to team rope, but I'll never win a buckle at that--ha--so I'll just keep answering the phone on Entry Day and wear my new buckle. Thanks again!

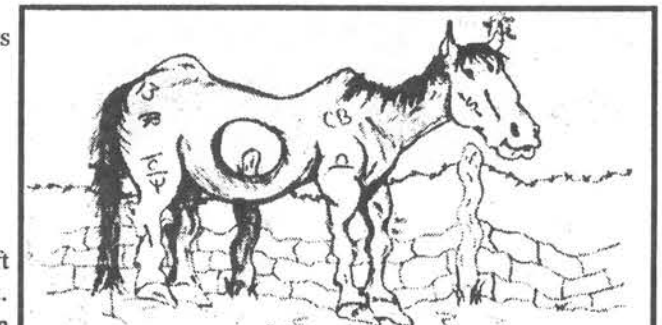

I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.





MARY SALMOND WINS \$10,577 IN 1993

Mary Salmond, the Ty Murray of the NRA, has just won her sixth NRA all-around title and her fourth NRA Ladies Breakaway Roping title. Like Murray, she has broken money-won records and is a role model to rodeo competitors--men, women and kids alike. Since 1983, Mary has won \$80,753 in the NRA. That compares to Bob Schall of Arlee who has won \$73,512 in that same decade.

Mary, now ranching with her husband Mark in Choteau, has won more than any man, woman or child in the NRA for three years (1990, 1992, and 1993).

People who rodeo don't have the luxury of arrogance, and Mary is very modest and humble. She tells people at her clinics, "Appreciate your family. Without your family's help, you can't rodeo. Without your family, you can't even practice!"

Mary, a native of Wolf Creek, turned 30 on January 24.

Mary and Mark have roped together since attending college at Montana State University in Bozeman. Mark and Mary, Charlie Briggs, Mike Germann and a few others organized a place where they could get some extra roping while attending college.

"Everybody has a bad day roping, but we never got after one another for how the other roped," comments husband Mark. "We've roped together forever, and I don't remember ever having any problems like that."

The couple did not date in college, but started dating after they graduated the winter of 1987 while they were both in Bozeman.

After their marriage in 1988, Mary filled her PRCA permit heeling for Mark, but came back to Montana before qualifying for the NFR. As far as she knows, there is only one other girl the same year who team roped and also filled her card.

Unlike Ty Murray, Mary Salmond

competes in three timed events, but she has the same commitment, dedication and determination for success as he does.

"Anything Mary does--it's not half way," says her husband Mark. "She loves basketball but never got to do much with it. The last couple of years she has played in two tournaments. She works at night jumping rope and shooting baskets." Mark adds, "She is committed to whatever she does."

Mary followed her mother's footsteps. Both Mary and her mother, Susie Burgraff Melaney, won the NIRA all-around title while attending MSU. Susie won it in 1961 and Mary in 1987. Her dad, Chuck Melaney, rode saddle broncs. Mary's sister and her husband (Chris and Dale McQueary) and brother Bill are active rodeo competitors.

Mary cracked out her young 5-year-old roan horse in 1993 to heel on after her superb yellow horse she called Jack broke a bone in his foot. She runs barrels and breakaway ropes on Roy, a 10-year-old son of LeRoy Brown. The gelding only has been hauled since 1990. In 1991 he took Mary to the NFR in the barrel race.

The NRA prides itself on family rodeo. Mary and her extended family certainly sum up this assertion.

BREAK-IN JACKPOT

In the 1993 Break-in Jackpot before the NRA Finals on Thursday in the Metra, Amy Wilson and Kera Washburn split the barrel racing earning \$240 each with times of 14.47.

Jody Peterson won the average with 6.9 on two head winning \$390

In the Steer Wrestling, Charlie Briggs won the average, got a check for \$390 with 14.7 on two head.

Laramie Baumann was 20.8 on two head and won \$360.

The team roping was won by Casey Nelson and Bobby Herman \$360 each.

WASHBURN WINS BARES AND ALL-AROUND TITLES

If grey hair counts, Dave Washburn has more hair than three of the best bareback riders around. Steve Cutler, Lane Yeager and Bob Schall can't match Washburn for hair growth, but these are the three who helped push him to his first NRA bareback riding title. He had to beat them everywhere he went. Who wouldn't have grey hair?

Washburn claims he's rodeoing just to haul his kids around.

He won \$7,825.99 in the bareback riding--the highest total for any other event winner. That is significant because the bareback riding usually does not pay as high as the other events.

1993 All-Around and Bareback Riding Champion Dave, the father, can't be mentioned without wife Robin, roper son Shawn, 12, and champion barrel racing daughter Kera, 10.

Dave and the kids compete, but Robin is the thread that holds the brood together. Robin is a detail person: she does all the entering, she knows what to be expected from the livestock, she figures the rodeo pay-off, she knows how far it is from any point in the northwest to any other point and how long it takes to get there, and she even does a lot of the driving.

Travelling with the Washburns is a treat if you can stand listening to lots of tales from Dave!

A Wyoming native, he has lots of stories from hitting the rodeo trail for many years.

Washburn, 37, enters the team roping with saddle bronc riders Troy Stroll or Tyler Holzum and Washburn also rides saddle broncs. The Cody, Wyoming resident won the NRA All-Around title by \$43 over Bob Schall.

It is no accident that Washburn won the 1993 NRA All-Around and Bareback riding titles. As a senior in Lander High School, he won the 1975 Wyoming state bareback, saddle bronc and all-around titles. He won the all-around title at the Cody Night Rodeo four years

in the early 1980's. During the '80's he rodeoed in the PRCA.

He quit for about five years and didn't rodeo. As his kids were getting ready to rodeo, Washburn told them, "I wouldn't make you kids do something that I wouldn't do myself." So back down the rodeo trail he went--this time with his family.

PARINI'S RIDES ADD UP Billings Barrel Racer Still Leads at NRA

During the week, Shirlee Parini works with numbers as an auditor at a bank.

On the weekends, Parini works with another set of numbers, but in a way, also working with money.

Only then, the money belongs to her.

For Parini, the numbers added up just fine for the Northern Rodeo Association season.

Parini entered this weekend's NRA Finals leading the barrel racing standings for the first time in her rodeo career. While Parini didn't post the numbers she wanted Friday night at Metra in the first performance, her standings lead remained safe.

The rodeo, which features the top 10 competitors in each event, continues with performances today at 8 p.m. and 2 p.m. Sunday.

The 26-year-old Parini won \$5,757.88 during 1993. Entering Friday's performance she had a \$743 lead over defending champion Kera Washburn, of Cody, Wyo. Parini turned in a solid time of 14.84 but did not place in the money. And she caught a big break when Washburn knocked over a barrel.

"It takes three good runs. Every run has to be a good one," Parini said. "Whether it's for \$100 or \$1,000 you can't do anything different."

Parini gives much of the credit to her horse Rodney. She trained the 7-year-old gelding and competed heavily in futurities the year before and continued his training schedule with rodeo competition last summer.

"My horse is a big part of it," Parini said. "He's not a real fast horse. But he's real quick around the turns. Outside of the arena, he's actually lazy."

"It's been tough (preparing for the finals). Luckily, we've had some good weather and I've been able to ride him outside. He's in good shape."

Parini, a native of Butte and a Montana State graduate, made her big push in the standings during the Fourth of July weekend, normally the busiest time in the rodeo schedule. She won at Ennis and picked up second-place checks at Harlowton and Choteau. She also won at Polson, her biggest winnings of the season.

"Sometimes it gets tough. It was easy to put on 1,000 miles during the weekend," Parini said. "We went Shelby to Ingomar and back one weekend. That isn't a lot of fun. I used to be a bank examiner and I was on the road it seemed for 100 percent of the time. For work and rodeo."

But a couple of things keep Parini going. Her love of the sport and traveling with friend Charlene Murphy. She would also travel with her sister Dana, who lives in Miles City.

"I started when I was five," Parini said, "I love animals and I like the competition. I like training the horses and seeing what they can do."

The Finals take an extra special meaning for Parini because both Murphy and her sister qualified.

"I don't mind taking money from her," said Parini with a laugh about competing head-to-head against Dana for the same check. "It's a good finals because all of us qualified. In fact, if I didn't win, I would love to see one of them win it."

"But I don't think the winning is all of it. It's just something that gets in your blood."

And the numbers on the check aren't bad either.

NRA FINALS VACATION TIME FOR WASHBURNS

Some families visit relatives for their vacation. Other travel to places such as Disneyland and the like.

The Washburn family travels the rodeo circuit.

Part of their vacation plans for the early part of 1994 include this weekend's Northern Rodeo Association Finals. Father Dave will be competing in bareback riding, daughter Kera in barrel racing (women's and junior's) and son Shawn in junior breakaway roping. Wife Robin helps coordinate everything.

"It's a six-month family vacation," said Dave Washburn. "And we pay the bills with it."

Washburn enters the NRA Finals leading the all-around and bareback standings. The 37-year old Cody, Wyo. cowboy already has locked up the bareback title with \$7,388.49 won for 1993 season. Washburn comes into the Finals with a \$2,455.58 lead over Helena's Steve Cutler. He holds a \$1,500 lead in the all-around standings over Roundup's Jody Wacker.

The Finals are at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday at Metra and 2 p.m. on Sunday.

"I wouldn't ride any different if I was behind," said Washburn, who also earned \$946.96 this past year in team roping. "There are a lot of good hands at the Finals. You have to be aggressive and get as many points as you can on every horse. I'm looking forward to getting on those NRA horses."

This will be Washburn's second appearance at the NRA Finals. Last year, he finished third in the average and third in the final year-end standings.

At the same time, he got to watch his daughter become the youngest competitor ever to win an NRA title as then 9-year-old Kera won the women's barrel racing and earn NRA

Rookie of the Year honors. This year, Kera enters second in the women's barrel racing standings.

For the father, it's part of a comeback after a five-year absence from rodeo competition. After traveling the rodeo circuit hard in the early 1980's Washburn took a five-year break (1985-90) to concentrate on work and his family.

"I have a construction company," he said. "I was busy then. At the time, (rodeo) was a way to make a living. Rodeo is a sport, if you want to go, all you have to do is enter."

When the children became old enough, Washburn returned to competition. And found being a few years away changes one's perspective.



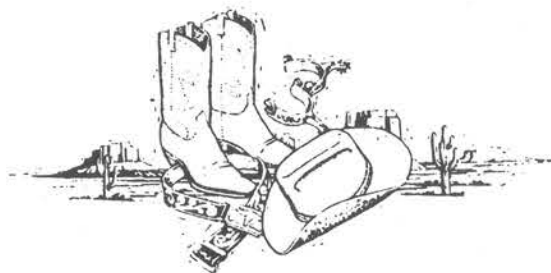

It was moved and seconded the minutes be corrected to read: If, in the opinion of the line judge, contestant is fouled by ~~barrier~~ NECKROPE, ~~ropers~~ CONTESTANT shall get their calf or steer back providing contestant declares himself/HERSELF by pulling up immediately. With change, minutes approved as written.

Committee Reports:

Judges Program: 1993 program was discussed. NRA has implemented the program as a permanent part of the NRA and feedback has continued to be positive. Evaluations will be sent out to the directors for their feedback on program. Skeeter Nordahl is working with the MHSRA to use NRA judges wanting additional experience at high school rodeos. The PRCA Judging seminar held in Great Falls in January was well attended.

North American Rodeo Commission (NARC): Annual meeting will be held in Las Vegas on Feb. 24-26. NRA will be represented by Stan Rasmussen and Jann Parker. NRA was not a NARC member in 1993, however information will be brought back from this meeting and presented to the Board at their spring meeting for 1994 membership consideration.

Rocky Mountain Association of Fairs (RMAF): Overview of annual convention held in Great Falls this past November.

Friends of Rodeo (FOR): Montana Executive Director of Friends of Rodeo, Karen Miller, addressed and updated the board on humane issues. Membership to FOR is encouraged.

Awards: The success of the 1993 year-end event sponsorship and saddlemaker programs was discussed.

NRA Finals Committee: Ron Shoen, chairman, updated the Board on the status of the Finals committee and the changes for this year's NRF. Areas worked on include the relocation of the Cowboy Auction and additional recognition for sponsors at the NRF.

OLD BUSINESS:

The term for the three positions of western committee representative on the NRA Board of Directors expired this year. Notices were to be sent to each western committee asking for their nominations for this position before the ballot was printed. The letter was not sent, thus the vote was invalid. Letter will be sent and the official ballot run in the March issue of the NRA News.

Rulechanges: Proposed Rules of Competition by-law changes were brought before the Board at this time. The following were passed for consideration and approval at this February meeting:

Ladies Barrel Racing: It was moved and seconded: Rule R14.11.3 It is the judge's responsibility and a judge must be present when the barrel racing pattern and electric eye positions are marked. PASSED > Unanimous.

It was moved and seconded that the following rulechange proposals be accepted:

Add to rulebook: If the rodeo has additional events requiring the use of a barrel, barrels must not be put on NRA barrel markers. PASSED.

Add to rulebook: There shall be absolutely no practicing or turning around the barrel markers after they have been marked. PASSED.

Add to rulebook: In the slack, ground around the barrels must be worked with a tractor, if one is available, before the barrel race and after the equivalent number of contestants drawn for a performance have competed. Example: with 26 entries drawn to run during slack, and 10 entries drawn to compete in the performance, then the ground is to be raked before #11 and #21. The rake is based on your position drawn on the official secretary sheet posted, regardless of any turnouts after the official draw is completed. DEFEATED*****

Add to rulebook: All contestants should run with a closed gate. PASSED.

Revision of R14.1 add to existing rule: with both ends intact. PASSED.

Change R14.11.9 and R14.11.10 to read: DEFEATED*****

Barrel Pattern

The standard course for barrel race is:

- >> 90 feet between barrel 1 and 2
- >> 105 feet between barrel 1 and 3 and between 2 and 3
- >> 60 feet from barrels 1 and 2 to scoreline. Scoreline should be at least 45 feet from end of arena.
- >> Maximum distance of 105 feet between barrels 1 and 2 and 120 feet between 2 and 3, and 1 and 3. Scoreline must never be more than 90 feet. Above rule is for unusually large arenas.

The following shall be used in small arenas:

- >> The scoreline should be at least 45 feet away from the end of the arena, unless there is a center alley or size does not permit. >> Barrel 1 and 2 must be at least 18 feet from the sides of the arena. In extra small arenas they may be less. In no instance should they be any closer than 15 feet from the sides of the arena.
- >> Barrel 3 should be at least 36 feet from the end of the arena, and no closer than 25 feet. In narrow arenas, the 3rd barrel should be set at least 15 feet longer than the 1st and 2nd barrel.
- >> If arena size permits, barrel must be set 60 feet or farther apart.
- >> In small arenas it is recommended the pattern be reduced proportionately to a standard barrel pattern.

** A graphic drawing as shown in the WPRA rulebook listing minimum distances must be included with this rule update/change. DEFEATED*****

LBR and JUNIOR BARREL RACING: There will be no circling horse in arena. One spin or pivot in either direction is acceptable. When contestants are not required to run in and out, they must keep forward motion toward first barrel, prior to crossing score line. Violators to be reported by judge and \$25 fine imposed. PASSED.

Page 50: R9.1 delete the following: A 10-foot tape must be on hand for the barrier judge to measure the broken barrier where the 10 foot rule applies. The 10 foot barrier rule is: if it is over 10 feet from the bottom of the post, at the pin side, it is not a broken barrier. PASSED TO DELETE. PASSED.

Clarification of NRA Finals team roping rule accepted: F1.4must have competed in five (5) NRA rodeos and won a team roping minimum of \$500.... PASSED.

Add: ALL PASSED:

>> Barrier equipment must be inspected by the judge before each timed event. if equipment is faulty, it must be replaced. Should barrier break at any point other than designated breaking point, decision is up to the barrier judge. if contestant obviously beats barrier, or barrier rope is broken and string unbroken, barrier judge may assess a 10-second fine.

>> In order for time to be considered official, barrier flag must operate. The barrier flag should be on the barrier pole or barrier instead of on the neck rope of the timed event cattle whenever possible.

>> If neck rope fails to work, but time is recorded, contestant or team will get time. Barrier penalty will be waived unless obviously beaten by contestant.

>> If, in the opinion of the line judge, contestant is fouled by neckrope, contestant shall get their calf or steer back providing contestant declares himself/herself by pulling up immediately.

>> All timed event cattle must be permanently identified. DEFEATED*****

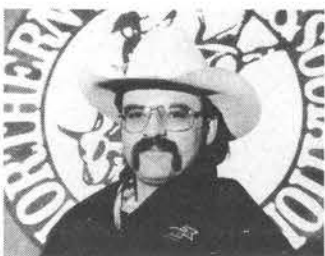
1. STEVE BLIXT, Helena, \$6,986.61

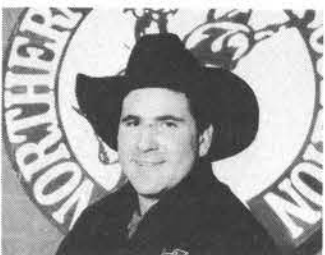
3. KENNEDY WALSH, Chinook, \$3,758.49

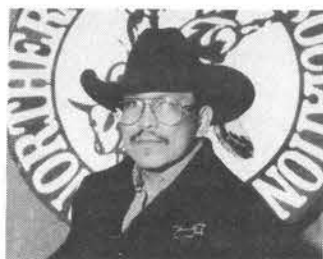

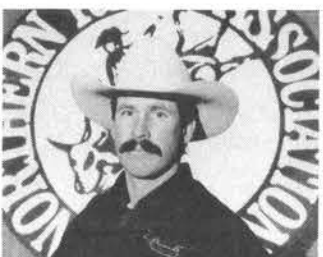
2. TROY STOLL, Green River, Wyoming, \$3,992.50

"Because of the saddles the NRA gives out. The calf roping saddles are outstanding. And now I've got two of them to use." Nancy Peterson and Rich Jeffers of Three Forks Saddlery constructed the calf roping saddles the last two years.



2. BILL BOYCE, Lewistown, \$4,818.63

Bill placed second in the average at his fourth NRA Finals. He placed second in the average winning \$1,062.50. Helping him to his many wins this year is a chestnut mare he purchased from Lyle Cochran.



3. CHAD JOHNSON, Cut Bank, \$4,164.63

This likable northern Montana calf roper is noted for his amazingly fast ties. This capable 22-year-old is attending college at Southwestern Oklahoma and journeyed to Billings to compete at his first NRA Finals and ended up fourth in the average. He had a shot at winning it all until the last calf. His big win was at the Montana Fair in Billings for \$1,092.96.



4. JIM BODE SCOTT, Shepherd, \$4069.29

"Bodie" is the current Montana ProRodeo Circuit Year-End Champion and it looked like he had a shot at the NRA Championship as well. This Waddie ended up third in the average and went home with \$500.
