The newly elected NRA President, Joe Warner of Whitefish Montana, will be the person to lead the NRA out of the 20th century and into the 21st century.

Joe comes in as NRA President with a lot of experience, enthusiasm, and love for the sport of rodeo.

He has a well-rounded view of the sport of rodeo, as a spectator, a competitor, and now rodeo announcer. Joe's love began as a child when his mother Jeanne Warner took him to rodeos that she would secretary. He then moved from the stands to the arena dirt by competing in High School Rodeo. He competed in all of the Men's events except Saddle Bronc Riding. Joe is now out of the dirt, but still very much in the action as he announces the rodeos. His past experience with many of the events gives his rodeo announcing an inside edge of what is happening in the arena. He knows what those competitors are going through when they climb over the chute, back in the box, and even come through the gate.

Joe give's Mike and Bee Gee Cole of Eureka the credit for giving him his start as a rodeo announcer, in 1986. He now announces NRA rodeos for Jacobs Livestock Rodeos and Gardner Rodeo Company. He pushes hard in the summer and puts a lot of miles on his Karl Tyler Chevy Truck each season, but he doesn't mind, he's doing what he loves.

He couldn't do what he does without the support of his family. His wife



Judie, 14 year old daughter Sunni Rae, 19 year old son Luke, an up and coming NRA Bareback rider, and 22 year old son Dan who Team Ropes. They're the people, who stay home in the summer and keep the family ranch running smoothly, while dad beats down the black ribbon highway.

Along with being an announcer, rancher, and family man, he also is an auctioneer. It isn't unusual to see him sell the 4-H sale and then work the rodeo that evening.

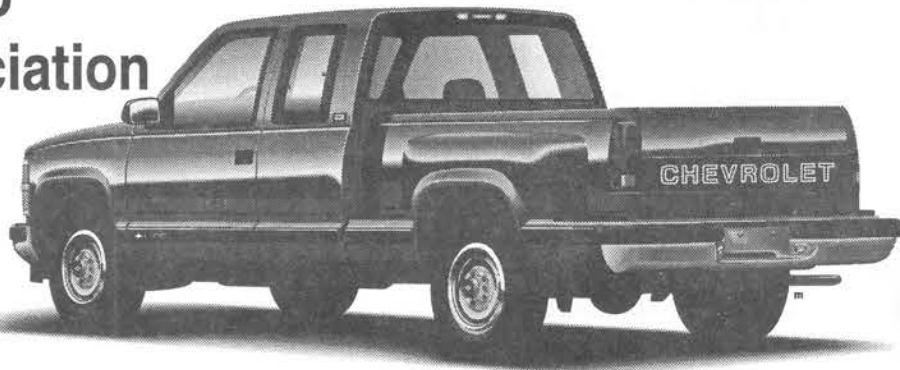

Don and Teeter Jacobs named NRA Personality of the Year

Winning and earning the Northern Rodeo Association's most prestigious award, Great Falls stock contractor, Don and Teeter Jacobs of Jacobs Livestock Rodeos were recognized by the Northern Rodeo Association as the 1998 NRA Personality of the Year.

Jacobs Livestock Rodeo have been a part of the Northern Rodeo Association for 28 years...and the NRA Finals for 23 consecutive events.

Don remembers that for one of the first NRA Finals rodeos, Jacobs Livestock Rodeos and Bob Schall, Sr., loaned the event \$5,000 to get started. The loan was to be paid back within a year...they paid it back within a month!

Jacobs Livestock's first NRA rodeo was Three Forks. "The contract was written on a napkin", Don explained, "and that was the only contract in 23 years of producing that rodeo that I've ever had!"

Well known for the quality bucking horses they raise, Jacobs Livestock rodeos has produced between 5 and 6 horses each year that first compete across the state at NRA events and then move on to the national scene.

If you were a Montana bull rider or followed the bull riding scene at all, the names "Blue Goose", "Baby Huey", "Tennessee Tuxedo", "Joe Brown", "The Goose's Brother", and "40 Thousand Laughs" should ring a bell. Not only were the bulls notorious, but the riders who learned on

them were, too. Clint Branger, Scott Breeding, Brett Todd, and "all the Nahrgangs" were among the bunch that twisted this pen of bulls.

The NRA congratulates Jacobs Livestock Rodeo on their achievement.

MAN IN THE CAN: FLINT RASMUSSEN

Earlier this fall Flint Rasmussen of Stevensville MT was accorded the honor of barrelman at the 1998 NFR.

It was quite a coup for the 30 year old Rasmussen who was in the arena at the Thomas and Mack Center in Las Vegas, for the bullriding events during the ten day rodeo.

At the PRCA Contract Personnel Banquet, Rasmussen was named both the PRO RODEO Clown of the Year and the Coors Man in the Can. It was the first time Rasmussen received any of the three honors. He beat out some illustrious performers for the titles, including former winners Leon Coffee, Rudy Burns, Quail Dobbs, and Lecile Harris.

Rasmussen became only the second man to sweep all three awards which are selected by a variety of bullriders and rodeo officials. Butch Lehmkuhler of Nebraska won all three in 1989.

MEET THE 1998 NRA FINALS PICK-UP MEN

The Saddle Bronc riders and Bareback riders decided that they wanted Dick Lyman of Great Falls and Tom Harmon of Kila to be the men to help them with soft dismounts off the best bucking stock in the state of Montana.

Dick Lyman got his start as a pickup man in 1976 when Don Jacobs started to produce rodeos. He started picking up with Denny Dryer working Montana Rodeo Association and High School rodeos. Dick worked with the likes of Larry Johnston, Ed Solomon, Charlie Hahncamp, Josh Hedricks, Dick Bassett, Walt Vermendell, Jack Solomon, Jay Hahncamp, the Newman brothers, Vince Thompson, and currently working with Steve Gruel. "They helped me learn something new and I tip my hat to them."

Dick has been with the NRA for a number of years. Members of the NRA helped Dick and his family out when he had to go to the Mayo clinic to have his large intestine removed due to colitis. Dick had no insurance and the members of the NRA made sure he and his family didn't go under. He repays those members by being beside them or their sons in the arena to help them out of tough situations. Lyman says the job is a lot of fun, but nerve racking. "It's worth it all because of the cowboys I've been able to save from bad wrecks. When I think of some of them I know God had a hand in helping me."

Dick brought four horses to the finals to use, Dean, Heidi, Wahli, and Big John. His

pick out of these four is Hiedi. This is the horse that he saddles when he needs to be mounted well.

Tom Harmon has been a NRA card member for 15 years. He was given his start picking up with the Powder River Rodeo Company, when the company was owned by the Carpenters of Kalispell. He started picking up for them at the Winter Series Rodeo in Kalispell.

Kenny Carpenter taught Harmon how to work the horses slower and cycle things around to make the horses come to him. When Carpenters sold the Powder River Rodeo Company to Steve Morrison and Hank Franzen, Tom went with and picked up for them. Harmon now works for Rocky Mountain Rodeo and Gardiner Rodeo Company. He picked up at Libby and Columbia Falls this year.

A few of the people Tom would like to give due credit to are Kenny Carpenter,

Walt Vermadahl, and Denny Dryer. He says he has learned something from everybody he has worked with. One of the most important things he has learned is to know where everything and everybody is.

Tom got to watch his son Jordan, who came to the Finals in fourth place in the Saddle Bronc Riding, from the best seat in the house, aboard his pickup horse. It was probably a comfort for Jordan to know that his dad was out there to help him if he got into trouble, and to make sure he got a good dismount.

Harmon brought three horses to use, but his pick was the 12 year old bay roan named Spider. His other two horses are owned by Denny Dryer, one he sold to Denny and one he borrowed from Denny.

Tom Harmon and Dick Lyman worked well together for the three days. Both of these gentlemen did a fantastic job of taking care of the competitors and the bucking stock.

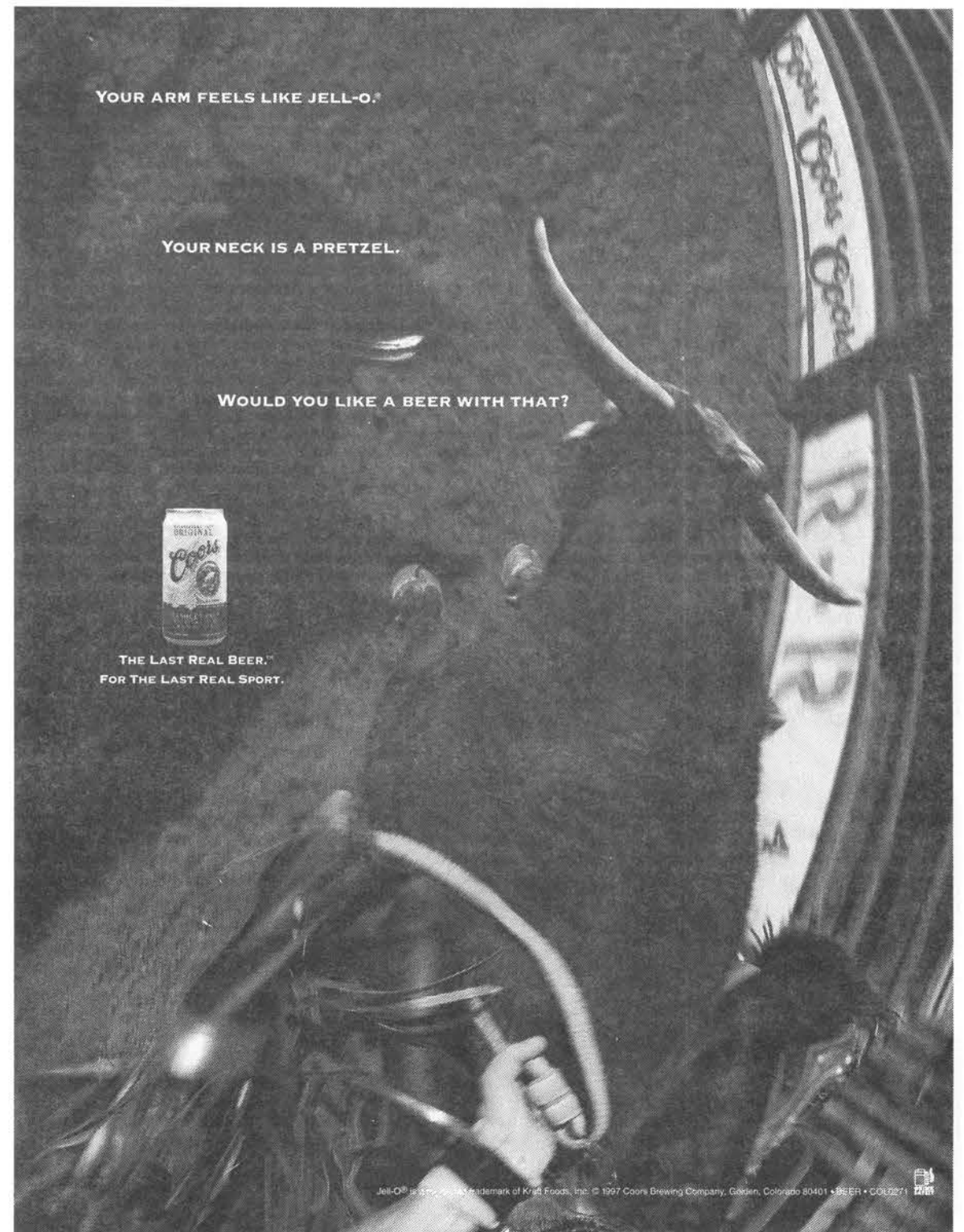

Hansen.

Financial Report was read and approved subject to audit. Budget committee for NRA Finals was discussed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

North American Rodeo Commission: Representative not present.

Friends of Rodeo: Karen Miller reported that memberships are needed and urged everyone to please purchase a membership if they have not already done so.

Awards Program: The awards program was discussed. The Board would like to have a list of sponsors that have a contract with the NRA and also a list of sponsors needed.

NRA Finals: The NRA Finals was discussed. Ideas for committee involvement in advertising and using articles on contestants in their local papers for advertisement were discussed.

Judges Program: Judging rating system was discussed. Dick Lyman will take ideas discussed to judging committee.

OLD BUSINESS:

Rodney Newman spoke with MontanaFair regarding their slack time. MontanaFair is unable to change their slack time due to the fact there are other events scheduled immediately after slack.

Sharon Martin reported the estimate on the cost of programming her computer to draw for order in events after she has drawn for performances is between \$1200 - \$1500. Sharon answered questions on the draw and had draw sheets from her computer program available for the board to go over.

NEW BUSINESS:

Bruce Martin requested that the NRA Finals judges' rooms be paid out of the Logan Coach Judges Program. Discussion. It was decided not to pay for the rooms this year.

Discussion followed concerning the top ten (10) headers and top ten (10) healers qualifying for the NRA Finals. It was moved and seconded that the board: amend rule F.1.1.: The top ten money winners in adult events in the overall Association standings at the end of the regular season will be eligible to compete at the Finals rodeo. If any person in the top ten will be unable to compete, the

numerical standings will be used to fill any positions. In the team roping event, the top ten money winners in the heading and heeling categories will be eligible to compete at the Finals rodeo. Passed.

It was moved and seconded that the board: amend rule A.5.13.: If a team roper's partner doesn't show up at the rodeo they may obtain a partner from the membership of the Association, provided that person isn't partnered in the team roping. That person must notify the rodeo secretary before the performance of his partner and whether they will be heading or heeling. If two contestants enter the team roping separately as two teams, and they end up roping together, they are still responsible for a partner's entry fee. The man who did not show up to compete is fined \$20, only if someone else ropes in his place and his fees were paid. Passed.

It was moved and seconded that the board: amend rule A.4.1.2.: When entering, every member contestant must give his Association number and is responsible for all non-member contestants entered by the member. Team roping members must notify central entry weather they are entering as a header or heeler. All non-members entering an Association rodeo will be drawn out if entries are not paid or guaranteed by a member in good standing when entries close. Passed.

Jim Martiny addressed the board regarding his interest in become a NRA stock contractor.

Concerns regarding the N.W.R.A. were discussed.

Discussion followed concerning junior breakaway ropers roping steer wrestling cattle. Defeated.

Discussion followed concerning event directors choosing timed event cattle for the NRA Finals. Defeated.

Discussion followed concerning top 12 in each event competing at the NRA Finals. Defeated.

Discussion followed regarding rule R.9.1.5. It was moved and seconded that the board: amend rule R.9.1.5.: If, in the judge's opinion, contestant is fouled by barrier the contestant must declare him or herself by pulling up immediately. Any penalties incurred before the foul will be assessed (i.e. broken barrier). If broken barrier is assessed, animal will be given back lap and tap plus 10 seconds. (Judge needs to be aware of the difference between a foul and a malfunction at/of the barrier). Passed.

Discussion followed regarding rule M.1.10.1: It was moved and seconded that the board: delete rule M.1.10.1. Defeated.

Meeting Adjourned.



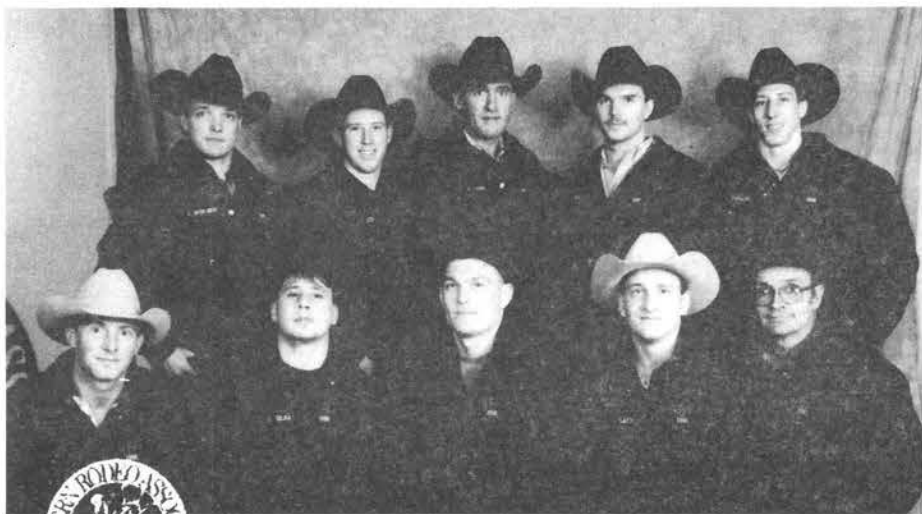

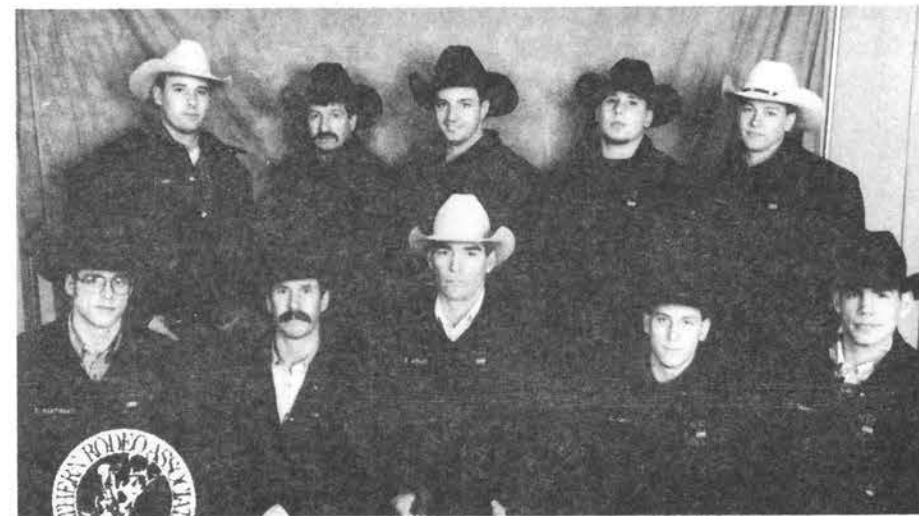

Rob finished the year with \$8,198 in earnings to make this his second All-Around title; his first was in 1996.

3. **LORNE KRONE:** The father of Denver and husband of Tami wasn't going to let the steers get by him. The 1994 NRA champion took home a second place check in round two, a first place check in round three, and average check to move him up from fourth to third.

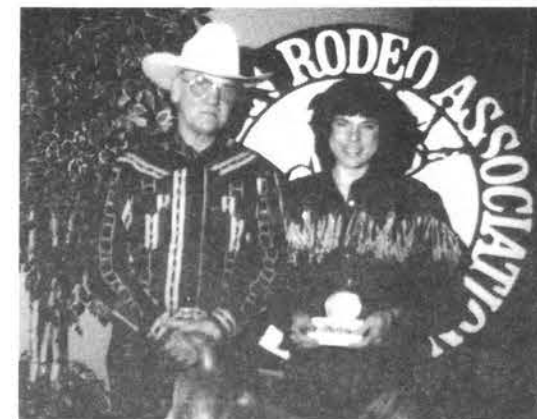

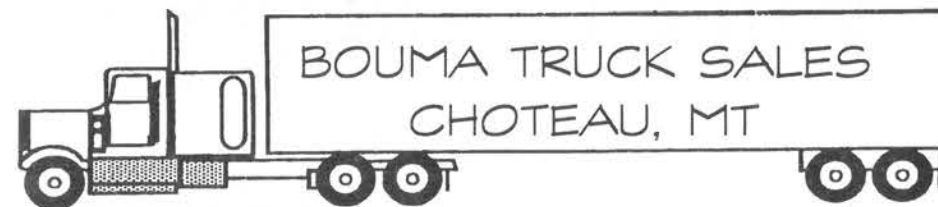

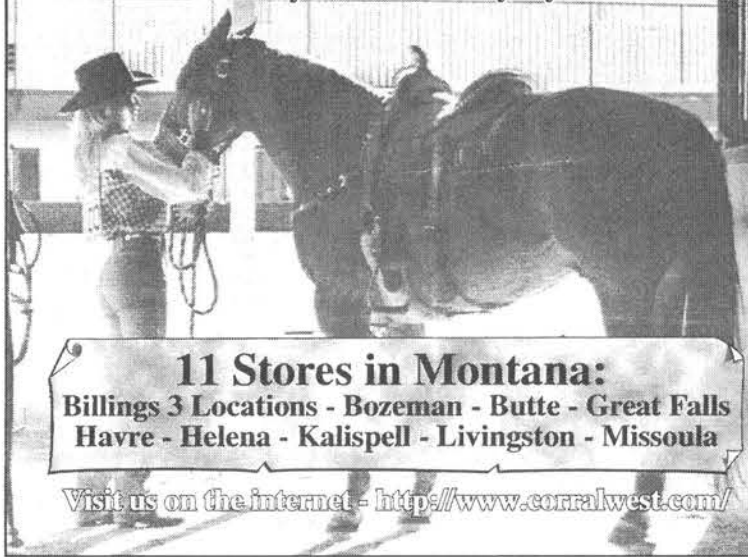
