored for the Drummond Trojans or the state Class C pole vault title he captured as a senior in high school.

But it was still a nice break from Hollywood.

Martin, who spent his formative years on a ranch in nearby Hall, is rubbing shoulders with actor Lou Gossett Jr. these days.

Martin has been hired as a wrangler for the made-for-TV movie "Return to Lonesome Dove" which was being filmed in such made-for-cowboys locations as Ennis, McAllister, Silver Star, Pipestone and Cardwell.

"There's a bunch of us doing it," Martin said, mentioning former Western Montana College teammate Marty Tomlin and bronc rider Ryan Mapston of Arlee.

"It's cuttin' back on my rodeos, but it's hard to pass up that money," Martin said.

The wranglers, who help the actors learn the ropes and reins of horses, work 16-hour days at \$17 an hour.

"It's more than we're worth, I know that," Martin said.

He said the actors in the movie are pleasant enough people.

"That Lou Gossett Jr., he'll come up to me and talk and stuff," said Martin. "I think he's a pretty nice guy."

But as horsemen, he said the movie stars make good actors.

"A lot of 'em are really ... they don't know how to ride a horse real well," Martin said.

He finished his rodeo career at Western Montana College in June by winning the first go-round at the College National Finals Rodeo with a 71.

Martin, who's been largely a weekend bronc rider the past couple of summers because of jobs, wants to give pro rodeo a full shot in the next few years.

And when the movie set moves to the Billings area in a couple of weeks, Martin is thinking about swallowing the easy money and going bronc riding full time.

Editor agrees that the NRA News is the official publication of the Northern Rodeo Association.

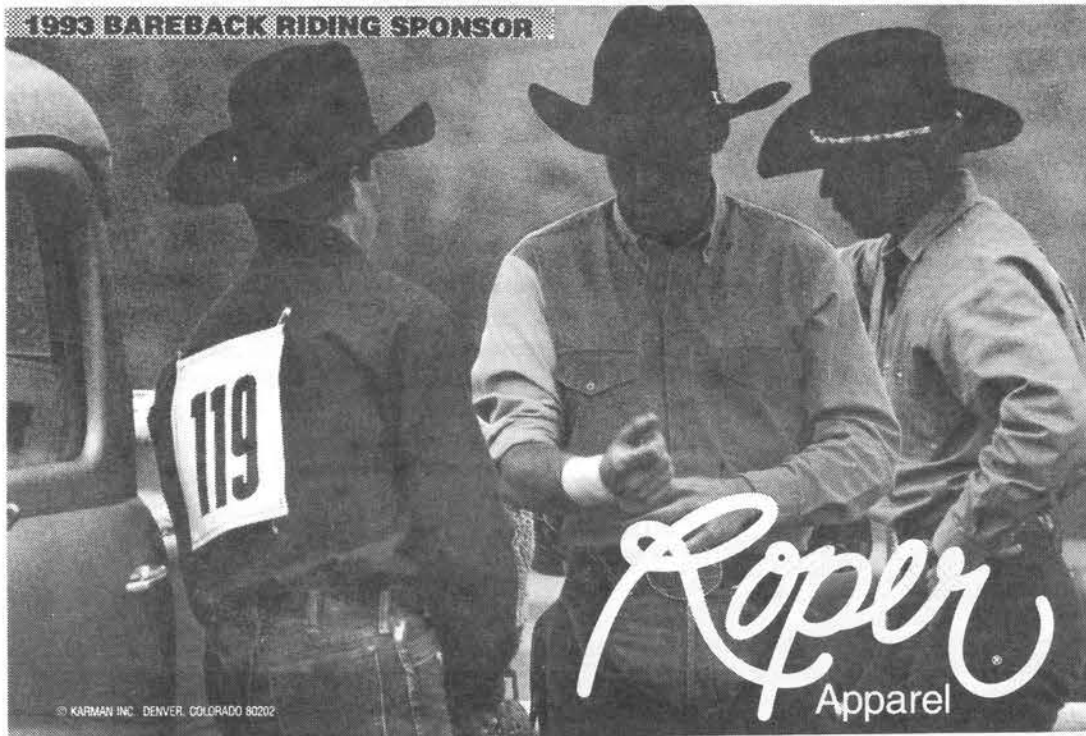
Editor agrees to publish a positive public relations tool, reflecting honesty, professionalism, sportsmanship, and competitiveness which this Association so highly endorses.

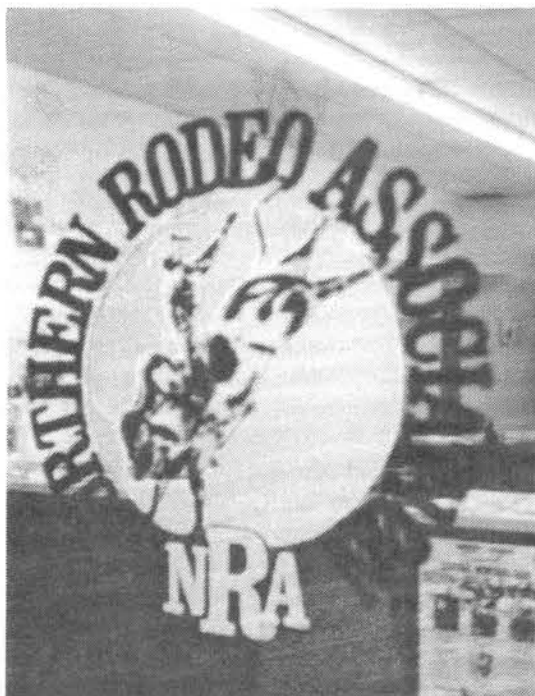

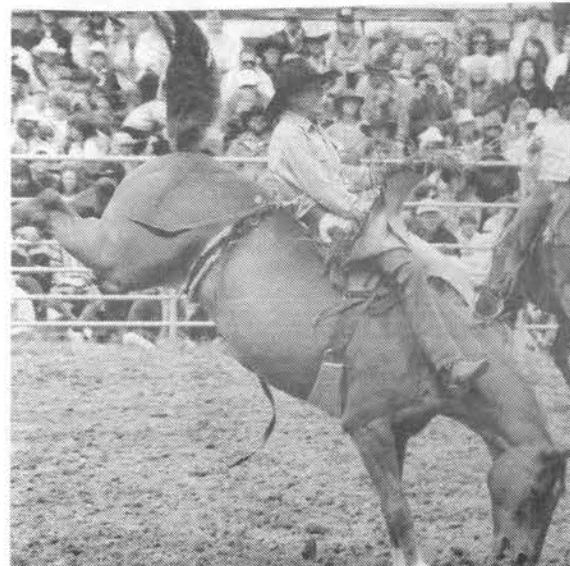

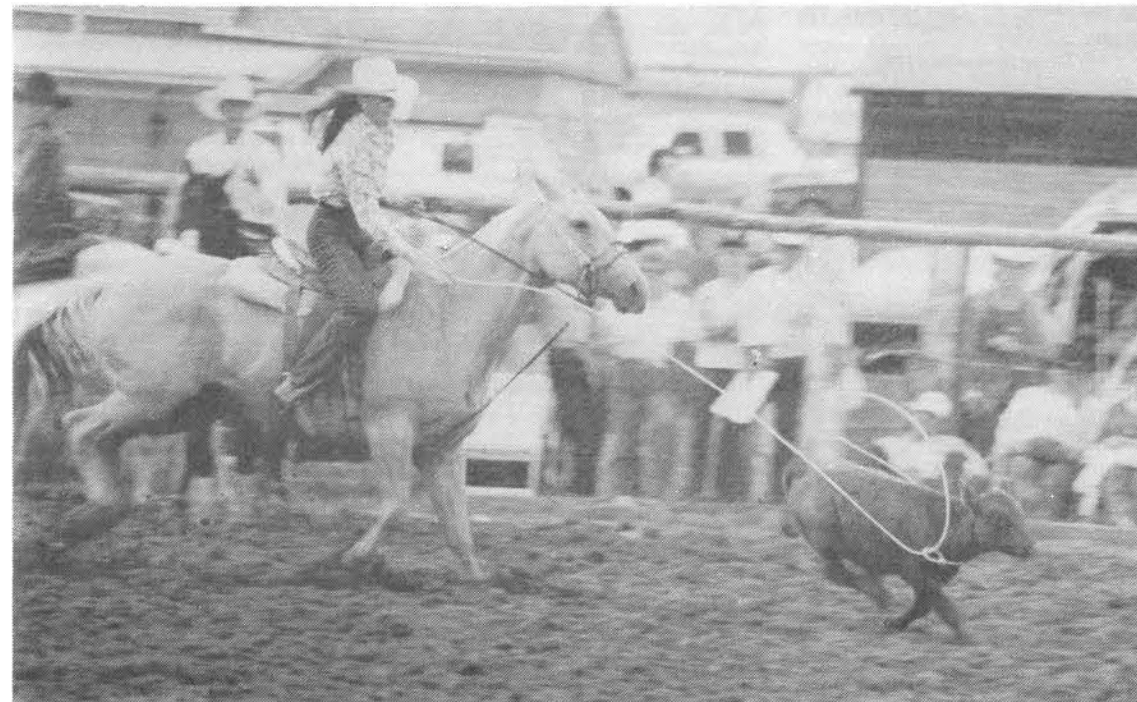
