White Sulphur Springs; better than ever



The rodeo is now a three day event, allowing the barrel racers and ropers all to have a chance to compete before an audience instead of having a lot of slack. Also, the audience is entertained by another performance of broncos, bulls and steer wrestling, which are always popular. This also allows for an increase in entries in the mixed team roping. The breakaway roping and the barrel racing were changed to two go-arounds and we raised the added money for the roughstock. Also added, is a calcutta to get the audience more involved.

The rodeo club added a special exit for the ambulance to allow for a quick exit without waiting for traffic and avoiding obstacles. New holding pens and stripping chute, allows for faster and safer handling of animals, while allowing the events to run smooth and fast for everyone involved. Eleven Montana Saddlemakers are constructing the year-end trophy saddles which will be awarded to the 1994 Year-end & All-Around Champions on Sunday, Feb. 5.

Three Forks, Montana, saddlemaker and NRA Awards Committee member, Nancy Petersen originated the program which was implemented by the NRA in 1992.

Now in it's third year, Montana saddlemakers participating in the program include Earl Twist, Kalispell; Bruce Ruckman, Great Falls; Ben Swanke, Billings; Wayne Kelly, Stanford; Alan Pursley, Great Falls; Jim Allee, Greycliff; Tim Martz, Wilsall; Tod Twist, Kalispell; Bill Murch, Glasgow; Mike Witt, Billings, and Bob Pletan, Wilsall.

One of the largest regional rodeo Associations in the United States, the NRA is made up of 1,100 contesting members who competed at 36 NRA sanctioned rodeos in 1994.

Top ten money winners in each of the eight sanctioned NRA events are eligible to compete at the 20th Annual Northern Rodeo Finals set for Feb. 3-5, 1995 in Billings, MT. Over \$50,000 in prize money will be paid out during the three day event.

Thank you for making this one of the most unique and prestigious award programs in the country.

Bruce Ruckman Custom Saddles: In his third year of participating in the NRA Saddlemakers Program, this Great Falls saddlemaker learned his trade at a saddlemaking school in Washington and then spent two years as an apprentice to well-known Montana saddlemaker, Alan Pursley, Last

year, Bruce opened his own shop at 3623-7th Ay-

enue North in Great Falls. Bruce is a past college

and NRA saddle bronc competitor and now builds

custom saddles and leatherwork, in addition to

repairs. Bruce is building the saddle which will be

awarded to the 1994 Champion Bareback Rider. **Tim Martz, Wilsall, MT:** A fifth-generation Park County native, this Montana saddlemaker is building his second trophy saddle presented to the Saddle Bronc Riding Champion. Tim became interested in leatherwork at a young age, watching his great-uncle build saddles and do rawhide work. In 1989, Tim became serious about saddlemaking and began working with Wilsall saddlemaker Bob Pletan. Tim now builds custom saddles & tack at Pletan's Custom Leather in Wilsall.

Allee Saddlery, Jim Allee: Since the beginning of the NRA Saddlemakers Program in 1992, Jim Allee has built the Bull Riding championship saddles. This Greycliff saddlemaker has built saddles since 1951. Learning his leatherworking trade from Wyoming saddler Eddie Stokes, Jim and his wife, Barb own Allee Saddlery located in the Prairie Dog Mall in Greycliff, MT. Stop by

and check out their full line of tack including bits and spurs—just off I-90 at exit 377.

Tod Twist, Kalispell, MT: This 27 year-old the saddlemaker holds an undergraduate degree in history from Willamett University in Salem, OR. Building his second trophy saddle for the NRA Steer Wrestling, his last year's project, the Championship SW Saddle, was seen used in arenas throughout the region. Learning the finer points of saddlemaking from his father, Earl Twist, Tod completes piece work, handles the shop's "overflow" and repairs, in addition to building over 100 knife sheaths this past year. Visit Twist's shop located at 224 Forest Drive in Kalispell.

Ben Swanke, Swanke Saddlery: In 1992, Ben built the top quality saddle awarded to NRA Champion Breakaway Roper, Mary Salmond. For 1993, Ben crafted both the Junior All-Around saddle in addition to the Championship Team Roping saddle.. and then due to a co-championship in the team roping, Ben built another Champion Team Roping saddle! For 1994, Ben has designed the saddle awarded to the Junior All-Around Champ. 





If your rodeo paid any one contestant \$600 or more, you are required by the IRS to send 1099s. If you need contestant social security numbers, they are available from the NRA office. Please call the NRA 252-1122. Federal law requires these to be filed by January 31.



Thompson Wins State Senate Race in South Dakota


Jim Thompson, long time rodoe announcer of Watertown, South Dakota, has won election to the South Dakota State Senate. In his first bid for the Senate in his home state, Thompson, A Republican, beat out 3 term incumbent Dale Howlett for the District 5 position.

Jim Thompson is a former radio station manager and owner from South Dakota and a past president of the South Dakota Broadcasters Assn. Since forming his own marketing company in 1986, Thompson has announced all the major Finals Rodeos in America. He has slowed down his rodeo announcing to concentrate on other ventures but still announces at about 2 dozen rodeo events each year.

Thompson's voice has become familiar to listeners through many commercials in South Dakota, Montana, New Mexico. Especially through his own daily rodeo program called "On the Road Again with Jim Thompson" which airs on over 4 dozen radio stations in the 5 state area of the Dakotas, Montana, Wyoming and Nebraska, and also reports to over a dozen area newspapers on the rodeo news and results.

"Will the State Senate get in the way of my rodeoing?" Thompson answered his own question; "this is the next step in giving back to the state that nurtured me...it'll all fit into place in the end".





NRA ANNOUNCES STOCK OF THE YEAR

The top fifteen Northern Rodeo Association bareback, saddle bronc, and bull riders have voted on the 1994 NRA Stock of the Year.

Larry Wirtz's Northern Rodeo Company of Outlook, MT garnered both the Bull of the Year and Bareback of the Year award, while Newman Rodeo Company of Melstone, MT took the top Saddle Bronc of the Year honors.

A ten year-old gelding named "All Grit" owned by Jack Hinnaland of Brockway and leased by Larry Wirtz's Northern Rodeo Company earned the NRA Bareback of the Year title. This 1,300 lb broke saddle horse bucked off two previous owners before NRA pick-up man Jack Hinnaland purchased him for a pick-up horse prospect. All Grit kept on bucking and has qualified for the NRA Finals four times.

Another broke saddle horse, Black Label, owned by Newman Rodeo Company of Melstone, takes top Saddle Bronc of the Year honors.

A black ten year old gelding, Black Label was bought by Dale Small at Wilsall and will be making his third trip to the NRA Finals. Only ridden twice this year, Black Label earns those who make the eight second ride a paycheck.

Larry Wirtz raised the 1994 NRA Bull of the Year, Velvet Coke, from a calf. Now five years old, the Saler/Brahama cross weighs in at 1,500 lbs and is unridden this season in 15 outs.
