



If you have not received your card or are not receiving the newsletter or know of someone who's not please let the NRA Office know. We have had a problem with people not receiving their cards and newsletters.



## NEW LOOK FOR NRA FINALS

Same quality cowboys and cowgirls. Same quality stock.

Just a new, fancier package.

The 22nd annual Northern Rodeo Association Finals, scheduled for Jan. 31-Feb. 2, 1997, will have a whole different look than its predecessors. NRA officials promise that.

George Runquist, of Nashville, Tenn., and the NRA mutually parted company after the last Finals in Billings. Runquist had been the executive director of the past 20 NRA Finals.

To change the image of the Finals, the NRA has hired Champion Sports Group from Charlotte, N.C. run by David Allen.

His group also handles the College National Finals Rodeo, the Professional Bull Riders and the marketing for NASCAR driver Dale Earnhardt.

"We wanted a little more emphasis on the rodeo," said Steve Cutler, who chaired the NRA hiring committee. "We still want to have it a family event, just make it a little faster paced than it has been in recent years."

"We were looking for someone who was in the business and had a strong track record of producing good, quality events. We were looking to spice up the rodeo." subn

"The NRA has a good following, we're not going to change the rodeo aspect at all."

According to both parties, it's a 50-50 deal. Both will bring ideas to the table of what will work and what will not. But there will be some changes, Allen promised.

"We have to make it a hipper event," said Allen. "We have to bring the NRA Finals into the '90s. We're introducing a new direction.

"We'll change the way it's presented and packaged. No more organ music. We'll have more country rock type stuff. And we'll have a two-hour, 2:15 rodeo. We'll shave an hour off the performance.

"It will have a lot of similarities to what we've done with the CNFR."

Allen said the move is not to drive off long-time fans, but to attract new fans and make the NRA Finals only stronger.

"We hope the older fans will recognize we haven't changed the competition or tradition. Tradition to me is the rodeo, man vs. animal, trying to do your best. The emphasis will be on a quality rodeo.

Allen said there will be programs installed specifically targeted toward children and the NRA Finals is willing to play ball, "with anybody who wants to play ball with us."

There will also be changes for the competitors. The NRA plans to increase the added money from \$5,000 to \$7,500 from the organization and add some perks for the cowboys and cowgirls who qualify.

"This is a Finals. They need to be treated like they're going to something special." Allen said.

Allen's group was one of seven that submitted bids. "I think it's exciting", he said. Same rodeo, just a different look."



## East Helena Valley Rodeo Association **Dedicated Volunteers -Great Facility**

For the past 20 some years, Rodger and I have been involved with the East Helena rodeo. We continue to be amazed by the quality of dedicated committee members, new and old (one member has 30 some years in). Through their efforts we continue to be one of the largest NRA rodeos in the state and with the help of our local newspapers, radio and TV stations we are able to promote NRA rodeo to a lot of folks.

Our committee sponsors an In-County rodeo the night before the NRA rodeo which encourages young people to give the sport of rodeo a try. In connection with the East Helena Improvement Association a parade is held each year and this year a flea market was on Saturday and a Rodeo Pancake Breakfast was on Sunday. Activities keep growing and growing. We stopped selling tickets at 7:30 PM on Saturday because their was standing room only, and there wasn't much room left to stand either. A new record crowd. We added two new 30' bleachers this year which provided seating for 300 additional fans

When the grand entry is over and it's time to rodeo the committee members know exactly what their jobs are to make the rodeo run smoothly. The improvements made at the timed event portion of the arena made their jobs easier this year. A separate entrance to the arena vet. for barrel racers and ropers was provided,

instead of entering and leaving the arena by only one gate. New metal panels were installed for the holding and sorting area, and additional sand was added to the boxes to ensure safe footing for animals and contestants. Old structures were torn down and removed and we sprayed for noxious weeds. Of course, a lot of painting was done too. Thanks to our "retired" members. we were lucky enough to have a great day crew to supplement our nightly and weekend work parties, for the past four months.

Under the leadership of President Ray McGowan and the other officers, vast improvements have been made to our facility. The rodeo grounds property is owned by ASARCO and the rodeo committee for 37 years has continued to improve and maintain the facility for the right to provide the NRA rodeo and several other rodeo events throughout the year to the community. Our committee members help out with several of these events also.

We had a great NRA rodeo (our 37th). the animals performed well, the contestants were tops and there were no serious injuries to the rodeo participants, but that doesn't include our committee President. Ray McGowan was serving as the arena director when a fast moving bull dumped his rider and pushed McGowan into a chute breaking his leg. He didn't let the injury keep him from Sunday's performance, he showed up on crutches - this time as a spectator.





# Penrod, Burns share bull win

Final show of 'best ever' rodeo by Independent Record staff (reprinted with permission)

Some fine rides were registered on the bulls in the opening two days of the East Helena Rodeo, but it was the final performance that produced the winner...er, make that winners.

Marty Penrod of Miles City and Jeff Burns of Terreton, Idaho, each scored 78 in the final event of the final performance to take home paychecks of \$794.38 each.

Penrod, the top bull rider in the Northern Rodeo Association, drew a bull by the name of Budweiser for his eight-second ride. The animal provided good spinning and high kicking to enhance the score.

Bo Didley was Burns' bull, and he wasn't about to be outdone, as the bull twisted from the opening of the chute to the buzzer.

Winifred's Nick Econom scored the fast time in the steer wrestling Sunday to take third overall behind Ron Schenk's top score of 4.2 seconds. Jared Nuffer's Sunday showing of 11.2 seconds in the calf roping earned him the top spot in the event, along with \$597.31.


Heather Hart, of Gallatin Gateway was the only woman to place in the two events, as she tied for second in breakaway roping and took fourth in barrel racing. Her total winnings were \$709.49.

Rodeo Official Sheila Nordahl said this year's rodeo-the 37th annual-was the best so far.

"We had a huge crowd here Saturday," she said. "We stopped selling tickets at 7:30 because it was standing room only in here, and there wasn't much room to stand. It's been a great rodeo for us this year."

Nordahl said the animals performed well and that there was no serious injuries to the rodeo participants, but that doesn't include the president of the East Helena Valley Rodeo Association, Ray McGowen.

McGowen was serving as the arena director when a fast moving bull bucked his rider and pushed McGowen into a chute, breaking his leg. The president didn't let the injury keep him from the show, however, as he was on hand for Sunday's performance on crutches-this time as a spectator.

# NRA GUIDELINES FOR TRADE-OUTS AND TURNOUTS

All NRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised as "NO TRADE OUTS."

#### TRADEOUT PROCEDURE:

A contestant may trade positions and/or performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled by central entry up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA office at 406-252-1122.

Both parties involved in the trade must call the NRA office and confirm the trade. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** 

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of the trade by both parties.

Keep in mind, the timed event draw must be made in the presence of the rodeo secretary and **CAN** be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. This is brought to your attention so contestants can plan to make position trades earlier.

## TURNOUT PROCEDURE:

As stated in the rulebook, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal





to the entry fees. The NRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout.


- 1. Notified Turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at that rodeo, call the NRA office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in., You must have your entry fees included in the payoff for that rodeo in which you will not be competing, so alternative ways to get your fees to the rodeo need to be considered. The NRA office will be glad to help you with this.
- 2. If it is too late to notify the NRA office, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judge, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus your entry fee).

Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcers and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this will eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

## MEDICAL AND VET RELEASES:

As soon as you know that you will be unable to compete at an NRA rodeo due to a medical release, contact the NRA office. With a medical or vet release you are not responsible for your fees but releases must be sent into the NRA office within five days after the rodeo along with a \$10 processing charge per rodeo. Vet releases are accepted in the barrel racing event only. Keep in mind, when you medical or vet release there is a five day waiting period before you can participate in another NRA rodeo.



I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.







Entries will be open from 10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. every Monday. Call backs will be Tuesday from 12 noon to 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise advertised. Charge is \$3.50

Give the following information when entering a rodeo:

- 1. Name of rodeo
- 2. Your NRA card number
- 3. Your name
- 4. The event or events you wish to enter
- 5. Preferences you have on which performance you wish to work.
- 6. Name of buddy or buddies two per event, six total.
- 7. If multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
- 8. Call back Tuesday between 12 noon and 6:30 p.m.(unless otherwise advertised) to find out when you are up.
- 9. Keep track of the confirmation number the operator gives you, both on entering the rodeo and calling back. Every conversation, both entries and call backs, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation. 
