

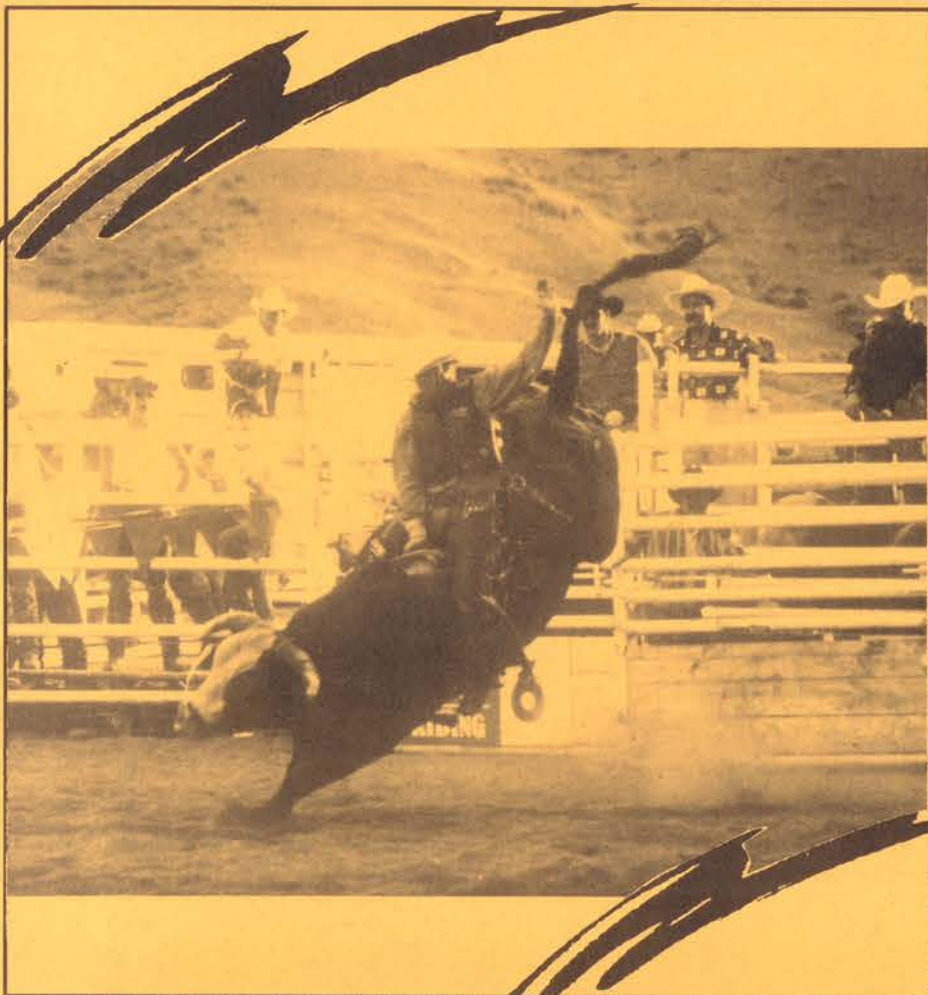

Wibaux County Fair and Rodeo offers NRA/NWRA Rodeo Action

Mark your calanders for the 1999 Wibaux County Fair and Rodeo August 27, 28, and 29.

The fun starts Friday evening August 27 with a night show. The NRA/NWRA rodeo actions gets underway Saturday August 28 at 7:00 PM. Sundays festivities offer a parade at 12:00 PM, followed by a demolition derby at 1:30 PM for those who like to observe some good wrecks.

The fair offers livestock judging, 4-H shows, and a 4-H sale at 3:00 PM Sunday. There will be giveaways each evening, a year's supply of Pepsi will be given away Friday night, Blue Rock Distributors of Sidney donated a Mens and Womens duster style jackets that will be raffled off during Saturday's NRA/NWRA rodeo performance, to two lucky spectators, and Demolition Derby Jacket will be given away Sun-

day. There will be a petting zoo Saturday and Sunday.

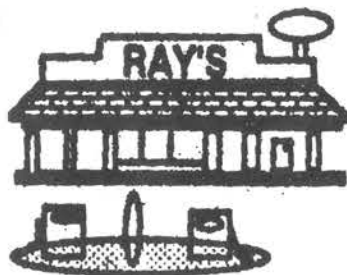

The guy it's named after thought relocating was a dumb idea when his wife thought it was time to build a new store on six acres outside of town. He advised staying where they were, downtown on the corner across from the town's locomotive. The locomotive was symbol for the town's main employer, an icon to its prosperity. But when the railroad left Harlowton, much of downtown declined.

"Oh he just thought we were foolish. He said we had a good thing going, why take the bull by the tail," his widow Alma says with a laugh. "But I saw all the traffic going by here, so I took that bull by the tail."

Her husband usually had keen business sense, Alma says. He built supermarkets in Harlowton and Martinsdale. He knew how to move merchandise and build customer loyalty. Both businesses prospered and he sold out in 1968 to open a fishing and outfitting shop.

"Back then it was just a fish hook shop," she says. "But it mushroomed into western wear before we realized what was going on. It did so well he

retired and my sons and I took over. He had a fine retirement. He was only 62 and he lived to be 84."

"He grumbled a little," Alma says. "But before long he knew we were on the right track."

The right track for Ray's included combining the western wear store with a convenience store and gas station.

The marketing is evident in the sheer volume and variety of merchandise. It's Alma's favorite part of the job.

"People like to see something different," she says. "I know I do."

At Rays, the merchandise includes workday ranch gear as well as fancy formal western wear.

"You can find just about anything you need or want," Alma says.

"I like that it's kind of like a old general store," she says.

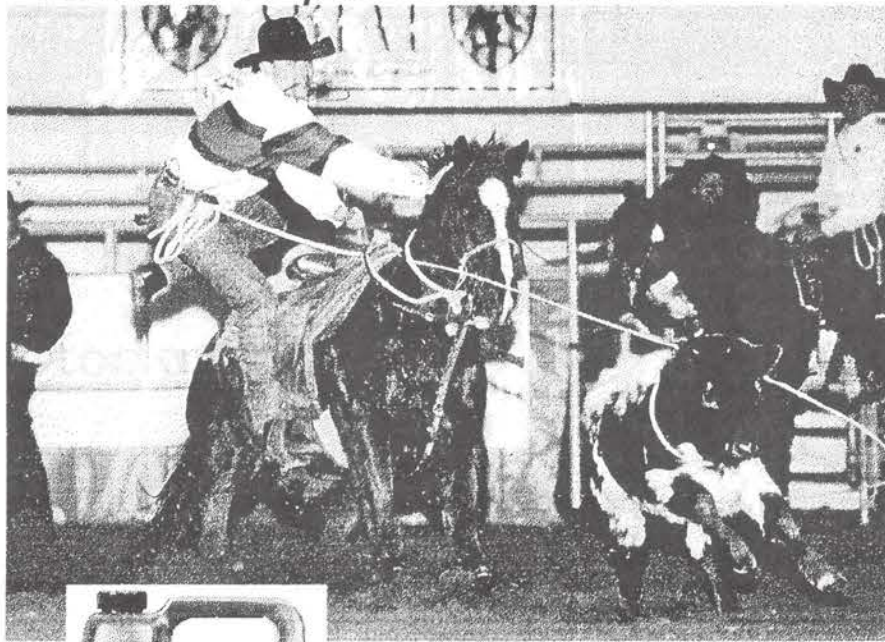
Her sons agree that mom's taste in clothes suits a wide audience.

Rick and Ron also learned a strong work ethic from their parents. The convenience store is open 365 days a year; the main store, every day but Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.



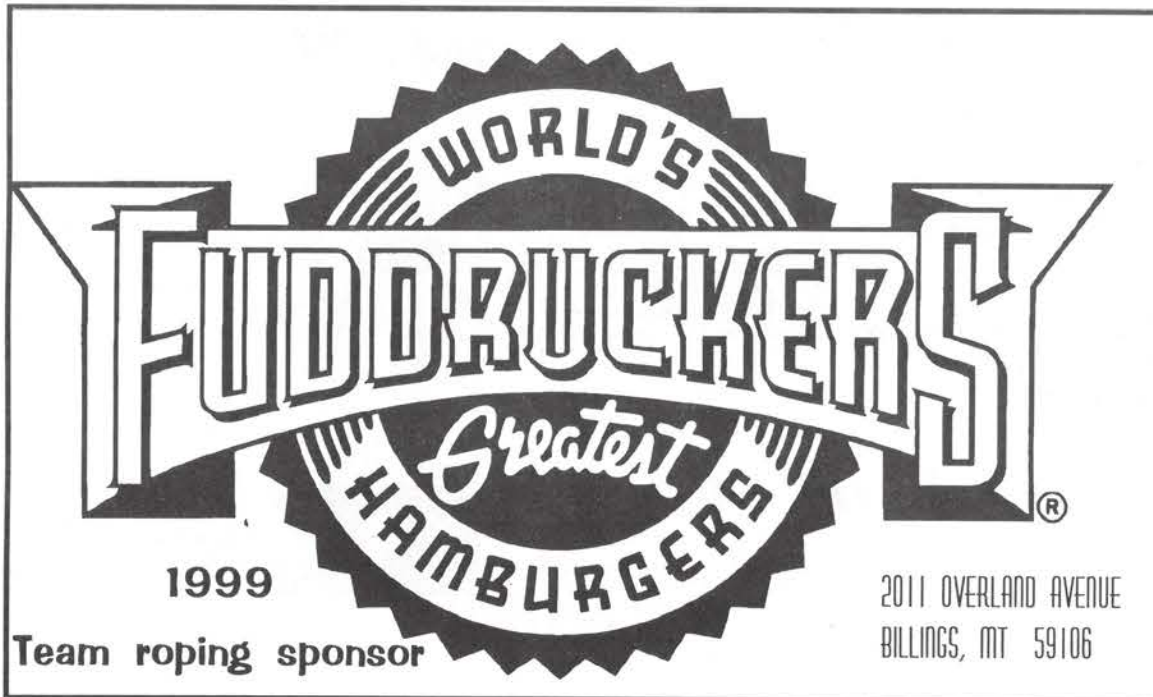

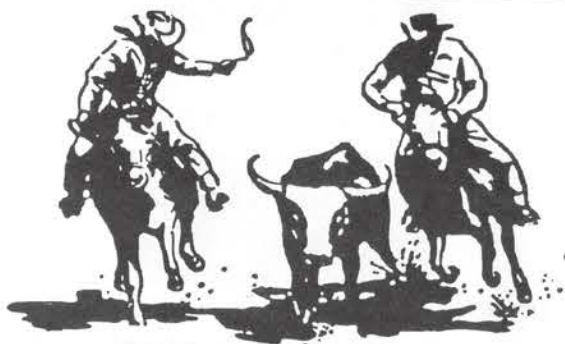

How to enter NRA/NWRA Rodeos

Welcome to the Northern Rodeo Association. NRA rodeos have utilized Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry since 1984 and offer the following guidelines to assist you. Take a moment to familiarize yourself with the NRA and NWRA rules on Central Entry. They can be found in section A.4.0 in the NRA rulebook and in section A.4.0 in the NWRA rulebook. A thorough knowledge of the NRA and NWRA rules which apply to entering will help you better achieve your entry objective.

NRA/NWRA Rodeo entry procedure through Big Sky Rodeo Central Entry • 406-428-2205

UNLESS OTHERWISE ADVERTISED, rodeo entries will open at 10 a.m. and remain open through 6:30 p.m. every Monday preceding a rodeo weekend. Call backs open at 12 Noon and remain open through 6:30 p.m. every Tuesday. Per rodeo charge of \$3.50 per contestant. Please read your rodeo listings carefully as the entry dates that fall on days other than the Monday before the rodeo will be in bold lettering.

When entering, be prepared with the following information for the central entry operator:

1. Name of rodeo(s) you wish to enter
2. Your NRA card number
3. Your name
4. The event (s) you wish to enter
5. Preferences you have on which performances you wish to work.
6. Name of buddy or buddies - NRA rules allow for two per event, six total.
(To buddy together you must enter together.)
7. If a multi-rodeo weekend, give information for each rodeo you wish to enter.
8. Call back Tuesday between 12 Noon and 6:30 p.m. (unless otherwise advertised)

to find out when you are up.

9. Keep a record of the confirmation number the central entry operator gives you, both upon entering the rodeo, and when you call back. Every conversation, both entry and call back, is recorded on tape, and each person calling is given a verification number for that conversation.

In the event of a discrepancy, you **MUST** have your confirmation number available. No complaints against Central Entry will be considered valid unless a confirmation number is given.

If you do not call back during the specified call back times, late call backs will be accepted at the late call back number 406-428-2398. There is an additional charge of \$2.50 per rodeo for this service.

After \$500 money limit is won by permit holder, a card must be purchased, the price of card to be the dollar difference between the cost of a permit and the cost of the card. Permit holder's points will be credited to the year-end standing, however, the contestant must be a card holder to compete at the NWRA Finals. The \$500 money limit will be accumulated from year to year, allowing the contestant to purchase a permit each year until the \$500 is won. RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Northern Women's Rodeo Association sanctioned events and membership in the Association, I and my heirs, successors, personal representatives and next of kin, hereby RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE and agree to HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY the Northern Women's Rodeo Association, the rodeo committees, stock contractors, sponsors, arena operations or owners, their agents, representatives (collectively referred to as the NWRA) from all liability me and my personal representatives, heirs, successors, and next of kin from any and all claims and liability for all loss of damage, and any claim of damages therefore on account of any injury to my person including death or damage to my property while I am utilizing NWRA facilities or participating in NWRA events.

I, hereby represent to the NWRA that I understand that THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS OF SERIOUS INJURY AND DEATH inherent in participating in rodeo events and any related activities. I realize conditions of the rodeo arena change from time to time and may become more hazardous, that rodeo animals are dangerous and unpredictable and there is INHERENT DANGER in rodeo which I appreciate and voluntarily assume because I choose to participate in such events. I make this choice even though I have observed or participated in events of this kind in the past and know conditions, facilities, rodeo animals, and other rodeo contestants and participants pose a danger to me. I recognize and expressly agree to assume the entire risk of any and all accidents or personal injury including serious paralysis or death which I might suffer during my participation in said events.

I further COVENANT AND AGREE NOT TO SUE THE NWRA for any injury, damages or death which occur as a result of my participation in said events and any claim or damage therefore. I understand that this document may be treated as a complete defense to any legal action I might bring against the NWRA for any injuries or other damages I might suffer.

I understand and agree this RELEASE AND AGREEMENT NOT TO SUE extends to any and all claims I may have, specially including, but not limited to, claims arising out of participation in said events, claims with respect to the design, manufacture, repair, or maintenance of facilities or equipment which I will be using, or with respect to the conditions, qualification, instructions, rules or procedures under which my use of said facilities or equipment are conducted or from any other cause.

Drawouts, Tradeouts and Turnouts

The NRA and NWRA Guidelines: for complete information, please refer to the NRA rulebook section A.8.0. The following is provided for your convenience.

Drawouts: At the time of call back, a contestant may draw out of a rodeo(s). There is not a charge IF you did not receive your preference of performances. However, NRA rule A.4.1.4 and NWRA rule A.4.1.4 states: "Any contestant who draws out of a rodeo after receiving their first preference of performance at a given rodeo or rodeos will be fined \$20 per infraction."

Tradeouts: All NRA/NWRA rodeos are trade-out rodeos unless advertised in the rodeo listing as "No Tradeouts".

A contestants may trade positions/performances of competition with another contestant at anytime after entries close, provided it is before the stock draw for that event.

If a trade is completed before callbacks close, trades are handled through central entry and may continue to be handled up until 10 a.m. the day following callbacks.

After 10 a.m. the day after callbacks, all trades are handled through the NRA/NWRA Office 406-252-1122. Both parties involved in a trade must call the NRA/NWRA office and confirm the trade.

Trades can be made at the rodeo upon consent of both parties involved before the draw in that event. Both judges and rodeo secretary must be notified of trade by both parties. NOTE: The timed-event draw must be made in the presence of the rodeo secretary and can be made a minimum of two hours before the performance. We bring this to your attention so contestants plan to make trades earlier.

Turnouts: As stated in the rulebook, if a contestant turns out at a rodeo, the fine will be equal to the entry fees. The NRA/NWRA has rules which can soften the blow of an expensive turnout:

1. Notified turnout: If you know before 3 p.m. the last working day before the first performance of a rodeo that you will not be competing at this rodeo, call the NRA Office. You will be responsible for your entry fees plus a \$20 fine. The fine is \$20 (plus all entry fees) no matter how many events you are entered in.

2. If it is too late to notify the NRA Office, you can find someone who will pay your fees at the rodeo for you and notify the secretary, judges, and contractor that you will not be there, your fine is half your entry fee (plus the payment of your fees at the rodeo).

Courtesy, please. Contractors, judges, secretaries, spectators, announcers, and fellow contestants appreciate knowing if you will not be there, thus an animal will not be drawn and this eliminate unnecessary turnouts.

Medical and Vet Releases: As soon as you are aware that you will be unable to compete at an NRA/NWRA rodeo you have entered due to a medical or vet release, contact the NRA/NWRA office. With a medical or vet release you are not responsible for your fees but releases must be sent into the NRA/NWRA office within five days after the rodeo along with a \$10 processing charge per rodeo.

Vet releases are accepted in the barrel racing event only. Keep in mind, when you medical or vet release, there is a five day waiting period before you can participate in another NRA/NWRA rodeo.

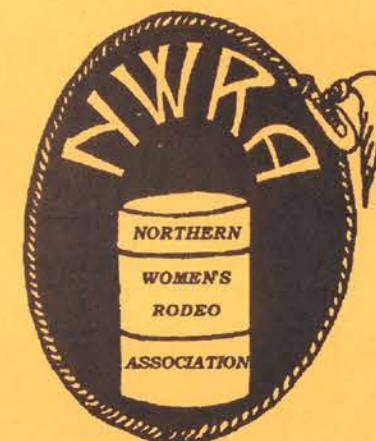
